Dear Madam,

I am oblige by your letter of yesterday, and thank you for recognising that it would not be possible for me to sign the request to the Government which is being circulated.

I should be glad to see this Bill make progress, but I am bound to say that I do not think it possible that it can be carried this session, and therefore, I am sorry that I cannot promise to make any attempt to get facilities for it at present. Whatever view one may take on the subject, the change is really a very great one, and it cannot possibly go through the House of Commons without detailed and long consideration; and I do not see how the necessary time could possibly be provided under the conditions which exist this session.
