UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 1925.

The Committee of the Union of Jewish Women present their Twenty-Second Annual Report.

Whilst this record of the activities for the year 1925 reviews well-established work and the exploration of some new avenues of usefulness, yet the mission of the Union will not be complete until it is representative of a far larger body of women labouring for the betterment of social conditions and for the maintenance of the Jewish Ideal. To be a true Union it should embrace, on a broad basis, in the first place the Jewesses of the United Kingdom, the orthodox and the liberal alike as an ethical entity, to stand for solidarity. The detail work is being carried on successfully and no opportunity is lost for enlarging its scope; but the great idea which inspired its Founders has not advanced at the same rate. It is the spirit of combination and co-operation animating its members individually and collectively which is the strength of such a Union which has never been fully realised by those women of our Community who, so far, have not joined its ranks. How can the Union respond to the call for co-operation on International problems unless it is strong as an English Union, and it is with a plea for an accession of strength as fully representative of our English Jewesses that the Committee open this Report before they pass on to the details of work on the lines of previous years.

Yet before all else a tribute must be paid to the memory of those friends of the Union who have passed away during the year. Mrs. Redcliffe Salaman, Scholar and Poetess, formerly Chairman of the Mrs. Nathaniel Louis Cohen Memorial Library, died in the Spring. She was ever ready to advise on literary matters and her gracious personality is as greatly mourned by the Union as by the general Jewish Community. In Mrs. Langenbach the Union has lost a valued Vice-President, whose keen interest was shown by her regular

attendance at all Council Meetings, when in London, and who was always a generous supporter of the Union.

Executive Committee The Executive Committee welcome two new members: Mrs. H. Aron and Miss Iris Castello, whilst Mrs. Hoster, who through stress of professional work is unable to attend Committee Meetings, has consented to become a Vice-President, still placing her expert advice at the service of the Union.

Branches, Correspondents, Affiliated Societies and Members The Committee desire to offer thanks to the Hon. Secretaries and Correspondents for Belfast, Bristol, Brondesbury, Hull, Johannesburg, Manchester, Liverpool and Sheffield, for their trouble in collecting and forwarding subscriptions and undertaking investigations when desired. Sheffield indeed has a most energetic protagonist in Mrs. Stone, who has established a strong branch of the Union in that city. Correspondents have joined in Birmingham and Swansea.

During the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Women, held this year at Birmingham, a special Meeting for Jewish Women was organised by Mrs. S. Abrahams and Mrs. A. Strauss, the leading social workers in the Jewish Community of that city. The speakers were Mrs. Model who reported on the work of the Union, Mrs. Eichholz who spoke on the Co-ordination of Social Effort, and Mrs. Abrahams, who presided, reported upon the result of the Co-ordination of the Birmingham Jewish Charities, which had proved successful beyond expectations.

The Dublin Ladies' Synagogue and Dorcas Society and the Durban Jewish Ladies' Guild have become affiliated to the Union during the year, and the Committee extends them a cordial welcome. Owing to the energy of the Treasurer a number of new members have been enrolled, but against this there is the inevitable loss through death and other causes.

Board of Deputies Mrs. Spielman still represents the Union on this important Body, and Mrs. Eichholz has been elected in place of Mrs. Model. By the regular attendance of these two members of the Union at the deliberations of the Deputies, the continuity of interest is

maintained and the Executive Committee keeps in touch with many vital matters concerning the Jewish Community.

Junior Branch An interesting development has been the formation of a Junior Branch of the Union which was inaugurated at a Meeting in February last. This branch aims at interesting girls in communal work and it has also a social side, arranging rambles, meetings, etc. The membership at present numbers seventy, but it is hoped that when this branch is better known there may be a great increase in membership; the annual subscription is 2s. 6d.

Confirmation for Girls The Committee notes with satisfaction that Confirmation Services have been held during the year at Birmingham, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, West Hartlepool and several of the London Synagogues. A preparatory course has been held at the Jews' Free School and it is hoped that a Confirmation Service for these girls will shortly follow.

New Activities, Eastleigh The forlorn condition of the 500 to 600 trans-migrants stranded at the Atlantic Park Hostel, Eastleigh, attracted the attention of the Union through the controversies in the Press, and at a Council Meeting specially convened early in March, at the house of Mrs. Pinder Davis, the following resolutions were passed: (1) "That the Union of Jewish Women organise a collection to defray the expenses of a Social Organiser to reside at Eastleigh for an experimental period." (2) "That the Executive Committee of the Union of Jewish Women be asked to secure an Organiser." In due course Mrs. Rachel Doniach was appointed, and, after spending a week at Passover in the Camp, she was in a position to recommend certain occupations, classes and recreations for the adult population, the children were already being dealt with by the Hampshire Education Authorities. Mrs. Doniach has carried on her supervision by regular visits and, together with her son, spent the summer holiday at the Camp doing very excellent work. She has established a workroom for women and a library to which many of the Union's friends have contributed books. Lectures, Hebrew Classes, discussions on varied subjects and a weekly journal have been organised by the combined energy

of mother and son, and the listlessness and utter despondency which lay like a shadow on the Camp have been in a great measure mitigated. Though the tragedy of these expatriated people, dwelling for two years in a concentration camp, cannot be shifted, it is at least something to have saved them by healthy recreation from utter despair and to have sent a sympathising friend amongst them. The collection made by the Union for this purpose amounts to £230, and, besides a monetary contribution, the Women's Lodge of the B'nai B'rith made valuable gifts of material for the needlework classes. For the children a Chanukah treat was arranged and gifts of toys, books and sweets are gratefully acknowledged. More financial assistance is needed to carry on the work, as the prospects of a complete evacuation of the Camp are not hopeful, and the Union must carry on the work they have started at Eastleigh until the last wanderer has passed to his destination.

This scheme has been carried through in close co-operation with the authorities of the Jews' Temporary Shelter, and Colonel Barbor, the Commandant of the Camp, who have given every encouragement to the undertaking.

Hospitality for Overseas Students Members of the Committee have entertained individual Jewish Overseas Students from time to time during the year, and all new Students known to the Committee have received invitations. All Students were given an opportunity of hospitality for Seder night. Though only five availed themselves of the invitations, many more wrote to express their thanks to the Committee.

The Committee, at the request of the Office of the Chief Rabbi, was also able to arrange Passover Hospitality for four Jewish boys travelling with the Australian Boys' Tour.

Far fewer Students are coming to this country from the Dominions than during the years immediately after the War, and from the Committee's experience it would appear that those who do come are in the more satisfactory position of having personal friends in this country.

Annual General Meeting The Annual General Meeting was held on Monday, February 2nd, at 190, Queen's Gate (by kind invitation of Mrs. George Mosenthal). The Treasurer and Loan Fund Treasurer

presented their accounts for the year. Mrs. Eichholz, the retiring President, after giving a resumé of the year's work, offered her thanks to the Executive Committee for the help they had afforded her during her term of office and introduced Mrs. Model as the new President. The Rev. A. A. Green gave a most interesting address on "Philanthropy, its Principles and Pitfalls," admonishing Social Workers to thoroughness and to the need of inspiring a spirit of self-dependence.

Council Meetings A Council Meeting, already referred to, dealing with the needs of Eastleigh, was held on March 9th, and on May 20th a further Meeting was held at 16, Dawson Place (by kind invitation of Mrs. F. D. Benjamin). The President reported on the work accomplished at Eastleigh since the last Meeting, and Mrs. Doniach gave some of her impressions of the people at the Camp.

At a Council Meeting on October 12th, at 29, Cambridge Square (by kind invitation of Mrs. M. A. Spielman), the President gave a report of the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Women at which the Hon. Mrs. Franklin had been elected President. She also reported on the Meeting arranged by Mrs. S. Abrahams at Birmingham. Mrs. Spielman opened a discussion on "Salesmanship for Educated Women" which aroused considerable interest, and the suggestion was made for further investigations as to such opportunities.

Social Gatherings The President, Executive and Staff held two informal "At Homes," similar to those in previous years, which were attended by many friends and workers. These gatherings are most useful in establishing friendships amongst the workers and a democratic spirit amongst the members of the Union.

Loan Funds The Loan Fund has at the present time twenty names on the register. All Students who have completed their course of training are refunding their indebtedness by regular instalments. Two Students have completed repayments during the year, two others will complete payments in the course of the next month and another three or four will clear their indebtedness to the Union in the coming year.

The fact that none of the Union's trainees are without posts will prove how successful they are, and how these loans have enabled them to become self-supporting.

The Union regrets having to report one bad debt of £24 15s., this was incurred during the War; since then the girl has gone abroad and the Union has lost all trace of her. Much as the Union regrets to report this one failure they feel that they have every reason to be proud of their protégées, both as regards their success and their repayments, as this is only the second time during the nineteen years that the Funds have been allocated to the Union that a debt has been incurred. The Loan Fund, however, has not suffered any loss of capital by this; as, owing to careful administration, the interest on investments has more than covered the amounts lost.

The Students have entered upon various avocations, such as Nursing, Dancing, Teaching in Elementary and Secondary Schools, Medicine, Art, Dispensing, Domestic Economy, Secretarial Work. Fees have been paid for study in France, for Teacher's Certificate, for College, for Medical Degrees and for Journalism.

The repayments this year amount to £207 19s. 3d., being £33 5s. 4d. more than last year. The loans granted amount to £235, being less than in the previous year, but this is accounted for by the fact that the loans have been granted in instalments spreading over a period of years instead of in one large sum.

The Louisa Lady Goldsmid Bequest Fund, which can be allocated in a somewhat different way than the Loan Fund, has not been much called upon this year, and it remains with the interest on investments at an amount over and beyond the original gift.

The Union is anxious to assist the educated girl to train, and is always endeavouring to find new openings, no easy matter now-a-days. The Secretary can be seen by appointment at the Office for advice, and will give all information and assistance possible.

The Union desires to repeat that all applicants are seen in private, that all loans are free from interest and that repayments are only due when training is complete, and posts secured.

Employment and Information Bureau.

The general depression in business is still reacting adversely on employment and this, together with the fact that the Union is used as a last resort by applicants who through age or lack of training are handicapped in the labour market, makes it difficult for the Office to place those applicants suitably and to fill such posts as are offered. There have been 200 new applications besides re-applications, and posts have been found for twenty-nine. Many others have been helped by advice and information. The Union keeps itself informed of all new openings for women.

Students Benevolent Fund.

This small Fund has been able to help several Students still at school by grants of money towards school fees or maintenance. The Committee are grateful for a collection towards this Fund which was made by Miss Reuben, Head Mistress of the Bene Israel Schools, Bombay, who lately was on a visit to England and was herself at one time a student at the London University.

Necessitous Ladies Fund.

By means of the Hahn Bequest and occasional donations to the Necessitous Ladies Fund, the Committee have again been able to help a considerable number of cases of distress among elderly and ailing gentlewomen. In some cases a regular grant is made which is paid each month, whilst in others financial help is given to tide over a difficult period. Holidays have also been arranged for several ladies and for some of the Students who would otherwise have no rest or change.

The Committee wish to extend their grateful thanks to the Grocery Relief Fund; the Passover Relief Fund; the Society for the Distribution of Bread, Meat and Coal tickets; the Queen Mary's London Needlework Guild, and the many ladies who have sent gifts of clothing, also to Mr. Claude G. Montefiore for a number of concert tickets. The grateful letters of thanks received at the Office testify to the pleasure and relief afforded by the distribution of these gifts.

Honorary Advisers Sincere thanks are tendered by the Committee to the Honorary Advisers: Dr. M. E. Landau, Dr. Liba Zarchi, Dr. Haldin Davis, Mr. A. H. Levy and Major H. L. Nathan, who so kindly place their services at the disposal of the Union when needed.

Volunteers The Office has again received valuable assistance from voluntary workers and thanks are due to the Misses Ruth Barnett, Ena Kahn, Rekah Keyzor, Adelaide Marks, M. Simmons and Wendy Solomon for the clerical assistance they have rendered. The Committee hope that these workers are recompensed for their trouble by the knowledge of office routine and insight into social conditions they acquire whilst working at the Office.

Staff Not only to the Voluntary Helpers but to the Office Staff the Executive Committee desire to record their thanks. Miss Gilbey by her ever ready sympathy with the applicants who come to seek her help and advice and her indefatigable work for the Union has endeared herself to the Committee and to her Staff, and has inspired her assistants with the same enthusiasm. Miss Eileen Van Noorden, who has held the post of Assistant Secretary for over three years, has seconded Miss Gilbey in all her efforts on behalf of applicants and is thoroughly conversant with the work in general, so that she is a most valuable second officer. During her leave of absence in the early part of the year Miss Olive Herz carried on the Assistant Secretary's work with great devotion.

Finance It is generally agreed that the work done by this Organisation is not only useful, but essential, in as much as it represents Jewish women in all public matters and affords aid to gentlewomen which would not be available otherwise.

To carry out this work necessitates funds, and the Union does all it can with the means which are placed at its disposal and exercises in everything a most rigid economy. Expenses, however, have inevitably increased in this work. The Staff is kept at the lowest possible limit and is devoted to the

interests of the Union. Aided by the surplus from last year, the result of the kindness of friends in providing entertainments, and this year by a special appeal, it has just been possible to cover the expenditure with a small surplus. Such a body as the Union of Jewish Women should have a sufficient number of annual subscribers to cover the expenses easily, and if more money were provided the work could be extended in many directions. Therefore, once again, an appeal for more members is made. It is felt that if each member would assist in the coming year by making the work more widely known and obtaining new members and donations, it would be beneficial for all Jewish women, as the work of the Union has various aspects.

Membership can be secured by a minimum subscription of 5s., and it is, therefore, hoped that all Jewish women will join and render the Union stronger and more representative and the financial position more secure than it is at present.
