I am very sorry to have
been so long in answering
your most interesting letter.
It came just as I was
leaving home for the term.
I think the Training
College for ladies, exactly
fills a very real need. I
do not want an ordinary
Training College some time

ago, and came to the con-
clusion that a lady would
have to undergo very much
that was unpleasant
before she gained her
Certificate. I was bent
to call your attention to
a letter written in the
Monthly Packet for October.
It is on this subject, speaking
of the difficulties in the way
of ladies becoming National
Schoolmistresses, and the

pity of it. I fancy it would
be worth while for you to an-
swer it, for the Monthly
Packet has a large circu-
lation among people likely
to be interested in the
subject; and give the details
of this new College. The writer
has evidently never heard
of it.

I send you a copy of our
Calendar. It will show you
the line our work takes.
During the past year, we
have found 30 situations
for teachers with certificates,
and many of them were
