THE PAPER

When the Board met last July it was faced with the necessity of trying to cut down expenditure which had already been drastically reduced. The cost to the Alliance of its paper has been heavy, and even after reducing the cost and cutting down printing costs to the lowest possible level, income from this source has not been sufficient to cover expenses. The Board therefore, after a very long discussion decided that the only remaining possible course to be selected, namely, to reduce the paper in size, after obtaining an estimate from the printer. It appears that provided our subscribers will share their impressions of the difficulties which the Alliance is making a earnest effort to meet, by accepting the smaller paper at the same subscription rate, and continuing their support the paper's budget may just be balanced. We realize that our readers may feel a slight sorrow dismay when they contemplate this slender issue, but our movement has been built up on small budgets, and every issue will be more economical than the reduction is effected by compressing the usual amount of news into the smaller space.

The only alternative is to cease publication, and it is an alternative which it is painful to contemplate. For twenty-six years "Jus Suffragi" has appeared regularly. To survive the war with all its difficulties, surely it can survive the present depression. But if it is to do so, our friends must not only be content to get less in bulk for their money, they must take a firm determination that their money shall be forthcoming regularly as subscription fall low. During the last year so many of our oldest subscribers have written to say that they can no longer afford to take the paper. Will not our friends remember that it is not only what they themselves may get from the paper which counts; their

support of it enables the Alliance to possess what is its most valuable link between its scattered societies and members; the one regular means of public notice. International meetings must always be held between the cost of travelling and stays in lodgings to many. The expense of a meeting is a tax to society that it will be found impossible for one who really cares. These are other papers, but there is not one other which provides exactly the general and impersonal news of the woman's movement. We are the organ of the Alliance indeed, but by the little space we may be able to dispose of, we shall have time to aim at being more than just the bulletins of a single society.

And in asking you to stand by us, we venture to ask you to give us active help as far as you can. A smaller paper if it is to be of value, we want more and less expression of opinion. We believe no Socialist nor should be the language of the paper. It is difficult to act. Without asking too much of our worked feminists, we do venture to ask readers to remember to send us the briefest note, a postcard will serve. When something of interest to women happens in their societies, language does not matter — we will manage to read them all—alphabets other than the Roman alone being barred, and with a qualm on the score of the Slavonic and eastern tongues. But English, French, German, Italian, Spanish and Scandinavian languages, can be dealt with adequately, if correspondents will take care to see that proper names are carefully written. We are willing to take a great deal of trouble on our side, if you will take a little on yours.
