The women who kept their own names generally changed miss to mes. Mrs F. M. did

Elected to School Board ¹⁸⁷⁹ Legal authorities gave opinion that the retaining of pre-marriage name was legal. This was accepted -

Described as Florence Fenwick Miller, married woman.

Objection was raised at the use of "maiden name" but Law Officers of Crown decided that her action was valid.

She was re-elected in 1882 - sat for 8 years
