If you have not already received collecting cards from the National Union, these will reach you shortly. Will you be good enough to ask those members who take cards to secure as many promises as possible of 1/- per month to the funds of the N.U. until the end of the year. By-elections have emptied our war chest and this we must refill without delay if our work is to be carried on.

One of the results of our work at the by-election at Sheffield was that out of the 12,000 voters over 5,000 signed the petition in favour of Women's Suffrage. Our total expenditure in Sheffield was £35. Is not this worth doing?

I do earnestly appeal to you as secretary to draw the attention of your Committee to our pressing need and ask for their co-operation. Can you send the names of any sympathisers, man or woman, to whom I might write myself?
