 you all as well and happy.  
 I do hope Franklin will be able to  
 stop until I come out. He is doing so

much the depth of the cause. How could it  
have come if it had not been for  
Lee. I am very sorry that the  
sentences have been so long. it is  
not what we expected and they  
seem quite out of proportion to the  
damage done. I want father to  
know that the government are trying  
to get rid of a few of the prisoners

I hope dear little Mante will not  
trouble about me or think that his
