& done anything about it.

fame - or notoriety - is here, &
we are anxious to get her a
good hearing if possible. She
says in her letter yesterday that she
has been booked for some meetings in
Glasgow, & am wondering if Thyllis
has already spoken to you of her
work. (Can you (if you have not
already done so) make any openings
for her? We are here now for the
summer - I hate the W. Coast - & my
husband comes out at week ends.
