Dear Madam,

I beg to forward to you the following amendments to be moved by the London Society at the Council Meeting on March 19th.

URGENCY. Proposed by London Society. *Between 6 & 7*

That the Standing Orders be suspended in order to demand urgency for that part of the Agenda which deals with the Union's Election Policy.

AMENDMENTS TO RULES.

RULE IV. Amendment proposed London.  
To insert the word "also" between the words "shall" and "annually".

RULE V. Amendment proposed London.  
To insert the word "policy" between the words "and" and "constitution".

RULE VII. Amendment proposed London.  
For "three" to substitute "twelve".

NEW RULE. Par. 1. Amendment proposed London.  
For "shall" to substitute "may" and after "formed" to insert "at the request" & before "affiliated" to omit "the".  
Par. 4. For "shall" to substitute "may".

That it be an instruction to the National Union Executive Committee and to the Societies in the Union to take into consideration whether the conditions in their constituencies are favourable to running a suitable Women's Suffrage candidate and report to the Executive Committee of the National Union.

20. London desires to amend this motion by the addition of the following words at the end -

"and that the attendance of representatives of the National Union at party meetings be organised to ensure the putting of a question on Women's Suffrage either by an elector or by the representative herself."

GENERAL POLICY.

For "instruction" to substitute "recommendation"; after "organise" to insert "in<sup>co</sup>-operation with the Local Society"; after "London" to insert "and in other parts of the country", ~~and for "people of the Metropolis" to substitute "publ";~~ for "and" after the word "Council" to substitute "or" and for "people of the Metropolis" to substitute "public".
