I wrote the enclosed letter to you dated 29.3.1912., but did not post it, as, after writing it, I received a satisfactory reply from the Governor of Holloway Gaol, that each of the 3 prisoners were alike sentenced to 3 months, and would, if their conduct were good, be released on June 44th, otherwise on June 18th next.

May I however thank your Lordship for the fact that the letter from the Chairman of the Newington Sessions appears at last to have induced the Home Secretary to grant to the Suffragette prisoners the facilities to which they were entitled under the old rule as political prisoners, and to release Murse Pitfield.
