## Dear Miss Strachey,

I am instructed by my Executive Committee to invite the cooperation of the Committee of the London Society in the organisetion of a joint demonstration in support of the Conciliation Committee's Bill. It is proposed that the joint demonstration should take the form of a series of separate daily meetings, extending over a week, arranged and organised independently by the various Suffrage Societies taking part in the demonstration, one of which meetings at least shall be arranged and organised by the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. There is also a possibility of a joint mass meeting to conclude the series.

The preliminary arrangements are being undertaken by a Committee of the National Union composed of the Officers and the following members of the Executive Committee:- Dr. Bentham, Miss Bryan, Miss Corbett and Miss Palliser, and the Bxeeutive Committee would be glad if you would add such of the members of your Committee as you wish to the number. The final arrangements
will be in the hands of a joint Committee of all the Societies participating in the demonstration, and on this Committee it is hoped that one of your members will be pleased to serve.

I enclose a Report of the negotiations as far as they go at present. There will be a further meeting of the Committee on Monday, October 3rd., at noon, for the consideration of further replies received, and arrangements for the appointment of the joint Committee, and it is hoped that representatives of your Society may be present at it.
