Dear Miss Phillips,

In reply to your letter forwarding resolutions passed by the National Union Commôttee on Thursday November 4th, I am instructed by my Committee to reply -

(1) That they will be very happy to arrange if possible for a deputation of electors to approach parliamentary candidates who have given an unfavourable reply to the National Union's questions. They would submit however, that in their opinion candidates should wherever possible, be first approached and questioned by persons living in the constituencies for which the/candidates are adopted, the best time for doing so being at the meeting at which the candidate is adopted by his party.

(2) My Committee cordially approve the resolution requesting all constituent Societies of the National Union to print at the head of their communications the title "National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies." It is already the practice of the London Society to do so upon all notices and
