The report of the Royal Commission on Trade Disputes and Trade Combinations was issued yesterday.

The Executive of the East Aberdeenshire Conservative Association yesterday resolved to recommend that the vacuacy in the Parliamentary representation of the division, caused by the death of Mr James Annaud, should not be contested at this time. This recommendation will come before a meeting of the Association on Saturday, when a final decision will be made.
