Dear Mrs. Vaughan Nash,

I thank you for your important letter, and I note the names that you have selected as those of men who might appropriately sign such a Memorial.

I venture to ask you to let me hear from you again when you have got the answers from such men as Lord Haldane, Mr. Balfour, Mr. Lyttelton, Mr. Henderson, Mr. Spender, Professor Sadler (but he is now Vice-Chancellor, not Professor), and Sir Thomas Barlow. I am quite ready to do my best to further the object you have in view provided it has the support of men whose experience is of the kind possessed by those whom I have named. Whether I can do this best by signing the Memorial or by independent action would have to be considered. I am not fond of signing Memorials, and prefer generally to write to the person to whom the Memorial is addressed. Pray let me hear from you again upon the whole matter. I realise very clearly its high importance.
