Dear Madam,

The following Resolution was passed at the Special Council of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies on Saturday, November 26th :-

"That the Societies be urged to do all they can to oppose the return of members who voted or paired against the second reading of the Conciliation Bill, and to ensure the return

- (1) of Women Suffrage Candidates where such are being run,
- (2) of such members who supported the second reading of the Conciliation Bill, and who promise further support,
- (3) of all candidates who give satisfactory assurances that they will press any Government which may be in power for early facilities for the passing into law of any Women's Suffrage Bill on the lines of the Bill promoted by the Conciliation Committee or in accordance with the object of the Union,"

and in forwarding it to you I am asked by the Committee to urge upon you the importance of its being put into operation at once and as vigorously as possible by our Societies.
