I am sorry to hear from Dr. Wilks that you have been forbidden to visit Mrs Taylor on Friday. I enclose the letter in the hope that you may see her tomorrow.

I have not heard again from Miss Borrowman. But hope that my action has not added too much to our obligation I hear today from a Holloway prisoner. Cornea or Corner Wilson who has been released nine days before her time. I have sent in three separate letters to the Home Secretary. three batches of signatures, receives from all over the country, to a petition for the release of Mrs Taylor Miss Brockle & Miss Roberts. Total nearly 400. The first has been most respectfully acknowledged!

If you may or can. please tell Mrs Taylor I am doing all possible to move Heaven & earth to make a Hell of Cabinet ministers lives.

I also spoke on two evenings this week from a cart in Nottingham. The first time in my life!

At any rate the Liberal did not get in.

I have written to the Governor. sending a prepaid telegram asking how far the new rule of Home Secretary. affecting Mrs Taylor & if so. if she may have visitors on 24th (after one month). If I receive a favourable reply tomorrow I shall telegraph the news to Dr. Wilks.

& my daughter & son will if possible come up to see Mrs Taylor as I understand from Dr. Wilks she wishes to see them as soon as she may.
