

Fourth Annual Report.

Your Committee have the honour to present the record of work from October 1st, 1924 to September 30th, 1925.

Vice-Chairman:

Your Committee report with great regret the resignation of your Vice-Chairman, Miss Edith Palliser. She was instrumental in starting this Committee and has given invaluable assistance. Mrs. Robert Jardine has been elected Vice-Chairman.

Members of Committee:

Your Committee also regretfully announce the resignation of Miss Idaberga Fooks owing to her move from London, Mrs. Elmslie Hutton, M.D., through pressure of work, Mrs. Cecil Joll and Mrs. Hope. Your Committee have pleasure in reporting the election of four new members of Committee, viz. The Countess of Northesk, Mrs. Charles Beatty, C.B.E., Mrs. Gerald Thompson and Mrs. Cyril Davies.

Hon. Secretary, Junior S.W.H.A.

Miss Audrey Seldon can no longer undertake to act as Hon. Secretary to the Junior Branch but is retaining the office of Hon. Treasurer. Miss Mona Jeffrey has kindly undertaken to be Hon. Secretary.

New Organising Secretary.

Your Secretary, Miss Willis, who has been with the Association from its outset as a half-time worker, was obliged to send in her resignation in November owing to family affairs and the part-time clerk left to be married in October. Your Committee decided in view of their coming new responsibilities to engage a full-time Secretary and Clerk. Mrs. de l'Hôpital, O.B.E. has been appointed Secretary and Miss Bulgin, Clerk, It is hoped that with the increased scope of work and two full-time officials your Association will develop both financially and actively.

Elsie Inglis Bed. £1000 collected for the endowment of the "Elsie Inglis" Bed was handed to the Hospital at the Annual Meeting on November 29th, 1924.

Evelina Haverfield Bed. On the same occasion it was decided to change the name "London Units" Bed to "Evelina Haverfield" Bed, the reason being that the name "London Units" was found to be misleading to the public. Mrs. Haverfield had been so closely associated with the London Units that the feeling was that all who had worked in those Units would be glad to have her work and name commemorated.

The endowment of £1000 will be collected by the end of November. The Green Cross Club, founded by the Hon. Evelina Haverfield and Mrs. Charles Beatty, C.B.E., expressed a desire to contribute to the Bed and your Committee had great pleasure in accepting this offer, as well as one received from Miss Vera Holme who offered to invite the support of many friends of Mrs. Haverfield unknown to your Committee.

Newnham and Girton Unit Bed. Your Committee found that with the extra help given them for the "Evelina Haverfield" Bed they would be in a position, by making a special effort in the autumn, to complete the endowment of a second, namely the Newnham and Girton Bed, this year. This Bed commemorates the Unit of which Professor McIlroy was Director in France, Salonica and Belgrade for four and a half years, a Unit originated by, and whose initial funds were collected by the old students of Girton and Newnham Colleges. Many of these old students have most generously extended their support to the Newnham and Girton Unit Bed and your Committee desire especially to thank them.

Extension of Work of S.W.H.A.

The object which your Committee set before them in the autumn of 1921 will have been accomplished by the date that this report is printed, namely, the endowment of the first four beds in the Gynaecological and Obstetric Unit of the Royal Free Hospital, and the question of the future work of the Committee has had to be faced.

Your Committee agreed that they did not wish to dissolve, but rather to develop their work which has been satisfactorily established. An urgent request from the Hospital authorities was at that time put before the Committee asking whether, in view of the valuable work done by this Association, your Committee would undertake to finance a new branch of maternity work, namely, the support of an ante-natal clinic in

Essex Road, Islington, a district whence many maternity patients come to the Hospital. The scheme for establishing a clinic with a resident woman doctor, three students, a nurse and an almoner meets a long felt want. This suggestion appealed very strongly to Dr. McIlroy who had thought for some time that the ante-natal treatment for maternity patients, which is so important, could be much more effectively given from a clinic actually in the district where the patients live, than from the Hospital some three miles away.

The cost of upkeep of this clinic is expected to be £1000 a year and your Committee in considering the question felt that if they undertook to finance it, they were helping to prepare patients to use the beds your Association has already endowed and that there would be a very special interest in improving the health of future mothers; that, in fact, it would be a very satisfactory extension of their work. Your Committee therefore agreed to finance the clinic up to £1000 a year, and that any balance of that sum not required by the clinic would be returned. It was decided to use any surplus funds for the endowment of further beds in the Gynaecological and Obstetric Unit.

St. Andrew's Eve Ball:

The Annual Ball was held on November 25th at Claridge's and included many new features. Thirty-five prizes were given by various firms, newspapers, theatres and Claridge's Hotel, and Miss Gladys Cooper kindly consented to draw the Lucky Ball tickets and present the prizes. Mrs. St. Hill read hands during the evening and gave the proceeds to the Ball funds. An entertainment was given by Messrs. Layton and Johnstone and the Chez Fysher Cabaret Mondain gave a performance with full Paris cast. The profits of the Ball amounted to £685 and two additional donations of £100 each were given by Mrs. Arthur and Lord Riddell as the profits exceeded £600.

Your Committee desire to express their cordial thanks to the above mentioned ladies and gentlemen and all others who helped to make the Ball such a great success, including the Donors of Prizes, namely, M. Lectures:

A series of three drawing room lectures was organised, mainly by Lady Petrie, in the spring which resulted in £72:10:6 Your Committee desire to express their cordial thanks to the following:—Sir Flinders Petrie, F.R.S., the Hon. Dame Edith Lyttleton, Mrs. Beauchamp Tufnell, for lecturing; the Hon. Richard Bethell, Sir William Barrett (whose recent decease is so deeply regretted), Mr. Cloudesley Brereton, for taking the Chair at lectures; Mrs. Beauchamp Tufnell, Mrs. Leonard B. Franklin, and Lady Colefax for lending drawing rooms.

Small Dances:

In December, 1924, a special Sub-Committee offered its services to organise the small dances. The price of tickets was only 3/6 or 2/6 and the efforts in the spring of 1925 were experimental in trying different halls and prices and different nights in the week. The proceeds of three dances amounted to £50:11:0. It is hoped that as "special night" dates have been secured at the Imperial Hotel it will be possible to make a greater financial success of the 1925-26 season.

Jumble Sale:

Your Committee held a Jumble Sale in the Drill Hall of the Royal Corps of Signals, Calthorpe Street, by kind permission of the Adjutant. Large supplies of miscellaneous goods were collected all over London, from friends of the Association, in a lorry very kindly lent by Sir Trevor Dawson. The collection was most efficiently carried out by Mr. Brown of Elstree and his staff, all of whom your Committee wish to thank most cordially for their hard work and for saving much expense. The amount raised was £63:10:0. Your Committee also wish to express grateful thanks to the many friends, too numerous to mention, who gave contributions to the Jumble Sale.

Garden Fête Organised by the British Charities Association:

Your Committee co-operated with the Guild of Help, (R.F.H). and the Hospital authorities in organizing a Home Produce Stall on May 21st, 22nd and 23rd at the Botanical

Gardens, Regent's Park. Many gifts were received from friends of the Association and your Committee's share in the proceeds amounted to £54:12:6. Much of our success was due to the splendid help of Lady Gosse, Miss Atkinson and Mr. Neame. Your Committee also wish to thank the Army and Navy Stores for kindly lending their window dressing expert, Mr. Masters, whose services were quite invaluable in arranging the stall, and to Messrs. Kent for the loan of a large ice safe, and the following friends who sent supplies to the stall, Mrs. Arnold, Mrs. Batley, Mr. Bickford Smith, Messrs. Beale, Chas. Bond, Bovril, Mrs. Eglinton, Col. Your committee wish again to remind their friends that on account of the multitude of charitable appeals in London, the undertakings carried through in the past year have only been accomplished at the expense of an enormous amount of labour and effort.
