> The Executive Committee at its meeting on May 20th instructed me to send you the enclosed minutes of its meeting and to ask you if your Society would approve of minutes of all meetings of the Executive Committee being sent to you, and if so whether your Society would be willing to bear its share of the expense.

Until the copies are made it is difficult to estimate what the approximate cost will be; but the Committee will ascertain the most economical manner of having them done and will then let you know what your share would be per year. We know the expense must be considerable, and that it will gradually increase as our Societies become more numerous; and it is this consideration alone which makes the Executive Committee hesitate to throw additional burden on to the general funds.
