Dear Miss Phillips,

I am desired by my Committee to write to you upon the upon the subject of the Annual Meeting of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies which will be held according to the National Union's Rules in London next January. My Committee is of opinion that in the event of a General Election being decided upon before that date all the energies of the Societies will be absorbed in preparation for the election - in the case of their own Society they would mesire to be free to concentrate their attention and strength at such a moment - and they would therefore suggest that if this continguency arise it will be desireable to postpone the date of the Mational Union's Annual Meeting. This will necessitate a breach of Rule VIII clause 5, and a special Meeting of the Council will therefore (Rule XII) be required to decide the point. My Committee suggests that a special Meeting for this purpose should be held at the same as the Special Meeting already decided upon for the discuss of General Election Policy. My Committee suggests that if step Wick desired by the National Union Executive Committee
