I write on behalf of the Public Meetings Committee of this Society, to whom Mrs Fawcett has forwarded your letter of the 5th inst. in which you express the hope that no one at the meeting in the Cannon Street Hotel will denounce or even criticise the tactics of the militant supporters of our great cause. The substance of Mrs Fawcett's reply has also been given to them..

Your letter has been read by Miss Sterling and the Committee has received a reply from her in the following words:-

I certainly have no desire to 'denounce' individuals, and would of course make a general Suffrage speech as well and amply as I knew how, but I cannot accept Sir Edward Busk's conditions. I can never again consent to have my hands tied as to the subject of what he calls 'tactics' but which I consider to be fundamental principle deeper and more important even than the immediate attainment of the Franchise.
