## ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting their Report, your Committee have pleasure in recording the great advance made by the Women's Suffrage movement during the past year. Although they are unable to point to progress in Parliament, they feel that the steady, persistent work carried on by this and other Societies in bringing the question before the constituencies has had encouraging results. During the General Election in January, 1906, a larger number of candidates than on any former occasion announced their support of Women's Suffrage in their election addresses, and the number of supporters in the present House of Commons is known to exceed 400.

On February 14th a Conference was held at the House of Commons. Forty-nine Members of Parliament were present and forty representatives of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. The forty-nine Members constituted themselves a Parliamentary Committee for Women's Suffrage. Sir Charles McLaren was appointed Chairman and Mr. Cameron Corbett, Mr. Geoffrey Howard, and Mr. Philip Snowden, Secretaries. Subsequently, sixteen Members of Parliament balloted for a Women's Suffrage Bill, but no place was obtained.

Among those who balloted later for a Women's Suffrage resolution, Mr. Keir Hardie secured the best place, and the resolution was set down in the second place for April 25th. The following is the text of the resolution, which was seconded by Mr. Eugene Wason :—

"That in the opinion of this House it is desirable that sex should cease to be a bar to the exercise of the Parliamentary Franchise."

The motion preceding that of the Women's Suffrage resolution had reference to vaccination, and was down in

operation of the Women's Co-operative Guild, the Lancashire and Cheshire Women Textile and other Workers' Representation Committee, the Manchester and Salford Women's Trade and Labour Council, the Women's Liberal Federation, and others who had taken part in the deputation.

The Executive Committee of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies called a special meeting as soon as possible after the deputation, at which it was decided to raise a fund to carry on special work in the constituencies represented by prominent opponents of Women's Suffrage. Work has been already set in hand in the selected constituencies within the area of this Society, and will absorb all the energies, time, and money at its command.

During the General Election a small band of canvassers was sent to assist candidates who had declared themselves in favour of Women's Suffrage, and had allowed their names to be printed in the list of favourable candidates issued by your Society and placed in their Committee Rooms. The help thus offered during the election was quite irrespective of party.

An Organising Secretary of this Society visited a constituency in which a vacancy arose since the General Election, and was successful in arranging an effective deputation to the candidate, and in arousing interest on the spot.

Your Committee have been asked to help the Lancashire and Cheshire Women Textile and other Workers' Representation Committee and the Manchester and Salford Women's Trade and Labour Council to organise the skilled women workers in London, with a view to enlisting their support in the cause of women's suffrage, and a grant has been made for this purpose.

Your Committee are endeavouring to establish a network of organisations in the area of which the Central Society is in charge. Such work is necessarily slow, but it is essential to the success of the movement. It is only through the con-

the name of Mr. Arnold Lupton. It had been hoped that in accordance with the usual rules of procedure in the House of Commons, Mr. Arnold Lupton's resolution would have been ruled out of order, as there was a Bill down on the notice paper dealing with the same subject; but the Speaker ruled that it was in order, as the Bill dealt with a different phase of the vaccination question. Mr. Lupton being in favour of Women's Suffrage, consented to shorten the discussion on his motion. Mr. R. W. Cremer and Mr. S. Evans spoke against it. Mr. Herbert Gladstone expressed his intention of voting for it. The House of Commons appeared in thorough sympathy with the motion, but the division was not reached owing to a disturbance created in the Ladies' Gallery during Mr. Evans' speech.

Mr. Cameron Corbett, Sir William Bull, Mr. Snowden, and Mr. Wedgwood, Members representing all parties in the House of Commons, have put down notices of motion on the Plural Voting Bill, which will be dealt with during the autumn Session. The text of the motion is as follows :--

"That it be an instruction to the Committee that they have power to deal with the question of the disqualification of sex."

A deputation on Women's Suffrage was received by the Prime Minister on May 19th, and Miss Emily Davies spoke on behalf of the Women's Suffrage Societies. The report of the proceedings has already been distributed among the Members of the Society. It is sufficient here to point out that more than twenty different Societies besides those forming the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies took part in the deputation; thus adding greatly to its representative character. Immediately after the deputation a public meeting was held in Exeter Hall, to receive the members of the deputation and hear their account of the proceedings. The work of organising this meeting was carried out by this Society, with the co-

stituencies that pressure can be brought to bear on Parliament, and the present passive adherence given to the movement by a large number of Members of Parliament converted into an active effort to urge the reform upon the Government.

Local Committees have been formed in Brighton and St. Pancras, and the Local Committee in Southampton has been formed into a Branch Society.

It would not be possible here to mention individually all those who have so kindly given their services in arranging for meetings, speaking, or helping in other directions the work of the Society—but your Committee desire to record their appreciation of their work for the movement.

Efforts will be made in the next Session to promote the introduction of a Women's Suffrage Bill, and no opportunity will be neglected of bringing the question forward. It is hoped that between this time and the opening of the new Session the Members of this Society and other supporters will urge Members of Parliament to ballot for a Women's Suffrage Bill or Resolution. Though your Committee are aware that the chances of a private Member's Bill passing into law are slight, yet a debate and division on the question are of the greatest value. Every verdict given by the House of Commons in favour of the extension of the Parliamentary Franchise to women brings it nearer realisation, for no Government can ignore repeated expressions of the opinion of the House of Commons. It is suggested that deputations may with advantage be organised, before Parliament opens next year, to wait upon friendly Members, urging them to ballot for a Bill or Resolution.

The Committee greatly deplore the loss through death during the year of some of the most valued and constant of the friends and supporters of Women's Suffrage. At the opposite

poles, as far as politics.were concerned, Sir Richard Jebb, M.P., and Sir Wilfrid Lawson, M.P., were alike in the courage and tenacity with which they urged the justice of the claim of women to representation. They were ever ready to speak and work for the movement, and the rare distinction of style which marked every utterance of Sir Richard Jebb was never more apparent than when he was advocating Women's Suffrage. In the death of Dr. Evelyn Shuckburgh, of Cambridge, the movement lost a valued and constant friend. The Dowager Countess of Portsmouth, during the early years of the Women's Suffrage agitation, gave it the great support of her singularly winning and powerful personality. Mrs. William Grey, the founder of the Girls' Public Day School Company, was a lifelong supporter of Women's Suffrage. The loss of Mrs. Sterling, who for so many years acted as the Treasurer of the Central Society, is a personal grief to all who knew and appreciated, as the Committee could not fail to do, her deep devotion to the cause of Women's Suffrage, and the unfailing and self-sacrificing spirit in which she devoted herself to all work for its promotion.

#### PROCEEDINGS.

#### CHAIRMAN . . THE LADY FRANCES BALFOUR.

Mrs. FAWCETT moved the following resolution :--

"That the members of the Central Society for Women's Suffrage here assembled desire to express their deep sense of the loss incurred by the death of Mrs. Sterling, and their high appreciation of her unfailing support during many years of faithful service. Persistent in effort, undaunted by discouragement, her zeal never flagged. While in the foremost ranks of the advocates of Women's Suffrage, she was at all times ready to take part in any necessary work for the cause, however humble. Those who are conversant with the inner working of the Society know how much it has owed to her unwearying devotion. Her removal creates a gap which can hardly be filled. The members of the Society desire further to express their sincere sympathy with the family of Mrs. Sterling under the heavy blow which has befallen them."

Mrs. FAWCETT said that those who worked with Mrs. Sterling on the Committee knew-and perhaps no one else could quite know-her whole-hearted devotion and spirit of self-sacrifice while working for Women's Suffrage.

The resolution was adopted, all those present rising.

Mrs. FAWCETT then moved the following resolution :---

"That the best-thanks of this meeting be offered to Miss Dimock for her valuable services as Acting Treasurer during the last four months."

This was seconded by Miss EMILY DAVIES, and carried.

The Report and Balance Sheet was moved from the Chair, and adopted.

### BRANCH SOCIETIES.

Proposed by Miss EMILY DAVIES :--

"That the scheme comprising regulations re Branch Societies, adopted provisionally at the Annual Meeting held on December 6th, be continued, subject to the omission of the preamble: 'Committees outside the Metropolitan area shall become Branches one year after their formation."" Seconded by Mrs. FAWCETT, and carried. Mrs. CONNAH was re-appointed Auditor.

Resolution moved by Mr. W. MCLAREN :--

"That this meeting protests against the delay in granting the Parliamentary Franchise to women, having regard to the fact that for 40 years, in constantly growing numbers, women have shown by every constitutional means their desire and their fitness for the Franchise.

"That while the question has long been ripe for settlement, the declarations of the Prime Minister and other members of the Government, and the pledges of a large majority of the House of Commons in favour of Women's Suffrage, have brought the movement still more clearly into the region of practical politics, and this meeting urges on members of Parliament the necessity of fulfilling their pledges without further delay.

"This meeting cannot accept the Prime Minister's recommendation to exercise patience, the time for which is long past ; it recognises the zeal shown by those women who have not hesitated to go to prison in support of their convictions, and calls upon this Society and upon all women to show an equal zeal in furthering, by every constitutional method, the cause to which they are devoted."

Seconded by Mrs. FAWCETT, supported by MR. SNOWDEN, M.P., and carried.

Mr. CAMERON CORBETT, M.P., moved a vote of thanks to the Chairman and the meeting then terminated.

- VI.—The Ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held monthly, on a fixed day, to be determined at its first meeting, which shall be called by the Secretary, as soon as convenient, after the annual meeting of the Society.
  - Special meetings shall be called at the request of not less than four members. Five shall form a quorum at all meetings.
- VII.—The ballot papers for the election of the President, Treasurer, and other Members of the Executive Committee shall be given to each Member of the Society, in exchange for the counterfoil of his or her ticket of admission to annual meeting, at a polling station within the precincts of the hall. The voters will be required to mark their ballot papers, when they receive them, inside the polling station, and to place them at once in one of the sealed ballot boxes provided. The polling station shall be open from 3 to 8 p.m. on the day of the annual business meeting.
- VIII.—Any person may be proposed for election or re-election as President, Treasurer, or Member of Committee, on the nomination of two Members of the Society, to whom the Candidate is personally known, such nomination to reach the Secretary at least twenty-one days before the annual meeting. Lists of nominations of President and Treasurer and Members of the Executive Committee of the Society, together with names of proposers and seconders and a table of attendances of Members standing for re-election, shall be sent to each Member of the Society at least fourteen days before the annual meeting.

### RULES.

- I.—The title of this Society is "THE CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE."
- II.—The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.
- III.—The Society shall consist of all persons who have signified in writing their approval of its objects, or their desire to join-
  - (A) Annual subscribers of any amount not less than a shilling shall be Members, and entitled to vote.
  - (B) Non-subscribers shall be Associates.
- IV.—The officers of the Society shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Chairman of Committee, Local Hon. Secretaries, and a Secretary.
- V.-The current business of the Society shall be conducted by an Executive Committee, consisting of the President and Treasurer of the Society, and eighteen other persons elected by ballot at the annual meeting. The Committee shall elect its Hon. Officers, the Vice-Presidents, and the Local Hon. Secretaries of the Society annually at its first meeting. It shall also appoint its paid officers.

- IX.—An annual general meeting of the Society shall be held as soon as convenient after September 30th in each year :--
  - (1) To receive the report, and the financial statement, which shall be duly audited.
  - (2) To elect the President and Treasurer of the Society and the Executive Committee.
  - (3) To appoint the returning officer and tellers for the ballot voting.
  - Not less than twenty-eight days' (preliminary) notice of the meeting shall be given to each Member.
- X.-Special general meetings of the Society may be called at any time by the Executive Committee, and shall be called by the Secretary within twenty-eight days, on the requisition of not less than twenty-five members of the Society. A special general meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting. Fourteen days' notice shall be given of general meetings to all Members.
- XI.—The Rules shall not be altered except at a general meeting of the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed alterations must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.
