

Dear Miss Strachey

The Executive Committee at their meeting held yesterday passed the following resolution :-

"That the London Society be asked to pay into our ordinary funds the money raised as a special effort and that the National Union make a grant of £150 from the General Election Fund to the London Society to be used in extending the Election work into other constituencies in the London area. "

The Executive Committee would also suggest that part of Mrs. Illingworth's donation might be used in hiring wagonettes for use by speakers etc. in those constituencies.
