Notes on the index

1. This index lists by subject heading the news and feature articles, Parliamentary Questions and labour market statistics that appeared in *Labour Market Trends* between January and December 1996. In addition there is a chronological listing of the research, statistical and special features that have been published.
2. *Labour Market Trends* replaced *Employment Gazette* in November 1995 when the Central Statistical Office (CSO) took over from the Department of Employment responsibility for publishing statistics on the labour market. In April 1996 the CSO merged with the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys to form the Office for National Statistics (ONS).
3. The A to Z subject index covers the whole of the journal apart from the labour market data appearing on the pink pages which are in a standard form each month. It therefore includes references not only to main features but also to Parliamentary Questions, reports and books under appropriate subject headings, and to the Labour Market Update and LFS Help-Line sections.
