GENERAL INFORMATION
Changes in the 1963 census
There were few changes resulting from amendment only minor changes in the scope of certain industry reports compared with 1958. Any such
changes are explained in the introductions to changes are explained in the introductions to
the industry reports concerned or by footnotes to the tables.
Industrial Classification
Establishments were classified to industries on the basis of major activity in conformity with
the second edition of the Standard Industrial the second edition of the Standard Industr
Classification (Consolidated Edition 1963, incorporat ing Amendment 1). Each industry basically def ined in terms of its principal
products, these being of a similar nature or products, these being of a similar nature or
commonly associated in production. Normally, an establishment was classified to an industry
if its sales of the principal products of that if its sales of the principal products of tha industry accounted for a greater proportio
its total sales than did its sales of the princial products of any other industry. How-
ever, where the application of this rule would ever, where the application of this rule would
have resulted in a change of classification between 1958 and 1963 , the establishment was rectassif ied only if the sales of principal products of the newly predominant industry was
more than one third greater than the sales of principal products of the previously predominant industry. This modification of the genera
rule was introduced for 1958 to avoid disrunt was introduced for 1958 to ayoid dis-
cont inuit ies which would result from marginal
changes in sales betwen successive censuses.
The principle of classification by major output was also normally followed in compiling output was also normaliy followed in compiling
the analysis by sub-divisions of an industry. In certain industries, classification was dealt with in a different way. Details of any
nonstandard treatment are given in the introductions to the relevant industry reports.

Outworkers are excluded.

The figures include persons engaged in merchanting or factoring and canteen workers. where particulars in respect of these activitie
could not be excluded from the return.
Working Proprietors
These include all persons regarded as 'self-
employed' for Nat ional Insurance employed' for Nat ional Insurance purposes, an
members of the ir members of their families who worked in the
business without receiving a fixed wage or salary: but persons who worked less than half the normal number of working hours are excluded
For Great Britain, directors working in the For Great Britain, directors working in the
business but not in receipt of a definite wa salary or commission are included under this heading for 1963, but are excluded for 1958 .
For Northern Ireland, directors of limited companies, other than those paid by fee only,
are included for bath years. (Directors pai are included for both years. (Directors paid

Employees
(i) Administrative, technical and clerical employees include managers, superintendents and works foremen; research, experimental, development, technical and design employees
(other than operat ives); draughtsmen and other than operatives); draughtsmen and
tracers; editorial staff, staff reporters, canvassers, competition and advertising staff; travellers; and office (including Britain, but not for Northern Ireland, they include also managing and other directors in receipt

(ii) Operatives include all other classes of employees, that is, broadly speaking, all anual wage earners. They include thos orks; operatives employed in power houses, transport work, stores, warehouses, shops and canteens; inspectors, viewers
and similar workers; maintenance workers; and cleaners. Operatives engaged in outide work of erection, fitting, etc. are also included, but outworkers (i.e.
persons employed by the firm who worked heir own homes, etc. on materials
supplied by the firm) are excluded.

## 126 Compataion

This Report on the Construction Industry covers the construction work done by private firms and by persons directly employed by Local Author it ies and Government Departments. It excludes construction work carried out by the employees of
nationalised industries and transport and water undertakings, except for the hausing departments of the National Coal Board. The report includes erect ing and
hous ind repairing buildings of all types; constructing and repairing roads and bridges erecting steel and reinforced concrete structures; other civil engineering work such as laying sewers and gas mains, erect ing overhead line supports and aer ial as asphalting, electrining, etc.; specialist sections of construction work ventilating apparatus, painting, plaster ing, plumbing, roof ing; and demolition ventilating apparatus, painting, plaster ing, plumbing, roof ing; and demo.
work. The hir ing out of contractors' plant and scaf folding is included.

Contractual work on opencast coal mining is included for 1958 and 1963 but the activities of the division of the National Coal Board responsible for selling the coal so obtained is excluded for 1963.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 500 in the Standard Industria Classif ication (Consolidated edition, 1963).
Except for Tables 1 and 4, in which summaries are given for the industry as a whole, the tables in this report are in two parts, Part A relating to private firms and Part B to public authorities. The report includes an additional Table 5(A)
Supplement supplied by the Ministry of Public Building and Works analys is of the value of output of construction work in Great Britain by private firms in the industry.

METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

In the classif ication of returns to sub-divisions of the industry, shown in Tables $2(\mathrm{i})(\mathrm{A})$ and $2(\mathrm{ii})(\mathrm{A})$, firms were asked to indicate from a list of the various the ir business and the returns were classified to scription most appropriate Returns allocated to sub-divisions were further sub-divided between 'main contractors' and 'sub-contractors' according to their major activity, measured in terms of the value of work done. 'Plant hiring contractors' were all classed as 'sub-contractors'.

The sub-divisions distinguished in the public sector of the industry, shown in Table 2(i)(B), relate to returns received from Government Departments, Local Authorities and other Public Authorities.
