Issued for the Year 1851.

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OF THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 Registrars in all the districts of England during the Winter quarter ending March 31st, 1851; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended December 31st, 1850.

The return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and have been supplied from previous years.

The results of the returns from the whole country are satisfactory. The mortality is low; the births and the marriages are much above the average.

MARRIAGES.

45296 marriages were celebrated in the autumn quarter, ending December 31st. The marriages are always more numerous in this quarter than in any other quarter of

the year. The close of harvest, the genial season of Christmas, the termination of the ordinary periods of service, and perhaps the old practice of anticipating Lent, swell the marriage roll at the end of the year. So there is nothing very remarkable in the distribution of the marriages over the quarters of the year 1850, although the marriages in the last quarter exceeded those in the first quarter of the year by nearly 15000. The marriages of the whole year exhibit an extraordinary increase; in 1840 the number was 122665; in 1850 it amounted to 152235. In the 4 years, 1847-8-9-50, the marriages were 135845, 138230, 141599, and 152235. The first (1847) was a year of great depression and great suffering; the last (1850), as the marriages testify, was a year of prosperity, which showed no symptoms of decline in the last quarter.

The increase extended over 8 out of the 11 divisions of England and Wales. The South Midland and the Eastern Divisions exhibit a marked decrease in the proportion of marriages to population. The decrease was greatest in Suffolk; but was also evident in the counties of Hertford, Buckingham, Oxford, Cambridge, Northampton, Huntingdon, Bedford, Essex, and Norfolk. In some of the other divisions the marriages did not keep pace with the population. In Wilts, Lincoln, and the North Riding of Yorkshire, the numbers declined. The marriages increased in Berkshire, Devonshire, Gloucestershire, Warwickshire, Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, the East and West Ridings of Yorkshire, Durham, and South Wales. The increase was the greatest in London, and in the North Western Division comprising Cheshire and Lan-

† The Table may be read thus, without reference to the decimal points:—In the year 1848, to 100000 of the population of England, there were 791 marriages, 3222 births, 2288 deaths registered.—The annual rates of marriage in each of the 4 quarters were *655, *799, *748, and *952 per cent.; the rates of death 2*771, 2*294, 1*987, and 2*090 per cent. In reading the population on the first line add 3 ciphers (000). The 3 months January, February, March, contain 90, in leap year 91 days; the 3 months April, May, June 91 days; each of the 2 last quarters of the year 92 days. cashire. The marriages increased at St. George Hanover Square, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, and St. James Westminster; and at all the watering places, at Gravesend, Ramsgate, Margate, Hastings, Brighton, Worthing, Bath, Clifton, and Cheltenham. There was a great increase in the pottery districts of Wolstanton and Stoke-upon-Trent, in Walsall, Dudley, and Birmingham, in Coventry, in Basford and Nottingham, in Shardlow and Derby, in Stockport and Great Boughton (Chester), in West Derby, Wigan, Bolton, Ashton, Oldham, Rochdale, Blackburn, and Preston. In Liverpool and Manchester the marriages, though more numerous than in some previous quarters, exhibited no increase on the corresponding quarter of 1850. Bradford, Leeds, and Sheffield, exhibit a remarkable increase.

The marriages decreased, were stationary, or increased slowly in many agricultural districts; and this implies a certain degree of depression in those parts at the close of the year 1850. In many of the manufacturing districts the increase was remarkable. In the country generally, the great increase in the marriages indicates that the great body of the people were in prosperous circumstances. The classes who live on wages should now husband their resources, and with their surplus earnings provide against the periods of depression which according to past experience invariably follow years of prosperity.

BIRTHS.

157374 births were registered in the quarter ending March 31st, 1851. This is a greater number of births than was ever registered in any previous quarter; and the increase is distributed over all the divisions of the country, although it was greatest in Cheshire, Lancashire, and Yorkshire. In a few counties the births exhibit no increase, in the majority the increase is considerable.

INCREASE OF POPULATION.

As 157374 births and 105446 deaths were registered in the quarter ending March 31st, 1851, an excess is left of 51928 living. It is the natural increase of the population in 3 months. And as all the deaths are registered while all the births are not registered, the difference is less than the actual increase. The variations in the increase of population from fluctuations in the births and deaths since 1847 have been considerable; the excess of births over deaths was 19704 in the winter quarter ending March 1848, and 51928 in the corresponding quarter of 1851.

The emigration in the quarter ending March 31st, 1851, from the ports of the United Kingdom at which there are government emigration officers, was 56072. The emigrants from English ports amounted to 48929; namely, 1515 from Plymouth, 4502 from London, and 42912 from Liverpool. 2339 emigrants sailed from Glasgow and Greenock; 4804 from Irish ports. It is well known that many Irish emigrants sail from Liverpool.*

STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

105446 deaths were registered in the quarter ending March 31st. This number is less by nearly 15000 than was registered in the corresponding quarters of 1847 and 1848; and more by 7000 than was registered in the March quarter of 1850. Taking the increase of population into account, the mortality was slightly below the average. It was at the rate of 2·365 per cent. per annum; whereas the average rate of the quarter is 2·457 per cent. The highest rate of mortality experienced in any winter quarter since 1839 was 2·830 in the cold winter quarter of 1847; the lowest was 2·144 in the mild winter quarter of 1846. A previous table shows that the average annual rate of mortality in winter is $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. nearly (2·457); the mortality being above this range in town, and below it in country districts. The mortality in the March quarter was somewhat lower than the average in the 117 districts including the chief towns; and considerably below the average in the 506 remaining country districts. The mortality of the towns was a fiftieth part, and of the country districts a twelfth part less than the average. The country districts are therefore enjoying more than their usual immunity, while the mortality in the town districts is scarcely reduced at all; yet it was in the town districts that cholera was most fatal, and according to a common theory cut off the weakly lives in 1849. The returns show that little impression has yet been made on the mortality of towns, which have practically been left unimproved. The drains, sewers, slaughter-houses, and churchyards are much the same as they were, and their effects therefore are the same.

The mortality was higher in LONDON than it was in the corresponding quarter of last year. Influenza was epidemic; and the mortality was raised during the weeks of March. 205 deaths were directly ascribed to this disease, which in ordinary seasons is not fatal to more than 50; and many of the 1612 deaths ascribed to bronchitis were the result of

influenza. The epidemic has ceased, and has been slight compared with that of 1847-8. Measles and hooping-cough have been more, scarlatina less than usually fatal. Small-pox was fatal in 275 cases, in the greater part of which vaccination had been neglected. Diarrhoea was fatal to 223 persons, dysentery to 30, cholera to 7. It is worthy of note that the winter diarrhoea shows no disposition to decline. The deaths referred to cholera in the 5 quarters ending March 1847-51, were 3, 9, 516, 8, and 7. Typhus has been more fatal than it was in the March quarter of 1850. The deaths by poison were 29, burns and scalds 100, hanging and suffocation 71, drowning 70, fractures and contusions 163, wounds 34.

The mortality was low in the SOUTH EASTERN, South Midland, Eastern, and South-Western divisions. Typhus raised the mortality at Maidstone, scarlatina and hooping-cough at Brighton, where the mortality was much above the average. The mortality was generally low in the Surrey and Sussex districts. Portsmouth and Southampton were unhealthy: at Southampton scarlatina prevailed. Measles and hooping-cough raised the mortality in Abingdon; measles and typhus in Wallingford. The mortality of Windsor, which has been recently drained, was much below the average; the deaths in the five quarters ending March 1847-51, were 132, 109, 114, 103, and 86.

In the SOUTH MIDLAND counties, Brentford, Edmonton, Ware, St. Albans, Aylesbury, and Oxford were the chief districts in which the mortality was higher than usual. Small-pox prevailed at St. Albans among the poor "who live in great numbers in ill-ventilated houses." Measles, hooping-cough, and typhus prevailed in Waddesdon, Aylesbury, in Winslow, and in Witney; measles and hooping-cough in Oxford. In Huntingdon low and intermittent fever prevailed. Seven deaths in the parish of Kings Ripton were ascribed to typhus; three-fourths of the population suffered from it. The want of drainage, and bad sanitary arrangements are supposed to have produced the disease. In the sub-district of Wisbeach St. Peter the births registered were 81, the deaths 107. 51 deaths took place in the union workhouse; 16 from measles, 18 from typhus, and 17 from other causes! This great mortality in a public institution requires investigation.

In the EASTERN DIVISION the mortality was high at Sudbury, Colchester, Yarmouth, and Kings Lynn, where measles and scarlatina prevailed. At Stow, 67 births were registered; the Registrar observes, that 20 still and premature births occurred during the quarter. Still births are not registered.

Plymouth, remarkable for its insalubrity, is almost the only district of the SOUTH WESTERN DIVISION in which the mortality is higher than in any previous winter quarter. Scarlatina, typhus, and hooping-cough have continued to prevail. At Morice in Stoke Damerel the oldest inhabitant of the town is said to have died in her 103d year. Such instances of longevity should never be admitted without scrupulous inquiry; they are rarely supported by valid evidence. Scarlatina raised the mortality in Taunton, Chard, and Wellington, Somersetshire.

The mortality has been high in many districts of the WEST MIDLAND DIVISION.

Scarlatina, measles, small-pox, typhus, hooping-cough, and bronchitis (influenza?), have been prevalent and have often terminated fatally. The mortality was low in Herefordshire, and the southern part of Shropshire. Vaccination is neglected in Shrewsbury; and several deaths from small-pox have in consequence occurred. Wolverhampton, West Bromwich, Birmingham, Aston, and Coventry experienced a considerable mortality. The deaths in Birmingham were 1252.

In the NORTH MIDLAND DIVISION the mortality was low in Lincoln, although scarlatina and typhus prevailed there; it was higher than it was in the previous winter

in Leicester, Nottingham, Derby, and Chesterfield; measles and hooping-cough prevailed in many parts of those counties.

The people of Stockport (in Cheshire, NORTH WESTERN DIVISION) have their children vaccinated with a most laudable regularity; and the result has been an almost complete immunity from small-pox. The registrar remarks:—

“I have registered one death from small-pox—that of a child, 5 years of age, which had lately been brought over from Ireland and had not been vaccinated. It is now more than three years since I registered a death from small-pox, out of a population of between 12,000 and 13,000, which I attribute to the appointment of public vaccinators, and the attention parents now pay to the vaccination of their children.”

In the same county, the people of Runcorn offer an example of criminal negligence, which is a reproach to the religion which they profess and the country in which they live.

“Births 132; Deaths, 112. Small-pox has prevailed during the last 3 months; in the above number, 40 deaths are from that disease, and only 3 of the deceased had been vaccinated. There appears a great want of attention on the part of parents, in not taking their children to be vaccinated. I trust that stringent measures will be adopted to compel parents to have their children vaccinated; the disease has been prevailing in this district 5 months, and at the present time very severely. There have been 11 deaths during the last 10 days.”

At Wigan the same negligence was observed. 139 children under 5 years of age died; and 25 were left destitute of medical advice. In Burnley 179 persons died; the cause of death was not certified in 40 instances, and 31 had no medical attendant. Small-pox, scarlatina, measles, typhus, or influenza were prevalent in Manchester, Prescott, Ashton, and Oldham. The same zymotic diseases prevailed in many districts of YORKSHIRE. The mortality was above the average in Bradford, Leeds, and Sheffield.

In the NORTHERN DIVISION we observe the loss of 27 lives by what it has too long been the practice to call vaguely an accident. The explosions in mines are now tolerably well understood; and with proper care and good arrangements could rarely or ever happen. Hooping-cough and bronchitis (apparently influenza) have raised the mortality in Newcastle-upon-Tyne: Bedlington and Morpeth have suffered from scarlatina and typhus; more than 50 persons suffered at one time from the latter disease in the lower part of Bedlington town.

The mortality in WALES was generally below the average. Scarlatina and measles prevailed in Newport, Cardiff, Merthyr-Tydfil, and raised the mortality. Scarlatina also prevailed in districts of Pembrokeshire. 18 persons died of small-pox in Holyhead, Anglesey; only 2 had been vaccinated.

Mr. Glaisher's description of the atmospheric conditions of the unusually mild, variable, and rainy winter, deserves attention. Cholera is scarcely mentioned in the Registrars' notes. The Registrar of Oldham records 3 deaths from English cholera. No trace of the great epidemic is left except the diarrhœa.

No pains should be spared to deprive another outbreak of half its terrors by sanitary measures. If the towns were supplied with pure water, the streets and houses drained, the slaughter-houses removed from the neighbourhood of dwellings, the dead buried in distant places, the progress of medical science, and well-ordered medical organization, would diminish the mortality not only from cholera, but from all other epidemics.

On the Meteorology of England, South of Scotland, and parts of Ireland, during the Quarter ending March 31st, 1851. By JAMES GLAISHER, ESQ., F.R.S., Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

Till February 22nd, with the exception of a very few days, the mean daily temperatures of the air were above their average values, the excess at times was very large; on January 1st it amounted to 14° nearly, and on several days it was as large as 10°, 11°, and 12°; the average excess for the period was 4°. Between February 23rd and March 17th, the temperatures were, for the most part, below their average values, the defect for the period was 2°. From March 18th to the end of the quarter the weather was warm, and the average daily excess was 3°. The month of March was distinguished by rain falling frequently and heavily, the amount collected about London exceeded 4 inches, an amount unprecedentedly large.

The mean temperature at Greenwich of the 3 months ending February, constituting the 3 winter months, was 41°.2, exceeding the average of 80 years by 4°.3.

Remarkable falls of Rain.—On January 1st at Roscommon; between January 1st at 9 P.M. and January 2nd at 9 A.M., there fell 0.87 in.; within the 12 hours following January 14th, 9 P.M., there fell at Roscommon 1.15 in.; at Strokestown 0.88 in.; at Longford 0.73 in.; at Castlebar 1.16 in.; on the 20th 1.14 in. at Truro; on the 21st 1.22 in. at Falmouth. On February 7th at Stonyhurst, 1.04 in. In March, on the 9th, at York, 0.52 in.; on the 15th at Lewisham, 1.725 in. fell between 1 A.M. and 4 P.M., and within the same time 1.4 in. fell at the Royal Observatory; at Jersey, 0.4 in.; at Guernsey, 0.9 in.; at Gosport, 0.9 in.; at Southampton, 1.1 in.; at Midhurst, 1.0 in.; at Uckfield, 1.2 in.; at London, 1.2 in., and generally at places N. of 52° no rain fell. So large a fall of rain on one day in March, is unprecedented in and about London.

The mean of the numbers in the first column is 29.604 inches, and it represents that portion of the reading of the barometer due to the pressure of air; the remaining portion, or that due to the pressure of water, is 0.249 inch; the sum of those two numbers is 29.853 inches, and it represents the mean reading of the barometer for the quarter at the level of the sea.

The highest readings of the thermometer in air, were 63.5 at Guernsey, 61.0 at Jersey and Highfield House; and the lowest readings were 21.0 at Midhurst, 21.0 at Linslade, and 22.0 at Wakefield. The extreme range of temperature, therefore in England during the quarter, was about 40°. The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey, 6.0, at Liverpool 7.3, and at Whitehaven 7.5, and their mean value was 6.9; and the greatest occurred at Highfield House 14.0, at Hartwell 14.0, and at Exeter 13.6, and their mean value was 14.0.

Rain fell on the least number of days at Dunino and York, and on the greatest number of days at Helston, Truro, Exeter and North Shields. The places where the least falls took place are Leicester, Gainsborough, and Durham; and the mean amount at those places was 4.0 inches. The largest falls occurred at Truro, Whitehaven, and Falmouth; and their average was 16.7 inches.

OF

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS
IN ENGLAND.

This Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 Registrars in all the districts of England during the Spring quarter ending June 30th, 1851; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended March 31st, 1851.

The Return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and approximative numbers have been supplied from the records of previous years.

The Returns still show a great increase of Marriages and Births. The mortality is near the average.

MARRIAGES.

The Winter quarter, including the months of January, February, and March, has always fewer marriages in its records than any other quarter of the year. The marriages in the Winter quarter of 1851 were, however, 32619; which is the largest number ever registered in the Winter season of any year; it exceeds by 8172 (one third) the marriages in the Winter quarter of 1841; by 4190 the marriages in the Winter quarter of 1849, and by 2194 the marriages in the Winter quarter of 1850. An increase in the marriages almost invariably accompanies a prosperous state of the country; and it is gratifying, in this sense, to see that the increase now extends over eight out of the eleven divisions. While the marriages in London have increased, a stationary or declining rate of marriage is remarked in the three divisions

round London, comprising the parts of Surrey and Middlesex out of London, Hampshire, Berkshire, Hertfordshire, Oxfordshire, Northamptonshire, Cambridgeshire, Suffolk, and Norfolk. An increase in some of the towns of Kent and Sussex gives these counties a character which is exceptional in the South-eastern Division, but is quite in accordance with the results of the returns for the South-western Division, where the marriages were evidently on the increase in Wiltshire, Dorsetshire, Devonshire, and Cornwall, and only slightly declined in Somersetshire. In Exeter, Plymouth, Tiverton, Barnstaple, Liskeard, Saint Austell, Redruth, and Penzance marriages in unusual numbers were celebrated. The West Midland Division exhibits a considerable increase, particularly in the seats of the iron, coal, and earthenware manufactures—in Newcastle-under-Lyme, Wolstanton, Stoke-upon-Trent, Wolverhampton, Walsall, Dudley, Worcester, Kings Norton, Birmingham, Aston, as well as in Coventry, one of the seats of the silk trade. The marriages declined in Lincoln; in Leicester the two last winters show an increase; in Basford, Nottingham, and Derby the increase was greater than in the other districts of the North Midland Division. In Cheshire and Lancashire the marriages increased most in Stockport, Macclesfield, Congleton, and Nantwich; Liverpool, West Derby, Ashton-under-Lyne, Oldham, and Blackburn. Huddersfield, Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, and York were the chief contributors to the increase of marriages in Yorkshire; Durham, Sunderland, South Shields, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and Kendal to the increase in the Northern Counties. The marriages in Wales during the two last winters exceeded the marriages in the three winters preceding. Monmouth and Pontypool exhibit a decrease; Cardiff, Merthyr Tydfil and Swansea, Brecknock, Presteigne, Holywell, and Wrexham, a decided increase.

BIRTHS.

The number of births registered in the quarter ending June 30th amounted to 159,138; which is more than the births registered in any preceding quarter. It

exceeds by nearly 30000 the births registered in the corresponding quarter of 1841, when the number was 129,884. The births in the year 1851 already amount to 316,512. The increase is distributed over nearly all the divisions of England, but is greatest in London, in Yorkshire, and in the northern counties.

INCREASE OF POPULATION.

The census has been taken since the appearance of the previous number of the quarterly Tables; and an unrevised statement of the population of each district is given in the present publication. The annual rate of increase from 1841 to 1851 is found to have been 1·212 per cent.; whereas it was 1·332 per cent. in the 10 years 1831–41. The Tables have all been consequently recalculated, and the former rate has been substituted for the latter in estimating the population of each year. To a slight extent the rate of mortality has hitherto been understated in the Tables of the Quarterly Return; but the results for 1850, when the error is greatest, are only affected in the second decimal place.

The population of England and Wales was 15,914,148 on June 7th, 1841, and 17,922,768 on March 31st, 1851; and this implies such a rate of increase that the population, exclusive of persons in ships, must have been about—

The population of England and Wales, therefore, increased on an average 204,700 annually; 51175 quarterly; 3923 weekly; and 560 daily. Prior to 1850 the excess of registered births over deaths does not account for the whole of the

increase; but in 1850 the births exceeded the deaths by 223,888; and in the June quarter of 1851 there is an equivalent excess: for the births of 159,138 children the deaths of 99,539 persons were registered, which leaves an excess of 59,499 persons in the population. The number of emigrants in the quarter from the ports of the United Kingdom at which there are Government emigration officers amounted to 115,568, of whom 28,696 sailed from ports of Ireland, 6,926 from Glasgow and Greenock, 34,737 from Plymouth, 104,511 from London, and 66,022 from Liverpool, making 799,466 from English ports.* Many of the emigrants that sail from Liverpool are of Irish birth; and there has also hitherto been a regular immigration of the Irish population into England.

STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

99,639 deaths were registered in the quarter ending June 30, 1851; the deaths in the corresponding quarter of 1850 were 93,005; and 102,143 in the corresponding quarter of 1849, when cholera was in the kingdom. The Table, p. 34, shows that the *annual rate of mortality in the Spring quarter* (April, May, June) was very uniform in the years 1841-46, or 2.141 per cent. on an average, 2.174 when highest (1841), and 2.077 when lowest (1844); in the Spring of 1847, after the potato failure, the mortality rose to 2.506, and remained 2.314, and 2.341 in the Springs of 1848 and 1849; in 1850 it fell to 2.106. In the Spring quarter of 1851 the mortality was at the rate of 2.228 per cent. per annum, which is lower than the mortality of the three bad seasons (1847-8-9), but higher considerably than the mortality in the corresponding quarter of the 7 years 1841-46 and 1850. Measles, scarlatina, small-pox, and hooping-cough were epidemic in many districts, and the chief causes of the high mortality.

Different epidemics prevail in different places at the same time, and the kinds of disease-matter are distributed over the face of the country like clouds over the sky: the outbreaks are partial, segregate, or universal; an epidemic arises and disappears in a village; at other times it radiates from a town; and at rare intervals infests the whole population. This law of the distribution of disease disclosed by the registration returns has a practical application. For if it is advantageous to know the places of the country which are generally salubrious, it is also useful to know at any particular time whether they are free from epidemics. Every disease of the zymotic class appears in almost every place at irregular intervals; and when people living in cities leave them, and visit watering places or open healthy districts, they may arrive in the midst of an epidemic to which their families are thus unnecessarily exposed. The Quarterly Returns show generally what places are healthy, what are unhealthy, in each season, and with the local registers furnish the information that is required to avoid the dangers of temporary residence in districts either habitually or casually the seat of epidemic visitations.

The health of LONDON exhibits no improvement. The deaths out of 2,361,640 living were 130,937; which exceed the deaths in the corresponding June quarter of the preceding year by 18,555, and are 88 more than were registered in 1849; 209 persons, chiefly children, died of small-pox, 495 of measles, 169 of scarlatina, and 734 of hooping-cough. The mortality from diarrhoea is declining; it caused 202 deaths in the June quarter of 1847, and 191 deaths in the corresponding quarter of 1851. The deaths from cholera in the 5 June quarters, 1847-51, were 4, 17, 268, 9, 3. Influenza has been prevalent, and 108 deaths are referrible directly to that cause, besides deaths from bronchitis and pneumonia which are frequent terminations of influenza, and properly belong to the epidemic. It is a favourable circumstance that few deaths are ascribed to purpura and scurvy. Typhus, metria (childbirth fever), erysipelas, and rheumatic fever have been less fatal than usual. No death from hydrophobia occurred in London. Consumption is more fatal than any other disease; it has destroyed 1815 lives in the three months. The deaths from consumption in the June quarter of the year 1850 were only 1548. So great a fluctuation in the mortality of this disease is unusual, and deserves attention. Chorea (St. Vitus's dance), epilepsy, and tetanus (lock-jaw) have been more than usually fatal; of metria and other diseases incidental

to childbearing 82 mothers died, or one to every 234 births of living children registered; 16 deaths were directly ascribed to intemperance; 32 to delirium tremens. By poison 19 deaths were caused; the number is considerably less than the average, and will, we may hope, be still further reduced under the operation of Lord Carlisle's Act. Burns and scalds caused 48 deaths; by hanging, strangling, and suffocation 50 persons died; by drowning 70. The deaths from fractures and contusions amounted to 159; from wounds to 31. Both the latter numbers exceed the averages.

The health of the SOUTH-EASTERN DIVISION, Surrey out of London, Kent, Sussex, Hampshire, and Berkshire, is always above the standard of England, and is in this quarter better than usual. The deaths (7,597) are considerably below the average. Yet there has been much sickness in Chertsey; scarlatina, measles, hooping-cough, and croup, have been prevalent in Rochester and Gillingham; low fever in Beckley, Rye; influenza in two subdistricts of Hungerford, Kintbury and Lambourn, where scarlatina has also been fatal in ill-ventilated apartments, too small for the large families of the poor occupiers. Scarlatina still exists in Shrivenham; hooping-cough and measles in Sutton Courtney. The mortality was somewhat above the average in Gravesend, Brighton, Southampton, and Reading, from epidemics or causes which the registrars have not named.

The health of the SOUTH MIDLAND DIVISION is above the average in every county from Buckinghamshire to Cambridgeshire. The deaths were 6189 out of 1,234,283 inhabitants. Small-pox and measles were prevalent at Uxbridge; cases of small-pox occurred in North Mimms parish, Hatfield; 13 persons died from small-pox in St. Albans; hooping-cough prevailed and was fatal in Quainton, Whitchurch, and Waddesdon; scarlatina was very fatal in Oxford, and in Wing, Leighton Buzzard; hooping-cough in Wisbeach.

The EASTERN DIVISION was less healthy than usual; of about 1,113,710 inhabitants 5994 died in the quarter. Norfolk suffered extensively from *scarlatina*; and the mortality was above the average. Measles prevailed almost universally among children in Manningtree, Essex; but only 2 deaths from the disease were registered. Many persons were attacked by small-pox in Coggeshall; only 3 died. In Hedingham the deaths of the quarter were doubled from bronchitis and pneumonia, chiefly in children. Hooping-cough, measles, and pulmonary affections were fatal in Sudbury, Suffolk, during the early part of the quarter. An increase of births is ascribed to the revival of the silk manufacture in the town. The registrar notices that the cutting of the Norfolk estuary has induced an afflux of population to Kings Lynn, and that measles has been rife. The mortality was above the average in the districts of Chelmsford, Tendring, Halstead, Cosford, Mutford, Yarmouth, Flegg, Kings Lynn, Downham, and Thetford.

The SOUTH-WESTERN DIVISION was generally healthy; the deaths out of about 1,803,706 inhabitants were 9352. Wiltshire was healthy; but a parish in the Chippenham District offers an example of one of those circumscribed epidemics which so well deserve attention. See remarks of the registrar of Corsham, No. 252; 2.

Diarrhoea was common, but not fatal, in Heavitree near Exeter. *Scarlatina* declined in Plymouth, was prevalent in Torrington, and fatal in Bideford, where it still prevails.

Scarlatina and small-pox were prevalent in Cornwall, and raised the mortality of the county above the average. The registrar of St. Ives gives an instance of the effects of the mistaken fatalism of an ill-instructed people:—

“People have a superstitious fear of having their children vaccinated. They say “it is taking the cause out of the hands of God.”

The influx of labourers into Redruth continues, and to this the increase of births is ascribed.

Taunton and Bridgewater, Chard and Bedminster, have suffered from scarlatina. Bath was healthy. *Ilchester* (No. 319; 5.) is an example of unusual exemption from disease.

The WEST MIDLAND DIVISION presents considerable diversities in the six counties of which it is composed; in Staffordshire and Warwickshire the mortality was

above the average; in Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Shropshire, and Worcestershire the mortality was below or not above the average; out of 2,132,853 inhabitants 12662 died in three months. The mortality was great in West Bromwich, Dudley, Birmingham, and Aston. The deaths in Birmingham amounted to 1295 out of 173,878 inhabitants; measles, small-pox, bronchitis, and pneumonia prevailed; vaccination and other sanatory precautions appear to have been neglected in this important town. In Shrewsbury the mortality was high; of the 34 persons who fell a sacrifice to small-pox in the sub-district of St. Mary not *one* had been vaccinated. Measles was fatal in many districts of the division. Scarlatina is rarely mentioned.

The population has decreased in the agricultural, and typhus has prevailed in the mining parts of the district of Shiffhal.

The NORTH MIDLAND DIVISION has been unusually healthy; and out of 1,214,621 inhabitants 6521 died in 3 months. The mortality in Leicester was remarkably low. Measles prevailed in several districts of Lincolnshire, in Nottingham and Basford; yet the mortality in Lincoln, Nottingham, and Derby was low.

The NORTH-WESTERN DIVISION comprises Cheshire and Lancashire. Out of 2,487,351 inhabitants the deaths were 15812; the mortality is therefore high, but lower than it was in some previous years. Small-pox was epidemic in many districts; measles, hooping-cough, and scarlatina also prevailed. The Registrar of Heaton Norris states, that 7 persons in one house were attacked by small-pox; all had been vaccinated in infancy, and all recovered. Stockport is healthy. "The factory operatives have regular employment, enjoy more exercise in the open air, and seem to pay greater attention to sanatory measures." The deaths in Liverpool were 1898 out of 255,055 inhabitants; the mortality was below the average. The Registrar of Howard-street notices one death from English cholera. Wigan is in an unhealthy state; small-pox, measles, and typhus are very prevalent; many nuisances still exist. The increase of births in Bolton is ascribed to the influx of people consequent on an improved state of trade, which affords pretty "regular employment to the labouring classes. Immense numbers of them are employed at very low wages; but provisions are cheap." The mortality is low. In the Manchester district the deaths were much below the average, or 1599 out of 228,437 inhabitants.

✱ The YORK DIVISION presents some contrasts, but the health of the county is above the average condition. The deaths were 10751 out of 1,788,767 inhabitants. Small-pox, measles, scarlatina, and influenza were epidemic in some districts; but the prosperous state of trade is said to have led to an increase of births, and diminished mortality. Thus, the Registrar reports, that in Bradford East End: "the inhabitants of the sub-district are in full employment; provisions are good and cheap; people are better fed and clothed. We have no particular epidemic prevailing. The majority of the deaths have been amongst the young, principally from pneumonia."

A similar state of things in Ecclesall Bierlow is accounted for "by the progressive improvement in the trade of Sheffield." The mortality in Sheffield, Leeds, York, and Hull was above the average. Measles was epidemic in several of the districts.

The NORTHERN DIVISION was comparatively healthy. Out of 968,934 inhabitants 4985 died. Measles prevailed epidemically in Stockton, Durham, Easington, Houghton-le-Spring, Gateshead, and Morpeth, in Durham, Alston and Kirkoswald in Cumberland, Kirkby Lonsdale in Westmoreland. This division contains some of the healthiest as well as some of the unhealthiest districts in the kingdom.

The WELSH DIVISION was in a less favourable state. Of 1,188,821 inhabitants 6616 died. Scarlatina, measles, and small-pox prevailed in certain districts. In Abergavenny the deaths exceeded the births in number.

On the Meteorology of England, South of Scotland, and parts of Ireland, during the Quarter ending June 30th, 1851. By JAMES GLAISHER, ESQ., F.R.S., Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

The weather during the past quarter has been for the most part cold and unseasonable, particularly from the 14th of April to the 9th of May, which period was distinguished by frequent thunderstorms, with snow, sleet, and hail showers almost daily all over the country. Some snow fell as late as the 4th of June at Leicester and on the 11th of June at North Shields.

At Greenwich till April 16th the average daily deficiency of temperature was $3^{\circ} \cdot 8$. From April 17th to April 24th the period was warmer, the average daily excess was $4^{\circ} \cdot 1$. On the 25th a period of severe weather set in, and the daily temperatures continued below their average values till June 18th. The deficiency on May 3d, 4th, 5th, was 11° daily, and the mean deficiency for the 55 days was 4° . After June 19th the daily temperature was about 3° daily in excess.

The mean temperature at Greenwich of the 3 months ending May, constituting the 3 spring months, was $46^{\circ} \cdot 1$, being below the average of 80 years by $0^{\circ} \cdot 4$.

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 Registrars in all the districts of England during the Summer quarter ending September 30th, 1851; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, about 3190 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended June 30th, 1851.

The Return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and approximative numbers have been supplied from the records of previous years. The marriages still exceed the average, but are less numerous than the marriages in the corresponding quarter of last year. The births continue to increase rapidly, and the mortality is below the average. The returns therefore present a favourable view of the state of the country.

MARRIAGES.

38498 marriages were registered in the quarter ending June 30th. This number is less by 520 than the number registered in the Spring quarter of 1850, but more by 3777 than the number registered in the Spring quarter of 1848. The marriages only amounted to 30048 in the Spring quarter of 1842; they rose to 34268 in the Spring quarter of 1844; to 37111 in the Spring quarter of 1846; declined to 35197 in 1847; and rose again to 39018 in the Spring quarter of 1850. Every marriage is the establishment of a family, and is generally the result of some deliberation; it is not surprising therefore that the prosperity of the country and the prospects

of the people should be expressed pretty accurately by the fluctuations in the marriage returns.

While the marriages increased rapidly in some parts, they were stationary or decreased in others. In London 6515 couples were married; which exceeds the number married in the summer of 1848 by 1106. In Surrey out of London, in Sussex, Kent, and Berkshire the marriages were nearly stationary; in Hampshire they decreased. In the South Midland, the Eastern Counties, as well as in Wiltshire, Dorsetshire, and Devonshire, marriage was stationary or decreased; in Cornwall and Somersetshire there was an increase. In Gloucestershire marriage was stationary; in Herefordshire and Shropshire the numbers married were unprecedentedly low; in Staffordshire, Worcestershire, and Warwickshire—including the chief seats of the Midland iron trade—the marriages increased. The marriages rose from 383 in 1848 to 487 in Birmingham. In Leicestershire, Rutlandshire, and Lincolnshire the marriages were below, in Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire above, the average number; the excess occurring chiefly in the districts of Nottingham, Chesterfield, and Hayfield. The marriages in Cheshire and Lancashire decreased. The decrease was considerable in Liverpool, and greater still in Manchester. In the West Riding of Yorkshire there is an excess; and this is most conspicuous in Sheffield, where the marriages in the five Summer quarters ending June 1847-51 were 283, 273, 289, 339, and 404! In Leeds the marriages were 351 in the June quarter of 1848; 530 and 487 in the corresponding quarters of 1850 and 1851. In Hull the marriages increased from 147 in the June quarter of the cholera year 1849 to 175 in 1850, but have fallen again to 158. The marriages decreased in the North Riding of Yorkshire, in Northumberland and Cumberland; increased in the coal districts of Durham. In Monmouthshire and Wales marriages were less frequent than in 1850.

It has been observed that the marriages increase after a fatal epidemic; and in the present return the marriages, it is seen, have been in excess generally where cholera was most fatal in 1849.

BIRTHS.

150,584 births have been registered in the quarter ending September 30th, 1851. This is the greatest number of births ever registered in the same season of the year, and exceeds by 23411, and 15361, and 3614, the births in the September quarters of 1847, 1849, and 1850. The births of 467,096 children have already been registered, and it is probable that in the year the numbers will not fall short of 600,000. The increase is distributed over all the divisions of the country except the South Midland.

INCREASE OF POPULATION.

While 150,584 children were born and registered in the summer quarter, 91600 persons died; leaving an excess of 58984 in the population. The excess of births over deaths in the first 9 months of the present year has been 170,411, which is probably more than equivalent to the actual increase of the population.

It is well known that up to a late period there has been a constant immigration of the Irish and Scotch into England, which appears to have been fully equivalent to the emigration of the English into the colonies and to foreign parts; but no exact statistical information on this subject exists.

85603 emigrants left the ports of the United Kingdom at which there are government emigration officers in the quarter ending September 30th, 1851. This is at the rate of 930 a day; 6510 a week. 13963 sailed from Irish ports, 4378 from Glasgow and Greenock, and 67262 from three English ports; namely, 10062 from London, 2799 from Plymouth, and 54401 from Liverpool. Many of the Irish emigrants are returned at Liverpool. Of the total number 68960 emigrants sailed to the United States, 9268 to British North America, 6097 to the Australian Colonies, and 1278 to other places. The emigration has hitherto been greater in 1851 than it was in the corresponding quarters of 1850.*

The present movement of the population is in many respects remarkable. The free admission of grain, fruit, and meat since the scarcity is equivalent to an addition to the country of a vast tract of fertile soil, which calls for cultivators, and, as the land is abroad, for agricultural emigrants who prefer the cheap though distant lands of America to the high-rented farms of Ireland, no longer possessing a monopoly for its produce in the English market. The fact deserves attention, that while the United Kingdom has been importing food in unprecedented quantities, it has been sending out swarms of emigrants from the population, of which the marriages and births promise to keep up a perpetual and increasing supply.

STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

The health of different parts of the country differs widely, and the difference is greatest in summer. In the 10 summer quarters of 1841-50 the mortality in 506 districts, comprising, when the census was taken, 10,126,886 people, was at the rate of 18.15 in 1000 annually; while in 117 districts, comprising the chief towns, and

7,795,882 people, the mortality was at the rate of 25 in 1000 *annually*. Thus, at least, 7 in every 25 deaths which occur in towns are the result of artificial causes. The mortality in the quarter ending September 1851 was at the rate of 23 and 17.93 in 1000 in the two groups of districts; it was a little below the average in the country, and considerably below the average in the towns. The *annual rate* of mortality per cent. in all England was, on the average of 10 summers, 2.099; in the summer quarter of 1851 it was 2.020.

LONDON has enjoyed a degree of health above the average in the last Summer quarter: 13064 deaths were registered, which is a less number than was registered in the Summer quarters of 1847 and 1848, and half the number (27172) registered in the Summer quarter of 1849, when cholera was epidemic. During the three months of July, August, and September, more people have passed through or resided temporarily in London, with its 2,361,640 inhabitants, than ever passed through any city before in the same time. The past experience of large armies, or of the pilgrimages of the east and of the middle ages, might have justified the sinister forebodings which some entertained; but the railways and the improvement in sanitary arrangements have now rendered it possible to move masses of men about in thousands and millions without danger to the public health, as the event has here proved. The deaths by violence, though less than in previous summers, were 363; 10 by poison, 35 by burns and scalds, 43 by hanging or suffocation, 89 by drowning, 156 by fractures and contusions, 21 by wounds, and 9 by other violence.

The number of Suicides and Murders registered in London was less in 1851 than in the summer quarters of 1847, 1848, and 1850.

The deaths by poison in the summer quarters of 1848-50, were 15, 20, 26; and instead of increasing, they were only 10 in the summer of 1851. This decrease is highly gratifying, as it follows so immediately the recent legislation on the subject. Fractures and contusions were more fatal than in 1849-50, but not more fatal than in 1848. That other form of poisoning, intemperance in the use of alcoholic drinks, seems also to be declining; 16 deaths were ascribed to intemperance, 55 to delirium tremens, in the summer quarter of 1850; while 13 and 35 were referred to the same causes in the summer quarter of 1851. No person has died of hydrophobia in any summer quarter since 1843. The deaths from that

cause in the 6 years 1846-51 were 3; in the 6 years 1840-5 they amounted to 15; in the year 1839 to 4; in 1838 to 12. The decrease of this dreadful form of disease may be fairly ascribed to improved police regulations. 34 women died of metria; 55 of the other incidents of childbirth. 1683 persons died of consumption; next to this disease in fatality, and far above all other diseases, was diarrhoea, which destroyed 1456 lives in 3 months. Summer cholera was more fatal than it was in the summer quarters of 1847-8; and more than twice as fatal as it was in the summer of 1850. There has been a progressive increase of diarrhoea since the summer of 1841, when only 228 persons died of the disease; 627 deaths were referred to typhus, 38 to remittent fever. Typhus was increasing at the close of the quarter.

The SOUTH-EASTERN DIVISION has been less healthy than it was last year. The mortality was above the average in the Medway district (including Rochester), the Isle of Thanet (including Margate, Ramsgate, and Broadstairs), Dover, Brighton, Worthing, Newport in the Isle of Wight, Hungerford, and Abingdon. Diarrhoea was prevalent, as well as typhus and scarlatina, in several of the districts. 3 cases of cholera were fatal at Newport in the Isle of Wight.

The SOUTH MIDLAND DIVISION was generally healthy. The mortality was much below the average in the counties of Hertford, Northampton, Huntingdon, Bedford, Buckingham, and Cambridge. In Oxfordshire the mortality was above the average in the districts of Thame, Headington, and Oxford. In Oxford 19 persons died of scarlatina, 16 of diarrhoea, and 3 of typhus. The health of Cambridge has, on the contrary, been unusually good. The deaths were only 105 in the quarter; whereas the deaths in the corresponding quarters of 1847-50 were 135, 137, 133, and 151. The Registrar of St. Andrew-the-Great, Cambridge, states that "very great improvements have been made in the sanitary arrangements of the town." There was a small local outbreak of Asiatic cholera in Leighton Buzzard.

"Three deaths from cholera occurred as follows:—At Lonslade, a woman aged 51 years, "cholera, 24 hours." She had been from home some time, and had recently returned from Manchester.—At Leighton Buzzard, a woman aged 43 years, "cholera (6 hours) and apoplexy." "The cottages where this case occurred are below the public road; the back premises confined, and drainage bad.—At Bellington, a woman aged 17 years, "cholera, 60 hours." Drainage bad; the situation adjoining a farm-yard. It was stated by informant that the carcase of a calf was lying "in a barn near the house in a putrid state."

In the EASTERN DIVISION the mortality was below the average in Essex and Suffolk, above the average in Norfolk. Diarrhoea prevailed at Leyton in West Ham, Wickford, and Rayleigh; in Rochford fever of the remitting and typhoid type prevails. Ipswich suffered from diarrhoea; Lowestoft from scarlatina and English cholera. Diarrhoea was fatal in Norwich and Yarmouth; scarlatina in Yarmouth, Flegg, Walsingham, and Docking; hooping-cough in Downham.

The SOUTH-WESTERN DIVISION, with the exception of Cornwall, was healthier than is usual. In Amesbury and Salisbury the mortality was high. Scarlatina was prevalent in Marlborough, Wilts; typhus in Wareham, where, in the opinion of medical men, it was aggravated by bad drainage. Scarlatina and diarrhoea prevailed in Plymouth and Stoke Damarel. Scarlatina was the chief cause of the high mortality in Cornwall. Small-pox has also been there. Dysentery is now prevailing in St. Ives. In the Penzance sub-district the deaths exceeded the births registered; and sanitary measures are so grossly neglected by the inhabitants, that 57 of their children have died of small-pox, which is still prevailing. In Bath diarrhoea was prevalent "in confined, dirty localities, where there were bad effluvia "from nuisances."

In the WEST MIDLAND DIVISION the public health was as good as usual in Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, and Shropshire. One death from cholera occurred in St. Mary Redcliffe, Bristol, and one in St. John the Baptist, Gloucester; a low fever and scarlatina were fatal in Stroud; dysentery prevailed in Albrighton, Shiffnal; and it is stated that the population is decreasing in Shiffnal "from emigration and want of employment in the agricultural districts." Small-pox

has nearly disappeared from Shrewsbury ; *one* person died of cholera in Burslem where diarrhœa prevailed, as it did also in Longton, Darlaston, and Dudley. The deaths in Birmingham were 1237 ; diarrhœa was rife, and several cases of cholera were registered. The high rate of mortality in this well placed town proves how much wise and timely sanitary measures are neglected. Coventry is in a still worse condition ; the mortality is higher.

In the NORTH MIDLAND DIVISION the mortality was high in Nottinghamshire ; Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, and Derbyshire enjoyed an average degree of health. In the towns of Leicester and Derby, however, as well as in Nottingham, the mortality was above the average. Diarrhœa and cholera prevailed in Nottingham and Chesterfield.

The NORTH-WESTERN DIVISION constantly suffers more from death than the other divisions of England ; the mortality of the summer has been less than usual. In Manchester the decrease of deaths is considerable. Diarrhœa prevailed in many districts. The Registrars mention 7 cases of cholera in Liverpool, 2 in Toxteth Park, 2 in Wigan, 7 in Warrington, and 3 in Little Bolton. In Hulme, Chorlton, 40 children and 8 adults died without medical assistance. The Registrar of Market Street, Manchester, says,

“ The improved health and, it may be added, temper of the people of the district may assuredly be ascribed to the cheapness of provisions, which are not only abundant but also of better quality, because the temptation to adulterate food is not so great.”

The population is quitting Colne in Burnley, in search of employment ; and increasing in Blackburn in consequence of the erection and enlargement of cotton mills. The Registrar of Poulton-le-Fylde says,

“ The harvest has proved very good, and the labouring classes have been fully employed, which, together with the inestimable blessing of cheap food, I presume has been the cause of the healthiness of my district.”

The Registrar of Sedbergh says,

“ The deaths have, for upwards of 2 years, been much below the average of former years. I am at a loss to account for it otherwise than that the labouring population have in general been better employed than in former years, and with the low price of provisions that class has been able to procure all the necessaries of life.”

In Yorkshire the mortality has been slightly above the average of ordinary summers. Diarrhœa and summer cholera prevailed, with scarlatina, and in some parts influenza. The mortality was higher than is usual in Huddersfield, Leeds, Sheffield, and York. A few cases of cholera, said to be Asiatic, occurred in Sheffield, and diarrhœa was exceedingly prevalent. The Guardians acting with praiseworthy promptness supplied the poor with medical aid and medicines, which diminished the mortality.

The mortality in the NORTHERN DIVISION was above the average. Diarrhœa prevailed in several districts ; scarlatina, small-pox, measles, and dysentery are referred to ; and the Registrar of Sedgefield mentions one case of cholera. Typhus prevails in Bewcastle, High Longtown, and has been fatal to two persons.

The mortality has been above the average in Merthyr Tydfil and Pembroke ; but Wales and Monmouthshire generally have been healthy. The Registrar of Llantrisant, Cardiff, remarks,

“ It is a most singular circumstance, that not one death happened within this district between the 15th of August last and the 11th of September, a space of 27 days, though the population is nearly 11,000. No movement of the population has taken place, and no sanitary arrangements have been effected.”

Mr. Glaisher has given a full and interesting account of the weather.

On the Meteorology of England, South of Scotland, and parts of Ireland, during the Quarter ending September 30th, 1851. By JAMES GLAISHER, ESQ., F.R.S., Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

Till July 26th, with the exception of a very few warm days, the mean daily temperatures of the air were below their average values, but the defect was not at any time large; the average defect for the period was 1°·9. Between July 27th and August 25, the daily temperatures were generally in excess, on some few days to the amount of 6°, 7°, or 8°; the average excess was 2°·4. This period was followed by one of an opposite character, though of short duration, the daily temperatures being below their average value, on one day (August 29th) to the amount of 11° nearly; the average defect to August 31st was 5°·3. This was followed by 4 days of warm weather, the excess of temperature being 4°·2, and from September 5th, the daily temperatures departure from their average values for the most part by small quantities, at times being slightly in excess, but generally in defect; the average defect for the period was 1°.

The mean temperature at Greenwich of the 3 months ending August, constituting the 3 Summer months, was 60°·4, exceeding the average of 80 years by 0°·5.

On all those days the magnets were disturbed. The aurora of September 29th as seen at Nottingham was very brilliant; it commenced at about 7 h. 30 m. and continued visible till 1 h. A.M. of the morning of September 30th. The colours were orange, scarlet, and pink. After 9 h. 50 m. many clouds obstructed the view of the streamers; at 10 h. many very brilliant streamers were seen; at 10 h. 14 m. orange coloured streamers rose up in N.N.E. and dimmed the stars; at 11 h. faint streamers passed E. of the Pointers; at midnight many clouds appeared as though illuminated by a full moon behind them. The distant hills were seen as if by daylight, and strong shadows were cast around.

Remarkable Rain fell on July the 14th, at Ennis in Ireland, amounting to 0·55 in. in depth, at Manchester to 1·104 in., and at Stonyhurst in eight hours 1·104 in.; at Helston on the 17th in two hours 1·12 in., and at Falmouth in 24 hours 1·008 in.; at Lewisham on the 23d 0·983 in., at Rose Hill near Oxford 1·051 in.; on the 23d and 24th at Lewisham a depth of 1·953 in. was recorded; at Grantham, from 9 h. A.M. on the 23d till noon on the 24th, 2·105 in.; on the 24th at Norwich 1·19 in., at Holkham 2·000 in., and at Nottingham 1·160 in. On the 28th at Strokes-town in Ireland 0·475 in.; on the 29th at Longford 0·330 in., at Carrick-on-Shannon, accompanied with thunder and lightning, 0·830 in.; and on the 31st at Castlebar 0·640 in. On August the 13th at Gainsborough in one hour 0·82 in. (the streets were flooded and houses filled); on the 14th at Helston there fell in a few hours 1·04 in.; at North Shields on the night of the 16th 1·189 in.; on the 24th at Ennis 0·78 in., with a storm; at Longford 0·900 in., and at Stokestown 0·810 in.; on the 26th at Whitehaven 0·807 in.; on the 28th at Uckfield 1·300 in., at Lewisham 1·550 in. (which fell in the night). On September the 25th at Ennis 0·460 in., at Wakefield 1·410 in., at Newcastle (from 9 h. A.M. till 9 h. A.M. on the 26th) 3·000 in.; at North Shields on the 25th 3·007 in.; on the 26th at Whitehaven 1·167 in.; on the 27th at Hartwell Rectory 1·005 in., at Holkham 1·225 in.; on the 30th at Longford 0·580 in., at Stokestown 0·630 in., and at Carrick-on-Shannon 1·100 in. At North Shields on September the 25th, at 10 h. 15 m. A.M., a thin rain began to fall; at a quarter after 12 the darkness was extreme, and from that time till 11 h. A.M. nearly on the following day rain fell to the depth of 3·007 inches.

At Derby on September 25th, at 4 h. P.M. a very heavy rain began to fall, and by the 27th the amount was 1·062 in.; it was accompanied by a hurricane, and which did much damage on the coast.

OF

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2190 Registrars in all the districts of England during the Autumn quarter ending December 31st, 1851; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, about 3228 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended September 30th, 1851.

The Return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and approximative numbers have been supplied from the records of previous years.

The marriages and the births exceed the average numbers; and the deaths are also slightly above the average of the corresponding quarters.

For the whole of the year 1851 the births have greatly exceeded the numbers in any previous year, and the mortality has been lower than it was in any of the 10 years 1841-50, except 1843, 1845, and 1850. The births, deaths, and marriages show a balance of births over deaths, and an increase of families; which are only observed in a state of prosperity. The tendency at the end of the year to decline towards the average state of things will no doubt attract attention to the great interests and to the public health of the country.

MARRIAGES.

74310 persons were married in the 3 months ending September 30th. The rapid increase of the marriages in England from 29221 in the September quarter of 1840 to 37155 in 1851 is partly due to the increase of the population and partly to the

increased disposition to marriage. In the September quarter of 1841 and 1851 out of 100,000 persons 365 and 409 married; consequently out of the same number of persons 8 married in 1841 and 9 in 1851.

The number of marriages is less than it was in the previous June quarter, which is usually the case, and slightly less also than it was in the corresponding quarter of 1850. In parts of the country the decrease is not inconsiderable; in others the marriages of 1851 exceeded those in the corresponding quarter of 1850. Thus in London the marriages in the quarter ending September 1851 were 7345, or 583 more than in the September quarter of 1850, and 1548 more than in the quarter of 1847! In Kent, Sussex, and Hampshire the marriages still exceed the average; in Berkshire the excess is inconsiderable. The excess was chiefly in Guildford, Dartford, Tunbridge, Dover, Eastbourne, and Lewes. In Brighton the marriages were 154, which is near the average, but less than in the corresponding quarters of 1849-50. In the South Midland Division, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Northamptonshire, Bedfordshire, and Cambridgeshire have fewer marriages in the quarter of 1851 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. In Essex and Norfolk, Wiltshire, Dorsetshire, and Somersetshire a similar decline took place; in Suffolk and Cornwall the marriages slightly increased. In the South Midland, Eastern, and South-western counties, the number of marriages, though less than in the corresponding quarter of 1850, was not below the average. The same state of things is observed in the West Midland Division; the marriages were less numerous in Herefordshire, Gloucestershire, and Shropshire than they were in the previous year; in Staffordshire and Worcestershire the numbers remained above the average, and there was a considerable increase in Wolverhampton, and Stourbridge; in Warwickshire the marriages are more numerous than they were in 1850, and the increase is chiefly in Birmingham and its suburbs. In Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, and Derbyshire the marriages rapidly increased from

1847 up to 1850, and have now slightly declined. Lincolnshire, which was at the lowest point in 1850, increased in 1851. The marriages in nearly all the districts of Lancashire, including Liverpool and Manchester, declined, but were more numerous than in any previous September quarter except that of 1850. The marriages have progressively declined in the North Riding of Yorkshire since 1848; they still remain above the average in the West Riding. In Keighley, Halifax, Leeds, and Sheffield the number of marriages in the quarter exceeds the number in the corresponding quarter of any previous year since 1847. In Leeds and Sheffield the increase is remarkable. In Hull and Sculcoates the rate of marriage declined. In the Northern Counties and in Wales the rate of marriage remained above the average, but was rather lower than it was in the September quarter 1850.

The Marriage Returns of 1850 and 1851 exhibit the excess which since 1750 has been invariably observed when the substantial earnings of the people are above the average; and the experience of a century, during which the prosperity of the country though increasing has been constantly fluctuating, shows that it is prudent to husband the resources of good times against future contingencies. Workmen, if they are wise, will not now squander their savings.

BIRTHS.

149,155 births were registered in the last quarter, and 616,251 in the year 1851. These are the greatest numbers ever before registered. The average annual rate of births in the 10 years 1841-50 was 3.261 per cent.; in the year 1851 the rate was 3.428 per cent. To every 100,000 of the population 3428 children were born in 1851 instead of 3261; and there was consequently an excess of 167, or of 5 per cent. The excess appears to have been distributed very generally over the whole country.

INCREASE OF POPULATION.

While the births in the last quarter of the year 1851 were 149,155, the deaths were 99,248; leaving an excess of 49,907 in the population. The deaths in the year 1851 were 385,933, the births 616,251; consequently 230,318 at least was the natural increase in England and Wales of a population amounting to 17,977,000 in the middle of that year, and now exceeding 18 millions of souls.

Emigration still continues; 59200 people left their homes and the ports of the United Kingdom in the last 92 days of the old year. 52292 sailed from English ports; namely, 42680 from Liverpool, 6252 from London, and 3360 from Plymouth.

1524 persons sailed from Glasgow and Greenock; 5384 from Irish ports. A great proportion of these emigrants from Liverpool were of Irish birth.*

Provisions have been cheap.—The price of beef by the carcase has for the last half-year been 4d. a pound, of mutton 4½d. a pound, at Leadenhall and Newgate markets. Potatoes, which were at the average price of 5s. the hundred-weight at the time the supply of old potatoes ceased in the September quarter, fell to 3s. 6d. in the 13 weeks ending December 31st. In the same periods wheat was 40s. 7d. and 36s. 7d. a quarter. The subjoined Table shows that while 74,714 quarters of wheat were sold weekly in the 290 cities and towns making returns in July, August, and September, the amount sold after the harvest, in October, November, and December, was 109,506 quarters weekly. The average weekly amount sold during the 6 months was 92,110. The amount of wheat consumed is unknown; but at the estimated annual rate of a quarter a head it is 345,712 quarters weekly in England and Wales; and it will be observed that in wheat and flour, 69,513 quarters, equal to three-fourths of the wheat sold, were imported weekly and entered for Home Consumption on the average during the 6 months.

STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

England is one of the few countries of the world in which the rate of mortality is lowest in the hot season. In the three months ending September 1851 the mortality, calculated on the population, was at the rate of 2.020 per cent., which was slightly below the average (2.099) of the 10 preceding summer quarters; in the three months ending December 1851 the mortality was at the rate of 2.182 per cent., which, on the other hand, is slightly above the average (2.162) of the 10 preceding Autumn quarters. The spring months of April, May, June, stand higher than the Autumn quarter in the order of mortality; while in the three months of January, February, and March the mortality is highest in winter. The mortality of the quarters of the year is seen in the subjoined Table; which also presents a strong argument in favour of the improvement of the sites, dwellings, drainage, cleansing, and water supply of the large towns of the kingdom.

The mortality of the large towns is, in the first and second half of the year respectively, one fifth and one third part higher in the large towns than it is in the country districts and small towns; where many causes of insalubrity also exist. The same causes that destroy the lives of so many people, degrade the lives of more, and may ultimately, it is to be feared, have a very unfavourable effect on the

energies of a large proportion of the English race. Here is then a wide field for salutary and beneficent reforms.

The mortality of the large town districts in the last quarter of 1851 is slightly below the average; and this may be hailed with satisfaction as an indication of sanatory activity. Unfortunately the mortality in the small towns and in the country districts has increased to some extent, and thus left the mortality of the kingdom above the average.

Scarlatina, measles, small-pox, and fever have been epidemic in many districts, and are still prevailing.

The weather in the three months is shown by the returns collated by Mr. Glaisher to have presented some extraordinary deviations from the ordinary state of things. The fall of rain in the three months was only two fifths of the usual quantity; many springs and small streams ceased to flow; and the atmosphere, containing less vapour than usual, was dry. The effect of the change in the meteorology on the public health and the growing crops must be carefully watched during the present year.

In LONDON 14355 deaths were registered in the quarter, while only 12956 deaths were registered in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Upon looking back to 1847, when influenza was epidemic, and 18586 persons died, there is matter of congratulation in the fact that at present the metropolis is exempt from any extraordinary epidemic, and is, allowing for increase of population, losing less than the average number of lives. 3137 persons died in 13 weeks of zymotic diseases; by small-pox 339, measles 204, scarlatina 603, hooping-cough 286, diarrhoea 401. These were chiefly children. Only 15 deaths were referred to cholera, 34 deaths were referred to influenza, 1050 to bronchitis, and 1053 to pneumonia. The inflammations of the air tubes and lungs have thus been rather more prevalent than usual, which may be partly the result of the extremely cold weather in November, and partly the consequence of influenza. Consumption was unusually fatal: 1737 persons died of this disease, which was the cause of one eighth part of the total deaths. Typhus or continued fever was fatal in 770 instances, erysipelas in 116, metria in 69, other accidents incidental to childbirth in 59. Carbuncle was fatal in 9 cases, and 18 deaths were referred to purpura or scurvy. These diseases are important, as their unusual prevalence denotes a low tone of health, only to be combated by fruit or wine, which is not within the reach of the people. Only 7 deaths were directly ascribed to privation, while 15 were ascribed to intemperance, and 33 to delirium tremens. The deaths by poison are above the average, and call for greater vigilance on the part of their vendors, the chemists and druggists. It is painful to find that in London 28 persons died of poison in 13 weeks. Burns and scalds (69), fractures and contusions (164), and wounds (33) were also unusually fatal; 55 persons died of hanging and suffocation, 58 of drowning, and 12 of other kinds of violence.

In the SOUTH-EASTERN DIVISION the mortality was near the average. Brighton, however, was exceedingly unhealthy, chiefly from scarlatina and measles; the deaths in the quarter were 510 from all causes, out of a population of upwards of 66000.

The health of the people of Hertfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, of all the South Midland counties, was unusually good.

The EASTERN COUNTIES, Essex, Suffolk, and Norfolk, had fewer deaths than usual. Of the 31 deaths registered in the sub-district of Docking, only 16 had the attendance of medical men! Of six children who died of inflammation of the chest and of scarlatina *three* were without medical attendance. This criminal negligence of sick children by their parents deserves the attention of the local authorities. It will be recollected that it was in the Eastern Counties that the crime of poisoning by arsenic was some time ago brought to light.

In the SOUTH-WESTERN DIVISION the mortality was above the average in Wiltshire, Cornwall, and Somersetshire, below the average in Devonshire.

The WEST MIDLAND DIVISION experienced the average rate of mortality.

The mortality in the counties of the NORTH MIDLAND DIVISION differs little from the average. Scarlatina prevailed at Melton Mowbray, small-pox in Great Grimsby and in Hayfield. The effects of the agricultural improvements now going on have been strikingly illustrated in a part of the Newark district.

“ The Registrar of North Collingham reports that the births are 54; deaths 20. The deaths are below the average. Some *important drains* have been cut within the last year; hence it has followed that in places where there was much stagnant water there have been no epidemics. Formerly epidemic diseases were very common in these localities. In the village of *North Clifton*, where the drainage was bad, *low fever was seldom out of the place; but now, through the influence of an intelligent farmer, the place has been well drained, and nuisances removed, and, as a consequence, there has not been any fever in the place for about a year and a half.* The district contains nearly 5000 inhabitants. The soil is almost entirely light and sandy. The rate of wages amongst the labourers is 10s. a week, and it is very seldom that a good labourer is in want of work. The allotment system, by which each labourer has a small quantity of land at a low rate, is very generally carried out, and contributes much to his comfort. There is scarcely a labourer who does not feed a pig.”

Such arrangements as are here referred to, when generally carried out, will exercise a beneficial influence much beyond common expectation, on the well-being, vigour, and character of the people. Agriculturists understand better perhaps than any other class, the effect of external circumstances not only on breeds of cattle but on races of men; and it is gratifying to see measures for the improvement of the dwellings and dwelling places of the people so ardently taken up, not only by the great and enlightened landowners of the country, but by men like this “intelligent farmer,” who has delivered North Clifton from low fever, and from the epidemics which were once so common.

The mortality of Cheshire and Lancashire was higher than the high average of those counties: where the population is often crowded in places unfit for the habitations of men, and the children and houses are not, as they are elsewhere, attended to by the wives and mothers, whose occupation carries them, unfortunately, all day from home. The population of the districts of Lancashire in 1851 was 2,063,913; the funerals were 54938.

The population of the WEST MIDLAND DIVISION, comprising Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Worcestershire, and Warwickshire, with Bristol, Birmingham, and the population of the coal districts, was 2,132,853; the deaths were 49238; too numerous, unquestionably, but less by 5700 than the deaths out of a smaller number of people in Lancashire.

The excess of sickness and death in Lancashire is constant; in infancy, in adult age, and in both sexes.* Yet the land of a great part of the county is high and salubrious, and the occupation of the people has nothing in it essentially injurious. What then is wanting? Apparently only this one thing: that the leading men of Lancashire, animated by goodwill, should apply that skill and vigour which have been so successful in the use of machinery and the production of clothing for mankind, to the amelioration of the social condition of the two millions of Englishmen around them.

The health of the YORK, the NORTHERN, and the WELSH DIVISIONS was nearly as usual; the prevalent epidemics are specified in the Registrars Notes.

On the Meteorology of England, South of Scotland, and parts of Ireland, during the Quarter ending December 31st, 1851. By JAMES GLAISHER, Esq., F.R.S., Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

Till October 28th, with the exception of a very few days, the mean daily temperatures of the air were above their average values at times to the amount of 8° to 10°; the average daily excess for the period was 3°·7. On October 29th a period of exceeding cold weather set in, and for thirty-seven days the daily temperature was below its average value, frequently amounting to 8°, 9°, and 10°, less frequently to 11° and 12°, and in one case exceeded 13°; the average defect for the period was 6°·2. So cold a November has not been since the year 1786. The period from December 5th to 24th was mostly warm, though at times it was cold; the average daily temperature was 2°·5 in excess, and to the end of the year from the 25th it was 2°·5 in defect. The reading of the barometer was in excess in each month, and greatly so in December. The fall of rain has only amounted to two fifths of its average fall for the quarter, and this deficiency of rain has been general over England, Scotland, and Ireland, excepting only the county of Norfolk. There has been much less water mixed with the air, and the degree of humidity of the air has been unusually low, particularly in December.

The mean temperature of the air at Greenwich for the quarter ending November, constituting the 3 Autumn months, was 49°·1, being 0°·2 below the average of 80 years.

The mean of the numbers in the first column is 29.767 inches, and it represents that portion of the reading of the barometer due to the pressure of air; the remaining portion, or that due to the pressure of water, is 0.262 inch; the sum of those two numbers is 30.029 inches, and it represents the mean reading of the barometer for the quarter at the level of the sea. The highest readings of the thermometer in air were 71° at Falmouth, 70° at the Royal Observatory, 70° at Jersey, Hartwell House, Linslade, and Highfield House; and the lowest readings were 19° at Uckfield and Linslade, 19° at Highfield House, 20° at Radcliff Observatory, 20° at Stonyhurst, and 21° at Thame, Hartwell House, Cardington, Derby, and Manchester. The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey 6° 6, at Liverpool Observatory 6° 7, at Whitehaven 7° 3, at Glasgow 7° 8, and at North Shields 8° 2; and their mean value was 7° 3; and the greatest occurred at Aylesbury 15°, at Highfield House 14° 2, and at Manchester 14° 1; and their mean value was 14° 4. Rain fell on the least number of days at Dunino, Newcastle, Bedford, Maidenstone Hill, and the Royal Observatory; and on the greatest number of days at Helston, Falmouth, and Whitehaven. The places where the least falls took place are Durham, North Shields, and Dunino, and the mean amount at those places is 1.74 inches. The largest falls occurred at Guernsey, Helston, Truro, Falmouth, and Norwich, and their average was 10° 02 inches.

Under the first order in this class of diseases 19,420 deaths are registered, including 5218 deaths from cancer and 1329 from mortification, 9872 from dropsy, and 1376 from hæmorrhage. Many of the causes of death, which according to the practice of former days would have been called dropsy, are now, in the progress of medical science, referred to their organic origin, chiefly in the heart and in the kidneys.

The 64,075 deaths in the second order of tubercular diseases include 2592 from scrofula in its various forms, 4510 from tabes mesenterica,

7807 from hydrocephalus, and 49,166 from phthisis. The last disease, which does not include ill-defined cases of atrophy, causes nearly 13 in every 100 of the deaths that happen, and was fatal to 2.781 in every 1000 of the population.

III. ORGANIC DISEASES (O.): or Diseases of particular Organs.

The parts of the body as they are variously endowed, and have different functions, are, some more, some less, intimately concerned in the tenure of life. The deaths by inflammation, by other affections, and by functional disorders of the eight principal organic systems, amounted to 143,644, or to nearly 37 in every 100.

Diseases of the nervous system.—The diseases of the brain, spinal marrow, and nerves caused 49,854 deaths; 3628 by inflammation of the brain (cephalitis), 7946 by apoplexy, 7587 by paralysis. Of convulsive diseases, including chorea, epilepsy, tetanus, and the common convulsion, 26,547 persons died. Convulsion is chiefly incidental to children; and of 24,592 deaths, 13,831 happened to males, 10,761 to females; 11,854 were in boys, 8710 in girls under one year of age. The means of medical observation are imperfect, and the diseases of infancy are often enveloped in great obscurity; and it is probable that other latent diseases exist in these cases of which convulsions are only the striking symptoms. Delirium tremens, which is generally the result of intemperance, was returned as the cause of 503 deaths; and the numbers fluctuated little within the last 5 years. Insane persons die of phthisis, paralysis, and a great variety of affections, some of which are and others are not the result of the mental disease; so that the 542 deaths under the head "Insanity" constitute only a small proportion of the deaths occurring among lunatics.

Diseases of the organs of circulation.—11,817 deaths were the result of heart diseases, aneurisms, and other diseases of the circulatory system. These caused 3 in every 100 deaths.

Diseases of the organs of respiration.—The respiratory organs were affected by diseases which were fatal in 48,759 cases; 17,294 of bronchitis, 22,001 of pneumonia, and 4896 of asthma. This aggregate constitutes 12.55 in 100 of the specified deaths, or nearly the same proportion of the total deaths as the deaths by diseases of the nervous system.

If phthisis (consumption), which, however, is a disease that affects the intestines as well as the lungs, is added to the diseases of this order, it doubles the aggregate; for the deaths from that disease are as numerous as the deaths from all the diseases of the respiratory organs. 25 in 100 deaths are caused by consumption and by the diseases of the respiratory organs. If the deaths by diseases of the organs of circulation are added, the proportion represents the deaths by diseases of the chest, as they are popularly designated.

Diseases of the digestive organs.—The diseases of the stomach, intestines, liver, and other organs concerned in digestion were the causes of 23,219 deaths; 4410 by teething, 5825 by gastritis, enteritis, and peritonitis; namely, 721 by gastritis, 3854 by enteritis, and 1250 by peritonitis. 16,701 deaths were referred to some one or other of the diseases of the stomach and intestines, and 8 to diseases of the pancreas; 6444 to diseases of the liver; and 66 to diseases of the spleen. Of 100 deaths, 6 were caused by diseases of this group.

Diseases of the urinary organs.—Diseases of the urinary organs were fatal to 3416 persons, including 403 whose deaths were referred to diabetes, 204 to stone.

Diseases of the organs of generation.—The diseases of childbirth, paramenia, ovarian dropsy, and other affections of this order, were fatal in 3327 instances. The deaths by childbirth were 2281, in addition to 1009 by metria (puerperal fever), making 3290 deaths of the mother to 615,865 children born alive; 1 mother died, therefore, to every 187 children born; or the mortality of the mother was at the rate of .00534. This does not, however, precisely represent the danger of pregnancy, as some of the deaths undoubtedly occurred after miscarriage, or after the

birth of stillborn children, which are not registered; and, on the other hand, as a certain number of the children were twins, two children in such cases only represent one mother.

Diseases of the organs of locomotion.—The bones, the joints, and the muscular system are subject to diseases which were fatal in 2412 cases; besides the instances that are found under scrofula, which specially affects the bones and joints. 1320 of the deaths are, however, referred to rheumatism.

Diseases of the integumentary organs.—The diseases of the skin and cellular tissue are now rarely fatal. Carbuncle was the cause of 161 deaths, or of nearly six times as many as were registered 10 years before; and as it has prevailed extensively in the epidemic form, proving, however, rarely fatal, it should be referred to the zymotic class.

IV. DISEASES OF GROWTH, NUTRITION, AND DECAY (D.)

(The total deaths by this class of causes was 57,920.)

Malformations.—It has been ascertained that the human embryo goes through several changes of form in the course of its evolution, and that in a certain number of instances the evolution is arrested at some of the earlier forms; hence *spina bifida*, *hare-lip*, *nonclosure of the oval foramen*; and in consequence the life of the child cannot go on, or it is cut short at the end of a few years; thus 786 of the deaths in the year are referred to malformations of various kinds.

Premature birth and debility.—Many children are prematurely born, or possess little vitality, so that they expire in a short time after birth; and these cases, as well as some occurring at advanced ages, have generally been called debility in the registers; 18,943 have been registered as from premature birth or debility. Of this number 17,236 were infants; namely, 9801 males, 7435 females. The excess in the vital debility or prematurity of birth is striking in the males.

Atrophy.—Wasting and loss of substance, without any discoverable disease, is put down as the cause of 12,195 deaths; of which number 3080 are the deaths of boys, 2743 of girls, under one year of age. The decay of men after the age of 60 and under 70 has in numerous cases been set down as atrophy.

Old age.—But a large number of the deaths of persons of the age of 70 and upwards is set down as simply the result of old age, or that decay which is apparently as much a stage of human existence as growth. Thus, in the year's abstracts, 25,996 deaths were referred to age, including the deaths of 11,243 old men, and of 14,753 old women. As the aggregate deaths of persons of the age of 70 and upwards amounted to 57,416, it is evident that 31,420 of such deaths were referred to diseases of various kinds, including typhus, dropsy, mortification, cancer, consumption, apoplexy, paralysis, heart-disease, bronchitis, pneumonia, asthma, kidney-disease, and fractures.

V. DEATHS FROM EXTERNAL CAUSES (E.)

Fatal injuries of a peculiar character are inflicted by external agents of various kinds; and in some instances, as in deaths by drowning, by hanging, and by poison, the attention is directed apparently to the cause, which acts quickly, rather than to the peculiar morbid state, which is induced. 13,559 persons died of causes that are classed under this head.

There are five heads in this class to which a certain number of deaths are referred; namely, 289 to intemperance, 58 to privation, 553 to the want of breast-milk, 15 to neglect, and 52 to cold; as, however, many diseases of various kinds arise under the influence of the excess or of the privation of natural food or stimulants, of heat or of cold, these deaths are but a small proportion of the number that are indirectly or directly the result of such causes.

444 deaths were the result of poisoning, 2620 of burns and scalds, 1162 of hanging and suffocation, 2280 of drowning, 4433 of fractures and contusions, 586 of wounds, either gunshot or incised, and 1067 of other violence. Nearly 8 in every 10,000 of the people living died by violent causes in 1851.

Such is a brief and rapid survey of the causes of the deaths of 395,396 people in the year 1851.
