For the Conference on Drug Manufacture meeting this month.

For those who are the victims of drug taking.

For the 63rd session of the Council.

For those who are working for the abolition of social evils such as the traffic in women, and for the welfare of children.

JUNE. For the meeting of the Permanent Mandates Commission this month.

For the International Labour Organisation. (The International Labour Conference meets this month). For those who are dealing with native problems and

colonial policy.

That the League's work for the Health of the World may continue to presper and set an example of how the nations can transcend political boundaries and co-operate for the common good.

July. That the rising generation in all countries may realise that high ideals can never justify resort to War. For those who will study the work of the League in Summer Schools this month.

For the Institution of International Co-operation. For those who are working for a spirit of wise toleration in the treatment of national minorities.

August. For those who have been appointed delegates to the 12th Assembly.

For those who will make the journey to Geneva from distant lands.

For the 64th session of the Council.

September. For the meeting of the Assembly (opens September 7th).

For the delegates—that in their counsels they may seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit of wisdom and truth.

October. For those who carry out the decisions of the League—members of the League Secretariat and government officials—that they may be inspired with high ideals and encouraged in their work.

November. For those who suffer from the effects of war, the crippled, the blind, the mentally afflicted.

For those whose purposes have been overthrown.

For those whose purposes have been overthrown—those who live under alien rule—that they may seek justice only by peaceful means.

For those who are working for a better way in international affairs. For the voluntary League of Nations Societies in all lands, especially our own League of Nations Union.

DECEMBER. That the Churches and all who are called by the name of Christ may be more active in their support of the League and of those organisations which are working for the peace of the world.

Subjects for Intercession

Arranged in calendar form for 1931.

HESE subjects for prayer and intercession have been arranged in calendar form in the hope that people may pray about them at that time of the year in which they are being discussed. For the guidance of those who wish to bring more detailed knowledge to their prayers certain books and pamphlets are suggested for each month. These may be ordered from the League of Nations Union, 15, Grosvenor Crescent, London, S.W.I. Some of the books may also be had on loan from the Union's library.

JANUARY. For the League in the 12th year of its work.

For the 62nd session of the Council of the League

(Meets on January 19th).

For the guidance of the League in its study of economic problems and the causes of unemployment and trade depression.

FEBRUARY. For greater progress towards reduction and limitation

of armaments.

That the nations may seek and find their security, not in force of arms but in mutual trust and goodwill.

MARCH. That the Convention on Slavery may be honestly carried out, that the number of slaves in the world be lessened, and the evils of forced labour reduced.

For those who are slaves or who are taken from their homes to forced labour.

April. For the preparations being made for the Permanent Court of International Justice which meets at the Hague in June. That the nations may seek to settle their disputes by law rather than by force of arms.
