~~recommend~~ That the Fabian Society  
does not undertake the publication of pamphlets upon specific issues of policy, since this function is already performed, in the research stage, by the New Fabian Research Bureau and, in the definitive stage, by the Labour Party.

It is the immediate task of the Fabian Society to re-state in the light of modern

world events and tendencies, social, political and economic, the fundamental principles upon which a Socialist Commonwealth in this country must be based. In the course of such a restatement a specifically Indian approach to particular problems may emerge in which case it may be advisable to consider <sup>its</sup> development and arrange for subsequent publication.

(ii)

The central contradiction of Capitalism

i undertake the arrangement of lectures upon fundamental issues, such as State Capitalism v. Socialism; Industrial feudalism v. Socialism, the Right of Free Discussion; the Position of the Middle Class under Socialism; Trade Union Policy and the Achievement of Socialism; under some such title as 'Planning the New Age'.

Recommencement of war.

ii publish these, subsequently, as a series of pamphlets.

And that such lectures be arranged for this Spring series in Mansfield House Jan - April 1935.

(iii) That a list of speakers be compiled shortly for classes a weekend

schools &c and both in this direction  
offered to Local Labour Parties, Labour  
Women organisations and leagues  
of Youth &c.

4. It was agreed that Cullen & Hutton  
in consultation with J.D.H. Cole, be  
appointed a sub-committee

to consider the establishment, under Fabian auspices and in  
connection with the bookshops, of a central agency for the  
promotion and distribution of Socialist books and pamphlets,  
to which all booksellers and enquirers could send their orders.  
(G.D.H. Cole has a plan on this and should be consulted). It can  
be done better by the Fabian Society than by the Party.
