EU Plan to abolish British Army if the UK votes to stay in Europe

The EU plan on merging all of Europe's militaries into one giant Euro Army, and have said they will dismantle the British Army if Britain votes to stay in the EU in the upcoming referendum on June 23rd.

If Britons vote to stay in the European Union then the UK military will be forced to share sensitive weapons technology and intelligence with the rest of Europe under a new agreement.

Britain would also be expected to contribute around £375million to the scheme – enough to rehire all of the 20,000 soldiers the Government sacked in its last defence spending review.

The plans have been unveiled by bureaucrats who are preparing to revive proposals to draw up a legally binding "White book" which would vastly expand the military role of the EU.

Britain has by far the biggest and best equipped army in Europe and is to plough some £2.2bn into developing new weapons this year alone.

These facts contained in an official EU report setting out recommendations for a new EU-wide defence scheme with an astonishing 3.6bn euro budget to develop weapons for a future Brussels army. The dossier has been put together by a "Group of personalities" including politicians and businessmen hand-picked by the EU to deliver its dream of becoming a full military power.

Establishing a standing EU army is seen by Brussels as one of the final steps in the creation of a United States of Europe, with the continent already hurtling towards full fiscal and political union.

Both current EU Commission president Jean-Claude Juncker and former British Prime Minister Tony Blair, who wants to be his successor, have called for the EU to have its own military.

UKIP's defence spokesman Mike Hookem MEP - himself a former serviceman in the RAF - warned an EU army would leave the UK unable to defend its own interests in the world, including the Falklands and Gibraltar

He said: "When you sign up you pledge allegiance to her Majesty the Queen. Who are you going to swear allegiance to in the future, Jean-Claude Juncker, Tony Blair?

"During the Falklands war France was selling weapons to the Argentinians. If they try to take back the Falklands again will France let us use this EU army to defend them? I doubt it very much.

"There's only one people who can defend the British, and that's the British themselves."

If the UK remained in EU it would be forced to join an EU army within five years with "catastrophic" consequences for defence if voters back retaining membership, the man who once commended UK troops in Afghanistan Col Richard Kemp has warned-:

"Absolute certainty" that the UK would have to give troops towards an EU army that would undermine NATO and be very costly yet act like a "Paper tiger".

"We would essentially be giving up our right to sovereign self-defence. Control of the EU army would not rest with us but in a collective EU decision."

"For Britain an EU Army would be catastrophic. Whatever the Prime Minister might say about not becoming part of ever closer union we will."

The German government has revealed that Dutch and German land armies and navies are set to move towards "closer integration", with two Dutch units already coming under German command. Last month the Dutch 43rd Mechanised Brigade was subsumed into the German 1st Armoured Division, following the takeover of the Dutch 11th Airmobile Brigade by German command last year.

The two countries are also already sharing the Netherland's largest war ship, the Karel Doorman, and aim to merge its two naval powers into one unified navy within the next two years.

This leaves the Netherlands with just the 13th Mechanised Brigade to its name, along with special forces and a limited military infrastructure, but the plan is to accelerate towards a merger of these entities within the next few years, Germany's Sachsische Zeitung confirms.

And according to insiders, the Czech Republic has now entered talks to bring its army under German control, with the Poles also mooted to be part of the plan.

The accelerated timetable follows a speech given by Germany's Defence Minister Ursula von der Leve last year, in which she stated the overall aim of merging Europe's defence forces into one unified army.

"The European Army is our long-term goal, but first we have to strengthen the European Defence Union," she said, adding: "To achieve this, some nations with concrete military cooperation must come to the fore - and the Germans and the Dutch are doing this."

A British Army Run by The Germans & The French is totally unacceptable.
