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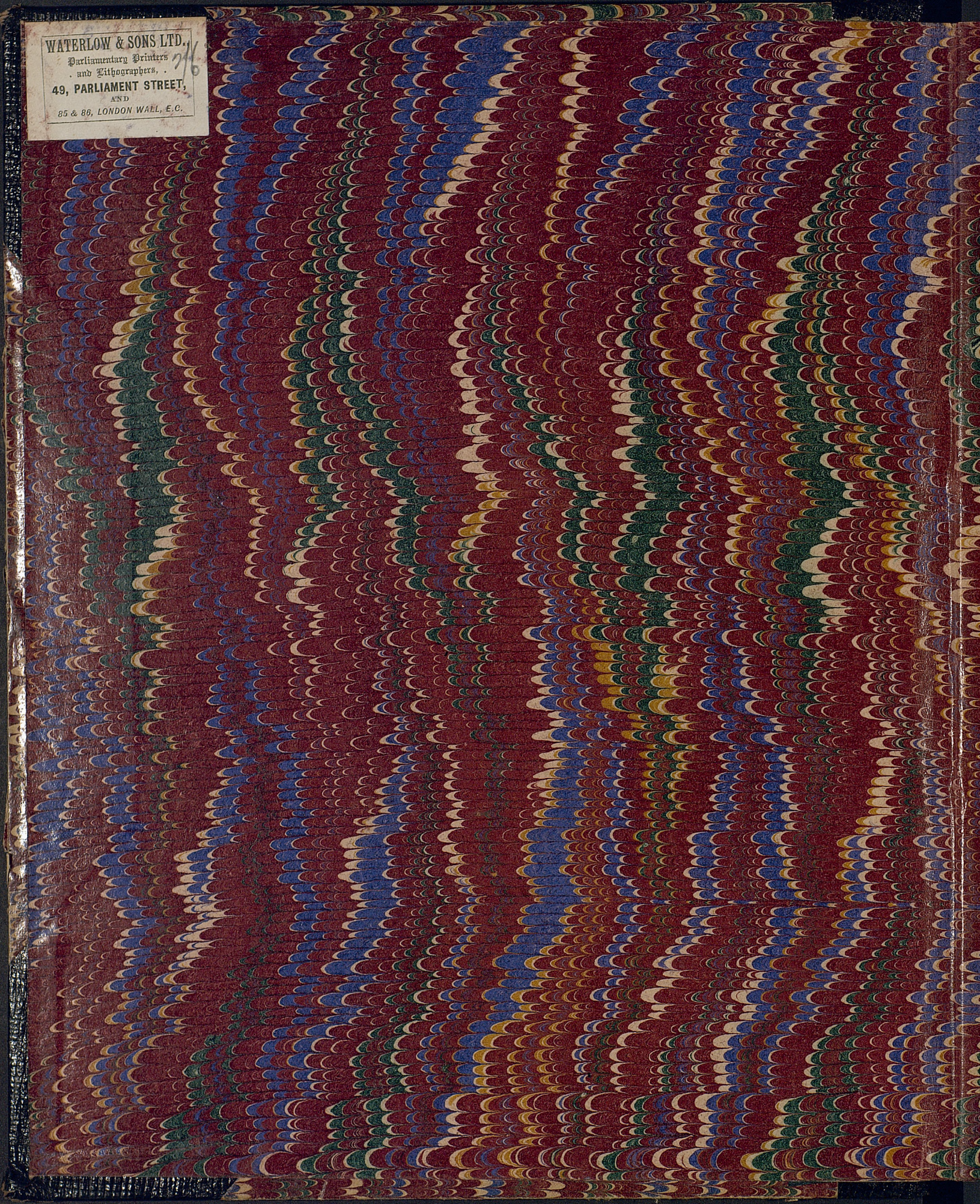
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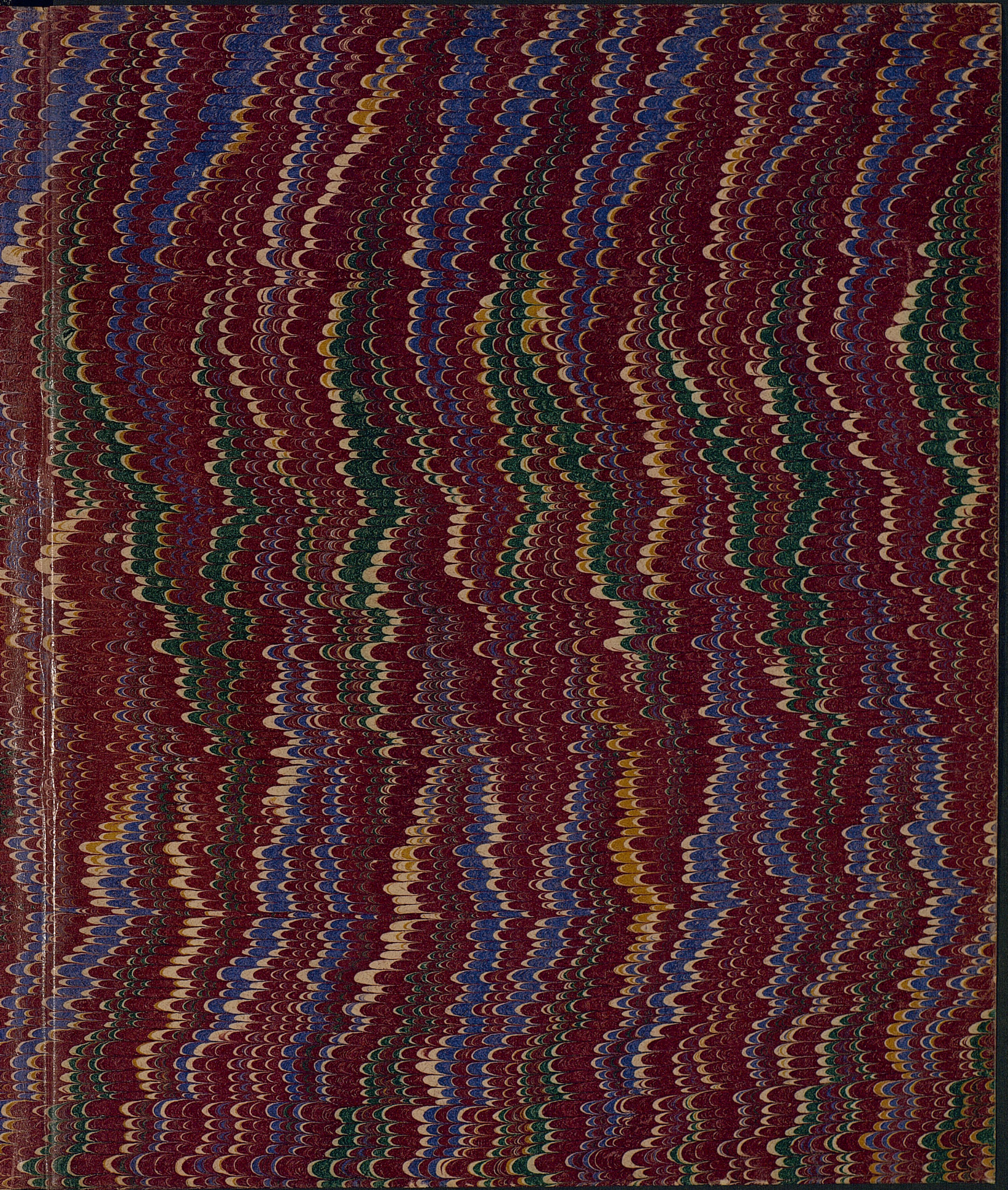

S. & I came here on our way from Tonawanda back to London, partly because we wanted to watch an impression of the T.U. The Trade Union Congress is strongly in favor of the War & most of the T.U. leaders ^{expressed} their views ^{on the} T.U. Congress with the T.U. Congress. Pessimism about the War is becoming more
pronounced: the optimists are in fact silent -
- their presence resists to the pessimists. Even

whether our working class could endure
any considerable hardship without breaking
out into industrial insurrection. Germany &
France certainly suffer from pessimism
- our Government does not do so, because
like the United States of 18 months ago
they are in high places. Our newspapers
are amazingly ~~frank~~ ^{free} ~~in~~ ^{with} their
expressed criticisms - certain persons
like John Dowd Hobson are persons with
venom - & then seem to be a chronic
conspiracy to put us of hope & fear.
There is a great deal of screaming "I am
sure I was right" a great many demands
for some one's head on a charger.

 by the sayings of Buddha or St. Francis
 or the ^{teachings} of the fathers, ^{in the various} ^{minor} ^{modern} ^{schools}

 have helped me far more to realize the
 purpose of life & to say if may be

 Take, for instance, his analysis of medieval
 Protestantism in the Age of Reason -
 compare it to the Proteology of the Germans
 of the European war - it seems almost
 like a prophecy of their conduct? (p 122-23)
 "Protestantism, in its perfectly instinctive trustfulness
 & self assertion, is not my kind of Christianity
 but more primitive than Jesus & even than
 man. The plants & animals, of by now
 speak, would express their attitudes & their
 destiny in the Protestant fashion. "He has
 turned us" by and by "into a creature with
 us. He has sealed his covenant with us,
 to stand by us if or an faithful & strenuous

in following the suggestions he offers in
 our hearts. Will finding to ourselves and
 that is to some thing, to him, in our lives
 to prosper and to have life more & more
 abundantly for ever. This attitude, then
 it concerns religion, involves two questions:

But he is brave and has still sufficient vitality to enjoy work & human companionship. His very love for me would help his beloved Society - he would become absorbed in finishing the work we have planned together. And with the wearing out of his energies there would come the wearing out of his sorrow. I shall become a living memory to him; and old people love a living memory - the idealism that is so real to them in the present. Mr. Bernard Shaw's Reason for His Resignation.

"The statement that I have resigned my seat on the board of the Statesman Publishing Company is true," said Mr. George Bernard Shaw to a "Daily News" representative yesterday. "The reason given is a guess, and a very absurd one at that. The notion that the directors of a company, owning a paper and placing it under the control of an editor, should proceed to object to the control of that editor, could only occur to someone who knows nothing about the practical conditions of journalism.

"The control of the editor of the 'New Statesman' is, and always has been, so scrupulously upheld by all the directors that it has never been necessary for him to defend it in any way, or even to assert it. He has simply exercised it in the fullest freedom and with the fullest responsibility.

"My own position was far less comfortable. People persisted in treating me as if I dictated the policy of the paper, and wrote everything in it that was not signed by someone else, the fact being that I had and have no more to do with the editorial utterances of the 'New Statesman' than with those of the 'Times' or 'The Daily News.' The misunderstanding was as unpleasant for the editor as for me; and I put an end to it by cutting off all connection with the paper except that of a shareholder in the company as soon as the firm position attained by the paper, and the reinforcement of the board by an extremely capable and distinguished man of letters made my assistance superfluous."
