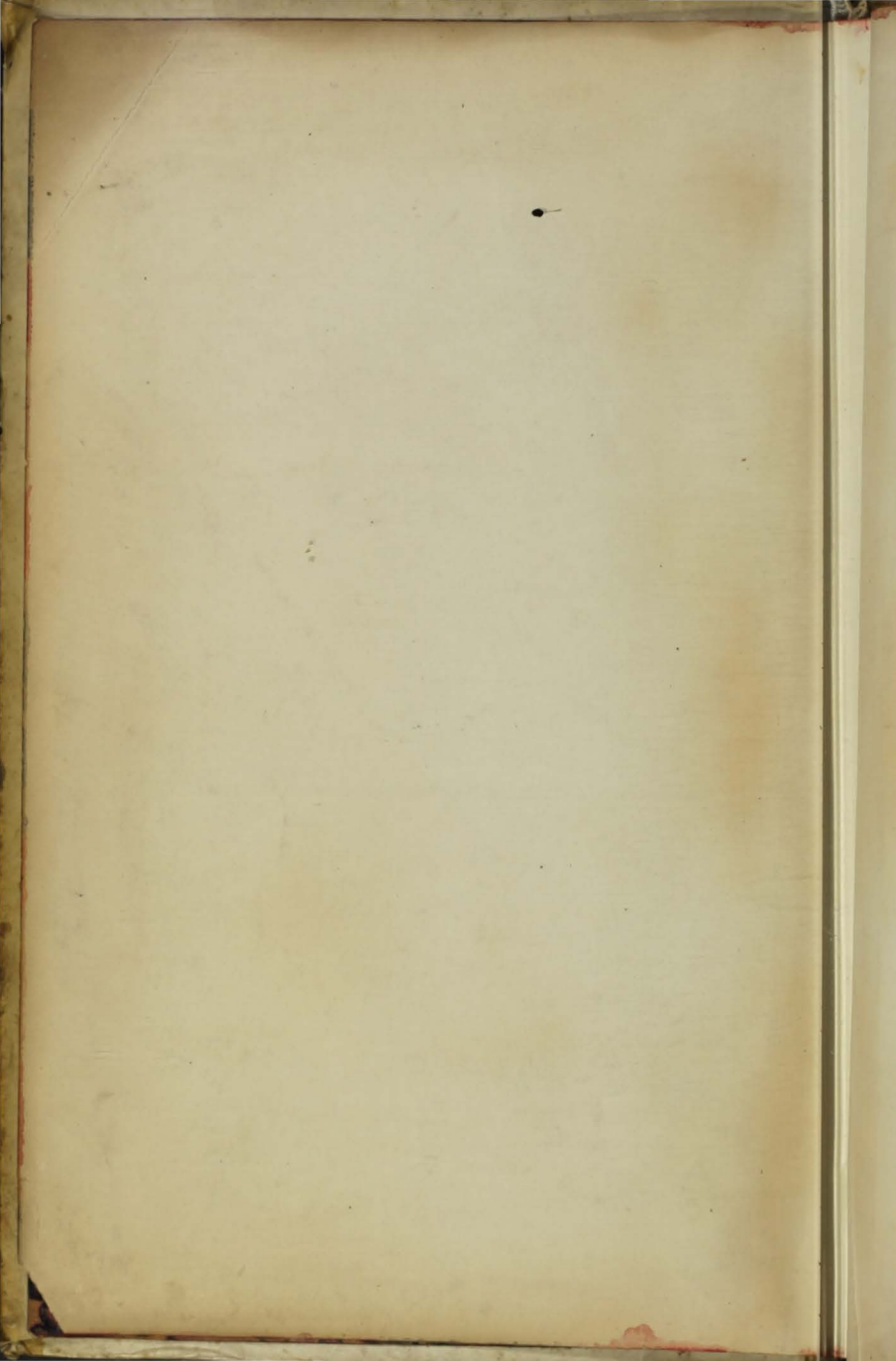

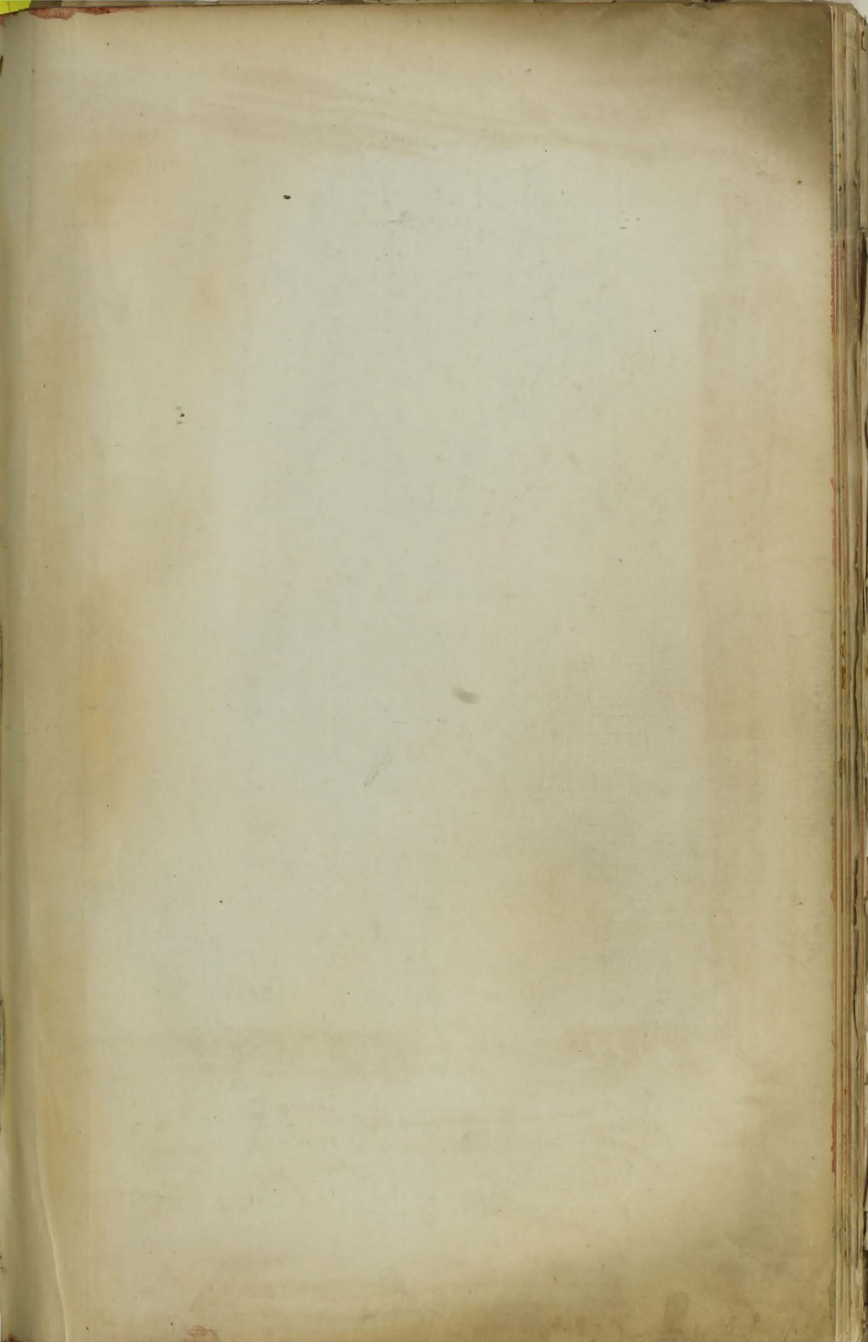

The Annual Report was adopted.

4. Treasurer's Report.

The Report and Statement of Accounts were moved by the Hon. Treasurer and, after discussion, were adopted.

5. Auditors

It was moved by the Hon. Treasurer and resolved that Messrs Pegg, Robertson, Antrobus & Co., be warmly thanked for their services in the past year and be asked to act as Auditors for 1949-50.

6. On behalf of the Executive Committee, the Vice-chairman moved the following resolution on the forthcoming General Election:-

"That this Annual General Meeting calls on all members of the Society to work for victory of the Labour Party in the coming General Election."

It was carried unanimously.

7. (a) On behalf of the Executive Committee, H.D.Hughes moved the following resolution:-

"That this Annual General Meeting confirms and approves the changes made in the Rules of the Society by the Postal Ballot held in April, 1949."

- (b) The following amendment was moved by Hugh Jenkins:-

"This Annual General Meeting of the Fabian Society DECLARES THAT the Rules of the Society were not changed by the postal ballot which took place this year.

Rule 5 of the Rules-as amended at the Annual General Meeting and which we now confirm to be still in force, states:-

"No alteration of or addition to the Rules shall be made save at the Annual Meeting or at a special general meeting convened solely for that purpose. Any alteration of or addition to Rules 1 - 6 shall be adopted only if supported by not less than three-quarters of the members present at such an annual or special meeting". This Annual General Meeting therefore rejects the attempt of the Executive Committee to change the rules by unconstitutional means and FURTHER DECLARES THAT the by-laws enacted under the unconstitutional rules have no valid existence".

(c) The following amendment was moved by E.S. Napier:-

"This Annual General Meeting of the Fabian Society, WHILE prepared to ratify, as an emergency measure necessary to meet a specific problem, the Amendments to Rules adopted as the result of the postal ballot of membership held in 1949.

- (1) PLACES ON RECORD its displeasure with the procedure followed by the Executive Committee;
- (2) ASSERTS THE PARAMOUNT RIGHT of Annual General Meetings to consider, adopt, amend, or reject, all amendments to the Society's constitution (Rules), and to ratify, amend, or reject any By-Laws introduced by the Executive Committee thereunder;

After debate, Mr. Jenkins' Amendment was defeated by 57 votes to 25, Mr. Napier's amendment was defeated on a show of hands and the Executive Resolution was carried by 53 votes to 34.

Mr. Napier's amendment was declared lost on a show of hands. The Executive amendment was passed, became the substantive motion and was carried.

## RESOLUTION

for the Annual General Meeting of the Fabian Society, Saturday 26th November, 1949.

"That the following Rules shall be and hereby are, adopted  
as the Rules of the FABIAN SOCIETY.

## RULES

1. The name of the Society shall be the FABIAN SOCIETY.
2. The Society consists of Socialists. It therefore aims at the establishment of a society in which equality of opportunity will be assured and the economic power and privileges of individuals and classes abolished through the collective ownership and democratic control of the economic resources of the community. It seeks to secure these ends by the methods of political democracy. The Society, believing in equal citizenship in the fullest sense, is open to persons irrespective of sex, race or creed, who commit themselves to its aims and purposes and undertake to promote its work. The Society shall be affiliated to the Labour Party. Its activities shall be the furtherance of socialism and the education of the public on socialist lines, by the holding of meetings, lectures, discussion groups, conferences and summer schools, the promotion of research into political, economic and social problems, national and international, the publication of books, pamphlets and periodicals, and by any other appropriate methods.
3. The Society as a whole shall have no collective policy beyond what is implied in Rule 2; its research shall be free and objective in its methods. No resolution of a political character expressing an opinion or calling for action, other than in relation to the running of the Society itself, shall be put forward in the name of the Society. Delegates to conferences of the Labour Party, or to any other conference, shall be appointed by the National Executive Committee without any mandatory instructions.
4. The Society shall consist of a national society and of local societies. The national society shall comprise persons resident anywhere in the United Kingdom. Local societies may be formed at any place or locality in the United Kingdom and shall comprise persons resident at or near such place or locality.
5. Membership of the national society and of any local society shall be open to all those willing to accept the Rules of the Society. No member shall be eligible to become a member of the National Executive Committee or of the Executive Committee of a local society if he is ineligible for individual membership of the Labour Party on grounds other than of nationality. Any person in general sympathy with the objects of the Society may become an Associate of the national society or of a local society but shall have no voting rights or be eligible for membership of the National Executive Committee or the Executive Committee of the local society. Federations of Labour Parties, Branch, Divisional, and local L.P.'s, Trade Unions and their branches, Co-operative organisations or other bodies may become subscribing bodies to the national society or to a local society. Acceptance of all candidates shall be subject to confirmation of the N.E.C. or the E.C. of the local society. The N.E.C. may elect honorary members of the Society who shall not however be entitled to vote or to take part in General or Special General Meetings of the Society.
6. The Society shall be governed by an Annual General Meeting of the members of the national society and of the local societies to be held at a time and place determined by the N.E.C. Notice of the date and place of the A.G.M. shall be given through Fabian News, or otherwise, not less than six weeks before the meeting; the Agenda, including Resolutions sent in by members, and copies of the Annual Report shall be circulated not less than a fortnight before the meeting. Notice of amendments must reach the Central Office at least three days before the meeting. Special General Meetings to discuss any resolution may be called at any time by the N.E.C. and shall be called by the N.E.C. as soon as convenient on receipt by the General Secretary of a requisition signed by not less than 100 members of the national society or of the local societies.



17

In the event of such A.G.M. being called the N.E.C. shall order the resolutions to be circulated not less than 14 days before the meeting. Notices of amendments must reach the Central Office at least three days before the meeting.

No resolution altering or adding to Rules 1 - 6 shall be passed save at the A.G.M. or at a S.G.M. called for such purpose. Any alteration of or addition to Rules 1 - 6 shall be adopted only if supported by not less than three quarters of the members present at such A.G.M. or S.G.M. All members of the National Society and of the local societies shall have the right to attend and vote at any A.G.M. or S.G.M. Associates and one representative from each subscribing body shall have the right to attend unless by resolution of the Meeting specially excluded from any private session, but shall have no right to vote.

The N.E.C. may, and shall on the requisition signed by not less than 100 members of the national society or of the local societies, refer any question except any question involving any alteration, amendment or addition to the Rules of the Society to the decision by postal ballot of all members entitled to vote in the election of the N.E.C.

- 7. The N.E.C. including Honorary Officers shall consist of not more than 24 members and an Honorary Treasurer.

The N.E.C. shall hold office for one year.

18 members of the N.E.C. and the Honorary Treasurer shall be elected in the following manner:

12 members of the N.E.C. shall be elected by the members of the national Society. Any member of the national Society qualified under Rule 5 who has been a member of the national society for not less than 2 years shall be eligible for election.

6 members of the N.E.C. shall be elected by the members of the local Societies. Any member of a local society qualified under Rule 5 who has been a member of such local society for not less than 2 years shall be eligible for election.

The Honorary Treasurer shall be elected separately by the members of the National Society and of the local societies together. Any member of the national society qualified under Rule 5 who has been a member of the National society for not less than 3 years shall be eligible for election to this office.

The elected members of the N.E.C. shall have the right to elect not more than 6 other members from amongst the members of the national society and of the local societies to serve for the remainder of the year.

Vacancies occurring during the year amongst the members of N.E.C. elected on the national society list or on the local society list shall be filled successively by the remaining candidates on the national society and local society lists. Any vacancies occurring by expiration of these lists, and any vacancies occurring amongst the co-opted members of the N.E.C. may be filled by the N.E.C. by further elections.

The N.E.C. shall elect from amongst its members such further honorary officers for the year as it thinks necessary.

Seven members shall be a quorum for the N.E.C.

Any member absent from four consecutive meetings of the N.E.C. without obtaining leave of absence shall upon a resolution being passed by the N.E.C. be deemed to have vacated his seat on the N.E.C.

- 8. The N.E.C. shall be elected by postal ballot each year before the A.G.M. of the Society.

The new N.E.C. shall come into office immediately after the A.G.M.

Nominations for the 12 members to be elected on the national society list, and for the 6 members to be elected on the Local Society list, and for the Hon. Treasurer shall be received at the Central Office at least one month before voting papers are due to be sent out.

All nominations must be supported by at least five members of the national society or of a local society.

Candidates may offer themselves for election, if qualified, on either the national society list, or the local society list, or for the office of Hon. Treasurer, but not in more than one of these capacities at the same election.

The Central Office shall distribute to all members of the national society voting papers for the 12 members to be elected on national society list, and separately to the members of the local societies voting papers for the 6 members

on the local society list. The voting papers shall be distributed not less than one month before the A.G.M. and shall be returnable to the Central Office within 21 days. Candidates for Hon. Treasurer of the Society shall be listed separately on both the national society and the local society voting papers and all votes cast for the candidates shall be counted together. Scrutineers shall be appointed by the N.E.C. who shall supervise the ballot, open the ballot boxes, count the votes and certify to the General Secretary of the Society the number of votes polled.

9. The N.E.C. shall subject to the decision of any A.G.M. or S.G.M. have full control over the affairs of the Society. Any question of interpretation of the Rules shall be settled by the N.E.C. subject to a reference of any such question to an A.G.M. or S.G.M. in accordance with Rule 6.
10. The N.E.C. shall conduct the general business of the national society, appoint such paid officers and staff as it deems necessary, create from amongst the members of the Society such sub-committees, groups and other bodies as are considered desirable from time to time and appoint all delegates to represent the Society. Any temporary or standing committee formed by the N.E.C. shall be given terms of reference and may be authorised by the N.E.C. to coopt further members from amongst the members of the Society. All appointments may be terminated by the N.E.C. at any time. The N.E.C. shall not delegate to any such committee the powers conferred upon the N.E.C. by Rule 9. No book, pamphlet or tract submitted to the national society shall be published by the Society unless approved as of suitable standard according to the Rules made by the N.E.C. All publications shall bear a clear indication that they do not represent the collective views of the Society but only the views of the authors.
11. The N.E.C. shall have power to elect from amongst the members of the Society a President and not more than 6 vice-presidents of the Society to serve for the remainder of the year. Members of the N.E.C. elected to any of these offices must vacate their seat on the N.E.C.
12. The N.E.C. shall have power to recognise any local society that has been formed and to approve its rules. No group shall be recognised as a Local Society unless it has a minimum of 10 members qualified under Rule 5 (1). The rules of a Local Society shall not contain any provisions which are contrary to the provisions of Rules 1 - 5. Local societies shall subscribe a minimum of 10/6 yearly to the Central Office and shall also pay an affiliation fee of 1/- a year for every member over and above the first 10 members. In the event of a local society failing to pay its dues to the Central Office, or adopting rules or policies contrary to those of the Society as a whole, the N.E.C. shall have the power to suspend its recognition of the local society until the next A.G.M. of the society or, subject to the right of the local society to an appeal to the next A.G.M. of the Society, to cancel the recognition altogether.
13. Local societies may form Regional Committees comprising local societies in particular regions or areas. The Regional committees shall consist of delegates from the local societies of their region or area who shall determine the rules and activities of the Committee. The Regional Committee shall have power to levy annual contributions from their affiliated local societies.
14. Members are expected to subscribe to the funds of the Society annually in accordance with their means. The minimum annual subscription for members, associates and subscribing bodies of the national society shall be 20/- which shall entitle the subscriber to receive a copy of Fabian News and of all pamphlets priced 6d. or less issued by the national society.

(18)

A subscription of 30/- or more shall in addition entitle the subscriber to a copy of all pamphlets priced 1/- or less; a subscription of 50/- or more also to a copy of all pamphlets priced 2/- or less. A subscription of 60/- or more shall in addition make the subscriber a member of the International and the Colonial Bureaux of the Society receiving all pamphlets and publications to which the Bureau members are entitled. Persons undergoing a full-time course of instruction and members of the ranks of H.M. Forces shall be allowed to be members for the period in which they are so engaged for an annual subscription of half the rate applicable in each category.

The N.E.C. shall have power in special cases to decide that a particular pamphlet shall be issued to either a greater or a lesser number of members than is specified in this rule.

The minimum annual subscription for members, associates and subscribing bodies of local societies shall be 5/-.

Members of local societies outside the Metropolitan Police area who are not also members of the national society shall have the right to attend the activities of the national society at the same rates as members of the national society.

The N.E.C., and the E.C. of a local society, shall have the right to strike off the books any member, associate or subscribing body who after notice fails to pay his subscription.

The office should discuss with Allen and Unwin the possibility of holding up the paper-covered edition in the meantime. Paper covered copies to be distributed free to 60/- members and International Bureau.
