

DEAR SIR OR MADAM,

We earnestly ask you to read this letter carefully, and having done so, we trust you will then give our Committee such co-operation and practical sympathy as it may be in your power to extend to them in their united effort to grapple with work of such an important and extensive character as that which they have undertaken.

We may briefly describe how the work originated a couple of years ago, and in doing so condense some valuable statements made from time to time by Mr. Henry C. Burdett, the Chairman of the Mansion House Executive Committee.

Early in 1893, the then Lord Mayor, Sir Stuart Knill, summoned a Conference at the Mansion House of the titular heads of the churches and religious communities in London and various representative laymen, to consider how far it was possible to secure the following objects:—

- 1.—The union of all religious organisations in each district, for the purpose of grappling with poverty by systematic visitation, and avoiding overlapping.
- 2.—The formation of an inter-denominational representation committee in each district, with the members of Parliament and the London county councillors, or some other representative laymen, as chairman and vice-chairman respectively, to organise and direct the work in the manner best adapted for the district.

A committee was appointed to discuss these questions; and, after much deliberation and correspondence, it formulated a report, which embodied the following resolution:—

"That this conference, representing various religious communities, is of opinion that the best way to discover and meet the sufferings of the poor in London is by concerted action of all the religious and benevolent agencies in the several parishes; and, therefore, suggests that some such mode of co-operation as has worked successfully in North Kensington, under the name of "The Friendly Workers among the Poor," should be formed as opportunity may serve in the different districts of London, by central committees representative of all denominations."

The committee further reported, as the result of their enquiries, that it was possible in many districts of the metropolis to secure the co-operation of all the religious and charitable agencies for the relief of poverty in the metropolis.

On the 12th of December, 1893, another meeting of the conference was held at the Mansion House, under the presidency of the Lord Bishop of London, to consider the report of the committee. A resolution was then passed empowering the committee to take steps in conjunction with all the religious and benevolent agencies in four areas other than North Kensington favourable to the present attempt, with a view to the establishment of the necessary machinery for carrying the Friendly Workers' scheme into operation at once.

In pursuance of the last-mentioned resolution, negotiations have during the present year, been opened in various quarters with the view of securing four areas other than North Kensington, in which an attempt may be made to establish the scheme advocated by the committee.

The Mansion House Executive Committee is most representative, and embraces, as members, Henry C. Burdett, chairman, The Right Rev The Bishop of Stepney, The Very Rev. The Chief Rabbi, The Rev. J. F. Kitto, The Rev J. Clifford, D.D., The Rev. J. Monro Gibson, D.D., The Rev. R. F. Horton, The Rev. E. E. Jenkins, G. W. Potter, M.D., Edwin P. Smith, A. A. Longstaffe and L. S. Bristowe, hon. secs., and Edgar Speyer, treasurer.

The results of the preliminary negotiations have been very encouraging; and the committee have now selected three areas, viz:—Spitalfields, Haggerston, Soho and Drury Lane. Chairmen and Hon. Secretaries for these areas have been appointed and the initial work is now being rapidly pushed forward. To those who would like to understand in detail the entire Scheme we heartily commend two pamphlets, one is entitled "The Cure of Poverty," by Mrs. C. G. Furley Smith, and the other "The Problem of the Poor in London," by Mr. Henry C. Burdett. Both pamphlets are most interesting, practical and sympathetic, they can be had at The Scientific Press, Limited, 428 Strand, W.C.

Briefly, the outline of the Scheme is this:—The portion of Haggerston we intend to work at present will comprise a population of about 25,000 persons. It will be worked by a District Committee representative of all the religious denominations within the area. This Committee has just been formed, and will meet at St. Mary's Institute, Mansfield Street, every Tuesday evening at 5 o'clock.

The object will be to obtain a census of the population in the autumn of each year, and to acquire full knowledge of the needs of the poor in our area, and of their circumstances and character. This knowledge we hope to obtain through an organised body of Friendly Workers. Our efforts will be directed towards relieving the deserving poor. Our special aim will be to provide work, and assist in such a way as to enable them to become independent.

We will work through existing institutions. We wish to utilise such to the very utmost: to supplement, not to supplant any charity or organisations now working. Each society, hospital, and board of guardians will be left free to do its own work in its own way.

We hope to prevent overlapping, to adapt assistance to the necessities of each case, and detect imposture.

Mr. Burdett has very strikingly said that charity must do four things :-

- 1.—Relieve worthy need promptly, fittingly, and tenderly.
- 2.—Prevent unwise alms to the unworthy.
- 3.—Raise into independence every needy person, where this is possible.
- 4.—Make sure that no children grow up to be paupers.

To accomplish this, it will at once be apparent that there must be close and regular intercourse between charitable workers. Our Office and Committee will afford opportunity for such intercourse. It will be a main object with us and our Friendly Workers to know the poor personally and as friends, and so to win their confidence, that in the time of trouble they will naturally turn to our Workers, and know they will get sympathetic and just treatment.

Money is valuable and needful, but it does not do everything! It is machinery, but without hand, heart and brain behind it, the most finely polished machinery is of little use! We therefore lay special emphasis on the fact that by our Friendly Workers we hope to prove to the poor that in these they will find genuine friends, to whom they can turn in the hour of anxiety, and who will gladly take trouble to give them advice, and seek for them information which they themselves could not possibly obtain.

Many a poor man and woman needs a little kind brotherly or sisterly advice and sympathy, which no money could bestow; Alms are good but can never take the place of a heart of love.

We ask your fullest sympathy, your support and your interest in this large burden of work. Give us a little of your time, your thoughts, and your means, the one if not the other. Friendly Workers we need, Gentlemen as well as Gentlewomen, and other tactful workers, who will by careful forethought contrive and plan so as to spare a little time for the Poor, their wants and their needs. Offer us your kind services, and you will soon find "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

We hope some of our Committee may soon have the pleasure of calling on you, but if delayed, please pay us a visit at our Office.

THE FOLLOWING ARE EXAMPLES OF CASES DEALT WITH.

Poor woman, aged thirty-six, applied to Association for assistance, as her husband had suddenly developed signs of insanity. Advised her what steps to take, and set in work the parish machinery. Ultimately the man was taken to Claybury Asylum. This occurred in the depth of winter, and therefore the Committee helped the woman and four little children (one a cripple) for several weeks, by contributing towards rent and support. Eventually work was procured for the woman, who is now able, thanks to the timely assistance of the Society, to maintain herself and children.

A young widow, five children. Had small shop, outgoings considerable and profits so small, had got into debt with tobacconist and other dealers. Society succeeded in getting two of the children into Homes. They granted 5/- to buy more stock, and advanced 10/- for same purpose. The loan is being repaid regularly, and, being relieved of the burden of two children, is now able to maintain herself and other children.

Man, thirty. Recovering from severe attack of rheumatic fever. Needed change of air before he could possibly be fit for work. Got him into Convalescent Home by the sea, paid railway fare, arrears of insurance, and contributed 10/- a week for three weeks towards support of wife and four children. Man returned restored to health, and able to resume work. Was very grateful and thankful for the help given.

Case of man, aged seventy-eight. Cabman for forty years. Now affected with rheumatism, unable to mount box. For last twelve months of life wife supported the home. At her death the only resource appeared the Workhouse. The Committee interested themselves in the case, and obtained from brother 2/6 a week, also a 1/- a week from a niece. The Association gives 1/- a week, and have obtained subscriptions from their

friends amounting to 3/- a week, making a pension of 7/6 a week. The gratitude of the poor man saved from the Workhouse repays all efforts made on his behalf.

Case of highly respectable young married man, aged thirty. Formerly kept a small shop for the sale of curios. A fire occurred at adjoining premises whereby his stock was destroyed. The loss fell entirely on the poor man, as he had not insured his property. Helped with a loan of \pounds_2 , and gave him 10/-. He has already paid off \pounds_1 of loan, and has succeeded by the help before mentioned, to maintain himself and wife.

A cripple, only walks with crutches. Required a surgical instrument—practically a steel leg. Society obtained estimate for cost of instrument required, viz, £6 10s. They obtained half the amount from the Sunday Hospital Fund, contributed £2, and made a loan to man for balance. The appliance proved a success, and man now able to work and maintain himself and family. This is a case where, had the Society not given the necessary assistance to the man, he would have become an inmate of the Workhouse.

## MEMORANDA OF SECOND ANNIVERSARY.

The Second Anniversary was commenced on Saturday evening May 9th with an open air Protestant Demonstration parading the District, in which two Brass Bands took part.

On Sunday, May 10th, 1896, Sermons and an Address was delivered in the United Methodist Free Church, Willow Street, Shoreditch, kindly lent by the Trustees.

11.0 a.m., the Rev. James Whittles, pastor, Subject: "Rooted Up." Text, Mathew xv., 13. Scripture Reading before Sermon, Mathew xv., 2 Thes. ii.

3.0 p.m., Address by Mr. Walter Walsh, Subject: "Reasons for Opposing Ritualism." Scripture Reading before Address, 1 Timothy iv., Mr. J. J. Hunt in the Chair.

6.30 p.m., Mr. W. H. TAYLOR, President, Subject: "The Protestant Angel in Heaven." Text, Rev. xiv., 6-7. Scripture Reading before Sermon, part of Psalm exix.; Ephes. iv.

Monday, May 11th. Tea and Public Meeting, 6.15. Tea was provided in the Schoolroom at which 72 Members, Friends and Speakers sat down. At 7.45 our President proceeded to the platform accompanied by General Sir Robert Phayre, G.C.B., Rev. Dr. Hamilton, Messrs. John Kensit, G. L. Mickleburg, (Church of England); Pastors W. Cuff, Phillip Reynolds, and G. L. Collins (Baptist); Pastor James Whittles, Mr. E. Widdowson, and J. J. Hunt, (Free Methodist); A. H. Guinness, Esq., Charles Hastings Collette, Esq., Rev. C. Stirling, M.A., Messrs. Job Williams, T. W. Cook, C. W. Brabner, and F. Watson. A well-known hymn was heartily sung, and prayer offered by Rev. C. Stirling. The Chairman then gave utterance to a few but very important and appreciative remarks. The Secretary, Mr. Frederick Watson, then read the Report. (See Page 5.)

A. H. Guinness, Esq., Secretary of the Parent Society, moved the following Resolution:

"That this meeting gratefully acknowledges the goodness of God in sustaining the operations of this Shoreditch Branch of the Protestant Alliance during the year now past, and Resolves that the Report now read be adopted, printed and circulated under the direction of the Committee."

General Sir Robert Phayre, was called upon to second the same. Before so doing he read correspondence which the Secretary had received from Lord Robert Montagu with a donation of £2; Surgeon-Gen. Partridge, £2; Miss H. M. DEAKIN, of Sheffield, £5; also Telegram from T. A. DENNY, Esq., with a promise of £5, each one regretting inability to attend. The General then seconded the Resolution, which, when submitted to the meeting, was unanimously carried.

The Treasurer, Mr. T. W. Cook, then read his Financial Statement, and the Collection was taken.

The Rev. Dr. Hamilton moved the second Resolution:

"That the present attitude and work of nearly the whole of the so called 'priests' of the Church of England in Shoreditch is that of Romanist. Such treachery, introduced into what should be sacred soul-saving work is to be deplored and repudiated by every honest Christian man and woman; as by taking Protestant pay to help them to do the work of the apostate Church of Rome, they are imperilling the moral, spiritual, and commercial safety and prosperity of this our beloved Country, for whose Liberty and Freedom from Ecclesiastical bondage and control our Forefathers suffered the loss of all things even to ignominy and death; and that this Meeting pledges itself to do its utmost to maintain for ourselves and our children an Open Bible with the liberty of conscience and speech so dearly bought for us by such Protestant Reformers, as WYCLIFFE, LUTHER, TYNDAL and MELANCTHON, and such Martyrs as LATIMER, RIDLEY, BRADFORD, HOOPER and many

The Rev. James Whittles seconded the Resolution, which was supported by Rev. W. CUFF, Rev. PHILLIP REYNOLDS, Mr. John Kensit, and was carried with acclamation.

Mr. C. W. Brabner moved the Third Resolution:-"That the hearty thanks of this Mceting be accorded to the President for presiding, to the Trustees of Willow Street Chapel, to the Speakers, including Preachers, Mr. Walter Walsh and all who have rendered help so as to make the Second Anniversary a success."

This was seconded by Mr. E. Widdowson, supported and put to the Meeting by Mr. G. L. Collins, and unanimously carried.

Rev. James Whittles closed this successful and memorable meeting with prayer. A prayer sent us from Rev. Dr. GRITTON, of Trinity Chapel, Devonshire Road, we hope has been been answered: -

# SECOND ANNUAL REPORT.

To our Members, Subscribers and Friends.

HE Committee in presenting its Second Annual Report of the Shoreditch Branch of the Protestant Alliance do so in the name of God, for they have again and again gone "with boldness to the Throne of Grace" and sought that divine guidance of His Spirit in the attempts made to maintain our blood-bought Liberties and the cause of Truth as it is in Jesus, our Lord, during the year now past, in this district known as the "Rural Deanery of Shoreditch."

Immediately following the Election of Officials and Committee our 1st Lecture was delivered on July 16th, 1895, by Mr. Job Williams, Subject: "The Confessional Unmasked," to an overcrowded school-room of men. (See page 10.)

October, 1895, your Committee's attention was drawn to a See two public announcement of a three months' Ritualistic adventure in page bill the church of St. Columba, Kingsland Road. They were amused neither alarmed nor fearful, as it was clear the Shoreditch fund Protestant Protest had been effective. This Ritualistic effort kantales we understood as an indirect cry "the Church, the Shoreditch or lestures Churches are in danger," and a host of full-fledged Romanisers as from all quarters, comprising Canons, Bishop, Principals, and a Columba, few so called "fathers" came and delivered a course of 16 "I he fach lectures. Not one of this number was delivered by any of the local clergy.

The Committee issued an important Circular to the Nonconformist Ministers of Shoreditch with a programme of lecturers' subjects, which gave our Protestant Pastors an opportunity to direct the attention of their hearers to what was going on in their midst.

September 11th, 1895. Our Second Members' Meeting was held at the Shoreditch Town Hall when a most interesting and instructive paper was read by Mr. W. Bull, entitled: "Refreshing Echoes of the Past."

November, 1895. Two of our number, namely Mr. T. W. Cook ("Protestant Contingent") and Mr. Kensit, attended a Shoreditch Conference of clergy, called by the Rural Dean at the Shoreditch Church Vestry, at which the Lord Bishop of London was present,—and "peppered" the whole assembly which was "speechless." (See pages 10 and 11.)

December 11th, 1895. A Third Members' Meeting at the Shoreditch Town Hall, when Mr. C. W. Brabner re-delivered an address by Dr. CLIFFORD, M.A., entitled: "The Renewal of Protestantism." A Resolution acknowledging the value of this Address, to be forwarded to the Rev. Dr. CLIFFORD, was carried.

The early part of the year 1896 this district was threatened with the Ritualistic processions nuisance parading our streets. Your Committee, however, were equal to the occasion, scattering broadcast leaflets headed, "Lent," "Good Friday," &c., &c., the result of which, we rejoice to say, opened the understanding of many who hitherto had thought that these Ritualists were "trying to do good," but are now convinced of their evil practices; and a good number of our Members, with Members of the Protestant Defence Brigade under Mr. JOHN KENSIT, conducted vigorous open-air meetings as a protest. (See page 12.)

The Women's Section have held several Meetings in the Town Hall, the outcome of which is that the Branch has determined to form a Circulating Library as soon as a central and convenient room can be secured. Books in support of our work will be thankfully received by any of the Officers. Already 20 Volumes have been promised.

Tracts and Leaflets, &c., have been freely though carefully circulated throughout these Ritualistic parishes by our friends and members, with very satisfactory results, namely, that children have been transferred from "priestly" schools to those schools where they are taught from an Open Bible; and one of our Nonconformist Pastors has been written to by one of the sacerdotalists protesting against the heretical work we are doing.

The Committee desire to remark that they feel greatly indebted to the Branch Treasurer, Mr. T. W. Cook not only for a continued advance of funds; but that he with a liberal hand has printed and circulated many thousands of leaflets to parents in Shoreditch. He having lived and worked in the district for more than 25 years, feels greatly interested in the maintenance of Protestantism, and this Literature has been read with good results following.

The Committee in conclusion, remind the Members that their Subscriptions are now due, and hope that each one will endeavour to secure additional Members-Subscription 1/upwards. Also we have a goodly number of a Pamphlet by Mr. JOB WILLIAMS, entitled: "The Power of the Keys." Every Preacher of the Gospel, and every Bible-class Teacher should read it; can be had on application to the Branch Officials, 1d. each, post free 11d. As a leading Protestant paper, your Committee recommend "The Protestant Observer," which can be had on application to the Branch Secretary, 1/6 per annum post

The Speeches delivered at the Conference of Nonconformist Ministers in the Shoreditch Tabernacle, January 1895, are in manuscript, and ready to be printed as scon as funds are forthcoming.

The material facts in connection with the purifying of the water of Jericho,-1 Kings, ii., 2,-combined and contrasted, are suggestive to the mind of the spiritual condition of this district; for if our readers will only visit the Churches of England for themselves doubtless they will be convinced that there is reason in the interest of the children to raise a cry in the language addressed by the men of Jericho to Elisha the prophet of the Lord, and say, -"The situation of this district is pleasant, with a multiplicity of buildings erected for Worship, but, in too true a sense, the water is nought and the ground is

## Some Encouraging Results.

Among those who attended the Lecture by Mr. Job WILLIAMS, on July 16th, 1895, was one of the Shoreditch "priestly" bachelors who prior to the lecture asked permission to take his seat on the platform, "as he had come expressly to reply at the close." Mr. WILLIAMS welcomed him, but your Committee refused him a seat on the platform, offering him a comfortable seat with those who had come to hear. Doubtless he did hear something from his own authors, which could not but make him reconsider his position, providing that any disposition to do so was left in him. However, no sooner was the Lecture over than a goodly number of men arose and in manly manner asked questions. Satisfactory answers were given, and the place rung again with applause; but not a word from this "cleric;' yea, he "was speechless," and at the earliest convenient moment he buttoned up his coat, gathered up his papers and book, &c., and made his exit. The lecturer did not spare bachelor "priests" whose ambition is to become anglican "fathers."

In our First Annual Report, page 5, we reported that our Treasurer, Mr. T. W. Cook, met the Romish lecturers, face to face on their own platform at our Shoreditch Town Hall, and in this our second we report that Mr. T. W. Cook also met the Lord Bishop of London, the (? R) "catholic Rural Dean" and the clergy of Shoreditch face to face at the Deanery as follows:

## "Peppering the Bishop."

An incident occurred a few weeks ago, says The Ventilator, in its issue of January last, which, if it had not been inexpressibly sad would have been indescribably comic:—

"We gather from a report in the Hackney Express and Shoreditch Observer that on Friday, November 29th, 1895, the Bishop of London 11

paid his annual visit to Shoreditch,—his Ruri-Decanal visit,—and invitations to clergy and laity were issued to meet his Lordship at the large Vestry of Shoreditch Church. The subject for conversation was announced as "How to deal with children who have passed through the Elementary Schools," and we learn that about 100 persons assembled on this auspicious occasion to meet his Lordship and to discuss the important Question involved in the announced subject, which, according to the report already referred to, was gone through very satisfactorily.

"But this evidently "rosy" report concluded thus:—"Mr. John Kensit was present with a strong Protestant contingent and peppered the Bishop with endless queries in regard to Protestantism; but he was promptly suppressed by the Rural Dean and ruled out of order by the Bishop."

In connection with this "report" the following letter was inserted in the same paper, signed by "The Contingent," which was no other than the Treasurer of the Shoreditch Branch, Mr. T. W. Cook:—

"Sir,—Will you favour me with space to correct an error in your report of the evening meeting of the above Conference, namely, "that Mr. John Kensit was present with a strong Protestant contingent, and peppered the Bishop with endless queries in regard to Protestantism, but he was promptly suppressed by the Rural Dean and ruled out of order by the Bishop."

"In the first place the "strong contingent" was one person only, Mr. Kensit alone accompanying me. This can be fully borne out by the two churchwardens sitting in the same seat, who as you say, assisted in comfortably scating the audience. Next, the remark as to peppering the Bishop with endless queries on Protestantism is scarcely accurate description or comment upon what took place, for after a personal reference to my own work among both young people and adults in the parish for over twenty years I remarked upon the omission from the speeches of the Clergy present of any reference to the teaching for the children's souls, but for their bodies only. This in my judgment being so important a point to overlook, I asked, "Does my Lord know that the confessional is set up and taught as the only means by which to secure the forgiveness of sins in some Churches of our parish? that papers headed "confession" were given to children as well as adults having certain forms of sin mentioned thereon with spaces for answers to be written in whether or no those sins had been committed; such papers to be then taken to the "priest" who after hearing the confession will absolve. Those papers I told my Lord I had in my pocket.

"I said further Does my Lord know and approve of the rosary being

"I said further Does my Lord know and approve of the rosary being used in certain Churches in the parish as a help to prayer, and I showed one of these rosaries that had come from one of our Churches and which had been so used. I further said, Does my Lord know that the children here are taught that at the ringing of certain bells at the Churches they are to lift their hats and say "Hail Mary" in honour of the Virgin Mary, and I asked was not this real Popews?

was not this real Popery?

"This was the so-called peppering of the Bishop with endless questions on Protestantism, which I thought was not so much to do with Protestantism as with Ritualism and Popery. May I add that the Rural Dean did not attempt to suppress what I had to say, for my remarks, imperfect though they were, were listened to quietly till I had done, and not one of the Clergy present aftempted to say a word to justify themselves or to deny the accuracy of my

statements but acted like the man who got into the feast without the wedding garment,-they were speechless.

"If any one says this is not correct, it will be better that the Bishop be respectfully asked to say which is right, this version of my statements, or that you supplied in your paper.

"After my address my friend Mr. KENSIT rose to speak, but was objected to by the Rural Dean, sustained by the Bishop, who intimated that another opportunity might be offered, for which Mr. Kensit expressed his thanks. THE "CONTINGENT."

"Yet these men," remarks The Ventilator, "charged to their faces before their Bishop with conniving at and teaching rank Popery, are still taking the salaries provided to pay men to support and teach the Protestantism of the Reformed Church of England: and, says The "CONTINGENT," not one of the clergy present attempted to say a word to justify themselves or to deny the accuracy of my statements but acted like the man who got into the feast without the wedding garment,-they were speechless."

Further comment on this significant incident is needless.

#### Collapse of Ritualistic Processions.

During Lent it was intended to parade the streets of Hoxton each week by a procession from St. Columba's Church. On their appearance, with raised crucifix and the swinging of incense at the image thereon the Vicar arrayed in red, thus provoking the parishioners and the Jews in particular, they met with severe opposition, and instead of turning out four times during Lent, three nights they deemed it most prudent to stay at home, and it was not till Good Friday evening that they made their second appearance, with cross (minus image) and incense, choir boys and the men, and the vicar all arrayed in white. Though the procession was not so provoking yet the opposition was more intense, and but for the extraordinary force of police, the laundress might have been made busy by the great need for the washing of garments which would have been

#### The Educational Bill, and the Shoreditch Protest.

December 10th 1895, and May 19th, 1896, meetings were held in the Town Hall, at which resolutions were passed condemning the Bill of the Government as a "Raid on our Board Schools," and demanding its withdrawal till it had been submitted to the people of England. Although these meetings cannot be claimed as directly Protestant work, they were promoted by one of our workers, and five of the speakers were our Vice-Presidents. Though this district is flooded with sacerdotalists and sacramentalists in whose sectarian interests the "Dead Bill" was promoted not one of them made an appearance to speak in support of the Measure.

A National Protestant Party.

Though not distinctly the work of the Shoreditch Branch Alliance, the Committee feel pleasure in giving prominence to the vigorous principles embodied in the proposal for a National Protestant Party provided by the Protestant Voter's Pledge given on pages 14 and 15, emanating as it does from one of their comrades on the Shoreditch Executive, and having been sent broadcast through the Country from this Shoreditch centre of Protestant activity. The Committee urge our Members to study the paragraphs of the Pledge and earnestly to advocate the out-and-out Protestant Principles therein contained, with a view to influencing their neighbours not only to approve the same but to obtain adherents, supporters and workers in this all-important Cause.

A most notable and monitory fact indicated by the Clergy-List on pages 8 and 9, in the judgment of your Committee, is that nearly the whole of the Shoreditch Clergy have come into this District within the last 10 to 20 years, and that the Popish-Ritualistic developments which have taken place have been thrust upon the people by these new-comers as though by general agreement! This is, however, just how Jesuits do their work and effect their insidious purposes; and this ominous agreement alone should be more than sufficient to open the eyes of the thousands of our too-trusting fellow Protestants to the fact of the presence and activity of these crafty "gentry."

But that is not the worst of it. The people have resented the thrusting upon them of this Popish-Ritualism by neglecting church-going to an awful extent; so that while our 21 so-called Protestant Churches afford accommodation for some 18,000 people to gather for Worship, about two or three of the buildings would comfortably accommodate the whole of the average congregations! Yet nearly £10,000 per year is absorbed in producing the farcical "shows" at these Churches, their unmitigated contempt for which is exhibited by our people in absenting themselves therefrom, thus indicating the rebound from Popery which lands the people in irreligion wherever the wicked Apostacy gets a footing!

Your Committee feel too, that such a fact as this should be pondered more than it is by our Nonconformist Ministers. It is not the first time that the point has been definitely brought under their notice by your Committee: WHAT ARE THEY NOW Going to Do About It?



#### From "THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND ALMANACK."

E.C.U. stands for English Church Union, which was founded in 1859, and is pledged to work for the restoration of Eastward Position, Vestments, Lights, Mixed Chalice, Incense, and Unleavened Bread in the Communion Service of the Church of England! (Church Union Gazette., vol. vi., p. 202.) It has officially advocated, in its Annual Report for 1878, the "restoration of visible communion" between the Church of England and the Church of Rome.

S.S.C. (Societas Sanctae Crucis) stands for Society of the Holy Cross. This, the oldest and most mischievous of the Ritualistic organizations, has been in existence for 36 years. It is composed of clergymen only, or bona fide candidates for Holy Orders, and is a secret Society. It is responsible for that infamous book. "The Priest in Absolution," which Archbp. Tait described as a "disgrace to the community." So fearful is this Society of its members being known, that, since 1880, not a single copy of its yearly printed list of brethren has fallen into Protestant hands!

C.B.S. stands for Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament. It admits both lay and clerical members. A secret "Intercession Paper" is circulated amongst the members every month. The chief objects are the propagation of belief in the Mass and the Real Presence, together with advocacy of Fasting Communion, Prayers and Masses for the Dead, and the Reserved Sacrament.
