# CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

## FINAL REPORT FOR 1902 OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL OF STATISTICS, RELATIVE TO MARRIAGES, BIRTHS AND DEATHS IN THE COLONY.

(THE TABULAR STATEMENTS APPEARED IN G. 67—03.)

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by Command of His Excellency the Governor.  
1903.

### POPULATION.

The number of persons in the Cape Colony, including British Bechuanaland, Pondoland and the Transkei, may be taken to have been 2,501,635 approximately on the 31st December, 1902. For obvious reasons it is impossible to do more at this time than make an estimate in gross. The deferred Census is to be taken in 1904.

### IMMIGRATION AND EMIGRATION.

According to the Customs Department returns—which do not include Naval and Military passengers, and in which children are reckoned at the ordinary scale—the excess of arrivals by sea over departures between the 1st January, 1891 (the census was held in April of that year), and the 31st December, 1902, was 71,057, practically all Europeans.

### ADMINISTRATION.

The provisions of the Act have been carried out, for obvious reasons, since October, 1899, more mildly than ever. In 1895 twenty persons were charged, in 1896 sixty (thirteen being Europeans), in 1897 one hundred and seven (twenty-nine being Europeans), in 1898 one hundred and twenty-four (fifty-five being Europeans), in 1899 two hundred and twenty-one (fifty-four being Europeans), in 1900 one hundred and eighteen (fifty-one being Europeans), with the result that one hundred and eight convictions followed, in 1901 only forty-eight (twenty being Europeans) were charged, with forty convictions, and in 1902 fifty Europeans and forty Coloured persons were accused and 84 convicted.

There are 115 Deputy Registrars all told, the area comprised in their jurisdiction being 276,995 square miles.

An important alteration was made by G.N., No. 763, of 5th November, 1900, in Regulation No. XXIV., and since that date Births can be registered within 7 instead of 5 years.

The only Magistrates who have still (10th August, 1903) retained the appointment of Deputy-Registrar *ex-officio* are the following:—

In the *Colony*—Port Nolloth.

In the *Transkeian Territories*.—Mquanduli and Xalanga.

In all other cases, special appointments are made.

On account of hostilities, there was a complete cessation of registration business, at Murraysburg, from 6th July, 1901, to 16th July, 1902, and Van Rhynsdorp from 16th June, 1901, to 15th June, 1902, while the Calvinia work was interrupted between the 17th February and 16th June, 1902, and the Namaqualand between 16th March and 15th May, 1902.

During the last ten months (October, 1902-August, 1903) some few alterations as to urban areas have been made. *Albertinia* (Riversdale), *Amalinda* (East London), *Gordon's Bay* (Stellenbosch), *Hopefield* (Malmesbury), and *Komgha*—the latter two previously Special Urban Areas,—*Paterson* (Alexandria) and *Maclear*, have by Proclamations Nos. 237, 249, 248, 282 of 1902, and Nos. 131, 142, and 150 of 1903, respectively, been placed under the Village Management Acts. The Native Reserve Location at Port Elizabeth was created a "Special Urban Area" by Proclamation No. 140, 1st May, 1903.



## REGISTRATION OFFICE ROUTINE.

We still, alas, have to record our inability to deal with the subject so often referred to in similar terms, viz., the great task of preparing a *General Alphabetical Index of Names of Persons Born and Died*. The usual staff can only just compass the absolutely necessary work. An important subject connected with Diseases, e.g., *occupations*, cannot be discussed, while only the fringe of the *age* question can be touched. Where then can the indexing of arrear events come in? Errors, and the still more perplexing inconsistencies in *Dates and Names*, continue to take up as much of the time of the staff as ever, not only in Marriage cases, but in Births and Deaths matters, and it is an uphill task to endeavour, in the interests of those who may not be directly concerned for years to come, to rectify reports, while the only persons qualified to amend the same are accessible.

The practice of this Department in regard to the difficult subject of the Names of *Natives* remains the same as that stated in the Preliminary Report for 1896:—

"It is not the policy or intention of this Department to interfere with any distinct native custom. It is simply desired that one definite plan of reporting may be followed. If, therefore, a Christian native woman contracts a marriage, and such marriage is solemnized under the provisions of the Order in Council of 1833, or the marriage Act of 1860, it will surely not be unreasonable to require that when such person comes to report the birth of her child, or the death of her husband, she shall sign the information form in the manner contemplated by the regulations. All that is aimed at is *consistency*. If the Registration system is to be of any value for the purposes of identifying individuals and facilitating the tracing of claims to property, uniformity of practice must be insisted upon."

## TABULATION BY OCCURRENCE DATES.

Reports relative to Births and Deaths are rendered monthly (becoming due on the 16th of each month and now usually arriving within 10 days from such due date), but the *final* results appear according to the *dates of occurrences*, i.e., events that occurred for example in 1895, but were only reported and registered in 1902, being added to the events of 1895, previously accounted for.

## SYSTEM OF REPORTING.

Reports are made by Informants (a) by Forms (b) in Books.

Books are made use of in Locations specially treated, and the native informants have to appear personally before the Deputy-Registrar or the Assistant, and sign the proper Book. In some few Native Districts, where exceptional circumstances obtain, the Headmen or Chiefs are allowed to make periodical bulk statements (*Numerical System*) of the number of males and females born or died in their locations. Transcripts of the book entries are forwarded to the Registrar every month.

In Municipalities, Villages under Board Management, and Special Urban Areas, Births, Still-births and Deaths must be reported in person to the Deputy-Registrar or Assistant, in whose presence the Informant must sign the Registration forms; otherwise the forms must be declared to before a J.P., Minister, or Medical Man. Outside Municipalities, Villages under Board Management, and Special Urban Areas, the Informants must appear personally before the Deputy-Registrar, or Assistant, or Field-cornet, or any Police Officer, and sign the forms, or must have them declared to, or must sign them in the presence of a witness. The Deputy-Registrar transcribes the entries from the forms into his Registration Book, and forwards the original forms to the Registrar.

## RACE DISTINCTION.

The following main race distinctions are observed, viz.: (1) European or White, (2) Malay, (3) Fingo, Kafir and Bechuana, (4) Hottentot, Mixed and Other. The *European or White* population consists of the descendants of the original Dutch Colonists and French Refugees, and of the immigrants chiefly of British and other Teutonic races, who more recently entered the Colony. The *Malay* class, consisting of only 13,907 souls at the Census (1891) date, owes its distinctive existence rather to the bond of a common and uniform faith than to any feeling of race. As its name implies, it is of Asiatic origin. *Hottentots*—the name given to the aboriginal natives with whom the Dutch pioneers first came into contact—include a sprinkling of Korannas and Bushmen. But it will no doubt be found that the term "Hottentot" is used as synonymous with "mixed." "Hottentot" births, therefore, are classed with "mixed," the separate specification being too doubtful. The number of pure-bred Hottentots can be but small. The *Fingoes* form part of the Bantu family, but were separately considered in the Census tables in consequence of the peculiar relations in which by force of circumstances they stand to the Colony, and of their progress in civilisation. *Kafirs and Bechuanas* include—taking them in order of numerical importance—Amaxosa, Tembu, Basuto, Pondomise, Baca, Bechuana, and other similar tribes. *Mixed and Other Coloured Races* include the great and increasing population which has sprung from the intercourses of the Colonists with the indigenous races, and Indians, Chinese, Mozambiques, Griquas, &c. They also comprise children born of parents belonging to *different* elements of the four main races. The fusion of Fingoes (a commercial, peaceful people) with the warlike Kafirs and Bechuanas, is proceeding more rapidly than might have been expected, and it has been often found convenient for statistical purposes to group these Races.

The proportion of each race to the *total* population of the *whole* Colony in 1891 was as follows:—European, 24.68; Malay, 0.91; Hottentot, 3.30; Fingo, 15.04; Kafir and Bechuana, 39.84; Mixed and Other, 16.23.

## PROPORTION OF THE SEXES, 1891.

It was established by the Census figures that to every hundred males alive on the 7th April, 1891, there were 99.03 females. When, however, the races are considered separately, conspicuous variations are noticeable. Thus, the proportion for Hottentots was 91.97 for every 100 males; for Europeans, 92.38; for Kafirs, 98.43; for Mixed and Other, 101.13; for Malays, 107.17; and for Fingoes, 111.56. In the District of Kimberley the employment of a large male population in the Diamond Mining industry accounts for the low proportion of females, viz., 56.82 in 1891. This cause still operates, and renders so striking the present disproportion between Births and Deaths at Kimberley and Beaufort.

## BIRTHS.

## PROPORTION OF THE SEXES, 1902.

It appears to be the general rule in European countries for male births to *exceed* the female. This rule also applied to the Cape Colony, except as to Malays in 1901.

Taking the figures for the *Colony Proper* for 1901-1902 we can derive the following percentages, viz.:—

A comparison of the Census Results for 1891 and 1875 as regards the old Colony, i.e., excluding Griqualand West and the Transkeian Territories, proves that the number of Females to every 100 Males of each race (except in the instance of the Malays) has increased 2½ per cent. for Europeans, Fingoes, Mixed and Other including Hottentots, and ½ per cent. for Kafirs and Bechuanas.

Placing the figures above quoted alongside of those given in the Census Tables, the following interesting comparison attracts attention, viz.:—

Owing to the continuation of hostilities during part of 1902, and the consequent incompleteness of the Colonial vital statistics, no proper estimate of the population or of the Birthrate in 1902 can be made.

"In 1897 the estimated population of the Colony Proper was 1,189,800; in 1898 it would be 1,214,129; and 1,239,154 in 1899. The Birthrate per 1,000 would therefore work out to 33.92 in 1897, 34.13 in 1898 and 32.69 in 1899."

#### URBAN CASES ALONE, 1902.

*Births.*—Discarding all rural cases, it is found that at present there are only 22,399 events in the Colony, excluding Bechuanaland and the Native Territories, to be treated of, and it is only too evident that there are numerous unreported cases. For sex, the division is fairly even, 50.78 per cent. being boys and 49.22 girls. European or White infants absorbed 39.53 per cent. of the whole; Malay 2.59; Kaffir and Bechuana, 16.79; Hottentot, Mixed and Other, 41.09.

*Deaths.*—There is no reason to think, on the contrary, that the Town mortality statistics are not fairly comprehensive, but all cases connected with the prosecution of hostilities, being excluded from the general tables, are specially stated elsewhere. Without these there were in 1902 in Cities, Towns and special Urban Areas in the old Colony no less than 19,477 cases, whereof considerably more than half (54.72 per cent.) were of males. Europeans contributed 25.81 per cent. of the total; Malays, 2.50; Kaffirs and Bechuanas, 28.15; Hottentots, Mixed and Others, 43.54.

#### ILLEGITIMATE BIRTHS.

The total number of births of *European or White* infants was 14,960 in the Colony Proper, comprising 7,698 males and 7,262 females; of these 419 were illegitimate, 212 being male and 207 of the female sex. It follows, therefore, that the percentage of illegitimate to total births was 2.80. By way of comparison, the following figures taken from Coghlan's "*Wealth and Progress*" are given:—

Before discussing the subject of percentages obtained from the figures published on other pages, it is worth while to advert to the difficult question of marriage by *Native Custom*. The Chief Justice, in deciding on the appeal case of *Nggobela vs. Sihle*, heard in the Supreme Court, December, 1893, delivered an elaborate judgment, from which the following items of information are taken. Act No. 16 of 1860 provides for the appointment of Marriage Officers for solemnising the marriages of persons professing the Mohammedan faith according to the Mohammedan customs and usages, but not for marriages according to Native custom, and a union therefore founded only upon native usage and custom within the Colony proper is not a marriage, and Courts of Law are bound to treat the intercourse as illicit. Any marriage which would be regarded as valid in any of the dependencies of the Colony, must be regarded as valid in the Colony, although Colonial solemnities have not been observed (and this is important), if it is not opposed to the essential nature of the contract as

\* As the war commenced in October, 1899, and was continued throughout the whole of 1900, 1901 and part of 1902, causing a far reaching displacement of population, especially of male adults, it is not surprising to notice a shortfall in the latter year in Births. Besides this, the inclination to register would be impeded by the excitement of the times, and often no doubt by the absence of facilities at the moment, with the result that later on the omission passed out of mind. Reports of arrear cases are however now arriving in fair numbers, special efforts having been made by the Cape Police to gather all such.

understood in the Colony. The Court held the effect of Proclamation No. 14 of 1885 is to dispense with the solemnities required by the laws of the Colony proper in the case of natives electing to marry in Tembuland (it was a case originating there that was before the Court) according to their own customs. If they register the marriage it has the same effect as marriage contracted under Colonial law; if they do not register it remains valid, but its effect must be judged by the native custom of the territory. The Supreme Court can only administer the law of the Colony, but for that purpose it may become necessary to give effect to the laws of other countries and dependencies so far as they affect the validity of any contract entered into by the parties to the suit, &c.

From the foregoing considerations it will be evident that from the information obtainable from the general run of natives, it is impossible to state for certain how many births are legitimate or natural. In the Registration Books specially framed for use in Native Locations no enquiry is made as to the date or place of marriage, and under the numerical system the sole question asked is whether the infant is a boy or girl. The returns of Fingo and Kafir births have been tabulated under three headings, Legitimate Cases, Native Custom, Illegitimate, but such an arrangement can only be viewed as a temporary expedient. When the difficulties of deciding the validity of certain native marriages in the Transkeian Territories are so great as to necessitate appeals to the Supreme Court to settle the moot points, this Department must reasonably be excused from tabulating decisively births the result of Native marriages as to which there is no evidence to prove the domicile of the parties at the time of the union.

It would be futile to investigate any proportion where such uncertainty exists.

Births of children belonging to the *Mixed, Other and Hottentot Races with Malays* amounted in 1902, in the *Colony Proper* only, to 15,469 in all, 7,920 being boys and 7,549 girls; of these events 4,883 were illegitimate, consisting of 2,463 males and 2,420 females, giving the following percentage proportions, viz.:-

DEATHS.

The continued troubles and displacements of population have seriously affected all returns of Vital Statistics for the first half of 1902.

GENERAL COMPARATIVE SUMMARY.—COLONY PROPER, 1900, 1901 AND 1902—with proportions.

In all, regard being had to events taken out to 15th April, 1903, deaths to the number of \*40,939 had been so far recorded for the year 1902.

Adding to the deaths registered in 1901, the events of that year subsequently recorded up to the 15th April, 1903, a grand total of 40,921 cases is arrived at; similar figures for 1900 are stated to be 47,387. The figures for Walfish Bay are insignificant—29, 58 and 23 deaths for the three years—while those for the Transkeian Territories 7,331, 7,460 and 9,596, for 1902, 1901 and 1900 are unavoidably imperfect, consequently it is advisable to compare—partially as it can now be done—simply the Colony Proper occurrences, which in 1902 numbered 16,712 as regards Males, and 14,542 for Females. 24.52 per cent. of the Male Deaths were amongst Whites and 75.48 amongst the Coloured Races; similar figures for Females show 22.29 and 77.71 per cent. respectively. It will be noticed that the percentages for European or White Deaths (excluding war cases) are higher than in the previous year. The subjoined statement affords a general view of the data :-

## ESTIMATED BIRTH AND DEATH RATES, CAPE PENINSULA, 1902.

In July, 1902, an enumeration—voluntary in character but comprehensive in application—was made of the residents of the Cape Peninsula. Although a considerable number of refugees from the Transvaal and elsewhere had left this country or had returned to their homes before that count was completed, rendering it fairly certain that the European population of the Peninsula twelve months ago was larger than it now is, an attempt has been made to arrive at some idea of the prevailing Birth and Death rates for Cape Town and Greater Cape Town, calculated on the estimated *Civil* population. The deaths returned below are irrespective of instances attributable to the war, and are believed to be complete. This, unfortunately, cannot be predicted of Births. Green and Sea Point has the *lowest* Death rate for *Europeans* (9.77) per mille, Rondebosch running close with 11.07, followed by Durbanville with 14.37, Claremont with 14.65, Kalk Bay with Muizenberg and Simon's Town with 15.39 and 16.84; the Wynberg rate was 17.37, and Cape Town 17.65 per 1,000. The *Coloured* population of Green and Sea Point was but small, and the rate was 13.41 per 1,000. Rondebosch figured at 29.80, Durbanville 25.05, Claremont 41.00, Kalk Bay with Muizenberg and Simon's Town, 28.57 and 40.17, Wynberg 41.79, and Cape Town 48.95. The *Birth rates* for Europeans vary from 16.84 Simon's Town to 44.97 Maitland, and for *Coloured* from 29.06 Green Point to 82.35 at Maitland.

## MARRIAGES.

The number of marriages solemnized in 1902 was 12,158, compared with 9,547 in 1901, 8,741 in 1900, 8,535 in 1899, 8,718 in 1898. A regular increase up to 1899 (when the war caused a falling off) is noticeable. Friday was again regarded as the unpropitious day for the solemnization of the marriage ceremony, as out of 12,158 marriages 367 (compared with 236 out of 8,535 in 1899) of the whole took place on that day. Tuesdays were most frequently selected, 37.9 per cent. occurring then (39.0 in 1900 and 38.5 in 1901), Mondays coming next with a percentage of 27.3 (31.58 in 1900, and 27.6 in 1901), and while 2,107 happened on Wednesdays, 850 on Thursdays, 446 on Saturdays, and 455 on Sundays. Three days are credited with *one* marriage each. The highest number, namely 117, on the contrary is recorded against the 29th April, with 116 on the 22nd July. The largest number in a full week was 288 in the seven days ended the 27th December, and the lowest 156 in January. In 10,338 cases banns were called by Ministers of Religion or by Resident Magistrates, the remaining instances, 1,820, being by licence. The number of marriages before Protestant Clergymen was 10,466, before Roman Catholic 266, and before Jewish 73, while 1,351 (or 11.1 per cent.), compared with 1,012 (or 10.6 per cent.) in 1901, 8 per cent. in 1900, 7.02 per cent. in 1899, 6.4 per cent. in 1898, 5.8 per cent. in 1897, and 5.3 per cent. in 1895 and 4.4 in 1896, were dealt with by Magistrates, under the provisions of Act No. 16 of 1860. The majority of the parties wedded belonged to the Dutch Reformed Church, the number of marriages being 2,778. The Church of England follows next with 2,301 cases, which was 49 in advance of the Wesleyan Church, while London Missionary Society and Independents combined show 1,283 marriages. In point of *Education* 35.33 per cent. of the wives and 36.09 of the husbands could not write their names. It appears that in 873 cases widowers married spinsters, in 403 bachelors married widows, and in 353 widowers married widows. There were 51 cases relating to divorced wives or husbands.

## REVENUE, 1902.

Arranging the districts according to the amount of the collections on account of Births and Deaths Registration in each, it is found that they take the following order:—

Thus 68 Deputies collected £314 11s. 6d., compared with £251 received by 63 in 1901, £213 received by 62 in 1900, £144 18s. 6d. received by 54 in 1899, £126 1s. taken by 62 in 1898, £114 15s. 6d. taken by 64 in 1897, £82 10s. by 46 in 1896, and £53 4s. 6d. by 39 in 1895.

The Municipal Records of Births and Deaths kept prior to 1st January, 1895, and the Voluntary Births Registration Books are preserved in the fireproof safe of the Central Office, where £23 13s. was collected. The total revenue was therefore £338 4s. 6d., against £64 10s. 6d. in 1895, £102 14s. in 1896, £130 15s. 6d. in 1897, £153 1s. in 1898, £175 2s. 6d. in 1899, £233 12s. in 1900, and £281 8s. in 1901.

The fee for alteration or assignment of a child's christian name is 2s. 6d.; for a search 1s. for each year or part of a year; for a certificate, 5s.—all payable in revenue stamps. If a certificate is *authenticated* by the Under Colonial Secretary, that officer charges a fee of 15s. in addition. It should be noted the *Bank of England* insists upon authentications.

For certified copies of duplicate original and R.M.'s MARRIAGE REGISTERS £83 1s. 6d. was received in 1902, £76 18s. in 1901, 41 6s. 6d. in 1900, £62 4s. in 1899, £55 5s. in 1898, £40 in 1897, and £42 in 1896.

## EXPENDITURE.

The expenditure brought to account for the financial year 1901-02 amounted to £5,450 for salaries and allowances to the staff in the Central Office, the Deputy Registrars, their Assistants and Field-cornets, and £147 for printing and £28 for books.

## CONCLUSION.

In the Transvaal and Orange River Colonies, systems of registration of Births and Deaths are being conducted in complete accord with the Cape Act No. 7 of 1894 and the regulations promulgated thereunder, and the Territory of Rhodesia is about to adopt the same system. Mr. Erlank, who had rendered good service in the 1891 Census Office in Cape Town, went in July, 1901, from the post of Deputy Registrar for Cape Division (which he held for several years) to Pretoria, as Acting Registrar of Births and Deaths, while Dr. Pratt Yule, Medical Officer of Health, has charge of the corresponding office at Bloemfontein.

The efficient services of the members of my staff are deserving of more than passing acknowledgment. I am truly grateful for their sustained efforts, and the assistance voluntarily given—often without regard to personal convenience. Good printers' proofs were a help to the staff employed on the preparation of these Reports.

To the Postal Service, the distributor and the collector of such a mass of valuable correspondence, we owe a great deal, and the good work done by the Deputy Registrars and their Assistants is certainly to be remembered. My many colleagues in statistical work in various parts of the world continue to benefit the office with their sympathy and friendly help. On this occasion Professor Harald Westergaard, of the University of Copenhagen, will hardly object to the appearance of the following extract from his note acknowledging certain reports on Vital Statistics, which he had reviewed in the 2nd edition of his *Lehre von der Mortalität*, viz.:—“It is impossible not to admire the perseverance with which all the difficulties have been overcome. The Reports are an honour to British Statistics.”
