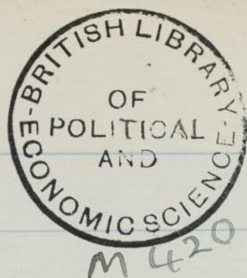

The husband was clerk at Nicholson's Wharf for 14 years, then at Fresh Wharf 4 yrs & discharged thro' drink; afterwards went into business with his brother Horatio & failed in May 1882. Sailed for Cape Town on June 13/82, leaving his wife & children. Wife says he failed thro' drink. She applied for relief on July 5/82. The family lived at 37 Brook St (3 rms 5/6). The clergyman's attention being draw to case he undertook to relieve, C.O.S. regard it as a "poor law" case. Man told his wife that he had made an arrangement for an allowance for her during his

absence. This was only partially done, he had asked a friend to send her; he sent £18. The man writes two ~~letters~~ letters to R.O. from the Cape, saying that he is not earning enough to keep his wife & family. He sent £3: was working as a sign writer. In Sept, the family are in a wretched condition in Sept/82 & the home reflects their condition "Children look wan & pinched". Relief in kind is given & Henry, Steuart & Anne are admitted. In Jan^y/83 the woman & her children are admitted & have been chargeable since. Woman came out two or three times but has not been out since Nov/85.

Nothing has been heard of the man since his second letter. Oct '83. He blames his wife for causing him to leave his country as he did.

Michael Lay (cont^d)
and offered to admit man to S.A. He declined. They are a rough drinking couple & did not seem to need relief. On Dec²⁹/86, the man was admitted to B.W.H. He absconded in Nov '87 but was re-admitted on Oct 4. 1888.

Some years ago, he was schoolmaster of the R.B. schools in Johnson St. He admits that drink has reduced him to his present state.

In July '88, R.O. is told that this woman is at 13 Narrow St in a wretched condition. Visited & found the woman smoking a clay pipe in a dirty & evil smelling room. Only furniture, an old bedstead, chair & table. She was sent to B.W.H. She has been out once since. She was in S.A. from March 29. 1889 to May 16/89 with an injured hand. She has since died. In Nov/87, the man got drunk when sent out by the W.H. authorities to deliver wood (see Case 615) In Sept '88, he applied for re-admission for himself & wife. After he had gone his wife was found in a drunken sleep in the waiting room.
