- 1. A satisfactory financial Statement was considered and received.
- July and August candidates (12) were elected. Last year (7).
 There were no resignations.
- 3. Kings Hall Lectures. Report received and actions approved. Cash receipts to date £200 considered satisfactory. Secretary authorised to advertise further if necessary. Agreed not to agrange for publication of the lactures but to allow the Labour Party to do so if desired.
- Summer Schools. Preliminary report was received. Both very successful. Priors Field will yaeld a good profit. Probably a deficit at Heathfield.
- 5. Winter Lectures at Essex Hall. Agreed to arrange course as usual January to April, on Questions of the Day etc.
 Prof. Gilbert Murray's offer to lecture on the League of Nations accepted; agreed to ask Gol. Williams to lecture on India and J.L. Cohen on Unemployment Insurance. Many other staggestions for possible lectures made, including Sir A. Newsholme, Ernest Barker, Norman Angell, Hamilton Fyfe, J. A. Hobson, and J. L. Hammond. Also that same lectures be arranged if possible on Socialism in other countries. i.e. Davies on Checko-Slovakia, Guest on Roumania ect. suggested. Agreed that if the Nursery would arrange some speakers for debates after lectures steps should be taken to see that they were called upon.
- 6. Parliamentary By-election Fund. Secretary reported that with consent and approval of the three trustees of the fund he had made a grant therefrom of £50 to Holford Knight for the S. Hackney by-election. The action was approved.

- 3. New Book. Offer by Mr. & Mrs. Webb of right to publish new book by them considered. Agreed to recommend Executive to accept the offer in terms of Webb's letter (copy annexed); To accept Clark's estimate for printing etc; to publish at 2/- for Labour and Socialist Societies; and a bound edition at 4/6 through Longmans.
- 4. Co-operative Tracts. The six tracts prepared under editorship of Woolf for the Sara Hall Trust considered. Estimates for printing received and agreed to recommend also that the six Conferences be held in Fabian Hall on Saturday afternoons, too before Xmas and four after, and that tea be provided.

Dear Galton,

The proposition we have to make to the Publishing

Committee is that the F.S. may, if it chooses, publish (probably
along with Allen & Unwin) one or more editions of our new book,

"The Reign of Capitalism" or some such title. This makes just
under 200 pages; and has been read by Laski, Pease and yourself.

We are having it set up by R. & R. Clark, so that proofs may be
available for other members of the Executive very shortly. We
should ask the Executive (1) to let us have 1,000 copies or more
for America at the of striking off axtra copies only; (2) to allow
us in future to get further copies struck off, if we wish this, at
cost price only; (3) to have some copies, in cloth or paper covers,
for gifts, at cost price only. We should be willing to let the
F.S. have further copies from the moulds, for future editions, as
you may require them, say for a period of ten years from
31st. December 1922.

We retain the copyright, partly because we may want to include the whole or part of the book in other sets of our works, or other books; or to make alterations; and partly because the American rights, translation rights and all other rights must remain with us.

But our intention is to present to the F.S. as a donation the ordinary English editions, so long as the F.S. Cares to issue them.

- 1. Chair Dodd was voted to the Chair.
- 2. A satisfactory financial statement was received.
- 3. October candidates (6) were elected. Last year 14. Seven resignations were considered. Two members were transferred to associates as requested; two others the Secretary was instructed to write to; the other three resignations were accepted.
- 4. Report on Kings Hall Lectures was received and considered very satisfactory. Receipts 2590, Expenditure about 2300. Sales of literature at the meetings 227. After discussion it was agreed that the Kings Hall be taken again for next autumn at once. (N.B. The Hall is not available for six successive Fridays next autumn.)
- Winter lectures at Essex Hall. The arrangements made (see list in curre t "Fabian News") were approved and more suggestions made as to vacant dates, etc.
- 6. Preliminary Report on Parliamentary Election Fund was considered and approved.

Report of Trustees of the PARLIAMENTARY ELECTION FUND, 1922.

The total receipts to the fund amount to £1,370.

Of this sum £210 were allocated by donors to special candidates, and grants were made of £1150 in addition, making total grants £1360. One candidate (Frank Smith) to whom a sum of £40 had been allocated by a donor has returned the cheque with thanks as his expenses had been fully provided otherwise, and asks us to use if for other candidates or treat it as a donation to our funds. This reduces the actual expenditure on grants to £1,320 and the cost of printing and issuing the circular, £20 or so, brings the total expenditure up to £1,340, leaving a balance of about £30.

The trustees decided not to make use of the £150 balance in hand of the Parliamentary by-election Fund, in tiew of probable early need for such a fund, and this sum is accordingly carried forward in our accounts.







Proposed reorganisation of Fabian Local Government Inquiry Bureau and issue of monthly bulletin,

The Labour Farty has now decided to ask the Fabian Society to undertake the work of Publishing a Local Government Bulletin subject to an agreement that the Farty shall have a definite option to take it over at the end of two years from the Publication of the first issue of the bulletin. The Atkinson Trustees have agreed to make a grant of £350 Per annum for two years certain towards the expense of the work, and the Executive Committee at its meeting in June last instructed the Finance, etc. Committee to consider and report on the matter and bring up a scheme.

The following suggestions for a someme are Put forward as a basis for discussion:-

- (1) It is Proposed that a Part time adviser be appointed to edit the bulletin, and reply to enquiries on Local Government matters; that he should be Paid a fee of say \$150 \text{ Per annum, and required to give say two hours daily to the work for five days a week.
- (2) That a monthly bulletin should be issued ten times yearly (omitting August and SePtember when Councils are in recess) beginning in January 1924. An 8 PR. monthly about size of Fabian News, 2000 or so copies each issue would cost about \$15 Per issue for Printing, etc.-say £150. Postage, etc. would cost £5 monthly making £200 yearly, and with salary of editor, etc., £350.

- (3) It is suggested that of the first issue some 7,000 8,000 copies should be printed and a specimen sent to all labour members of local authorities with circular offering to supply one copy regularly for annual subscription of 1/-, or a number of copies in one parcel for all the members of the same council for 2/6 Per annum.
- (4) This would Produce a small result, Probably £25 or £30 in the first year, which might increase later.
- (5) The bulletin would be sold Price ld, and in the course of time some regular sales and Possibly some advertisements might be secured, but this could hardly be expected to yield any substantial revenue in the first year or two.
- (6) On this basis the grant of £350 per annum Promised would just about cover the expenses. Any extra revenue the first year would be absorbed by the extra cost of first issue, etc.

PRIVATE.

To Members of Fabian Society.

It is probable that members of the Society do not fully realise its financial position, and we therefore venture to write you on the subject.

During the three last completed years the subscriptions from members amounted to £1122, £1133, and £1005, and the salaries of the staff in the same periods were £1247,£1343, and £1337. Therefore the whole of the other working expenses of the Society and a part of the salaries have been paid out of small contributions of associate and non members, and out of the profits from the summer schools, and Kings Hall lectures, etc.

But this is not all. The Society began as a group of amathur propagandists: next they found it necessary to pay officials who were also members of the Society, and who did not ask for commercial salaries. This tradition of uncommercial remuneration has continued to the present time, and the Society's scale of pre payment is considerably below that for example, of the Labour Party. It is fairly obvious that a Secretary, and five clerks and assistants, all over 20 years of age cannot be fully remunerated for their services ou t of a total of less than £1,550 a year.

During the last two years the current expenses of the Society have exceeded its income by £505 and £270, and although we hope there

will not be so serious a loss in the present year, it is clear that it is impossible for the Executive Committee to incur more liabilities without an increase of income.

The average subscription paid by members is no more than 11/- and we cannot but think that a good many members who joined the Society with a small subscription when they were younger and poorer, are now in a position to contribute larger sums. Other members pay by Bankers Order and this goes on without alteration, sometimes for decades. The value of money has notoriously declined; a prewar 20/- subscription is now only worth about 12/-: we received the same but have to pay more.

To conclude, we believe that many members will not wish that the work of the Society should be crippled for the want of funds. We feel confident that many who now pay us 5/-, or 10/- or 20/- could easily afford to at least to double these sums.

We therefore, venture to request a favourable reply to this appeal.

Report on Local Government Nows.



The circulation of the journal has reached proportions much in excess of our anticipations and now stands at 2,000 copies monthly. This involve a great addition to the office work and has resulted in a large increase in the number of enquiries received by letter on Local Government questions. It seems desirable to "run our profits" and if possible add further to the success of the paper, and it is suggested that this could be done by (a) enlarging it to 12 pp. (at present 8 pp.), (b) securing advertisements; and (c) increasing the circulation.

To add another 4 pp. would cost for printing about £6 per issue, £60 per year, bring the total expenditure up to £500.

If we could get say £4 or so per issue for advertisements and increase the sales by 1000 por month, we should have about another £100 of revenue which would cover all the additional expense and leave a balance which could be used to diminish the grant from the Atkinson Trustees or in any other approved way. An opportunity occurs to secure the services of an expert to undertake this work on favourable terms and conditions, and it is accordingly proposed

Fabian Parliamentary Election Fund, 1924.



Report of the Trustees.

The response to the appeal for the Election Fund was as we anticipated considerably less than in the two previous years, amounting to only £1091. 16. 6d against £1537 in 1923 and £1363 in 1922. The falling off was due ontirely to the loss of one or two large subscriptions, the number of smaller sums received being greater than on previous occasions, and the total receipts larger if allowance is made for the loss of the fow large donations referred to above.

The Trustees mot several times and voted the money away in grants to candidates as fast as it was received. They decided not to use any of the ordinary funds of the Society for grants, but to charge the cost of printing and posting out the Appeal, amounting to about £20, to the Society's ordinary expenditure. Thus they were enabled to distribute the whole of the sum received for the special fund in grants to candidates

Of the total of £1091. 15. 6d received and distributed, £126. 0. 6d was specially allocated to particular candidates by the donors. The balance of £965. 15. 0d. was given as grants in sums ranging from £10 to £60 to 47 of the members of the Society standing as Labour candidates whose claims seemed to be the most urgent.

No fewer than 81 members of the Society stood as Labour candidates on this occasion, besides one member of the Liverpool Fabian Society who is not a member of the parent body. Of these only 18 were successful, the twenty-five members of the last Parliament being reduced to that number by the loss of ten seats, viz., Messrs. Percy Alden, Major Church, Dr. Somerville Hastings, W. W. Henderson, Miss a. S. Lawrence, Herbert Morrison, H. Walter Samuel, Bon Tillett, Lt. Col. Williams and Andrew Young; and the gain of three seats only by Dr. Dalton, Mr. Rosslyn itchell and Dr. Drummond Shiels. Only five of our members lost their deposits, viz. Messrs. David Froman, Lt. Commander R. H. Mope, H. D. Rowntroe, Miss amy Sayle, and Major H. E. Weaver.

Draft of proposed reply to members enquiring as to the Society's attitude to the General Strike.

I have peceived your letter dated May, enquiring what is the policy of the Fabian Society regarding the present wide-spread stoppage of locomotion and industry, consequent on the dispute in the coalmines and the action of the General Council of the Trades Union Congress.

I have some difficulty in giving an official answer to your enquiry, as the policy of the Society can be determined only by a General Meeting of its members. But I may point out that the Fabian Society has had no part in any of the action taken, and is, of course, unrepresented either in the Miners Federation of Great Britain or in the General Council of the Trades Union Congress, to which it has never been affiliated. It has at no time expressed any opinion in favour of a General Strike, which is quite foreign to all the Society's declarations of policy, as it is to the Society's "Basis", to which alone its members are committed.

I may add that the Labour Party, to which the Fabian

Society, as a definitely Socialist Society, has

always been affiliated, has also been unimplicated in the action of
the Miners' Federation and the General Council of the Trades

Union Congress, as the Labour Party is, by its constitution and consistent policy, confined to political action, and is debarred from inter-



Executive Committee of the Labour Party - and especially the leading members of the Party in Parliament - have been doing their uthost to find some method of accommodation by which both the general stoppage, and the miners' dispute with which it is interwoven, can be brought as quickly as possible to an end. You will realise that this is no easy task, as obstinacy and passion seem to prevail on both sides, and the way of the peace maker is proverbially hard!

In the meantime, I fear there will be terrible hardship and suffering among the mass of the population, as well as no little inconvenience to our own members, which will, I hope, not prevent us all from doing what we can for those who will suffer most.

Dear Sir,

I have received your letter enquiring what is the policy of the Fabian Society regarding the present wideparead stoppage of locomotion and industry, consequent on the dispute in the coalmines and the action of the General Council of the Trades Union Congress. I have some difficulty in giving an official answer to your enquiry, as the policy of the Society could be determined only by a General Meeting of its members. But the Executive Committee has now considered the matter, and your letter with others making similar enquiries has been read, and I am directed to send the following reply:

I am to point out that the Fabian Society has had no part in any of the action taken, and is, of course, unrepresented either in the Miners Federation of Great Britain or in the General Council of the Trades Union Congress, to which it has never been affiliated. I may add that the Labour Party, to which the Fabian Society, as a definitely Socialist Society, has always been affiliated, has also been unimplicated in the action of the Miners' Federation and the General Council of the Trades Union Congress, as the Labour Party is, by its constitution and consistent policy, confined to political action, and is debarred from intervention in industrial disputes. I need hardly say that the Executive Committee of the Labour Party - and especially the leading members of the Party in Parliament - have been doing their utmost to find some method of accommodation by which both the general stoppage, and the miners' dispute with which it is interwoven, can be brought as quickly as possible to a just settlement.

I am to add also that the Committee is of opinion that if such crises are to be avoided in the future it will be necessary for Governments to deal with industrial problems and difficulties in a very different spirit from that persued during the past few years,


It was agreed to suggest the following points for consideration:-

- 1. That the Programme ought to be a literary document and not a mere list of proposals.
- 2. That it should be preceded by a statement of the Aims and Objects of the Labour Party.
- 3. That it should re-affirm the principles laid down in the tract "Labour and the New Social Order" and that these are to be realised by democratic methods in National and Local affairs.
- 4. That the programme should be short and confined to a limited number of points, say seven or so, expressed generally so as to imply as much as possible.
- 5. That we suggest the following points out of which the required number might be selected:-
 - (1) Industrial Reorganisation in particular Mining and the repeal of the T.U.Act, 1926.
 - (2) Social Services in particular Education and the treatment of the sick.
 - (3) Unemployment covering adequate National provision for all unemployed, Insurance, Poor Law, Training, etc.
 - (4) Finance and Taxation.







Memorandum on the proposed Association of Members of Local. Authorities in Great Britain and others.

representation on local authorities has been one of the most outstanding features of the Labour Movement. There are now thousands of Labour councillors on local bodies of every size and rank from the humble Parish Council to the great County and Borough Councils. Furthermore, in an increasing number of towns and country districts a Labour majority on the Council is being secured.

has always attached great importance to municipal affairs and has put forward continuous efforts to show the important place which Local Government must necessarily occupy in the Socialist Commonwealth. It has at the same time devoted much attention to studying the various problems of local government and suggesting proposed lines of Labour policy thereon. In 1984, the Local founded, in conjunction with the Labour Party, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT NEWS, a monthly journal devoted exclusively to local government questions, and this paper has received wide-spread support from Councillors candidates, and officials.

It is now proposed to carry the work of the Fabian Society in this connection a step further. The sphere of local government continues to expand; new powers and responsibilities are daily added to the work of local authorities. It is felt that consideration should be given to the task of organising progressive effort on local Councils, and the Fabian Society feels that its work in this direction could be rendered still more effective

if it could look to the co-operation of an active association of persons specially interested in local government. Such an association would serve as a clearing house of information, and would provide a closer link between the progressive elements of local government throughout the country than at present exists. It is proposed that the association should be called The Municipal Information Bureau and should consist of

- (a) Members of any local government authority.
- (B) Candidates, (past, present, or future) for election to such bodies.
- (c) Other persons, (including local government officers) who are specially interested in municipal affairs.

It is suggested that members of the Association should pay an annual subscription of 5/- and in return should be entitled to

- (a) Receive regularly a copy of TH LOCAL GOVERNMENT NEWS as issued each month, and also a copy of any tracts or special bulletins dealing with local government affairs that may be published by the Fabian Society from time to time.
- (b) The privilege of asking questions on local government matters to be replied to by letter and / or in the columns of THE LOCAL GOLVERNMENT NEWS.
- (c) To be invited to at least one Conference annually at which the policy and problems of local government should be disfussed.

It is hoped that all regular readers of THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT NEWS, and all who are members of local authorities or candidates, or local government officers will avail themselves of this proposal and join the Association. Subscriptions may be sent to the Secretary, Fabian Society, 25, Tothill Street, London, S.W.1.

Further particulars and information as to the work of the Association, etc. will be given in THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT NEWS from time to time.
