

EU Energy Regulations double gas prices. Truth.

According to the International Energy Agency, natural gas prices are over 241% higher in the EU than in the US. A plethora of EU Directives have added huge costs to industry and consumer alike and have virtually destroyed UK steel making.

For every £3 of goods and services we sell to the EU, they sell us £5. The absence of a trade deal on Brexit would be ruiness for their economies. Britain holds a very strong hand when it comes to negotiating the economic terms of Brexit.



Cut the Red Tape

All companies would have to comply with EU laws if the UK left the EU. Myth.

Only 5% of British companies trade with other EU states. On leaving, EU red tape could be scrapped for 95% of British companies. The top 100 EU Regulations alone cost British industry €27.4 billion annually. Removing these costs would be a huge boost to corporate profits.

3 Million Jobs are at risk on Leaving the EU? Myth.

Europeans won't stop buying British goods just because we leave the EU. British goods sell because they are desirable and people want them. Likewise, we shall continue buying goods from Europe too.


Since WWII the EU has helped keep peace in Europe. Myth.

Every week the UK gives over £350 million to the EU, enough to build a modern hospital.

The majority of UK Laws come from the EU. Truth.



EU Projected to Double by 2030



Open door immigration increases the supply of workers and pushes down wages.






In the last 3 years 75% of the new jobs created went to migrants typically on lower pay (source ONS).

What EU Membership Means


- EU forbids UK to make its own trade deals

Leaving the EU will allow us to control Immigration and reduce unemployment.









Mass Migration drives down wages offered to British jobseekers, a major report by the Bank of England has found.


The 6 Famous Questions Asked by the late Tony Benn MP (former Labour Cabinet Minister)

EU Trade Shrinking



Trade with the EU has been in steady decline for over 15 years.

At the same time the UK has been increasing its exports to countries outside the EU.

If We Leave
