DALTON PAPERS

Introduction

The Dalton papers were deposited in the School between 1962 and 1966. In 1964 the late Lady Dalton gave the physical ownership of the papers and the copyright she possessed in them to the School.

The collection as it exists at present does not wholly represent the original state of Lord Dalton's papers. Dalton kept a detailed diary at intervals from 1916 to 1960 but he did not otherwise preserve papers in any systematic way, and, although many letters and memoranda survive, they do not appear to have been arranged according to any principle of order. His executors removed material which was considered personal or defamatory and also Cabinet Office papers and related documents. The latter part of the operation seems to have concentrated mainly on the period of the third Labour government. There is very little of substance, except for the Diary, relating to the years 1945-47 when Dalton was Chancellor of the Exchequer; on the other hand a number of documents about Special Operations Executive between 1940-42, which would have been removed by an official examiner, were left in.

After its arrival in the School the Diary and about half of the papers were summarily listed. The remainder of the papers which were closely related to the catalogued part chronologically and thematically, were closed, but access was permitted to a number of scholars, and the existing disorganisation of the collection was greatly increased. A check in the spring of 1975 showed that a number of important documents cited either by Professor Dilks or Dr. Stafford (i) had been removed, and it was therefore decided to close the collection and to recatalogue it.

The papers were resorted into clear order, each document or group of documents was to be listed in sufficient detail to enable documents in earlier publications to be identified, and all files of importance were to be paginated. A number of late files which appeared from internal evidence to be as Lord Dalton left them have been left as they were found.

The collection was divided into three parts: the Diary, the arrangement of which has not been altered, all other unpublished papers, and printed material.

Part II is divided into four groups. The first contains material covering Dalton's career up to the fall of Chamberlain in 1940, the second covers the wartime coalition, and the third the period from the formation of ^{the} third Labour government: the fourth section contains business papers of all dates, drafts for his books, cartoons, photographs, etc.

Only a few of Dalton's pre-war papers survive; they fall into the clearly-defined subject groups which form sections 1-4 of the list. The main series of correspondence has been arranged alphabetically in Section 5/1 followed by files of letters from several people on single subjects, and concluded by letters of congratulation and abuse. The final section of part II A consists of speeches arranged chronologically.

The wartime papers are much fuller and more coherent. Part II B, section 7 consists of Dalton's ministerial papers including speeches and official correspondence arranged chronologically, with parallel files for the Ministry of Economic Warfare and the Special Operations Executive, followed by a small file of non-ministerial political papers and a larger group on Labour's post-war plans. Section 8 consists of correspondence arranged alphabetically, including letters from Attlee and Churchill on ministerial matters, and is followed by more letters from the general public and by some personal correspondence.

Part II E, section 18 consists of a further group of papers related to the Second World War which were found among the A.C. Gardiner papers after the main list was completed.

In Part II C, all the papers relating to Dalton's chancellorship, including correspondence and speeches are arranged chronologically: from 1948 the papers become fuller, and within the chronological arrangement, contain subject groups. The Tribunal of Enquiry into the Budget leak, the Council of Europe, German Rearmament form separate files. The reader should note that several of these files are Dalton's own arrangement and that the first page of the file is the original file cover. Important related material will however be found in the general files for each year. Section 10 consists again of letters of politeness etc. and Section II of letters from Ruth Dalton.

Part III contains printed material, press cuttings about Dalton, copies of his printed journalism, and marked copies of Hansard. Printed matter closely related to the unpublished papers has been put in Part II.
