MEMORANDUM.

Colonial Office, Cape Town : 15th August 1866.

The following tables exhibit the results of the Census taken in pursuance of the  
"Census Act 1864."

No Census, in the proper acceptation of the term, has been taken of this Colony  
before the present occasion. Up to the year 1856, statistical returns for the annual Blue-  
book were received at this office from the several civil commissioners, arranged under the  
heads of population, births, marriages, and deaths, distribution of lands and agricultural  
produce, and stock and animal productions.

A want of confidence in the accuracy of the information thus supplied, owing to  
the mode and instrumentality of its collection, together with the expenses attending it  
(which averaged £1,184 per annum), led to a discontinuance of the system in 1856.  
But the returns for Clanwilliam (including at that time Calvinia), Uitenhage (including  
Humansdorp and Alexandria), Fort Beaufort (including Stockenstrom), and Colesberg  
(including Middelburg and Hope Town), were generally more correct than those of other  
divisions; and the numbers derived from a Census of Cape Town executed by private  
agency in 1854 may be accepted as trustworthy.

Upon the whole, little reliance can be placed on these returns; but the general result  
in regard to population, will be seen in the following figures:

## CENSUS OF THE CAPE COLONY, 1865.—MEMORANDUM. v

For financial reasons, this enactment was not carried into effect; and, in a subsequent session of Parliament, the Census Act 1864 was passed, which was put into operation in the early part of March in the following year. The information supplied by it is now presented.

This Act repeals the one of 1862, makes the mode and time of taking the Census dependent on the state of the finances of the Colony, and, with the view of diminishing the expenses of the measure, omits certain of the details and particulars required by the previous Act, and does not insist on the enumerators obtaining the information in only one day. It also introduces the agency of divisional councils and municipalities for the collection of information relating to their respective jurisdictions; but retains, as far as may be necessary or convenient, the forms of schedules prescribed by the Act of 1862.

The particulars omitted are those included under the columns "house or hut," "relationships," and "Government schools." "Schools aided by Government" were excluded from Schedule A; the distinction between "schools aided" and those "not aided" was ignored, as well as the distinction between "mission" and "other" schools. An inquiry was, moreover, introduced respecting idiots and lunatics. Schedule B was left intact.

The work of enumeration was assigned to the field-cornets, assisted when necessary, and acting under the direction of the civil commissioners; while, in the case of municipalities, missionary institutions, and native locations, the respective managing bodies and superintendents were requested to undertake the duty.

The time for completing the enumeration was limited to six days, commencing with Monday, the 6th March 1865: the information collected was to have reference to the previous Sunday.

About the middle of March, the returns began to arrive; they soon reached the entire number of about 1,000 volumes; and the operation of compiling their contents was commenced on the 20th March, under the superintendence of the clerk charged with the statistical business in this office, aided by assistants specially employed for the purpose. Their duties involved the scrutiny of nearly half a million of entries, spread over about 30,000 pages, as respects the population returns; and, as regards Schedule B, a deliberate comparison of the parts of each entry, so that no omission or contradiction should escape detection. The latter entries, although fewer in number, demanded more patience and discrimination, both from their nature, and from the circumstance that in numberless instances enumerators had not comprehended the true significance of the form used, or had been imperfectly instructed as to the mode of filling it up. Instances occurred in which whole series of volumes had to be sent back for completion of Schedule B. Nor was it always possible to deal with Schedule A without returning the volumes for revision, and thus disturbing the progress of tabulation. The compilation was finally concluded about the middle of February last, and the resulting tables were soon after committed to the press. Preliminary statements of the approximate numbers of the population, arranged according to fiscal divisions, and distinguishing sexes and races, were laid before Parliament in the course of last session; but from their partial character, and the imperfections incidental to their hurried preparation, errors necessarily crept in, which will be found corrected in the more complete results now put forth.

The abstracts derived from the returns furnished under the latter part of Schedule B may appear somewhat unsatisfactory, but not more so than may have been expected in taking a first Census of a thinly-peopled colony, in which prevails, in a perhaps more eminent degree, the feeling encountered in countries of more advanced civilization, that demands for statistical information necessarily precede measures for increased taxation. The experience now acquired has suggested the consideration whether, in any future

Census, it will not be more advisable that all [the enumerators be employed and paid directly by the Government, and be made directly responsible to it.

With a view to illustrate the changes the Colony has undergone during the interval between 1856 and the present time, as far as the returns of the respective periods admit of comparison, the six tables hereunto appended have been prepared, as showing:

- A.—Comparison of the numbers of the population in 1856 and 1865, distinguishing white from coloured.
- B.—Comparison of the occupations in those years,—agricultural, manufacturing, and commercial.
- C.—Comparison of the numbers of live-stock.
- D.—Comparison of the land laid down for various purposes.
- E.—Comparison of the crops severally realized.
- F.—Comparison of the clips of wool.
