REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT-GENERAL OF EDUCATION FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE, 1881.

Department of Public Education,
Cape Town, 31st December, 1881.

The Honourable the Colonial Secretary, &c.

1. SIR,—In accordance with the requirements of the Education Acts, 1865 and 1874, my Report on the administration of Educational Grants for the year ended 30th June, 1881, is respectfully submitted for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

OBJECTS OF GOVERNMENT AID.

2. The various objects for which grants have been appropriated by this department, under the provisions of the Elementary Education Act and Supplementary Regulations, approved by Parliament, are as follows:—

- (a) The half salaries of principal and assistant teachers in the three classes of Undenominational Public Schools.
- (b) The half salaries of superintendents and teachers of District Boarding Schools among the agricultural and pastoral population, and of Boarding Departments in connection with the Public Schools.
- (c) Capitation allowances towards the maintenance of indigent scholars resident in District Boarding Schools, and aid towards the expenses of industrial departments connected with these schools.
- (d) Aid towards the salaries of teachers of District Mission Schools under the direction of religious bodies, with the view of assisting the managers to provide secular instruction for the children of the poorer class, who are not reached through the agency of the Public Schools.
- (e) Aid towards the salaries of teachers of Day Schools among the Aborigines, Kafirs, Fingoes, Basutos, &c.; also of trade teachers in the Native Training and Industrial Institutions.
- (f) Capitation allowances for part maintenance of Native boys and girls resident in Industrial Institutions and receiving general industrial training besides ordinary school-instruction.
- (g) Capitation allowances to native apprentices in the Trade Schools.
- (h) Assistance in equipping schools with all necessary appliances,—Furniture, Books, Maps, Blackboards, Scientific Apparatus, &c.; Sewing materials where a seamstress is employed to teach sewing and cutting out clothes, and tools for the native workshops.
- (i) The training of Elementary Teachers.

3. Through these several agencies, the elementary school instruction of the children of all classes, without any distinction of colour or creed,

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and the trade instruction of a limited number of native lads, and the practical domestic training of native girls, are sought to be promoted throughout the Colony and the adjacent territories of Fingoland, Tembuland, East Griqualand, and Basutoland.

4. Under the Higher Education Act, 24 of 1874, grants may be made towards the salaries of Professors or Lecturers in any of the Departments of Literature, Science, Law, and Medicine, provided that the institution with which such chairs are connected is so situated and conducted as to offer special facilities to students who wish to qualify themselves for Degrees in the University.

RESULTS OF INSPECTION.

8. During the year, 647 schools have been inspected and examined. The state of Basutoland prevented Mr. Rolland from completing his annual circuit, and Mr. Clark was absent from the Transkei on special duty from December to June. Mr. Samuel is engaged chiefly in organising schools.

9. The results of the examination of scholars in elementary subjects for the year, and for 1879, and 1880, are given below; and it will be seen that although 2,178 fewer scholars were examined this year, yet the number of those who were classed in the higher standards was 345 more than in the previous year.

11. In forming his opinion, the Inspector takes into account all the elements, moral, intellectual, and physical, that contribute to the character of a school. The general tone and discipline, the furniture, the methods of instruction, the organisation, as well as the sanitary arrangements, come under his notice; and although the grants do not depend on the percentage of passes under the respective standards of attainments, this annual classification is necessary for noting the progress of the school and of Elementary Education, generally, from year to year.

12. A detailed report is furnished to the department of every examination and inspection held by the Inspector. This contains a statement of those scholars who have been presented in the higher schools for the other class subjects, Latin, Greek, Physical Science, Algebra, and Geometry; and for specific subjects, such as Modern Languages, Physiology, Music, Drawing, and School Hygiene, which are beginning to find a place in the course of those schools which profess to train pupils to the business of teaching.

13. In the Public Schools, the number of scholars reported to learn subjects, not tested by the foregoing standards of elementary attainments, is as follows:—

GOOD SERVICE ALLOWANCES.

14. Good Service Allowances are paid to teachers of not less than five years' standing, whose schools are certified by the Inspector to be thoroughly satisfactory, and whose scholars reach a definite percentage under the higher standards.

15. Whilst, therefore, the fixed income of a teacher is unaffected by the inspection taking place at an unfavourable season, such as harvest-time, or on a wet day, or a day of extreme heat, the Good Service Allowance depends mainly on the attendance and ascertained attainments of the scholars at the day of examination; but I have refrained from withholding this allowance where exceptional circumstances have been noted by the Inspectors.

COST OF EDUCATION.

17. The details of the Government expenditure on education, amounting to £82,952, 18s. 2d. for the financial year, are clearly set forth in the statement furnished by my Accounting Officer. (Table I.)

18. The local expenditure for the same period, as reported by the Treasurers and Managers of the various institutions, amounted to £91,725 3s. 6d.

19. The following calculations exhibit the annual cost of each scholar. In the expenditure are included the grants to the University and the Colleges, and also to the Boarding and Industrial Institutions for the Aborigines, and part expenses of the late Educational Commission.

EXAMINATION OF TEACHERS.

22. The annual examination of candidates for the Elementary Teacher's Certificate was held at 29 centres in September, 1880. The subjects were :—

The English Language.
 Arithmetic.
 Geography.
 Penmanship.
 School Management.
 Dutch, German, French, Kafir, and Sesuto (one).

23. The result of the examination was as follows :—

Two hundred and sixty-nine candidates presented themselves for examination. Of these :—

38 obtained Certificates with Honours.
 101 Certificates of Competency.
 17 Provisional Certificates, and 113 failed to pass.

24. The second examination of candidates for the Middle Class Teacher's Certificate took place in December, 1880, and of the eight candidates who presented themselves, two obtained Certificates with Honours, and three certificates of Competency.

25. As changes are contemplated in the time and mode of conducting this examination in future, it is convenient to record here the results of the third examination held in December, 1881.

26. Twelve candidates presented themselves, and to all were granted certificates, one candidate taking Honours, and the remaining eleven Certificates of Competency.

27. Most of the subjects in Literature and Science, studied by candidates for the Middle Class Teacher's Certificate, are the same as those required at the Matriculation of the University; and it is intended to restrict the departmental examination, in future, to what is chiefly professional and technical; but as the University tests proficiency only by *written* work, it is obvious that a supplementary *oral* examination is necessary to ascertain the candidate's capacity and fitness to teach the prescribed subjects.

28. The arrangements for the two examinations of teachers in July and September, 1882, will be, therefore, as follows :—

MIDDLE-CLASS CERTIFICATE.

1. This certificate qualifies the holder for the charge of a Public School (Boys') of the second class, or of a Public School (Girls') of the first class, or for an Assistant Teachership in a Public School (Boys') of the first class.

2. Holders of this Certificate *with Honours*, provided that they have gone through a course of practical training, will, after three years' satisfactory service, be accepted as qualified for the charge of a Public School (Boys') of the first class.

3. Those intending to be Candidates must first pass the Matriculation Examination of the University, or must produce satisfactory evidence of having passed a public examination, of at least equal range and difficulty, in the following subjects :—

The English and Latin languages.
 Dutch, *or* French, *or* German.
 Elementary Mathematics.
 History of England.
 Geography.
 Outlines of Chemistry, *or* Geology, *or* Elementary Physics.

4. The Examination is both oral and written, and includes:—

- (1) Elocution.
- (2) Penmanship (Specimens and Writing from Dictation).
- (3) Freehand and Model Drawing.
- (4) Music.
- (5) School Management (Theory and Practice).

5. The oral examination will, if necessary, extend to each of the subjects required for Matriculation, with the view chiefly of testing the capacity of the Candidates to teach that subject.

6. Candidates must be at least eighteen years of age.

7. Candidates are required to send their names, with evidence of age and training, and testimony to good character, before 1st May, to the Superintendent-General of Education, Cape Town.

8. The Examination will begin on the first Tuesday in July, and be conducted in the following order:—

9. The Candidates will be expected to have studied thoroughly FITCH'S LECTURES ON TEACHING, published at the University Press, Cambridge, 1881, and GLADMAN'S SCHOOL METHOD, and they will be required to teach a class in the presence of the Examiner. For the exercises in Elocution, they are required to commit to memory portions of Shakspeare, Milton, and Wordsworth (not less than fifty lines from each author); and the passage in Virgil, *Æneid*, Book VI., from v. 788 to v. 853, *or* in *Georgic*, Book IV., from v. 453 to v. 527.

ELEMENTARY OR THIRD-CLASS CERTIFICATE.

1. This certificate qualifies the holder for the charge of a Public School of the third class, or of an ordinary Mission or Native School.

2. Candidates will be examined in:—

- (a) The English Language—Reading, Dictation, Grammar, and Composition.
- (b) Arithmetic—including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, Practice, Proportion, and Simple Interest.
- (c) Geography—Political and Physical.
- (d) Elementary Physics.
- (e) Penmanship.
- (f) School Management.
- (g) Dutch, German, French (*one*).
- (h) Kafir, Sesuto (*one*), specially required of Native Teachers.

3. Those who distinguish themselves in the Examination will have the words "with Honours" marked on their certificates.

4. Candidates must be at least sixteen years of age.

5. Candidates are required to send their names (in full), with statement of age and testimony to good character, *before* the first of August, to the Superintendent-General of Education, Cape Town.

6. The Examination will begin on the last Tuesday in September, and be conducted in the following order:—

NOTE.—Special arrangements will be made for holding the Examination in other places besides Cape Town, if timely notice is given, and if there is a sufficient number of candidates at any one place.

PUPIL-TEACHERS.

29. There have been 192 Pupil-Teachers in receipt of Government allowances. Of these, six were probationers at £6 each; fifty-nine were in the first year of apprenticeship at £12 each; one hundred and three were in the 2nd or 3rd year of apprenticeship at £18 each, and twenty-four were normal students at £24 each.

30. The Pupil-Teacher system has been hitherto introduced chiefly into the Elementary or District Mission Schools in the Western Divisions; but the necessity of keeping up a regular and adequate supply of candidates qualified to fill vacancies as assistant teachers in the Higher Schools, has led to the gradual adoption of the system in some of the superior Girls' Schools that have been recently established.

31. The managers of Public Schools have, in some cases, applied for Government allowances to Pupil-Teachers or monitors, whom they proposed to employ in lieu of qualified assistants who would have to be paid jointly by the managers and the Government. Such proposals have been always declined, as contrary to the regulations under which grants are made for teachers in Public Schools. It is essential that those institutions which, in addition to the ordinary course of instruction, undertake the special training of candidates for a Teacher's Certificate, should be equipped with a full staff of qualified teachers, as well as with the best appliances of a well-ordered school.

32. The inadequate supply of native teachers for the schools in Fingoland, Tembuland, and East Griqualand has compelled me to invite the authorities of the principal native institutions to provide for the special training of young men and women for the charge of Elementary Day Schools.

At Peelson, St. Luke's, D'Urban (Peddie), Umtata, and Kokstad, Pupil-Teachers have been admitted. Arrangements on a larger scale are made for the same object at Lovedale and Heald Town.

INTRODUCTION OF SUPERIOR TEACHERS.

33. The demand for assistance in introducing teachers of high qualifications from the United Kingdom and America is still increasing. During the year the following grants have been made:—

COLONIAL SUPPLY OF TEACHERS.

34. Although the supply of teachers, qualified by their knowledge both of the English and Dutch languages to take charge of country schools is still unequal to the demand, it is satisfactory to note that the Colonial Institutions have sent forth during the last few years a fair number of such teachers. The District Boarding School for Girls, known as the Huguenot Seminary, has provided 127 teachers, of whom 70 hold a certificate. The Girls' Public School, Bloemhof, has trained 44 teachers, of whom 21 hold a certificate; and from the Rhenish Institute 62 have gone forth as Governesses or Public Teachers. Of these, 24 hold a public certificate. Twenty-five young men, holding the Middle Class Teacher's certificate, have completed their career at the Normal College, and are engaged in teaching.

SCHOOLS OF ART.

35. The arrangements for founding a School of Art under the direction of the Fine Arts' Association, Cape Town, were completed on the arrival of the Art-Master selected by the Assistant-Director of the South Kensington Museum, and the classes were opened on 19th January.

36. Special provision has been made for the instruction of artizans and also of pupil-teachers, Normal College students, and others wishing to qualify themselves to teach Free-hand and Model Drawing.

37. The numbers in attendance have been:—

38. At Graham's Town, a Committee of Management has been formed, and the school there is to be opened in October, or as soon as the class-rooms are ready; and a school will probably be opened at Port Elizabeth early next year.

39. It is desirable to introduce Free-hand Drawing into the ordinary school course; and all teachers will be encouraged to avail themselves of the Art-School, so that they may acquire the practice of art and the knowledge and application of its scientific principles. At the more important centres of population, the course of instruction should include Mechanical, Architectural, and Engineering Drawing, for the benefit of artizans and other operatives.

INSTRUCTION FOR DEAF AND DUMB.

40. Aid has been given, this year, to a school for deaf-mutes in connection with St. Mary's, Cape Town. The number in attendance has been 10; the school is conducted by a trained teacher, who is herself deaf and dumb.

41. An institution, on a larger scale, has been opened at Worcester, under the direction of the Dutch Reformed Church, and assistance has been asked from this department. The Deputy-Inspector has reported favourably on the success of the treatment.

42. The old method of teaching the deaf-mute to translate or interpret the movements of the fingers is pursued in Cape Town; but the German or Heinecke's method of treatment, by which the pupils are taught to watch and interpret the lip movements, is coming to be regarded as the more successful. The lip-teaching method is practised at Worcester.

43. It is not easy to procure accurate information about the number and ages of deaf and dumb persons in the Colony; the proportion is reported to be as high as 1·23 per 1,000 of the white population. In the district of Piquetberg alone I have ascertained that there are at least thirty young persons thus afflicted.

BASUTOLAND.

44. The school work and industrial training have been more or less suspended during a greater portion of the year. Of 57 schools 46 were unable to furnish returns of regular attendance (June quarter, 1881); but, at the date of closing this report, considerable efforts were being made to re-open schools at all the main stations.

45. The trade-teaching will be resumed for a time at Quthing; but the situation is not adapted for an industrial institution on a large scale.

46. In my letter to the Government, 30th April, 1881, I suggested a spot near Koro Koro, which has great natural advantages, particularly an abundant water supply for gardens, and for working a mill. There may be some delay in securing this site, as compensation would have to be made to a few native holders of garden-plots. It is desirable that the site, wherever fixed, should be central and easy of access, and if possible contiguous to one of the main roads through the territory.

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INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTIONS.

COLONY AND TRANSKEI.

47. The Institutions at Blythswood, S. Mark's, Umtata, Clarkebury, and Clydesdale have been disorganized, to some extent, by the war; those at Lovedale, Heald Town, Keiskama Hoek, Graham's Town, and Cape Town (Zonnebloem) have been regularly carried on, and in the case of S. Matthew's, Keiskama Hoek, an energy has been shown in the development of the trade-teaching that augurs well for its usefulness. At Lovedale also, the completion of new and commodious buildings will add largely to its capacity for industrial training. An enormous outlay is thus imposed on the Missionary Societies for the erection not only of the ordinary class-rooms and other accommodation required for a Mission School, but also of workshops, store-rooms, residences for trade teachers, and dormitories for apprentices; and the resources of the Institutions are further drawn upon to provide tools, and an adequate stock of materials, timber, iron, smith's coal, &c.

48. Whilst the authorities of the Mission are thus willing to co-operate with the Government in the industrial teaching of the Natives, it must be allowed that the expenditure incurred by them in providing the appliances for the various handicrafts is scarcely a legitimate charge on the local funds of the Mission; and on this ground I hope that substantial assistance may be given by Government for such necessary objects.

49. The following statistics illustrate the extent to which Government Aid is now given for Industrial training:—

50. The foregoing statement does not include the Native Boarders who are maintained and educated in the Institutions without assistance from this Department.

GRIQUALAND WEST.

51. The annexation of this Province to the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope imposed on me the duty of inquiring into the state of Education, and of assisting the inhabitants, where necessary, to establish schools under the Education Act of 1865.

52. It appeared that a sum of £1,000 was placed on the Estimates of the Province, in 1879-81, for Grants to schools; and Mr. F. Orpen was called upon to advise the local Government as to the apportionment of the amount among the different schools in the Province.

53. The apportionment was intended to be based on the relative efficiency of the schools, without any reference to their mode of management, denominational or otherwise; and the local Inspector recommended that the sum should not be divided into separate grants for each school, but be apportioned among the Denominations, as follows:—

54. The ultimate distribution was made by this Department, and was based on the character of the Education, daily attendance, and general efficiency; a specific sum being given to the authorities of each schools as follows:—

55. Of these, all the Church of England and Roman Catholic Schools were in operation at the time of my Inspector's visit, and appeared to have well earned their grants. One Dutch Reformed Church School, which was doing fair work, was managed as a private school. Only one of the Wesleyan Schools was in operation. I found that the Provincial Government was also under obligation to give £125 per annum to the Rev. R. H. Godwin, who conducted a School at Barkly, and this was paid to 30th June, 1881.

56. The Organizing Inspector, who was appointed in October, 1880, proceeded at once to inquire into the state of Education in Namaqualand, Clanwilliam, and Calvina; and the results of his inquiry were embodied in the Supplement to my Report for 1880.

57. During the first six months of 1881, the Organizing Inspector (Mr. J. Samuel) on his way to Kimberley traversed the districts of Beaufort West, Richmond, Hanover, Colesberg, Philipstown, and Hope Town; and then proceeded to carry on his inquiries in Griqualand West, and to co-operate with the inhabitants in the establishment of Schools. The results of his visitations during that period are given in a Supplement.

58. The managers of the proposed First Class Undenominational Public School at Kimberley found themselves confronted at once with the want of a suitable site, and nothing has yet been done to clear away this difficulty which bars all progress.

UNDENOMINATIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

NEW CLASSIFICATION OF SALARIES.

59. In my evidence given before the Educational Commission in November, 1879, I urged the necessity for the fuller development of the Undenominational Public Schools by a revision of the grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal and Assistant Teachers.

60. The present scale was fixed in 1865; and the minimum salaries thus guaranteed are now found to be inadequate. The salaries should be such as to enable the Teachers to live in a manner befitting those who are charged with peculiarly laborious duties, and whose personal deportment and character exercise so marked an influence over the progress of the people, morally and intellectually.

61. The diffusion and improvement of Elementary Education among the agricultural population and in the more remote villages and towns will be effectually promoted by offering better salaries, and thus attracting teachers of higher qualifications to the charge of the Elementary Schools.

62. In the more populous towns, there is year by year a growing demand for advanced instruction; and although many superior schoolmasters and schoolmistresses have been lately introduced into the Colony to assume the direction of Public Schools on the salaries as at present fixed, the managers find that they cannot retain the services of these Teachers unless the salaries are largely increased from local sources: in other words, the fees of the scholars are unduly raised, so as to provide adequate salaries, and this tendency to make education too expensive can be checked only by the Government supplementing the local contributions towards the Teachers' salaries by a more liberal scale of grants.

63. It was resolved by the Commissioners to recommend the scale of grants given in the memorandum (Educational Commission Report, p. 132), which I had the honour to submit to them.

64. I propose, therefore, that the Government should invite the concurrence of both Houses of Parliament, in the manner prescribed by Section I. of the Education Act of 1865, to the following augmentations and changes. For convenience, the existing regulations and the proposed alterations are put side by side.

EXISTING REGULATIONS.

Order A.—Undenominational Public Schools.

CLASS 1.

1. Each division shall be allowed a sum not exceeding £200 per annum, in aid of the salaries of two Teachers of a public school of the first class, to be erected in the chief town of the division, if the Government shall be satisfied that such chief town is one that ought to be provided with such a school: a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school, to the satisfaction of the Government, that for a period of three years with this aid the salaries to such two Teachers shall be at least £250 per annum to the Principal, and £150 per annum to the Assistant, and that these salaries shall be duly paid.

2. Where the standard of instruction and the number of scholars in daily attendance appear to the Superintendent-General of Education to require the services of additional assistant teachers, a grant, not exceeding £75 per annum, in aid of the salary of each Assistant Teacher, will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school that with this aid the salary of such Assistant shall be at least £150 per annum, and shall be duly paid; provided that in schools attended by both boys and girls, one female Teacher, whether Principal or Assistant, shall be employed whenever circumstances permit.

CLASS 2.

1. Each town or village, not being the chief town of the division, or each chief town of a division in which a public school of the first class cannot be established, shall be allowed a sum in aid of the salary of a teacher

PROPOSED REGULATIONS.

Order A.—Undenominational Public Schools.

CLASS 1.—HIGHER GRADE.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal, Vice-Principal, and Assistant Teachers, in the more populous chief towns, where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, shall be made on the following scale:—

A grant not exceeding £200 per annum for the Principal.
A grant not exceeding £150 per annum for the Vice-Principal.
A grant not exceeding £100 per annum for each Assistant Teacher.

CLASS 1.—LOWER GRADE.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal and Assistant Teachers in towns, where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, shall be made on the following scale:—

A grant not exceeding £150 per annum for the Principal.
A grant not exceeding £100 per annum for each Assistant Teacher.

CLASS 2.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal and Assistant Teachers in the smaller towns and villages, where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, shall be made on the following scale:—

EXISTING REGULATIONS.

to an amount ranging from £50 to £75 per annum, a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school, to the satisfaction of Government, that for three years their annual contribution towards the Teacher's salary shall be at least equivalent to the grant in aid.

2. Where the standard of instruction and the number of scholars in daily attendance appear to the Superintendent-General of Education to require the services of Assistant Teachers, a grant not exceeding £30 per annum, in aid of the salary of each Assistant Teacher, will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school that with this aid the salary of such Assistant shall be at least £60 per annum, and shall be duly paid; provided that in schools attended by both boys and girls one female Teacher, whether Principal or Assistant, shall be employed whenever circumstances permit.

CLASS 3.

1. Schools not in towns or vilages, at eligible stations among the agricultural population, approved by the Government, shall be allowed a sum of £30 per annum in aid of the salary of the Teacher, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers, to the satisfaction of the Government, that for three years their annual contribution towards the Teacher's salary shall be at least equivalent to the grant in aid. In districts where the distance of farms from each other prevents the assembling of the scholars at one central locality, a grant not exceeding £45 per annum will be made towards the salary of the Teacher having charge of two school stations; the grant being made on the same conditions as before named, and the number of scholars at the two stations being not less than that required by Government in other cases before granting aid, and school being kept at each station for such time as the Superintendent-General of Education shall approve; only one such itinerant Teacher, however, shall be aided in a field-cornetcy.

2. Where the number of scholars in daily attendance appears to the Superintendent-General of Education to require the services of Assistant Teachers, a grant not exceeding £15 per annum, in aid of the salary of each Assistant Teacher, will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school that with this aid the salary of such Assistant shall be at least £30 per annum, and shall be duly paid: provided that in schools attended by both boys and girls one female Teacher, whether Principal or Assistant, shall be employed whenever circumstances permit.

GIRLS' SCHOOLS.—CLASS 1.

The grant in aid of the salary of the Principal Teacher in a Girls' School of the First Class shall be £75 per annum; a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school, to the satisfaction of the Government,

PROPOSED REGULATIONS.

A grant not exceeding £100 per annum for the Principal.

A grant not exceeding £60 per annum for each Assistant Teacher.

CLASS 3.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principals and Assistant Teachers at localities, approved by the Government, among the agricultural population, shall be made on the following scale:—

A grant not exceeding £60 per annum for the Principal.

A grant not exceeding £30 per annum for each Assistant.

GIRLS' SCHOOLS.—CLASS 1.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal, Vice-Principal, and Assistant Teachers in towns, where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, shall be made on the following scale:—

EXISTING REGULATIONS.

that for three years their annual contribution towards the Principal Teacher's salary shall be at least equivalent to the grant in aid, and shall be duly paid.

Where the standard of instruction and the number of scholars in daily attendance appear to require the services of Assistant Teachers, a grant not exceeding £50 per annum in aid of the salary of each Assistant Teacher will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school that with this aid the salary of such Assistant Teacher shall be at least £100 per annum, and shall be duly paid.

CLASS 2.

The grant in aid of the salary of the Principal Teacher in a Girls' School of the Second Class shall be £50 per annum; a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school, to the satisfaction of the Government, that for three years their annual contribution towards the Principal Teacher's salary shall be at least equivalent to the grant in aid, and shall be duly paid.

Where the number of scholars in daily attendance appears to require the services of Assistant Teachers, a grant not exceeding £30 per annum in aid of the salary of each Assistant Teacher will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the school that with this aid the salary of such Assistant shall be at least £60 per annum, and shall be duly paid.

65. PREPARATORY SCHOOLS.

EXISTING REGULATION.

To encourage the formation of Preparatory Schools in connection with, and subsidiary to, the Undenominational Schools in towns and villages, a grant not exceeding £30 per annum, in aid of the salary of a qualified teacher of each department of a Preparatory School, will be made by the Government, on a guarantee being furnished by the Managers of the Undenominational Public School that with this aid the salary of such Teacher shall be at least £60 per annum, and shall be duly paid.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS.

A grant not exceeding £100 per annum for the Principal.

A grant not exceeding £75 per annum for the Vice-Principal.

A grant not exceeding £60 for each Assistant.

CLASS 2.

Grants in aid of the salaries of the Principal and Assistant Teachers in Towns and Villages, where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, shall be made on the following scale:—

A grant not exceeding £60 per annum for the Principal.

A grant not exceeding £30 per annum for each Assistant Teacher.

PROPOSED REGULATION.

To encourage the formation of Preparatory and Infant Schools in connection with the Undenominational Public Schools of Towns, Grants will be made in aid of the Salaries of Teacher and Assistants of a Preparatory or Infant School, situated in the more populous localities where the Government is satisfied that such a school is required, but no grant shall exceed the amount allowed for an Assistant Teacher in the Undenominational Public School with which the Preparatory or Infant School is connected.

66. HOURS OF ATTENDANCE AND PROVISION FOR RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN UNDENOMINATIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

EXISTING REGULATION.

The Managers of the school may provide for the religious instruction of the scholars at an hour set apart by them for that purpose, in addition to the ordinary school hours; but no scholars shall be compelled to attend at that hour for religious instruction, without the consent of their parents or guardians.

The ordinary school hours are to be computed at not less than two hours in the forenoon and two hours in the afternoon.

PROPOSED REGULATION.

The managers of an Undenominational Public Schools may provide for the religious instruction of the Scholars at a time set apart by them for that purpose in addition to the ordinary school hours; but no scholars shall be compelled to attend at that time for religious instruction, without the consent of their parents or guardians.

The ordinary school hours shall be computed at not less than two and a half hours in the forenoon and two hours in the afternoon.

67. COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

EXISTING REGULATIONS.

CLASS 1.

The subjects of instruction in a school of the First Class shall include Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Grammar, and Descriptive Geography in the primary or elementary course; and also the Greek and Latin languages, English Literature, History, Elementary Mathematics, and the Elements of Physical Science, in the secondary or superior course.

The subjects of instruction in a school of the Second Class shall include Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Grammar, and Descriptive Geography, in the primary or elementary course; and also the rudiments of the Latin Language, Plain Geometry, and Elementary Algebra.

CLASS 3.

The course of instruction in Third Class schools shall include, at least, Reading, Writing, and Elementary Arithmetic.

GIRLS' SCHOOLS.—CLASS 1.

Provision must be made in a Girls' School of the First Class for superior instruction in the English Language and Literature, History, Geography, Arithmetic; and in Domestic Economy, as far as may be practicable.

CLASS 2.

Provision must be made in a Girls' School of the Second Class for instruction in Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Outlines of History and Geography, and Plain Needlework.

68. DAILY ATTENDANCE.

Bye-Law.

In a public school, and in each department in which a separate grant is made, a minimum daily attendance of at least 20 to 30 children is required to be maintained.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS.

CLASS 1.

The subjects of instruction in a school of the First Class shall include Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Algebra, English Composition and Grammar, Political and Physical Geography, Outlines of History, and the Elements of Natural Science, in the primary course; and, in addition, the Greek and Latin languages, English Literature, History, Higher Mathematics, and one at least of these specific subjects—Chemistry, Geology, Mineralogy, Botany, Animal Physiology, Principles of Agriculture, in the secondary or superior course.

Greek may be omitted, where instruction in an additional specific subject and in a modern language other than English is provided.

CLASS 2.

The course of instruction in a school of the Second Class shall include—Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Algebra, English Composition and Grammar, Political and Physical Geography, Outlines of History, Latin, and the Elements of Natural Science.

Latin may be omitted where instruction in one specific subject—Chemistry, Geology, Mineralogy, Botany, Animal Physiology, Principles of Agriculture—and in a modern language, other than English, is provided.

CLASS 3.

The course of instruction in a school of the Third Class shall include at least—Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Outlines of Geography, and Lessons on Natural Objects.

GIRLS' SCHOOLS.—CLASS 1.

The subjects of instruction in a Girls' School of the First Class shall include—Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Composition and Grammar, Outlines of History and Geography, Plain Needlework and Lessons on Natural Objects in the primary course; and English Literature, History, Political and Physical Geography, Higher Arithmetic, Elements of Natural Science, Laws of Health and Domestic Economy generally in the secondary or superior course.

CLASS 2.

The Course of Instruction in a Girls' School of the Second Class shall include—Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Outlines of History and Geography, Plain Needlework, and Lessons on Natural Objects.

69. The study of drawing and music, though not usually treated as ordinary class subjects, should be encouraged, especially in the larger town schools; the former as being of the greatest practical utility to all who are to be engaged in building-industries, surveying, engineering, &c.; the latter as having a refining and disciplinary influence, which is freely acknowledged by the most experienced educationists.

70. The Education Department of the United Kingdom recognises the special value of these subjects in the Public Elementary Schools by making special grants for both.

71. I propose, therefore, to add the following regulation, to stimulate the teaching of drawing and music.

EXISTING REGULATION.

Nil.

PROPOSED REGULATION.

Where Drawing and Music are included among the subjects of the ordinary school course, and are taught without additional fee, a grant not exceeding £50 per annum will be allowed in aid of the salary of a Teacher of Drawing and a Teacher of Music; but no grant shall be paid unless the Government is satisfied with the qualifications of the Teacher, the time, the subjects, and the mode of instruction, the number of pupils in regular attendance, and the progress of the pupils from time to time.

72. The Managers would, in each case, be called upon, as now, to provide an equivalent amount of salary and a free residence for the Principal, or an annual house-allowance, calculated at one-fifth of the whole salary.

73. The guaranteed emoluments of Teachers would thus be:—

Class I., Higher Grade.	{ Principal, £400 per annum with free residence. Vice-Principal, £300 per annum. Assistant Teacher, £200 per annum.
Lower Grade.	{ Principal, £300 per annum with free residence. Assistant Teacher, £200 per annum.
Class II.	{ Principal, £200 per annum with free residence. Assistant Teacher, £120 per annum.
Class III.	{ Principal, £120 per annum with free residence. Assistant Teacher, £60 per annum.
Class I., Girls'.	{ Principal, £200 per annum with free residence. Vice-Principal, £150 per annum. Assistant Teacher, £120 per annum.
Class II., Girls'.	{ Principal, £120 per annum with free residence. Assistant Teacher, £60 per annum.

74. It is not intended to advance the school grants at once, and indiscriminately, to the higher scale, but gradually as the number of scholars in daily attendance, and the general efficiency of the school, as tested by inspection, may justify the increase.

HIGHER EDUCATION.

INCREASE OF GRANTS.

75. In Section I. of the schedule to the Higher Education Act, No 24 of 1874, it is provided that a grant, not exceeding £200 per annum, shall be made in aid of the salary of a Professor or Lecturer in any of the Departments of Literature, Science, Law, and Medicine, if the Government is satisfied that such a Professorship or Lectureship is one that ought to be

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so aided, and that the College or Institution with which such Professorship or Lectureship is connected is so situated and conducted as to afford facilities to youth of all classes for the prosecution of higher or professional studies, and for qualifying themselves for the Examinations prescribed, or to be prescribed, by the University of the Cape of Good Hope for Degrees in the faculties of Arts, Law, and Medicine.

76. The same causes which call for a higher scale of grants in the Undenominational Public Schools necessitate a corresponding increase in these grants, and it is proposed to recognise this need, as well as meritorious service, by adding the following section:—

77. The grant in aid of the salary of a Professor or Lecturer may be augmented to £300 per annum where the Government is satisfied that the Professor or Lecturer, appointed under this Act with the approval of the Government, has completed five years' continuous and meritorious service, the words, *in the first instance*, should be inserted in the original section 1, after, *a grant not exceeding £200 per annum*.

78. This will be a more satisfactory way of recognising good service in the case of Professors and Lecturers than by introducing the plan adopted in the Public Schools of awarding good service allowances on the Inspector's annual report of the standard of attainments of the scholars and the general efficiency of the school.

79. The Inspector-General can scarcely be expected to report minutely on the individual attainments of the Senior College Students in each department of Science and Literature, and much less of those in the Professional faculties; but he will be able to keep the Government informed of the arrangements of each department, the attendance and discipline, the methods of instruction, and the general results of the professor's work.

UNDENOMINATIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

LOCAL MANAGEMENT.

80. The rules laid down by the Education Act are that the names of the Managers shall in every case be submitted for approval before any grant is made; and the Government shall satisfy itself with the arrangements proposed for the management and maintenance of the school.

81. In consequence of local disputes, it has been found necessary to indicate a mode of procedure which the Government recommends for securing Managers who fairly represent the community; but this mode of procedure is not obligatory; and in organising elementary schools among the farmers or in places where there is no conflict of local interests, the nomination of Managers is made in a less formal manner, sometimes, through the Deputy-Inspector convening a meeting of those interested; at other times, by the mutual consent of the residents.

82. Whatever inconveniencies may arise from so elastic a mode of nomination, it is acknowledged that the Managers, thus appointed, are usually those who are most interested in the successful maintenance of the school, and no rigid system of nomination could be enforced without discouraging the voluntary labours of many who are best fitted by position and education to have the local control of the school.

83. When local taxation for school purposes is resorted to, and School Boards are vested with the same power as in the United Kingdom, it will follow constitutionally that the rate-payers should have the election of the Managers; but the cost of the School Board Machinery will be so great that I prefer to continue the present system of what may be called Voluntary Management, because, by so doing, the more important business of raising

the status of the Public Teachers, and of developing various internal improvements in the schools, is likely to meet with favourable consideration.

84. To ask the Government to provide for the introduction of the School Board machinery and for the revision of salaries of Teachers at the same time, would endanger both proposals; and the latter is not only the more desirable measure but is necessary.

85. I do not, therefore, contemplate at present the introduction of a Bill for the appointment of School Boards on the basis recommended by the late Educational Commission.

MISSION SCHOOLS.

86. The revision of the conditions of aid to Mission-School Teachers has not escaped notice; and the Commissioners in the Report, p. lvi, recommend a new classification, involving a proportionate increase of grants to each class of these schools; but the inquiry of the Education Commission did not extend to the Aborigines' Day and Industrial Schools; and, as the points of contact between the two orders are numerous, I consider that the classification of grants to both should be revised together.

87. The interruption of the Aborigines' School system by the unsettled state of the country has prevented me hitherto from deciding what changes, if any, are immediately desirable in that order of schools; and I expect material assistance from the inquiries of the Native Commission which will shortly be concluded.

88. For these reasons, the changes that are this year recommended to the Government have no reference either to the Mission-Schools (Order B.); or to the Aborigines' Schools and Industrial Institutions (Order C.)

SCHOOL BUILDINGS.

89. There has been, from year to year, an increasing number of applications for Government aid towards the erection of Public School-rooms, and of dormitories and class-rooms, in connection with the District Boarding-Schools.

90. In some cases, special grants have been made but not through the Education Department; and it appears to be inexpedient for any school-grants to be made in future except on definite principles, duly recognised and formally assented to by the Parliament.

91. If Government assistance is to be given towards the erection or enlargement of buildings, I venture to recommend the following general rules and limitations:—

(a). Aid will be given towards the erection or enlargement of (1) School-rooms, used only for the purposes of an Undenominational Public School; (2) Residences of Principal Teachers of Undenominational Public Schools, including dormitories and other accommodation required for Boarders; (3) Dormitories and class-rooms connected with District Boarding-Schools among the agricultural population; and (4) Workshops used only for the training of Natives in handicrafts.

(b). The grants will be in proportion to the amount actually raised by local contributions, pound for pound, subject to the limitations that no grant for any one Institution shall exceed £1,000; and that the grant will be paid in instalments on satisfactory evidence of work done.

(c). The site and plans of buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Government.

(d). The terms of the Trust-Deed in every case must be such as to satisfy the Government, and must provide, *inter alia*,

(1). That the buildings shall be used only for the purposes (as the case may be) of an Undenominational Public School or a District

Boarding-School or a Native Workshop, conducted under such conditions and regulations as may, from time to time, be fixed by Parliament; and

(II). That if the buildings should cease to be required for the purposes abovenamed, or should be at any time used for other than the purposes abovenamed, the Government shall have the right, by sale of the property or otherwise, to recoup itself to the full extent of the grant.

92. There would be many cases where the Managers might be unwilling or unable to comply with the foregoing strict conditions, and also where the Managers might be unable to complete the buildings, even with a Government grant of £1,000.

93. In such cases, I recommend that facilities should be offered to Managers to obtain money by loans from the Public Treasury, on the *principle* laid down in the Irrigation Act, Section 65 of Act 8 of 1877, the Government holding a mortgage bond or other satisfactory security until the debt be liquidated. I should recommend that the rate of interest be fixed at $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., so that by the annual payment of 6 per cent. the loan, with interest, would be repaid in about 32 years.

94. The whole subject is beset with difficulty; and this privilege of obtaining a grant, or a loan, or both, for the erection of buildings, appears to be the only means of encouraging the Managers to provide suitable and adequate accommodation for the scholars until such time as the Parliament may decide on the imposition of a school-tax.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS.

95. The matters, to which the consent of Parliament next Session is invited, are, therefore, as follows:—

- (a). The new classification of salaries of teachers of Undenominational Public Schools, involving an increase of grants, estimated at £500.
- (b). Increase of grants to Professors after five years' meritorious service, estimated at £400.
- (c). The adoption of a system of building-grants involving an immediate expenditure, to meet pressing applications, of at least £10,000.
- (d). The adoption of a system of loans from the Public Treasury for the erection of buildings.

RESULTS OF INQUIRIES CONDUCTED BY THE ORGANIZING INSPECTOR, DURING THE SIX MONTHS ENDED 30 JUNE, 1881.

RESULTS OF INQUIRY.

DIVISION OF BEAUFORT WEST.

1. BEAUFORT WEST itself is well supplied with schools for Europeans and the coloured classes. It has the first-class school for boys with 47 pupils in attendance; the Dutch Reformed Church mission school with 32 boys and 20 girls, and the English Church mission school with 19 boys and 20 girls on the books. These are connected with Government. Besides, there are the Orange Grove school for girls and young boys, supported by the Dutch Church, at which 18 boys and 49 girls attend; Mrs. Cowan's Preparatory School with 21 boys and 32 girls; and, lastly, a small preparatory school kept by Miss Newton with about 30 pupils. I was permitted to inspect the Orange Grove school and Mrs. Cowan's, a report of both will be found elsewhere. As Beaufort has a population of about 2,500, and has 292 children attending school, it may claim to have a fair proportion of children who are being educated.

In the district I found no public schools out of the town. Not more than six children attending the town school are from the country. The well-to-do farmers who care to give their children a superior education send them to Stellenbosch, where the cost of boarding is very cheap.

2. SLANGFONTEIN, No. I., Nieuwveld, Farm of Mr. W. R. Thompson, F.C., J.P.—This would be a good site for a district boarding school, there being abundance of water, a fine garden, and a large two-storied house available for schoolroom and teacher's residence. About 30 children could be got to attend, not only from Beaufort Division but from Victoria and Fraserburg. Mr. Thompson is one of the leading men of the division, who has sent his own children to Beaufort and Cape Town for education, and has many grandchildren on his farm now needing instruction. I have written to him, urging him to take steps to establish a boarding school.

3a. RIETBRON, Willowmore, Farm of Mr. Carel Keulder, formerly Field-cornet.—This farm lately belonged to Beaufort, and Mr. Keulder still attends church and makes purchases there. On the farm is an unoccupied house, large and suitable for a school. The only water is supplied by a dam. There is a fair garden and a large shop near. Between 25 and 30 children could be got to attend a district boarding school if it were established here. Mr. Keulder has always taken an interest in education. Till lately he has had a private tutor on his farm. I have written to him to try to establish a school.

3b. PAALHUIS, Farm of Mr. W. C. J. Viviers.—This farm is on the road to Fraserburg, and is about thirty-six miles from Beaufort. It has abundance of water and a good garden. There are plenty of children in this neighbourhood to form a school. I have written to Mr. Viviers, urging him to establish a district boarding school; and am the more certain that he will interest himself in the matter, as he has hitherto had private tutors for his own children.

4. MIDDLE KRAAL, centre of Ward No. II., Nieuwveld, Farm of Mr. Stephanus F. Erasmus, about thirty miles from Beaufort.—I met Mr. Erasmus and urged on him the necessity for a school in his neighbourhood. He informed me that he had once before tried a boarding school on his farm, but after fifteen months' trial it had failed. He means to give the

matter another trial. From his own family and those of his neighbours, more than 30 children could easily be got. Mr. Erasmus is a man of much influence, and a boarding school under his direction would be a success. He has promised to get up a guarantee, if possible.

5. VAN DER BYL'S KRAAL, No. V. Ward, Gouph, Farm of Mr. J. J. le Sueur van der Byl.—This would be a good spot for a district boarding school, having good available buildings, plenty of water, and a large garden. Mr. Van der Byl is an energetic man, having great influence among the farmers, and could easily get a guarantee signed. I have written to him on the subject.

For information on the last five places I am indebted to Mr. Garcia, the Civil Commissioner, who courteously offers to assist in every way in his power. I also wrote a letter requesting him to bring the subject of education to the notice of the Divisional Council at its next meeting, and to explain the conditions on which grants in aid are given.

The following is a list of the places at which private teachers are employed:—

1. MAATJES VLEI, Nieuwveld, Farm of Mr. Rose.—Teacher, Miss McLeish, daughter of the Mr. McLeish, formerly headmaster, Grey Institute. She has been educated at Wellington, has been teaching three years, and is a competent teacher. She has six pupils.

2. Mr. MINAAR'S FARM, Nieuwveld.—Till lately the younger Miss McLeish was governess here. She was educated at Wellington, and has a teacher's certificate. At present she is out of employment.

3. PALMIETFONTEIN, Mr. P. J. Jansen van Vuren's Farm.—Miss Wannenberg teaches here. She was educated at the Paarl, has about nine pupils, and gives a sound elementary education in English; teaches music also; been here four months.

4. KUIL'S POORT, Gouph, Farm of Mr. H. de Jager.—Miss Ball; competent to give a sound elementary education in English; teaches music; has about 5 pupils.

5. DE HOOP, Mr. De Jager's Farm, about nine miles from Beaufort.—Miss Dale, educated at Bloemhof, Stellenbosch; competent to give good education; has very young pupils. I could not learn how many. Very highly spoken of.

6. DOORNHOEK, in Gouph, Mr. J. J. Fourie's Farm.—Miss Wicht; has had a good education and travelled in Europe; has about 10 pupils; teaches English and Dutch well; also music.

7. HOOGEKRAAL, Lower Gouph, Mr. Eyber's Farm.—Miss Eybers, niece of the proprietor; has a teacher's certificate; teaches about 12 children, able to give fair education in English and Dutch; teaches piano.

8. WILGERBOSCH, in Gouph, sixty miles from Beaufort.—Mrs. J. Maritz (lately married); gives fair English and Dutch education to about 6 children, and has classes preparing for confirmation.

9. RHENOSTER KOP, Farm of Mr. P. Swanepoel.—Miss Raath, has a few pupils. She chiefly trains for confirmation in the Dutch Church, but knows and teaches a little English.

10. ESTERVILLE, Farm of Mr. Jan de Villiers.—Mr. Gerald Harris, born in India, but educated in Cape Colony; teaches 10 children; gives instruction in elementary subjects; a competent man. He prepares also for confirmation.

11. BRONKHORST VLEY, Farm of Mr. Isaac Verster.—Mr. Herbert Davis; was formerly superintendent of a farm; competent to give instruction in elementary subjects; has a few pupils.

12. MAATJESFONTEIN, Mr. Albert du Toit's Farm.—Miss Palmer taught here till lately. She is now sick in Beaufort.

13. MODDERPOORT, George Marais' Farm.—Mr. Daniel Wilhelm, born in Batavia; teaches English; gives a fair education to a few children.

DIVISION OF RICHMOND.

1. RICHMOND. This town is fairly supplied with schools, having a first-class school for boys with one teacher, and 51 children on the books, and a first-class school for girls with a lady teacher, and 24 children on the books. These two schools are managed by the same committee, with the same guarantee, and in the same building, yet they are quite distinct. I held a meeting of the committee, and proposed that the two schools should be amalgamated, as at present there is a great waste of teaching-power. The teacher in each school is giving instruction at the same time in the same subjects. By uniting the schools, each child would receive double the amount of instruction. The meeting was hastily called together, and the attendance of town members only could be secured. These, however, cordially accepted my recommendation, and promised that the whole matter should be formally brought forward at a full meeting shortly to be convened.

Besides these, there is a school for coloured children with 53 pupils.

In all, 128 children are in receipt of instruction. From a report made to me by one who made a house to house visitation for the purpose of ascertaining the facts of the case, I learned that about 50 white and 100 coloured children in the village are receiving no school instruction whatever.

The farmers have a few governesses and private tutors, but the number of these is small in proportion to the size of the district and its wealth. Several farmers send their children to Cape Town and Stellenbosch for schooling, while others send theirs to Richmond itself. The chief guarantors of the first-class schools are farmers. It seems difficult to establish district boarding schools without injuring them. As for third-class schools, the farms are so large and far apart that they are out of the question.

There are only two places which have been pointed out to me as eligible for district boarding schools, viz. :—

1. DROOGFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Frans Willem Kock, which has abundance of water, a garden with fruit trees, and an available house.

I visited Elandsfontein to see Mr. Kock. His father, Mr. Ludowick Kock, once proposed before to set apart Droogfontein as a place for a boarding school, and offered the handsome sum of £300 a year for five years to support it. The Kerkeraad of Richmond, to whom the offer was made, rejected it on the ground that it would injure the town school, and Mr. Kock abandoned the project and made over the farm to his son.

Both father and son have promised to consider the matter, and, if found to be feasible, to endeavour to get a guarantee list signed.

2. SCHIETKRAAL, Farm of Mr. Berend J. van der Merwe.—This place, which had a school formerly, is about fifteen miles from the village. I met Mr. van der Merwe, and explained the conditions on which Government granted aid to district boarding schools. I have since written to him to urge him to establish a school on his farm.

The following is a list of the private schools, tutors, and governesses in the district :—

1. RICHMOND.—Mrs. Arderne; has 8 pupils, gives very good education in elementary subjects, and is a good teacher of music.

2. RICHMOND.—Miss Roussouw; has 20 or 30 pupils, to whom she gives a good infant school education.

3. RICHMOND.—Miss Williams; has 3 pupils of one family, to whom she gives a good education. She was formerly teacher of the first-class school.

4. RONDAVEL, Farm of Mr. Cornelius Conradie.—Small school of 10 children; teacher, Mr. Ernest Jan Jansen; has only lately begun; means to keep boarders, and hopes his numbers will increase to 15 or 20. He has had an elementary education only, and is engaged for six months.

5. KRIEGERSFONTEIN, Farm of Frans Naudé.—Rev. M. C. Ackermann, brother-in-law of Mr. Naudé; received university education in Europe; has about 10 pupils; able to give a superior education, but teaches elementary subjects only and prepares for confirmation; teaches English and Dutch.

6. DASSIESFONTEIN, Farm, of Messrs. C. S. and F. J. Eckard.—Teacher, Mrs. Roehlin, sister of the proprietors; teaches about 12 pupils, of whom several are boarders; reported as being a good teacher; gives instruction in elementary subjects and music.

7. ROELOFSFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Albertus Meiring.—Teacher, Miss Williams; has 9 pupils, gives a good elementary education, and teaches drawing and music; is sister of Miss Williams, late teacher of First-Class Girls' School, Richmond.

8. ZOETVLEY, Farm of Mr. Thomas Burgers, late President of Transvaal Republic.—Teacher, Miss Booij, a highly educated lady from Holland; has 6 pupils; teaches in Dutch only; gives lessons in music and drawing.

9. JAKALSKUIL, Farm of Mr. Francis Bailey.—Teacher, Miss Wicht, sister of Miss Wicht, of Doornhoek in Gouph; has about 12 pupils; been here only one month; has had an excellent education; been in Europe; teaches music; gives elementary instruction in English and Dutch.

10. KANTFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Jan van Niekerk.—Teacher, Mr. O. Munting; has about 6 pupils; is a good elementary teacher in Dutch.

11. NIETGEDACT, Farm of Mr. B. Booysen, junior.—Teacher, Mr. Gert Moll; has about 20 pupils; educated at the Paarl; was formerly in the district of Victoria West; has been three months on this farm; said to be a very fair elementary teacher.

12. BRITSTOWN, small village, with monthly periodical court; school under the management of the Kerkeraad of the Dutch Reformed Church—Teacher, Mr. H. F. Keet; has between 20 and 30 pupils; gives instruction both in Dutch and English.

HANOVER.

In this town there is at present a school under the management of the Kerkeraad of the Dutch Reformed Church, which has only been open since the 21st February. The teacher is Mr. Le Roux, who recently passed the middle-class teacher's examination, and there are two female assistants. The school attendance numbers 45 boys and girls. I spent two days calling on the principal inhabitants and endeavouring to ascertain their wants. The magistrate of the division, Charles Beere, Esq., then, at my request, convened a public meeting, at which I represented that as Hanover was now erected into a Civil Commissionership it was entitled to a grant for a public aided school of the first-class. I proposed that, instead of setting up an opposition to the school already in existence, this school be incorporated with the one to be set up. The meeting, which

was composed of thirty of the leading inhabitants of the town and neighbourhood, heartily took the matter up, and it was resolved that a first-class school should be established, and that a committee be appointed to canvass the division for subscriptions to a guarantee fund, and to call a public meeting in accordance with the Education Act. It is proposed also to add a boarding department, so as to provide for the wants of the farmers.

At BUSHMAN'S VALLEI, in this division, are to be found 7 or 8 families, and on the neighbouring farm of Mooifontein, 5 families more, of farmers, who are not in circumstances to pay for the board and education of their children at the town school. I propose that a third-class school be established on either of these farms, at which an attendance of from 20 to 30 children could easily be secured. The Rev. A. Hofmeyr of Hanover made this suggestion, and promises to call a meeting on the occasion of his next visit, and to take such steps as are required. I was sorry that it was out of my power to visit these farms.

No other spots have been pointed out as available for schools among farmers.

The following is a list of the private teachers :

1. HANOVER.—Mr. Booysen, private tutor at Mr. Pick's house, near Dutch Reformed Church School; has about 6 pupils; gives elementary education in Dutch.
2. BERNARDUS DALE, HOOGMOEDFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. H. van der Merwe. Teacher, Miss Blanckenberg; only recently come.
3. KLEIN WONDERHEUVEL, Farm of Mr. Jacobus Kotzé.—Teacher, Miss Pratt, formerly assistant in the Midland Seminary, Graaff-Reinet; has about 6 pupils; a good teacher.
4. DWAALFONTEIN, Mr. P. A. Pienaar's Farm.—Teacher, Mr. Thomas McNaughton, educated at South African College; has 10 pupils; gives a good elementary education.
5. KLIPKOP, Mr. George Murray's Farm.—Teacher, Miss Marillier; has 4 or 5 pupils; gives fair elementary instruction; teaches instrumental music.
6. RIETPOORT, Farm of Mr. Piet Theron.—Teacher, Mrs. Conroy; has about 12 to 18 pupils, some of whom are boarders; gives instruction both in English and Dutch.
7. PRESTBURY OF DWAALFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. J. van Zyl.—Mr. H. Coetzee, teacher, is a self-taught man; can teach fairly in Dutch.
8. ALLEMANSFONTEIN, Mr. Louw Conradie's Farm.—Teacher, Mr. Parker; only able to give elementary education in both languages; has about 6 pupils.
9. LEEUWPOORT, Mr. Ignatius Viljoen's Farm.—Teacher, Miss Fincham, formerly of Middelburg; gives elementary instruction to about 6 pupils.
10. LEEUWPOORT, on another portion of the farm, which belongs to Mr. Cornelius Visser, is a governess, whose name I did not learn. She has about 5 or 6 pupils.

DIVISION OF COLESBERG.

1. The town of COLESBERG has a first-class public school for girls and boys, with a headmaster and two assistants. The number of children in attendance is 59. The buildings, &c., are in an unsatisfactory state. I had an interview with the committee and pointed this out. It was resolved that steps should at once be taken to rectify matters.

There is a school for coloured children, which owing to the change of teachers is in an unsatisfactory state. Forty-five children are in attendance.

I found also a small school for infants, with about 10, taught by Miss Marillier. She has been educated at the Graham's Town Convent, and is reported as being a good teacher.

In the vestry of the Native Episcopal Chapel there is a small school with about 25 in attendance. The teacher is Caroline Spies, who was educated at the Wesleyan Native School here.

The town may claim to have schools enough for the population.

2. At RATELPOORT is a district boarding school with 18 pupils. The education is very elementary as yet, owing to the shortness of the time during which the children are permitted to attend. I have written to the Rev. Mr. Alheit, the minister of the Dutch Church, to urge his congregation to take advantage of this school, and to leave their children there till they had a fair education.

3. VOGELFONTEIN, on the farm of Mr. F. Potgieter, is a boarding school, under the care of the Dutch Church, where the children of parents in straitened circumstances are boarded and educated free. Those who remain for a year or less are instructed in Dutch only; while those remaining a longer period learn English also. The house had been rented for five years, and I am informed the school is in a flourishing condition. I have suggested that this be made into a district boarding school under the Act, and have given to the chairman the necessary information as to guarantee, &c. I also suggest that the Civil Commissioner, Mr. Attorney Will, and the Rev. W. Alheit, the chairman, be requested to report to Government on the claims of those who may receive the annual allowance of £6 in aid of their board.

4. BULTFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Jan van der Merwe.—There is also a boarding school here, supported by shareholders, who each contribute £5 per annum, in return for which one child is educated. The teacher, Mr. Eales, is reported as giving a good elementary education, both in English and Dutch.

5. ZEVENFONTEIN, on the road to Philip's Town, Mr. Adriaan Plessis' Farm.—Teacher, Miss Gysbers, from Holland; has 6 pupils; gives instruction in Dutch only.

6. WOLVENFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Joseph van der Walt.—Teacher, Mr. Ochse; has 8 or 10 pupils; gives instruction in English and Dutch.

7. JAKALSFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Jacob van der Walt.—Teacher, Mr. Wolff, a native of Holland, fairly educated; gives education of a very elementary character to about 7 children.

8. TAAIBOSCHLEEGTE, Farm of Mr. N. van Rensburg.—Teacher, Miss Van Rensburg; has 8 pupils; gives very fair elementary instruction both in English and Dutch.

9. RIETKUIL, Farm of Mr. J. Theunissen.—Teacher Miss Leonard; was educated at Graham's Town; has about 6 pupils; good elementary teacher.

10. TYGERHOEK, Farm of Mr. James Norval.—Teacher, Mr. Devenish; gives elementary instruction to 4 pupils in English only.

11. RICKERTSFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. John von Maltetz.—Teacher, Miss Williams, who has passed Cambridge local examination; has 2 pupils in elementary subjects only; a good teacher.

I am indebted to the Rev. William Alheit for most of the above information in regard to private schools.

I also addressed a letter to the Civil Commissioner of the Colesberg Division, requesting him to bring the subject of education to the notice of the members of the Divisional Council, and enclosing copies of the regulations under which aid could be given to third-class schools and district boarding schools.

PHILIP'S TOWN.

1. PHILIP'S TOWN VILLAGE.—This village has two Dutch churches, but only about 150 inhabitants, including coloured people. The surrounding district has about 5,000 inhabitants, who are now petitioning for a separate Magistracy. Most of the houses in the town are only used when the owners attend church. The richer inhabitants of the town have no children; those who have children are uninfluential, and could not support a school. The farmers around would require to help with the guarantee and to send children. A second-class school was tried and failed. A private school kept by Mrs. Trollope has dwindled down, and is likely to be given up, chiefly on account of its inefficiency. There is an excellent schoolroom, with good furniture, which is available at any time. I called on the leading inhabitants, and endeavoured to enlist their sympathy in the cause of education. The Rev. P. du Toit, minister of the Dutch Reformed Church, and P. MacNaughton, Esq., Special Justice of the Peace, have promised to convene a public meeting at next Nachtmaal, and to try to resuscitate the second-class school.

2. MODDERFONTEIN.—The owner of this farm, Mr. Jan Potgieter, about a year ago, offered a building for a public school, but withdrew his offer, and now intends having a private school. On the farm are 11 children of school-going age, and in the immediate vicinity are 10 more who could walk to school. I wrote to him, inviting him to reconsider the matter, and to establish a third-class school instead.

The following is a list of places where governesses or private tutors are to be found:—

3. PELSER BAAKEN, Farm of Mr. Stephanus du Plessis.—Teacher, Mr. George Marriott, who, I am told, is well educated; has 4 or 5 pupils; gives elementary instruction only.

4. HONDEBLAF, Farm of Mr. Jacobus van Vuren.—Teacher, Mr. F. Ahrens, a Hollander, who has had a fair education; has about 8 pupils, who are young; prepares for confirmation.

5. QUAGGAS GAT, Farm of Mr. Adriaan Venter.—Teacher, Mr. Charles Ochse, a Hollander; has about 6 pupils; prepares for confirmation.

6. WASCHBANK, or EZELFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. R. du Plessis.—Teacher, Miss Roux, who has had a good education at the Wellington Huguenot Seminary; has three pupils; a very fair teacher.

7. ROLFFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. Van der Walt.—Teacher, Mr. Hendrik van der Walt; has 8 young pupils; gives elementary education in Dutch only, chiefly for confirmation.

8. BRULFFONTEIN, Farm of Mr. P. J. van der Merwe.—Teacher, Miss Morris, formerly head teacher of the Government School for Girls at Worcester; a good teacher; instructs in music.

HOPE TOWN.

1. VILLAGE OF HOPE TOWN.—This village has a population of about 500, and has two schools, one for boys with an attendance of 31, and the other for girls, with an attendance of 35. There was formerly a school for coloured children, which has been closed. The schoolrooms in which the

boys' and girls' schools are conducted are small, badly ventilated, unhealthy, and generally unfit for teaching purposes. I met the school committee, and pointed this out, explaining that it would be necessary to provide better accommodation if the annual grant was to be retained.

The committee resolved to build new schoolrooms, and five of them subscribed the sum of £100 each towards the funds required for the purpose.

Nearly all the children in attendance belong to the village, and few, if any, are from the country.

The following appeared from the inquiry to be the best spots at which schools for farmers might be established:—

2. BEERVLEY.—This is a large vley in the west of the district, formed by the expansion of the Brak River. It has several farms around it. One of these, Kalk Kraal, the property of Mr. Hermanus Venter, is the most central and convenient for a school. About 12 children either reside on it or are within easy walking distance, and 12 or 15 more could ride every day. I wrote to Mr. Venter, inviting him to take the necessary steps to set up a third-class school on his farm.

3. LEEUWBERG, about thirty miles from Hope Town.—There are four farms clustered together, with about 20 children of an age to attend school. These children live within walking distance. In the event of a school being established, more would be sent from other farms. At the recommendation of Mr. Hudson, Civil Commissioner and Resident Magistrate, I wrote to Mr. Johannes Andreas Wijd, Field-cornet, Verlaten Dam, requesting him to use his influence to establish a third-class school, or, if possible, a district boarding school.

4. JAKALSKUIL, Farm of Mr. J. W. de Villiers.—Mr. James Curlewis, formerly second master at the Petrusville village school, is teacher here; has 4 pupils; and gives a good elementary education in English. Mr. De Villiers formerly proposed to have a school on his farm. About 20 children could be got to attend from Jakalskuil and the neighbourhood. I wrote to Mr. De Villiers, inviting him to proceed with the establishment of a third-class school, and suggesting that Mr. Curlewis should be retained as teacher.

The following is a list of places where tutors or governesses are to be found:—

5. WIJDSPAN, Farm of Mr. Jan Wijd.—Teacher, Mr. T. Boylan, a native of Ireland; has about 5 or 6 pupils; gives elementary instruction.

6. BEERVLEY, ZWINGLES PAN, Farm of the Widow Duran.—Teacher, Mr. Jacob Gerritz, a Hollander; has about 7 pupils; prepares for confirmation in Dutch Reformed Church.

7. ZOUTSPANSPUT, Farm of Mr. Piet J. du Toit.—Teacher, Mr. F. Marriott, educated in England; has 8 pupils; gives elementary education in English only.

8. WONDERDRAAI, Farm of Mr. Nicolaas Badenhorst.—Teacher, Miss Francis, educated at Hope Town Public School; has about 7 pupils; gives elementary instruction in Dutch only.

As far as education is concerned, the district of Hope Town is in a backward state.

KIMBERLEY.

The large and important town of Kimberley is fairly supplied with schools. For boys of European extraction there are, 1, *St. Cyprian's*, in connection with the Church of England, with an attendance of about 40,

the instruction given being fair, but not equal to that of the best first-class schools in the Colony. 2. *Mr. Bennie's Private School*, with about 40 pupils, who have received the greater part of their education at St. Cyprian's. The standard of attainment is lower than it is at the latter school. For European girls there are, 1. *St. Michael's* in connection with the Church of England, with about 70 pupils, including little boys in the infant department. It is a day school, and being only a preparatory school to the St. Michael's Home, Bloemfontein, is of a lower standard than might be expected. 2. *The Convent of the Holy Family (High School)*, in connection with the Roman Catholic Church. It has about 60 pupils and is an excellent school. 3. *Mr. Bennie's Private School for Girls*, having 11 pupils. The standard of attainment is that of a second-class school in the Colony.

There are also several mixed schools. 1. *St. Catherine's Parish School (Day School)*, under the Roman Catholic Church. Including the infant department it has about 90 children in attendance, and is a good preparatory school. 2. *The Dutch Reformed Church School at Newton*, which has 60 pupils, and has a tolerable standard of attainment. 3. *Miss Manley's Private School* with 50 pupils, a well conducted institution.

For coloured children there is only one school, the Wesleyan School in Bean-street. None of the pupils could work even a simple addition sum correctly, on the occasion of my visit.

As all the grants from the late Government cease at the end of June, 1881, it was necessary to bring the schools at Kimberley under the Colonial system. For this purpose, a meeting, called by the Mayor, was held in the Town-hall, on the 21st of April, and was largely and influentially attended. I suggested that, as Kimberley was the most important town in the north of the Colony, a really first-class school should be established, capable of giving as good an education as Dale College, the Grey Institute, or the South African College School; that the Headmaster should receive at least £600 per annum, and assistants in proportion; and that the Committee of Management should keep in view the necessity for in time taking advantage of the Higher Education Act. I further suggested that a number of preparatory schools, to act as feeders, should be set up in suitable parts of the town.

The meeting resolved to establish a first-class public school for boys and to open a guarantee list to meet expenses. A proposal to the effect that St. Cyprian's be taken over as the public school was set aside. A subsequent meeting was held on the 2nd of May, at which it was announced that over £1,100 had been guaranteed for three years, and £600 subscribed towards a building fund. The Committee of Management at St. Cyprian's have determined to continue it as a church school.

In addition to the schools mentioned above, all of which were submitted to inspection, I ascertained that the following teachers had small private schools:—

1. *Miss Hilder*, who teaches in the vestry of the West End Wesleyan Chapel. She has about 20 children, boys and girls, who receive a fair elementary education, and gives lessons in music.
2. *Miss Cundell*, at De Beer's, has from 20 to 25 pupils, chiefly girls, to whom elementary education is given.
3. *Miss McCormack* was formerly a pupil in St. Michael's, where she was trained as a teacher.
4. *Miss Naudé*, who has herself had a good education, gives elementary instruction to about 20 pupils.
5. *Miss Webb*, educated at Uitenhage, said to be a trained teacher, has about 30 girls, who receive elementary education.

6. At Koedoesberg, farm of Mr. Philip Wright, *Miss Hilder* gives instruction of an elementary character to 5 pupils; she was educated at the Convent, Bloemfontein.

Thus about 640 European and 100 coloured children attend school in Kimberley.

DU TOIT'S PAN.

Du Toit's Pan is tolerably supplied with means of education, having, 1. *All Saints' School for Boys*, in connection with the Church of England. The attendance is 24, and standard of attainment somewhat low. 2. *All Saints' School for Girls* with 36 pupils. It has been only a short time in existence, but the children have reached a very fair standard. 3. *Mrs. Wallace's Private School for coloured children* mostly, which is now held in All Saints' Church, and has 20 pupils in attendance, who have reached a fair standard.

The magistrate, at my suggestion, called a meeting of the inhabitants on the 20th April, to consider the advisability of setting up a second-class school, in terms of the Colonial Act. After explanations, it was resolved to set up such a school. A subsequent proposal that the existing schools of all Saints' be taken over on condition that the public be represented on the committee was negatived, and it was resolved to begin *de novo*. A committee was appointed to procure subscriptions to the required guarantee, and to collect information. With this committee I had a conference, and gave advice as to future procedure. The managers of All Saints' have determined to keep their schools on their original basis, and no amalgamation with the public school is likely to take place.

It is intended that Mrs. Wallace's school be changed into a mission school under the superintendence of the rector of All Saints'.

Besides the schools mentioned above, all of which were inspected, I learned that a private school is held in the Roman Catholic Church at Bultfontein. The teacher is *Miss Walsh*; she has 6 boys and 24 girls, to whom education of a very elementary character is given.

There are thus about 90 European and 20 coloured children receiving instruction in Du Toit's Pan.

PNIEL.

Pniel is a mission station on the banks of the Vaal, with about 800 inhabitants and two missionaries. At one time the population was larger, but in 1865 a severe drought compelled many of the inhabitants to leave, and at last only 50 remained. By constructing large dams, erecting steam pumps, and enabling irrigation to be largely carried on, the missionary has induced many to return. To earn a living all are compelled to plough and reap, and no better education could be given.

One of the missionaries teaches a school attended by about 70 children, who have reached a tolerable standard of attainment. This school will now be placed under the Education Department.

BARKLY.

Barkly is a small town on the banks of the Vaal, formerly the capital of the Diamond Fields, but now only of secondary importance. The population is small, and there are only 30 European children of a school-going age. The only means of education are the so-called Barkly High School and a small private school.

The High School is held in a house which is private property. At one time it was a flourishing institution, giving a really good education, but since

that it has declined to the level of a third-class school. The former Head-master, Canon Doxat, lodged his boarders in a spacious building situated at some distance from the lower end of the town. This building was originally erected for a hospital, but when the prosperity of the place declined, the trustees found it was no longer required for this purpose. They therefore handed it over to the late Griqualand West Government, on the distinct understanding that it was to be used for educational purposes. Since that it has been burnt down and rebuilt at Government expense. The present Head master was appointed in March, 1880, by the Griqualand West Government, and received permission to occupy this building on condition that he started a school as soon as possible. But recently the Bishop of Bloemfontein, on the recommendation of the Head master, applied to the Colonial Government for a lease rent free of this building for 21 years to be used as a Convalescent Home. The inhabitants of Barkly are thus without school premises, although a commodious building, formerly used for a school and actually handed over for the purpose, is there.

As the grant from the Griqualand West Government ceases in June, it was necessary to try to establish a school in terms of the Colonial Act. For this purpose the Civil Commissioner, at my request, convened a public meeting in the Court Room, on the 25th of April, which was attended by the leading inhabitants. It was resolved to establish a first-class school, and an influential committee was appointed to obtain subscriptions to the usual guarantee. Before the close of the meeting a considerable sum was subscribed.

The private school is kept by *Miss Brunette*, who has 8 pupils, 2 boys and 6 girls. To these she gives a very fair education, besides giving lessons in music and French. Her pupils have taken high places in advanced schools.

KIESIKAMA.

Kiesikama lies on the banks of the Vaal, midway between Niekerk's Rush and Waldeck's Plant, mining villages, four miles apart. Besides, the village of Gong-Gong lies about one and a half miles away. These villages are inhabited by diggers who formerly owned claims in Kimberley and Du Toit's Pan, which they have sold to companies. The houses are now made of brick or iron, and I am assured by the Civil Commissioner of Barkly and the Inspector of Claims that the population is permanent. Waldeck's Plant contains 5 shops and a post office, Niekerk's Rush has two, and Gong-Gong two.

The community have had a school since July, 1880. They procured a teacher, guaranteed his salary, and erected a house and schoolroom. At the period of my visit 32 children were in attendance, and it has been ascertained that at least 20 more of school-going age are in the neighbourhood.

A meeting of the leading inhabitants was held at Waldeck's Plant, Mr. C. Campbell, the Civil Commissioner, being in the chair, at which it was resolved to establish a second-class public school, under the Colonial Act. A committee of five was appointed to make the required arrangements and to summon a public meeting at three weeks' date. They were specially charged to report on (1) what subscriptions to a guarantee fund had been procured, and (2) whether the Committee of the existing school were willing to hand over the premises to be used as an undenominational school. Before I left an ample sum had been subscribed. I have to acknowledge my obligations to the Civil Commissioner for information and assistance.

HAY.

I met the Civil Commissioner of the district, who gave me the following information:—

Griquatown has only five European families, with about 12 or 13 children. The whole population, white and coloured, is only about 100. The latter are Bechuanas, Korannas, Bushmen and Griquas, the Griquas forming the greater proportion. In seasons of drought the coloured population leave the town in search of water for their flocks, &c. The population of the division numbers about 300. Being mostly Dutch, there is a disinclination at the present time to have the children taught English. No good, therefore, could be accomplished by a visit.

As the Rev. W. Robertson, of Tulbagh, who was recently appointed by the Synod to hold services in Griqualand, intended to visit Griquatown, I requested the Civil Commissioner to co-operate with him in endeavouring to establish a public school, and have since learned that the inhabitants were unable to guarantee the amount required.

There are no schools whatever in this district.

HERBERT.

This division has no town or centre at which a public school could be erected. The Divisional Council, however, propose that the seat of magistracy be removed from its present inconvenient locality to some spot near the middle of the division. When this is done an effort may be made.

There are about 200 children of school-going age in the division.

I made a journey through the district with a view to finding convenient spots for a district boarding school or third-class schools. The neighbourhood of Vetberg is probably the most central. The Field-cornet, Mr. Wroe, summoned a meeting of the inhabitants to meet me and discuss the question of education. Only a very few attended. I urged them to establish a boarding school, and to build a schoolroom and residence for the teacher and boarders, and explained what grants could be obtained in aid. Mr. Dugmore, who was present, offered a site and the sum of £100 towards the erection of a chapel, which would be available as a schoolroom. Another gentleman offered £30 besides contributions towards the working expenses of the school. Nothing further was done. But I have since met Mr. E. Boyer Cook, J.P., who has promised to hold another meeting for the purpose of establishing a district boarding school. The leading inhabitants have also been supplied with copies of the conditions on which grants are issued.

The following is a list of private tutors and governesses in this division:—

1. At Vetberg, farm of Mr. G. W. Dugmore, is *Mr. Henry Limecar Price*, who gives two boys an elementary education. They read and write well; one works simple multiplication fairly.
2. At Kruidfontein, farm of Mr. J. Maritz, *Miss Dall* has 9 or 10 pupils, who receive instruction in the Dutch language only, and are chiefly prepared for confirmation.
3. At Thornhill, farm of Mr. E. Boyer Cook, *Miss Hudson* has 2 pupils receiving instruction in the usual elementary subjects.
4. At Buckland, on the Vaal River, farm of Mr. James Turner, *Mr. A. de Smidt* has 5 pupils, to whom instruction in English is given.

5. At Naauwpoort, on the Riet River, farm of Mr. Guildenhuis, *Mr. Lane*, an Englishman, who has had a good education, instructs 4 or 5 pupils, and is reported as being a good teacher.

6. At Valschefontein, Riet River, the farm of Mr. Herbert, *Mr. Sylvester Herbert* teaches 4 or 5 pupils in English; he is said to be fairly educated.

7. At Sandrift, or Koedoesberg Drift, farm of Mrs. Heidemann, *Mr. Scholtz* gives instruction of a very elementary character to about 8 or 10 pupils.

8. At Du Plooy's Berg, farm of Mr. Du Plooy, a teacher, whose name I did not ascertain, educates about 4 pupils. Being a Hollander, he teaches in Dutch only, and chiefly prepares for confirmation.

About 40 children are thus in receipt of instruction, mostly of an inferior kind.

HOPE TOWN.

I met the school committee of Hope Town to enquire as to the progress made with school buildings. It was reported that subscription lists had been sent out, and that the sum of £380 had been collected. A balance of £38 in the bank made up an available sum of £418. If the building at present in use is sold, a further sum of £200 will be obtained, making a total of £618. Through their member a petition was sent to Parliament asking for a special grant of £500 on the pound for pound principle, which was refused. It is to be hoped that building will be commenced as soon as possible, as the present schoolrooms are most detrimental to the health of both teachers and scholars.

In the month of March I called the attention of Mr. Wyd, of Leeuwberg, and others, to the necessity of setting up third-class schools on their farms, but nothing has been done.

PETRUSVILLE.

Petrusville is a small village, in the division of Hope Town, about 10 miles from the Orange River. It is about four years old, contains a Dutch Church and two stores, and has a population of 188 souls, of whom 42 are of an age to attend school. There is no minister as yet, but one is expected shortly.

A private school with 25 children on the books is held in the church. I was permitted to inspect it, and found that all the pupils, except four, are instructed through the medium of Dutch, and chiefly with a view to confirmation. The school had only been open for a short time.

I called on the leading men, explained the object of my visit, and summoned a meeting. The people declined to attend, but one of their number, Mr. Petrus van der Walt, waited on me, to discuss the conditions on which grants are issued. No hope was held out that a school would be established. On the contrary, Mr. Van der Walt begged I would receive and forward to the Education Department a letter, embodying the objections he, on behalf of his fellow townsmen, had to urge against the present system. The main points are these:—

1. That the Protestant religion alone should be taught in schools, and that religious teaching be no longer optional.
2. That the appointment of free scholars be left in the hands of committees instead of with the Governor. I understand this to aim at the exclusion of coloured children.
3. That the medium of instruction be English or Dutch at the option of the committee.

4. That grants should be issued to religious bodies instead of committees elected from the general public.

These are a fair sample of the objections which are constantly raised, and will help to explain why so little progress is made in setting up new schools in localities remote from the larger towns.

PHILIP'S TOWN.

On the occasion of a former visit in March, I called on the chief inhabitants, and urged them to resuscitate the school in this rising town. An attempt was made, when Natchmaal was held, to obtain subscriptions to a guarantee fund; but this failed, as the farmers present were nearly all in favour of a church school. On the 18th of May I paid a second visit, and invited the inhabitants to meet me. The meeting was attended by twenty of the leading men, Mr. P. McNaughton, Special Justice of the Peace, in the chair, when the following resolutions were adopted:—1. That the second-class school be re-established. 2. That a committee be chosen to obtain signatures to a guarantee. 3. That a meeting be held to hear the report of the committee and to elect managers.

The committee chosen consisted of influential men, the requisite sum has been guaranteed, and the school will re-open next quarter.

COLESBERG.

I addressed a letter (enclosing copies of School Regulations) to the Civil Commissioner, to be submitted to the Divisional Council. These have been distributed among the members. A sub-committee of three was appointed to ascertain the feeling of the farmers, and to report. Nothing more has yet been done.

At Bultfontein a district boarding school was established in April last, and has now 23 pupils. More are expected. The widow Van der Merwe has given the use of the farm and buildings free of charge for one year. The managers have spent a small sum on the conversion of an outbuilding into a schoolroom. If this school proves a success, the managers intend to remove it to the neighbouring farm of Middlewater, where buildings will require to be erected, but the farm itself will be rent-free.

I met the committee of the first-class school to hear what progress had been made with regard to new premises—the old ones having been condemned. It appears that a public meeting was held by the managers to ventilate the subject. A committee was appointed to consider ways and means, a site was procured from the Dutch Church, and an unsuccessful petition sent to Parliament for a separate grant.

HANOVER.

When I visited Hanover in March, a meeting of the inhabitants of the town and neighbourhood was held, at which it was resolved to establish a first-class school, and incorporate it with the existing school belonging to the Dutch Reformed community. The congregation of that church refused to ratify this, and the matter therefore remains in abeyance. An attempt has been made to obtain fresh subscriptions to the guarantee fund of the church school, but, I understand, without success. Should this school fall to the ground through want of funds, it is expected that there will be little difficulty in establishing a good school on a broad and liberal basis.

RICHMOND.

The first-class school continues to thrive. The committee have attended to the recommendations made in regard to out-offices, and, as soon

as the frosts of winter are over, intend to put the rest of the premises into thorough repair. The guarantee expires at the end of the present quarter. Subscription papers have been sent out, and a considerable sum has already been promised. There will be no difficulty in raising the sum of money required to maintain the school in its present efficiency. A meeting of guarantors will be held in July next to elect managers. The question will also be submitted as to whether it is desirable to amalgamate the boys' and girls' schools, so as to economise teaching power.

VICTORIA WEST.

This division, which has long been without a public school, has now a second-class school, with an attendance of 60 boys and girls. Considerable progress has been made since it was opened at the beginning of the year. As there are too many pupils for one man, the committee have resolved to apply for a grant for an assistant, and intend to appoint a lady to teach the girls exclusively. As the present schoolroom is much too small, it is intended that new buildings be erected, and a bazaar will be held about September to procure the necessary funds.

The mission school connected with the Dutch Church has had a new master appointed, and there are over 30 children on the books.

The English Church mission school is now closed.

I met the Divisional Council, and pressed upon them the necessity for taking steps to erect district boarding schools or third-class schools in the several wards of the division, and at the same time distributed copies of the conditions on which grants are issued. They promised to ventilate the matter, and take what steps they deemed necessary, but declined to advise me in the meantime as to the most suitable localities for erecting such schools.

So far as I could ascertain, the following is a list of the different private tutors and governesses now at work in this division:—

1. *Mrs. Miller* in the village. She has about 23 pupils, and is said to be a good teacher; she gives lessons in music.
2. *Miss Herman*, also in the village; has 4 pupils; is a good teacher; gives instruction in music; has herself received a good education in England and Holland.
3. *Miss Meiring*, also in the village, has 8 pupils; teaches elementary subjects and music.
4. *Miss Clayton* at Beyersfontein, farm of Mr. Jacobus Barnard, instructs 12 pupils in English and music; teaching up to a fair standard.
5. *Miss Danielli* at Kalkfontein, farm of Mr. A. de Bruijn, has 5 pupils to whom elementary instruction up to a fair standard is given in English; she also teaches music.
6. *Miss Van der Merwe*, at Modderfontein, farm of Mr. P. J. van der Merwe, gives fair instruction both in English and Dutch, has 6 pupils, and gives lessons in music.
7. *Miss Erasmus* at Eendvogelfontein, farm of Mr. Gert Verster, has 5 pupils, to whom fair instruction is imparted in both English and Dutch. She also teaches music.
8. *Mr. Van Heusden* at Slagberg, farm of Abel Erasmus, has 10 pupils to whom elementary instruction is given in English and Dutch.
9. *Mr. Hofstede* at Barnard's Dam, farm of Mr. H. C. Barnard, is a good Dutch scholar, and has 9 pupils receiving instruction in both languages.

10. *Mr. J. H. Loots* at Hex River, farm of Mr. Loots, his father, has 8 pupils, who receive very elementary instruction in Dutch only.

11. *Mr. Moll* at the Dam, farm of Mr. Dirk Human, has 6 or 7 pupils.

12. *Mr. Smith* at Gabriels Baken, farm of Mr. Adrian Blom, has received a good education, and teaches about 8 pupils.

13. *Mrs. Williams* at Request, farm of Mr. Thomas A. Hugo, has 10 pupils who are taught in English; she instructs also in music.

14. *Mr. B. Bergman*, at Klercksfontein, farm of Mr. John de Klerck, has about 15 pupils, who are taught in both languages; the teaching is very elementary.

15. *Miss Swanevelder*, at Reitgat, farm of Mr. Frans Nolte, has about 12 pupils, who receive very elementary instruction in Dutch, chiefly for confirmation.

16. *Mr. Andries Vorster*, at Duivefontein, farm of Mr. Hendrik Olwage, teaches 6 children, mostly beginners, in both languages.

17. *Miss Emily Row*, at Brandewyn's Kuil, farm of Mr. H. S. Wilson, J.P., has received a good education in England and France, and has 3 pupils, who receive the usual elementary instruction, together with French and drawing.

18. *Miss A. Nickerk* at Kromaar, farm of Mr. P. J. A. Vos, was herself educated at the Rhenish Institute, Stellenbosch, and teaches about 6 or 7 pupils; she gives lessons in music.

19. *Mr. Bruwer*, at Dissels Kuil, farm of Mr. Johannes Jooste, has 8 pupils, and teaches in Dutch only.

20. *Mr. James Rose Innes Anderson* at Pampoen Port, farm of Mr. J. Hugo, has about 8 pupils; teaches in English; is reported to be a good teacher.

There are thus about 230 European and 30 coloured children receiving instruction in the division of Victoria West.

PRIESKA.

The small village of Prieska is so far removed from the main road that I found it impossible to visit it. At the present time there are two private schools in existence.

1. The first is taught by *Miss Devenish*, who has about 18 or 20 children of both sexes on her books. The school is held in a private house, and a superior elementary education is given, besides lessons in music, sewing, and fancy work.

2. *Mr. Carl van der Merwe* keeps a small school, where only Dutch is taught, and the children are chiefly prepared for confirmation.

I wrote to Mr. Robert Mitchell, Special Justice of the Peace, requesting him to summon a public meeting for the purpose of endeavouring to set up a second-class school, and suggesting that Miss Devenish's school might be incorporated with it. In reply, I am informed that the meeting will be shortly called, and the matter of education discussed.

BEAUFORT WEST.

The first-class school is in a languishing state, the numbers having declined about 50 per cent.

The mission schools are in a flourishing condition, especially that connected with the Dutch Church.

On the occasion of my former visit in February, I wrote a letter to the Civil Commissioner, requesting him to bring the subject of education under the notice of the Divisional Council. This body resolved to print a circular for distribution among the field-cornets and leading farmers, and to enclose copies of the conditions on which grants are issued to district boarding schools and third-class schools. These circulars are now distributed, and it is to be hoped that the farming population will embrace the opportunity of bringing superior education to their own doors.
