LEAGUE OF NATIONS UNION

is a British organisation whose aim is to educate and to make effective public opinion concerning the League of Nations. It already possesses more than 400 Branches throughout England. The following are the terms of Membership:—

An Annual Subscription of at least £1 entitles a member to "Headway," the journal of the Union, and to all pamphlets and similar literature published by the Union.

An Annual Subscription of at least 2s. 6d. entitles a member to receive "Headway" regularly by post.

The Minimum Subscription is one shilling.

The above Annual Subscriptions supply only a small part of the funds required to maintain and develop the work of the League of Nations Union.
