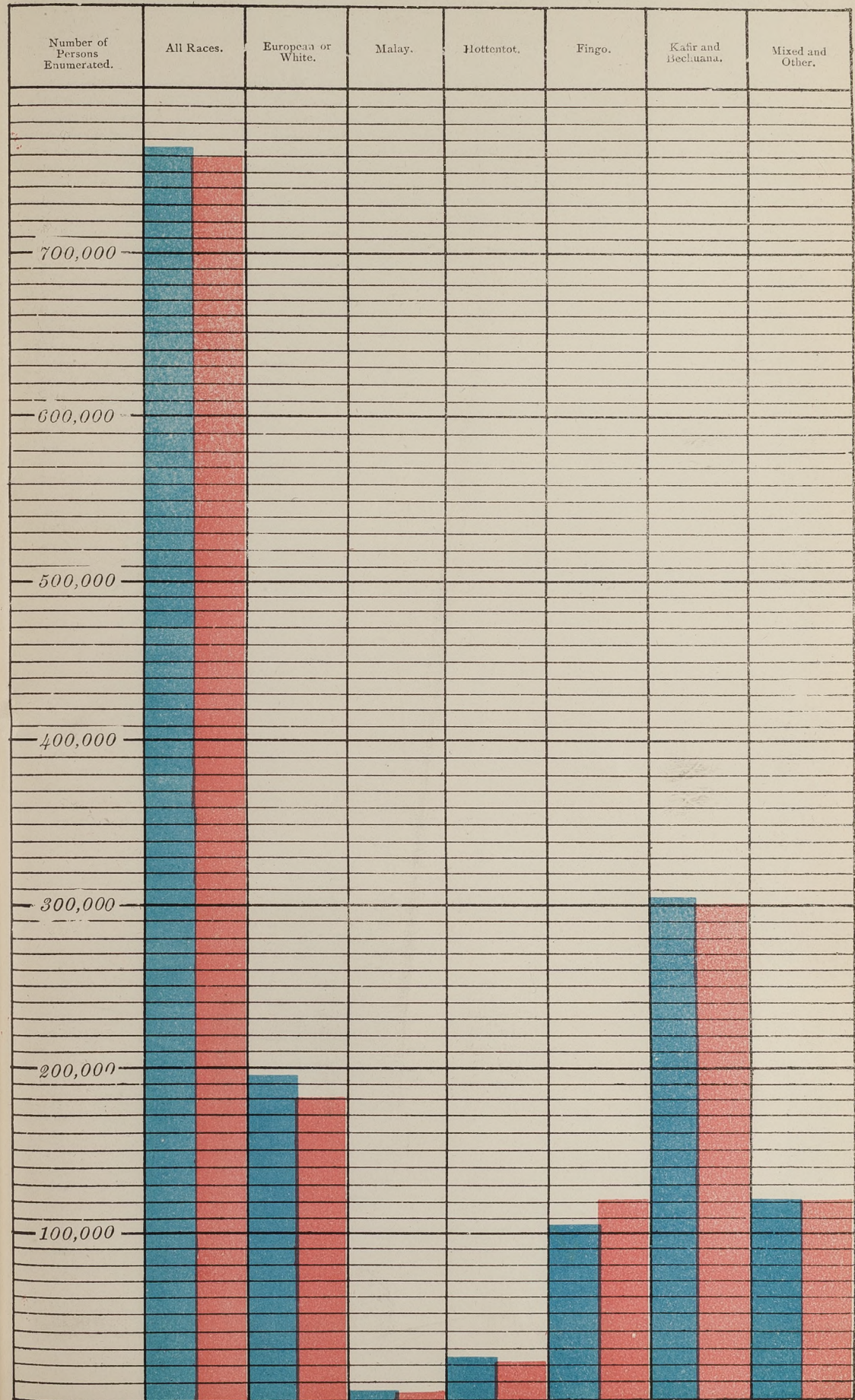

Diagram showing the Population of each Race according to the Census of April, 1891.

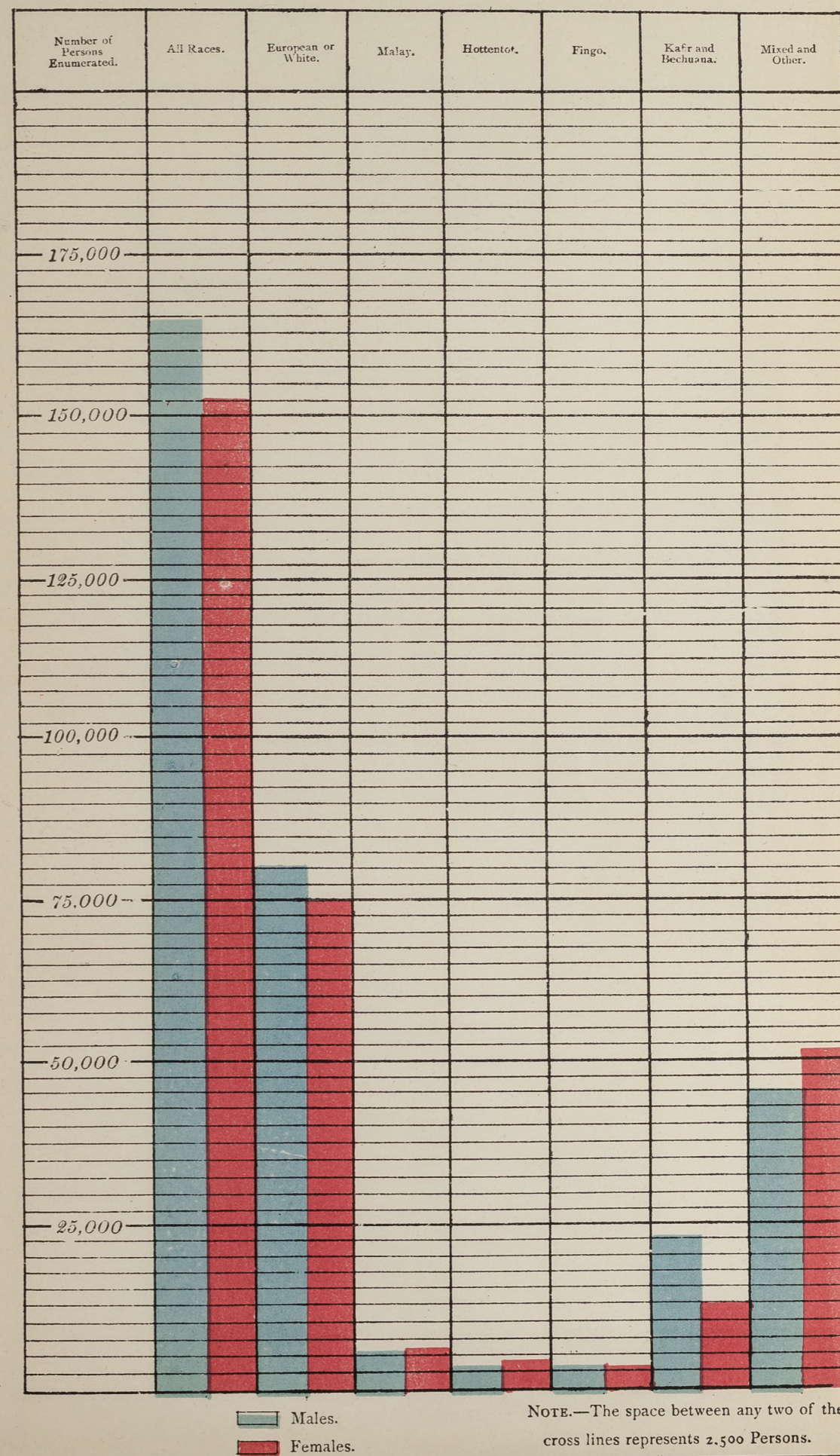

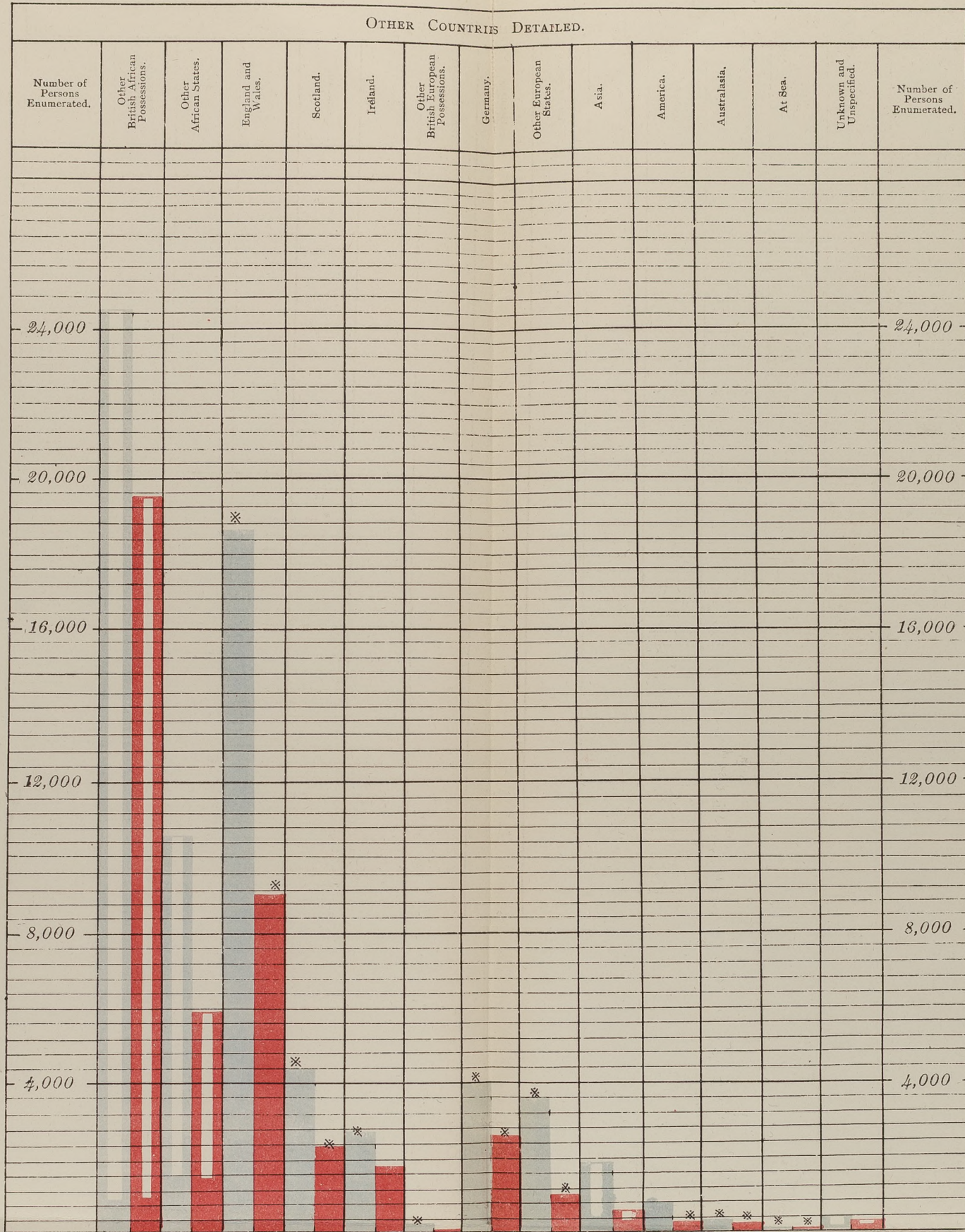
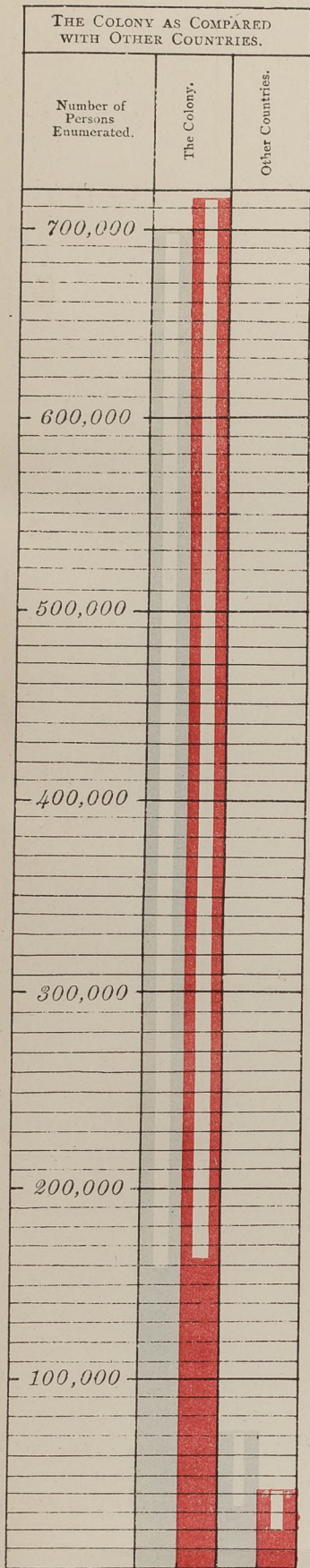

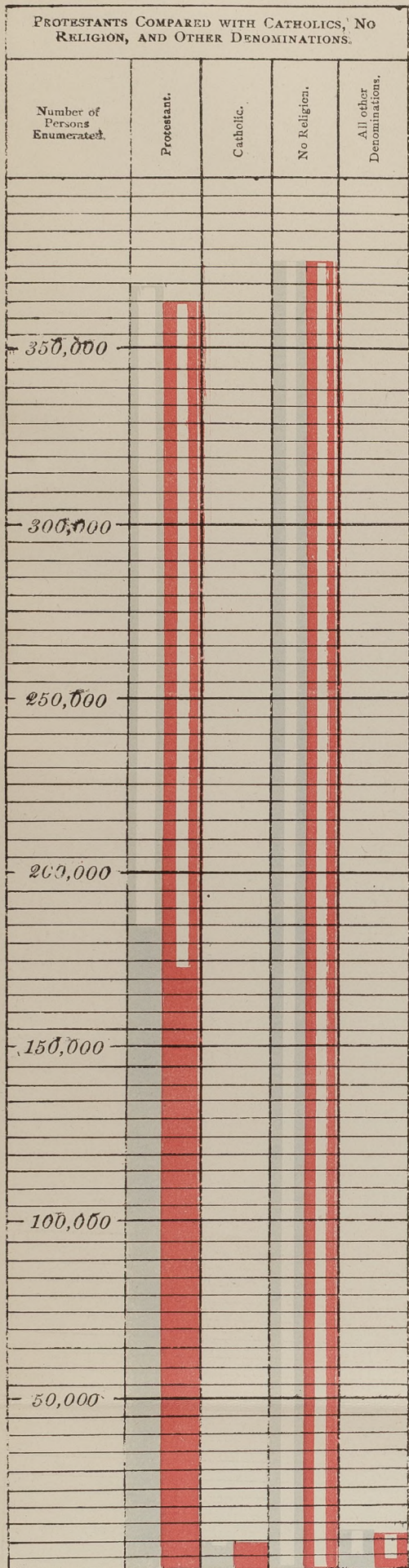

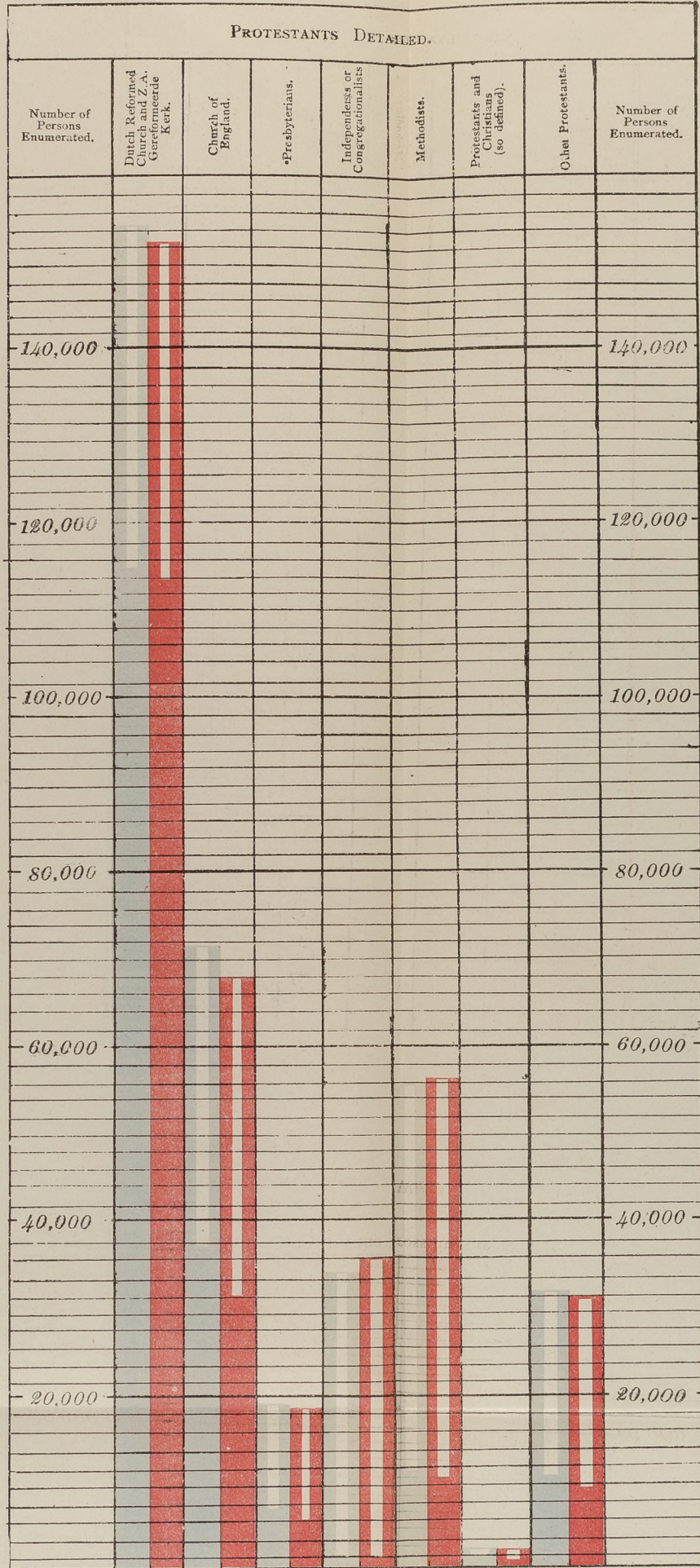

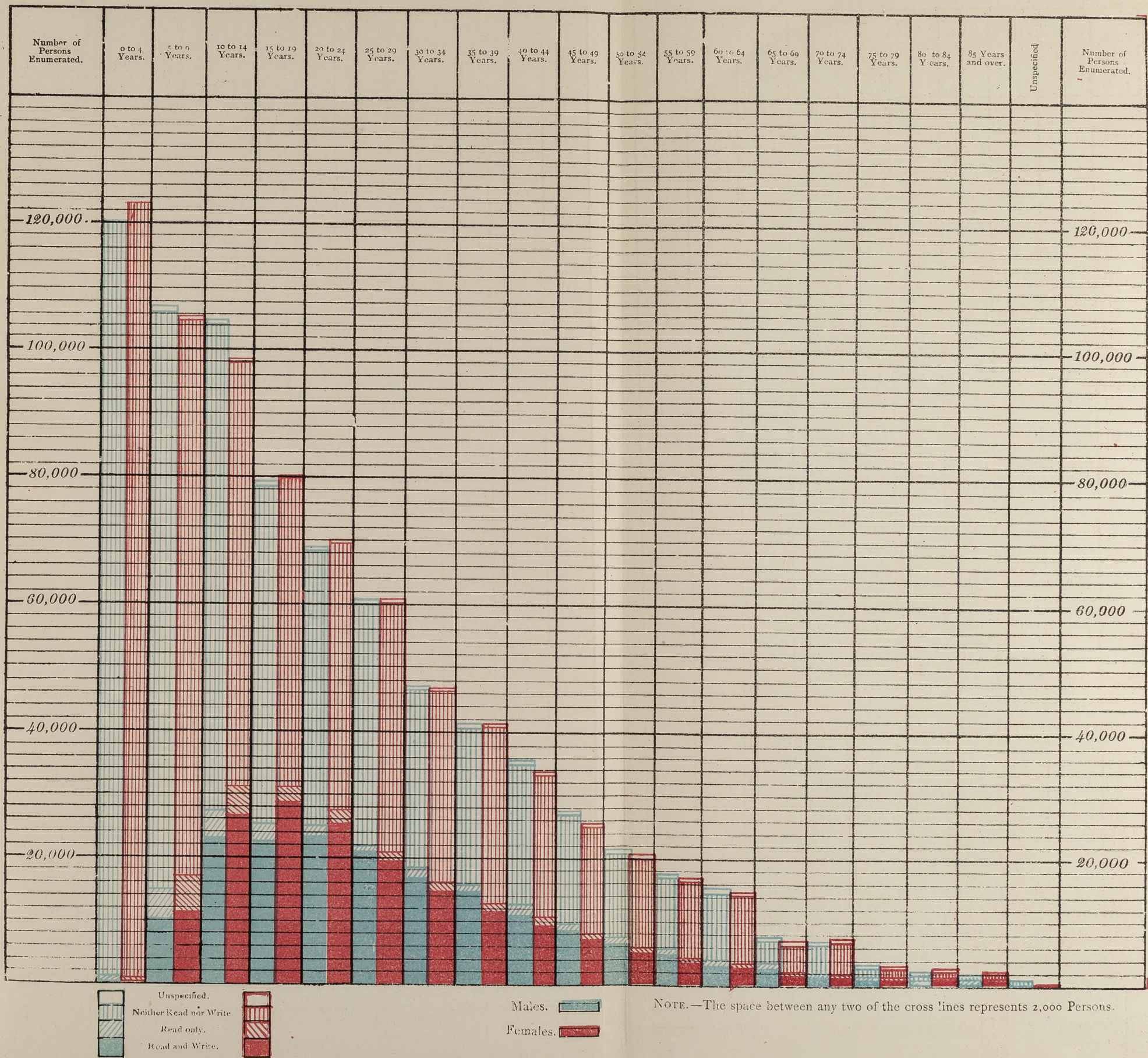

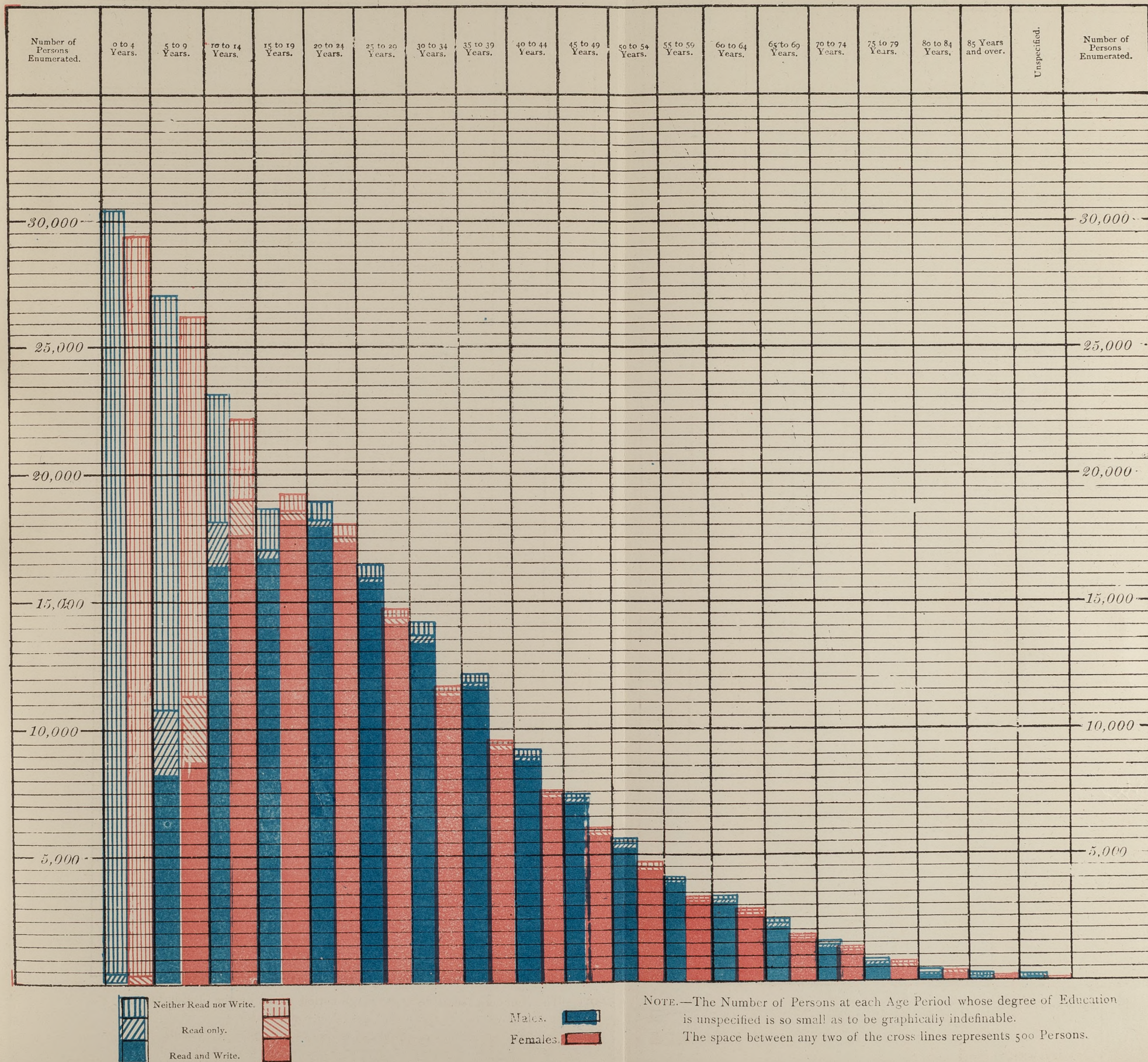

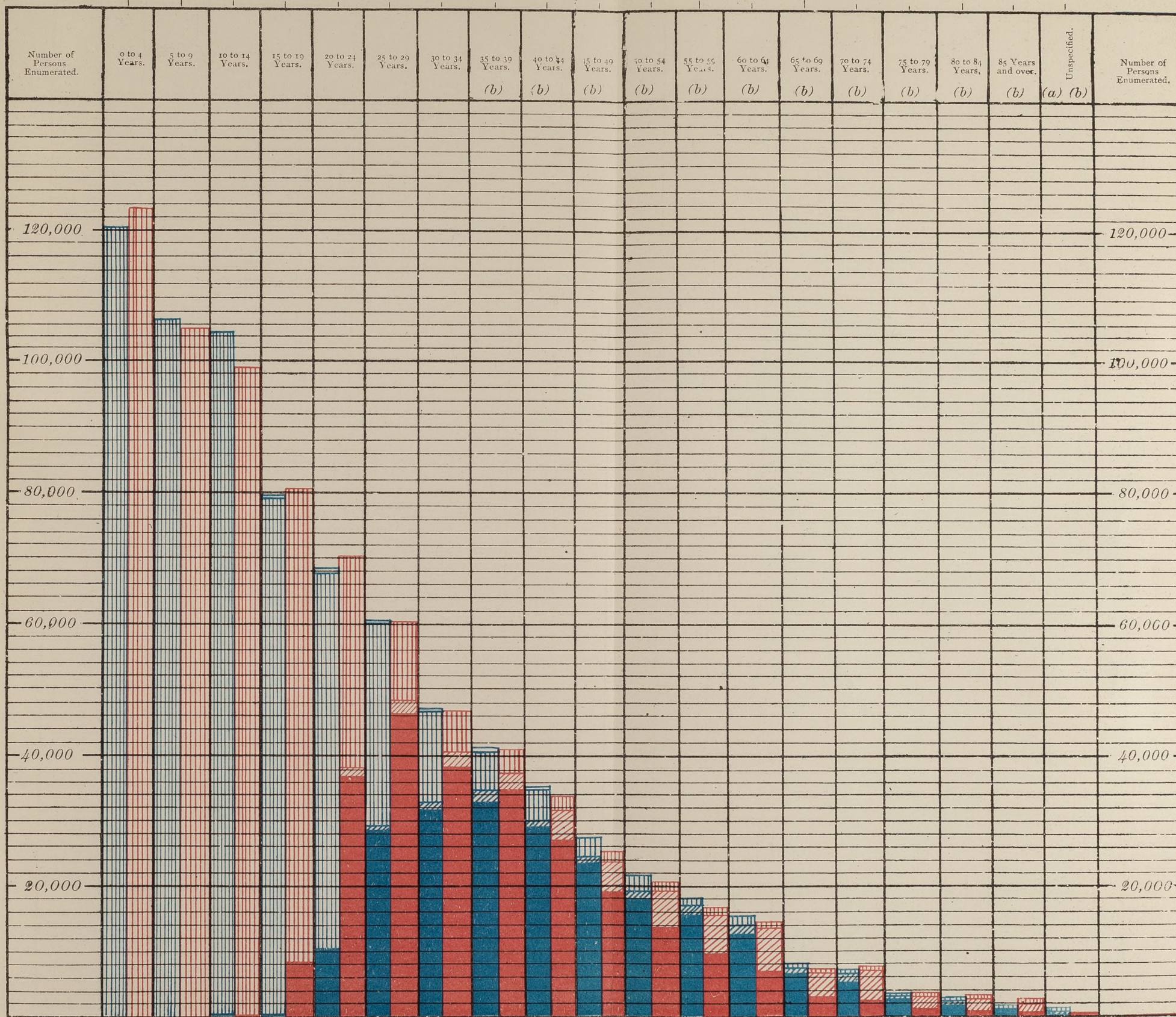
Diagram showing the Ages of the European or White Population in combination with Education, according to the Census of April, 1891.

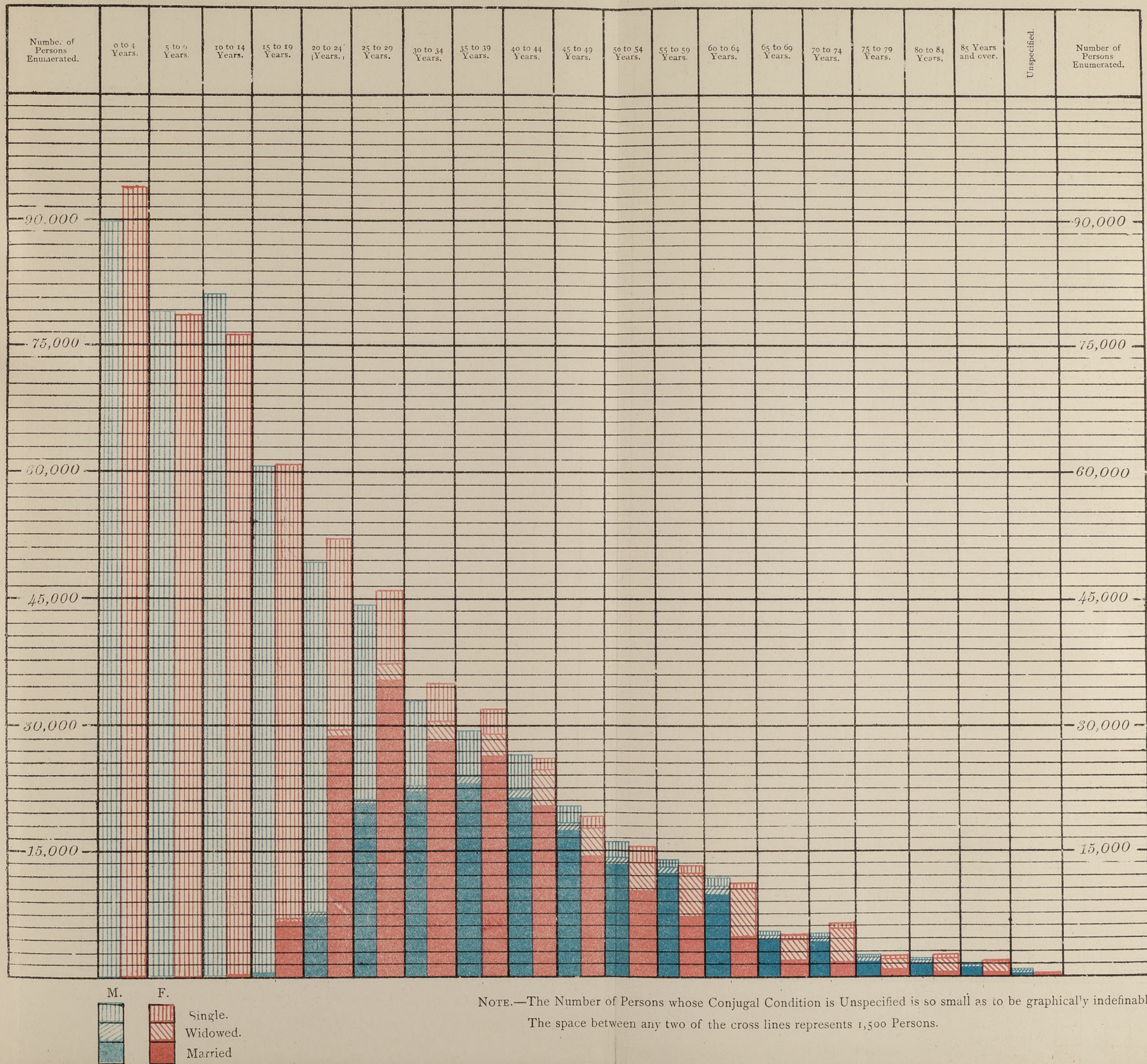

Diagram showing the Ages and Conjugal Condition of the People, Other than European or White, according to the Census of April, 1891.







Diagram of the Occupations of the People, European or White, and Other than European or White, classified according to the different Orders, according to the Census of April, 1891.

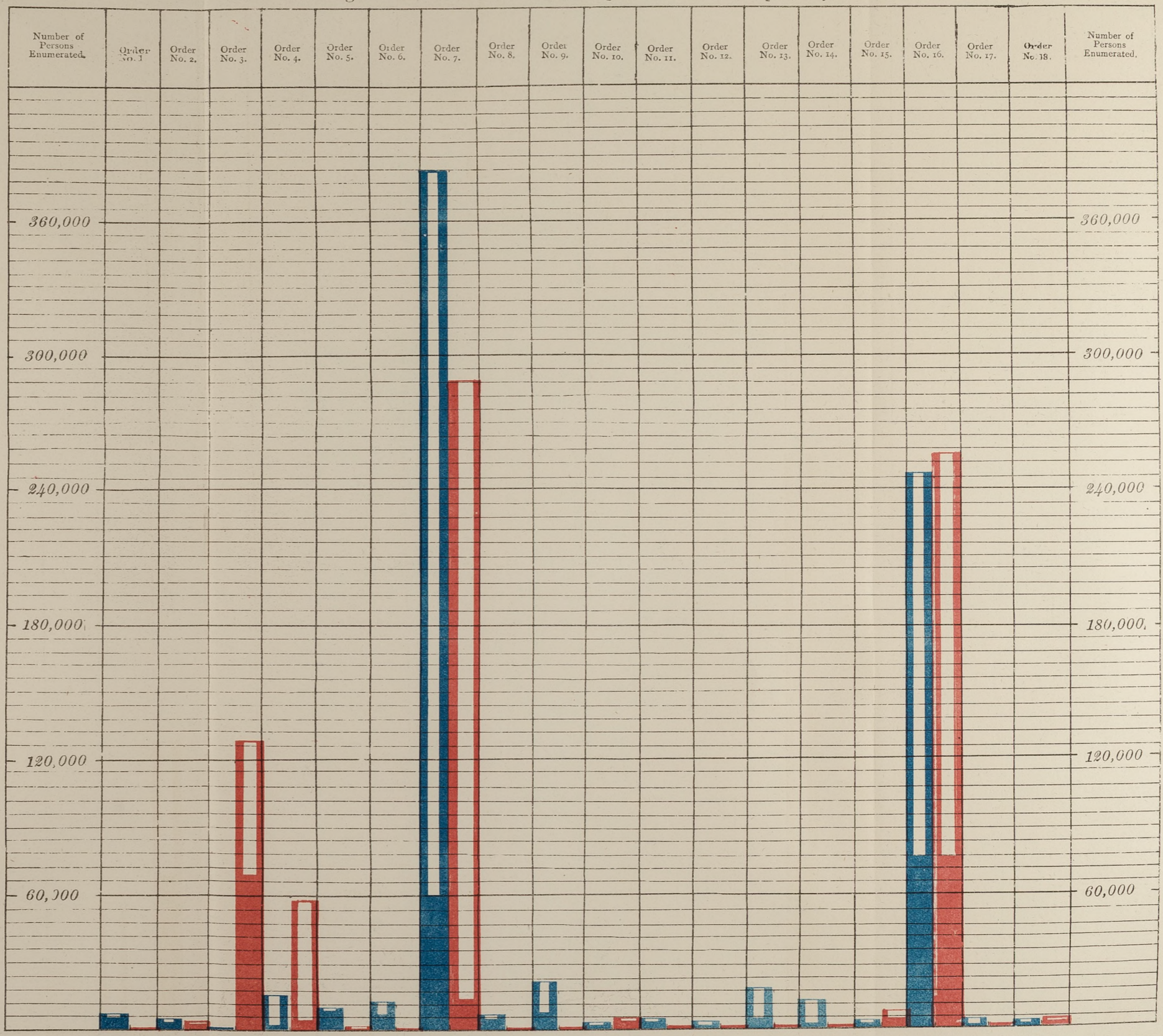

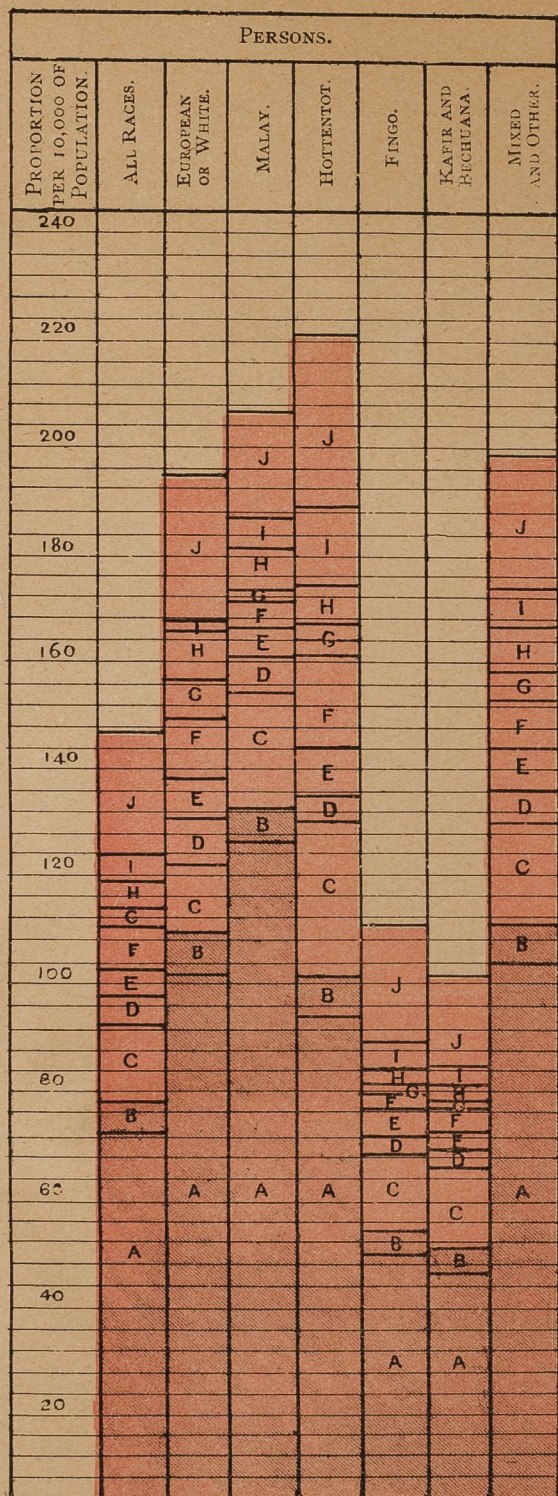

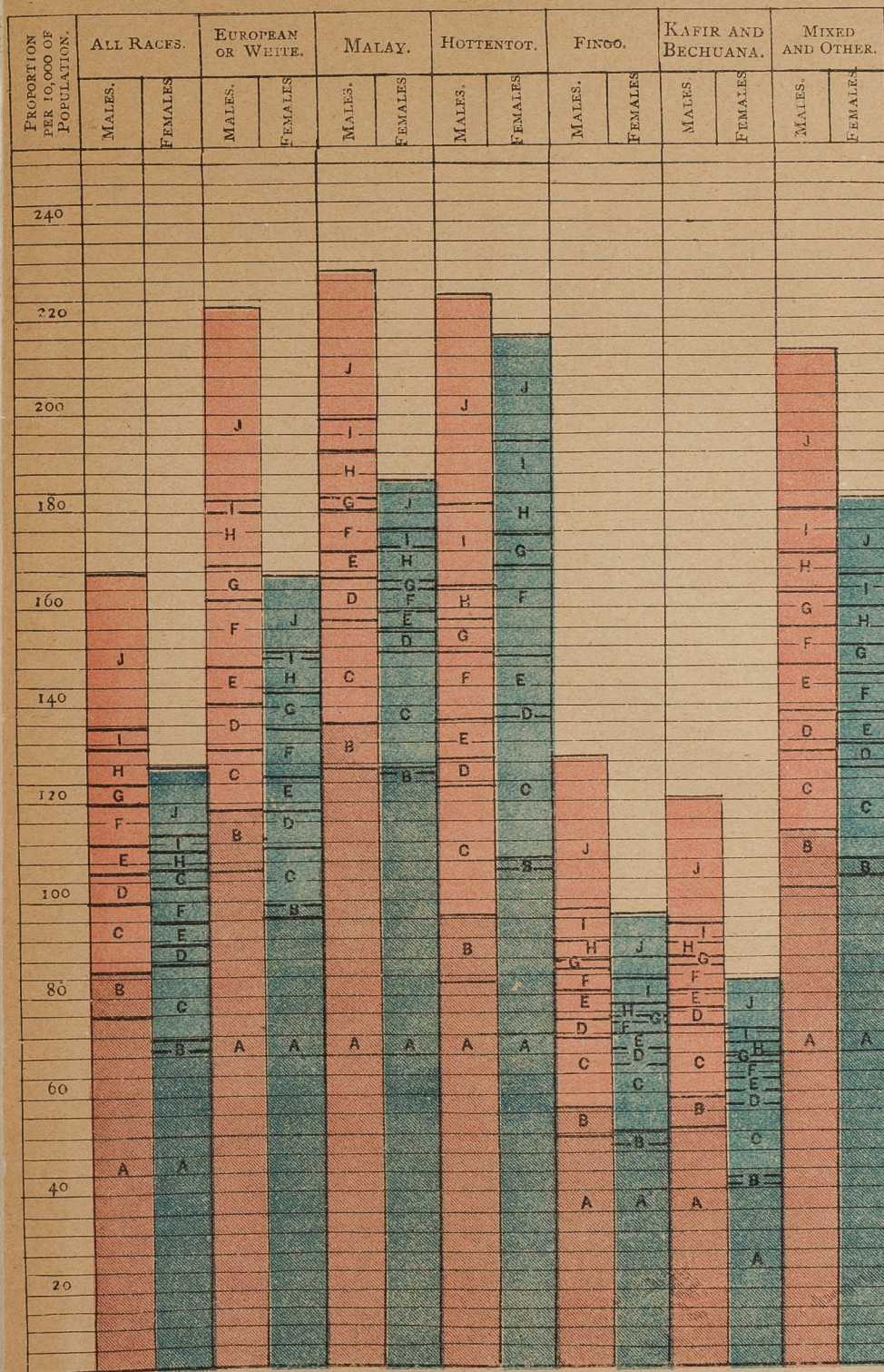
SICKNESS AND INFIRMITIES.

Diagram showing the proportion of Sickness and Infirmities per 10,000 Persons of the population of each Race, according to the Census of April, 1891.



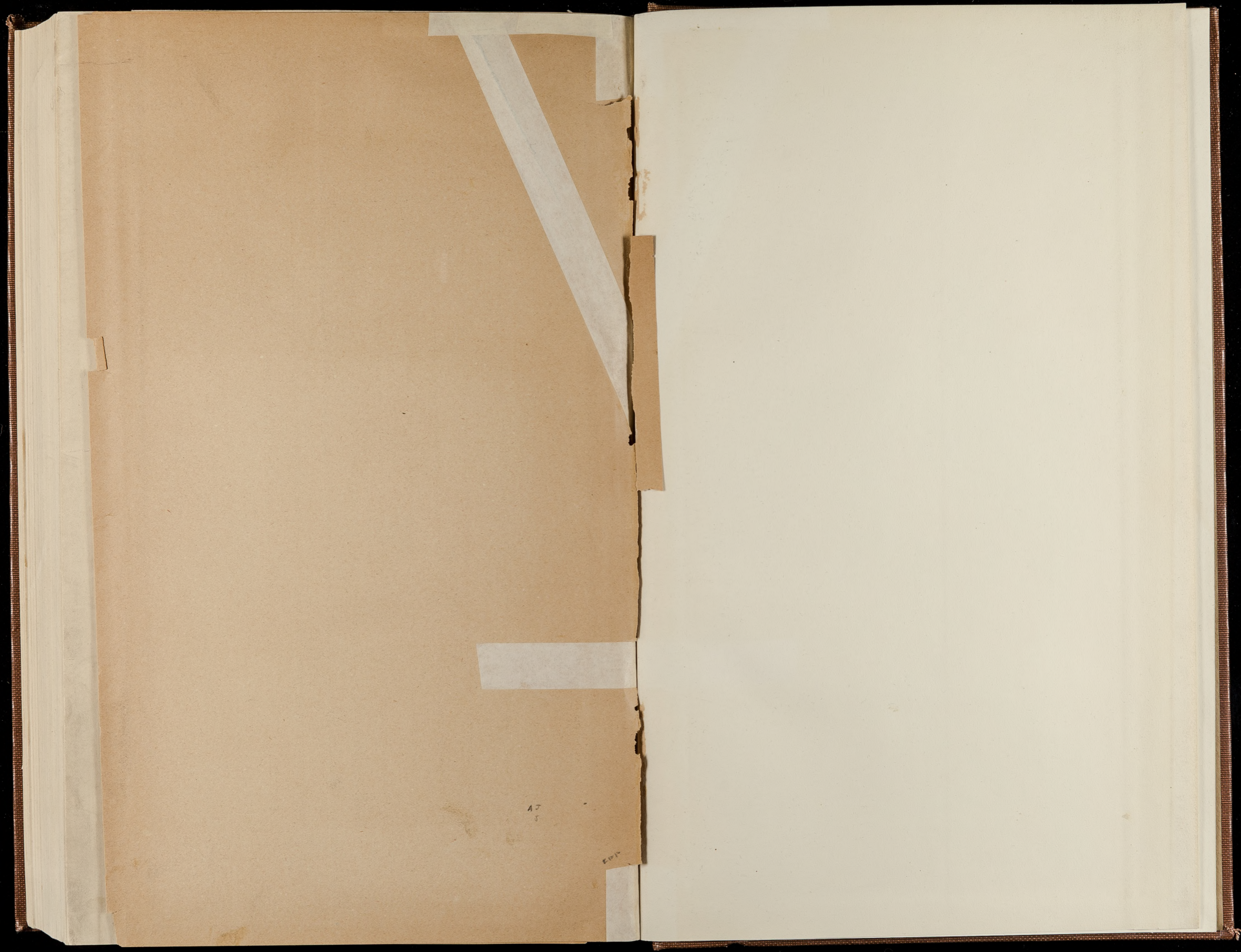
