Memorandum by the Organising Seoretary.

The existing constitution of the Society provides for the goverhment of the Society by an Exeoutive Committee elected by ballot, and general meetings of $y$ the members. The total number of members is 952457 , of which 1311 are in the London Distriot (an ares within the 20 miles radius of Charing Cross), and 1146 distributed in the oountry and abroad, as shewn in the enclosed statement. The relations of the local Fabian Societies to the London Fabian Society are set out in the By-laws in the Annual Report. The number of members of local Fabian Societies who are also members of the London Fabian Society is 509 ; non-members of the London Society who are members of the looal Fabian Societies number 531. Dedueting these of the former, 100 belong to 100 al Fabian Societies in the London District. Deducting these, to the 409 left must be added the 304 University Fabian Society members outside London in order to ascertain the number of country members and members living abroad who are attaohed to the London Fabian Soolety only. This number is 433 (1146-713).

Members of local Fabian Societies may join the London Fabian Sooiety on payment of $2 / 6$ annual sub. Members of University Fabian Societies pay only $1 /-$ per annum. The Executive Committee desires to oall attention to these extremely low subscriptions.

## Preliminary Note.

The object that we have kept before us is to provide a practical constitution suitable for the Fabian Society as it now exists. The simplicity beloved of theorists is forbidden by the complexity of the situation; but this is no reason for delaying action. The outstanding fact that we have to consider is the urgent need for some orange by which loos Fabian Societies may be brought more closely into touch with one another and may feel themselves to be fully-gualified branches of an effective national organisation instead of mere isolated groups of Socialist students. This need must be satisfied by a temporary reorganisation in order to pare the way for that very development of provincial strength which require and Justify a more complete scheme. Hence in the scheme set forth below we have attempted to provide only for the circumstances of the immediate future. We are aiming at the achievement of a practical scheme and not of a theoretically perfect demoersey.
(1) Definitions
"The Central Society." means the original Fabian Society and ineludes all members wherever resident who pay their subscriptions themselves direct to the London office.
(N.B. Those who are members of provincial societies will, in future, under this scheme, pay through their leal secretary).

1. Definitions (anntinnēd)

A Central Member means a member of the Central Sooiety. A Provincial Member means a member of a Provincial Society. The National Orpanisation inoludes the Central Sooiety and the Provinoial Sooleties.
2. Executive of the National Organisation.
(a) To be eleoted in April by all members, Central and Provinoial; any elector to be eligible for nomination provided he has been a member for two jears and is prepared to attend the meetings of the Executive with reasonable regularity. (b) To Pulfil the functions of a governing body both of the Central Society and of the National Organisation. (c) To appoint a standing sub-committee of its own members (With power of co-option) to deal with National affairs inoluding the reports of the Organising Seoretary and the arrangements for the Annual Conference.

## Finance.

(a) All members of the Central Society to pay a minimum subsoription of $5 / \mathrm{m}$.
(b) All provinoial sooleties to pay an annual sum to the Central Soolety representing at least $2 / 6$ for each of their members.
(N. B. Broeptional onditione consideration might be given to the cases of oertain societies - to the University societies for example, it has been suggested.)

## Functions and Powers of Conference.

(a) To meet annually in the month of June.
(b) To reoeive and approve the Annual Report with power to refer any part of it back to the Exeeutive for alteration.

Functions and Powers of Conference (continued)
(c) To consider all resolutions of which due notioe has been given by the Executive or by any Soclety or reognised Groug.
(d) To pass resolutions as to general policy whioh resolutions may be either advisory or mandatory to the Bxecutive and to the govrning Comaittees of the Provinoisl sooieties; but the Executive shall have power at any time to refer any resolution to the decision of the entire membership by means of a postal Referendum.
(e) To alter of amend the Rules of the society (inoluding those relating to its own constitution) but only after due notice published in "Fabian News" and by a two-thirde majority of those voting.
(f) To alter or amend the Basis - by a three-fourths majority.

## Extra-ordinary Conference.

An extraordinary Conference may be summoned at any time by the Executive and the Exeoutive shall be obliged to summon such a Conference upon receiving a reguisition duly signed on behalf of so many Groups and Sooieties as represent onethird of the membership of the Conference. But suoh an extraordinary Conference shall not be competent to deal with any business other than that for which it has been expressly eallea summoned.



## General Provisions.

All members, Central and Provinaial, shall reoeive a copy of "Fabian News" monthly and of each tracts as the Executive may think ifit to send out.

The Annual Report of the outgoing Exeoutive shall be sent out to all members at the beginning of May and a General Meeting of the Central Members shall be held in London in May at which the Report shall be considered and the representatives above referred to elected. Any resolutions passed at this meeting shall be taken as instructions to the Central Iepresentatives.

A business meeting of the Central Members may be oalled at any time by the Executive for the transaction of any ordinary business as heretofore; and one such meeting shall always be called in December or Janaary when the Chairmon. of the standing Sub-Committees shall peport upon the wore on andebeuing nait-year. But any resolutions passed at such a meeting other than those relating solely and striotly to London affairs shall be advisory only and not binding upon the Exeoutive.

## Constitutional Amendments Committee.

## Memorandum by Sidney Mebb.

Accepting the provisional decision of the Comittee that the Annual Conference is to be made a feature of the constituilion, and that proportionate representation at it it to be seoured to the Local Societies, there seem to be two alternatives open. One plan that now before the Comittee - proceeds on the basis of making all the nembers of the Local Sooieties full members of the parent Society for voting and representation purposes, but diverting from the parent Society all their personal contributions. In return, the Loeal Soc lety is to contribute to the parent Society an affiliation fee of half-a-crown per member - it is not olear whether on all its membership. or only on so much of it as it desires to olaim representation on7! This would be a serious financial blow to the parent Soclety, as it would lose at one stroke more than a quarter of its direct personal subscribers, and of the persons to whom it can now address a special appeal. On that the Treasurer will probably have something to say. But it might not be welcome to the Local Societies them selves. At present these Sooleties pay nothing collectively, and some of them have very few members contributing individually. The proposed affiliation fee of half-a-crown seems to me quite insufficient, but even at that low sum, the Liverpool Fabian Sosfety would have to pay 614 a year, and the Letohworth Fabian Soclety $£ 14.7 .6$ a year out of their coprporate funds. I do not think that this w 111 be either welcome to the Local Societies, or a wise step.

Another way, it seems to me, would be to let the present arrangenent alone by which members individually join the parent Son lety if they like, (at whatever minimum subsoription it may be necessary to $\mathrm{f}(\mathrm{x}$ ) and the Local Soc lety make its own arrangeaents as to membership of its own body. Then, if the Local soolety desires representation at the Conference, it should be entitled to get it upon (a) the number of its members who are members also of the parent Soctety, and (b) such of its other members as it eares to pay an affiliation fee for (whether the present rate of half-a-crown a member or a revised rate). This would leave it free as at present to increase its local membership at a low rate, without imposing any cost on the parent society, and to be represented at the Conference though only by one member, without necessarily seeing any of its scanty corporate funds (except for the Conference Fee) diverted to London. If it wanted to be represented in proportion to its looal membership it would be open to it to secure this at no great expense.

## Constitutional Amendments Comaittee.

Memorandum by Hubert Rland, Hon. Treasurer.
The proposal to invite more provincial members to join the Society at an annual subsoription of $2 / 6$ and to permit university members to remain at an annual subscription of $1 /-$, it seems to $m e$, would soon render oritical a finanoial state of things already grave.

I have for sone time been of opinion that the finances of the Soolety need serious consideration and re-adjustment, and the acoounts for the past year have strongly oonfirmed my view.

The annual cost of running the parent Society, ouitting altogether the London meetings - of which in the past year the net cost was $\AA 8$ - now exceeds $£ 1740$ which sum is made up as follows

For the expenditure of this sum of 21742 each member, whether London Provincial or University, gains an equal advantage: - that advantage being the existence and aotivity of the Society and the oonsequent spread of Socialist ideas.
an amount at least approximating to the present arneqe subs ription. of course special cases might be specially oonsiderem
dealt with as they are now, by the adnission of the oandidates on payment of subsoriptions considerably smaller than the average. In addition to the annual subscription sooieties sending delegates to a conference with mandatory powers should be called upon to pay a Conference Fee per representative sufficient to oover the travelling and other expenses of the Conference.

I think it should be made olear to the local soofetles that any change in the direction proposed would have to be accompanied by the ralsing of the present minimum of $2 / 6$ from such members as join the parent Society to an affiliation fee of say, 10/- per annum.

The case of university societies must be considered separately. The subscriptions for the year 1908-9 amounted to £1496. For the year 1907-8 to $£ 1608$, a dearease of 2112 and this In spite of the fact that membership of the Society increased by 447 members.

It is worth noting that of these members 192 were London and 269 provineial and university members.

The oost of printing and distributing Fabian News inn reased by 242 , that is 336 subsoriptions at $2 / 6$.

## Local Autonomy.

The Conference to have no control over local finance other than power to determine amount of affiliation fee.

The control of the Conference over local affairs will be limited automatically to within the extent of its moral control over local Societies since the association is and must remain an entirely voluntary one. In prat ice its control will only be effed five where united action is demanded.

Affiliation Fee.

Provincial Secretaries will pay affiliation fees upon such members as do not subscribe direct to the central Society.

Existing local societies may join the National Organisation or not but if they elect and join it they must pay affiliation fees on the whole of their members. Each such Society may make its own arrangements as regards associates or subscribers on whose behalf no affiliation fees will be paid, and who will have no rights as regards the elecoftion of the delegates.

Funotions and Powers of Conference.

The funds of the Central Soolety to be divided into two portions - a National Fund and a London Fund, the former alone being under the oontrol of the Conference. The National Fund to consist of the Affiliation Fees and 2/6 per London member and Conference fees and to be used for National Expenses e.g. Fabian News, Cost of Conference Organiser's Salary and expenses, Loss on Tracts (details to be disoussed

If the affiliation fee is fixed at $2 / 6$ there will probably be a loss show on the Balance Shieet of the National Fund for some time to come. This loss will be met by a voluntary grant from the London Fund, thus giving London effective control of the whole of the Sooiety's Pinance until such time as the Conference ohooses to become tadpeme independent by increasing affiliation fees.

This arrangement will introduce no book-keeping complications but will merely involve a new division of the Annual Balance Sheet.

That portion of the Annual Report whioh deals with speoifioally London affalrs (e.g. Book Boxes and Suburban leotures) shall be printed under a separate he ading and shall not be subjeot to discussion by the Conference but only by the London meeting.

We think that experience has show that the existing organisation has both advantages and $\$+$ adwantages drawback. At present, the Local Societies aocepting the name and basis of the Fabian Society are wolly autonomous. As local organisations or groups they contribute nothing to the funds of the Fabian Soolety of London; nor do they bear any share of what may be oalled the national expenses of the movement such as the work of the Central office, the printing of tracts, the issue of "Fabian News" and the organisation of leoturing and other propaganda. None of their member need necessarily be members of the London Sooiety, though they are enoouraged to join; and those who wish to join are admitted to full membership/at the low minimum subscription of half-s-crown a year, which very inadequately represents the average expenditure per head of membership. Such National Conte rences have been held have been arranged and paid for by the London Society. But whatever may be the advantages of this loose conneation, which allowa the Local Society complete freedom of action, and control of all its funds, it has the disadvantage that the members of the and the Executive Committee of the London Society Dose the stimulus and advantage $\phi f$ meeting the members of the Loo al Societies.

Among various proposals to which the desire for closer association has led is one for the transfommetton or the whole group si Fabian cosectes (London and provincial) into a siagien single national organisation, with a single membership, with a national Delegate Meeting and local branches, with branch subscriptions for local expenses and and affiliation fee to a national fund for all expenditure of a national character. To this plan, there has been expressed the objection that the creation of a Delegate Meeting with legislative powers could hardly fail, oven if those powers were limited to scaled national questions to a diminution of the complete autonomy now possessed by the Local Societies; that the Local Socleties would become, in effect, branches; and that there would be no compensating gain in an annual meeting of delegates. Moreover, as the expenditure not specially connected with any one locality now exceeds, however calculated, $£ 1000$ per annum, and amounts, as some say, to much more, the affiliation fee that would be required to meet this expenditure, if assessed equally on the whole membership of about 3000, would involve a heavy drain on the funds at present available for expenditure by the Local Sooleties; and would, in fact, bring some of them to an end. It is understood that proposals will have



As an alternative it has been suggested that the constitution of the several societies should remain as at present, each Society making its rules, settling its own membership fee, and spending its own money; but that the arrangements for the National Conference should be definitely settled, and made more effective. The main purpose of Conference should be to exchange ideas, discuss methods of action with the object a lamaze rom each other's ser al societies to stimulate each other's local activities. At the same time, it is suggested that the Conference might assume an authoritative position, and be entitled definitely to be consulted, before any action were taken by any Society, in the nature of affiliation or formal alliance with any political or other organisation, or the termination of any such affiliation $\theta^{r}$ formal alliance. Moreover, it is suggested that there would be great advantage in the Loo al Seoretaries being put in a position to supply everyone of their members, as a matter of course, with Fabian News monthly, and with all Tracts as issued. In order to meet the cost of this, and of the correspondence conducted by the Central office it is suggested that an affiliation fee of half-a-crown per member a year should be paid by each Local Society. In order to equalise the cost to societies in all parts of the Kingdom, the travelIng and other expenses of representative attending the Conference should, it is suggested, be paid by the Treasurer, and covered by an equal Conference Bee for each representative, to be paid by the Society sending him or her.

With s view to carry into effect the suggestions that have
been made, in such a way as to preserve the advantages of the present organisation, whilst remedying its defects as far as peouniary and other oiroumstances will permit, the following proposals have been drafted. So far as can be ascertained, these proposals appear, broadly, to oommand widespread assent. The resolution of the members' meeting of January 8th, 1909, and the enquiries set on foot by the committee may be taken to indicate the existence of a feeling that it would be desirable to bring the local Fabian Societies in other towns into closer and more constant touch with the London members; to secure to their members more adequate representation; and especially to provide more systematically than at present for the interchange of opinions and discussion of Fabian methods.

We think that experience has shown that the existing organization has both advantages and drawbacks. At present, the local societies accepting the name and basis of the Fabian Society are wholly autonomous. As local organizations they contribute nothing to the funds of the Fabian Society of London; nor do they bear any share of what may be called the national expenses of the movement, such as the work of the central office, the printing of tracts, the issue of Fabian News, and the organization of lecturing and other propaganda. None of their members need necessarily be members of the parent Society, though they are encouraged to join ; and those who wish to join are admitted to full membership at the low minimum subscription of half-a-crown a year, which very inadequately represents the average expenditure per head of membership. Such national conferences as have been held have been arranged and the collective expenses met by the London Society. But whatever may be the advantages of this loose connection, which allows the local society complete freedom of action and control of all its funds, it has the disadvaritage that the members of the local societies come very little into contact with the national movement, have few opportunities of expressing effectively their view on matters of common concern, and seldom have opportunities of meeting the members of the Fabian Societies outside their own towns. The London members and the Executive Committee of the parent Society lose the stimulus and advantage of meeting the members of the local societies.

If it should be deemed necessary at any time to take action on any of the following matters, such action shall not be taken by the parent Society or by any of the local societies until the proposal has been brought before the conference for discussion and (if so decided) order for referendum :
(d) Any alteration in the Basis of the Fabian Society.
(e) Any union, affiliation, or formal alliance with any other society, or with any political party, whereby the freedom of action of any society or group, or of the officers or members thereof, is in any way limited, or any termination of such a union, affiliation, or formal alliance already entered into.
(f) Any change in the constitution of the conference or in the amount of the capitation fee.
On any of the above matters (d) (e) (f) the conference may pass resolutions, either in terms of recommendation or else mandatory. In the latter case they shall be binding on the Executive Committee, the groups and the local societies; unless the conference itself, the Executive Committee, or any six local societies ask that a referendum of the members entitled to be represented at the conference be taken.

## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS to the Constitution

 in relation to Local Societies, submitted by the Executive Committee; with Report on the reasons for their adoption.The resolution of the members' meeting of January Eth, 1909, and the enquiries set on foot by the committee may be taken to indicate the existence of a feeling that it would be desirable to bring the local Fabian Societies in other towns into closer and more constant touch with the London members; to secure to their members more adequate representation ; and especially to provide more systematically than at present for the interchange of opinions and discussion of Fabian methods.

We think that experience has shown that the existing organization has both advantages and drawbacks. At present, the local societies accepting the name and basis of the Fabian Society are wholly autonomous. As local organizations they contribute nothing to the funds of the Fabian Society of London; nor do they bear any share of what may be called the national expenses of the movement, such as the work of the central office, the printing of tracts, the issue of Fabian News, and the organization of lecturing and other propaganda. None of their members need necessarily be members of the parent Society, though they are encouraged to join ; and those who wish to join are admitted to full membership at the low minimum subscription of half-a-crown a year, which very inadequately represents the average expenditure per head of membership. Such national conferences as have been held have been arranged and the collective expenses met by the London Society. But whatever may be the advantages of this loose connection, which allows the local society complete freedom of action and control of all its funds, it has the disadvantage that the members of the local societies come very little into contact with the national movement, have few opportunities of expressing effectively their views on matters of common concern, and seldom have opportunities of meeting the members of the Fabian Societies outside their own towns. The London members and the Executive Committee of the parent Society thus lose the stimulus and advantage of meeting the members of the local societies.

Among various proposals to which the desire for closer association has led is one for the setting up of a national organization with a single membership, of which such Fabian Societies as agreed to come
in would become parts, with branch subscriptions for local expenses which would be under local control, together with a capitation fee to a national fund under the control of a conference of representatives empowered to legislate on matters of national concern. To this plan some members have expressed the objection that the creation of a national conference with legislative powers could hardly fail, even if those powers were limited to so-called national questions, to diminish the complete autonomy now possessed by the local societies ; that the local societies would become, in effect, branches; and that there would be no compensating gain in an annual conference of representatives. Moreover, as the expenditure not specially connected with any one locality now exceeds, however calculated, $£ 1,000$ per annum, and amounts, as some say, to much more, the affiliation fee that would be required to meet this expenditure if assessed equally on the whole membership of about 3,000 , would involve a heavy drain on the funds at present available for expenditure by the local societies. Indeed, proposals have been under consideration for raising the present minimum subscription.

It has, therefore, been suggested that while the constitution of the several societies should remain as at present, the arrangements for the national conference should be definitely settled and made more effective. The main purpose of the conference should be to exchange ideas, discuss methods of action with the object of learning from each other's experience, and generally to enable the several societies to stimulate each other's activities and to realize that they are an integral and effective part of a national organization. At the same time the conference might assume an authoritative position, and be entitled definitely to be consulted before any action were taken by any society in the nature of affiliation or formal alliance with any political or other organization, or the termination of any such affiliation or formal alliance. Moreover, it is suggested that there would be great advantage in the local secretaries being put in a position to supply every one of their members, as a matter of course, with Fabian News monthly and with all tracts as issued. In order to meet the cost of this, and of the correspondence conducted by the Central Office, it is suggested that a capitation fee of eighteenpence per member a year should be paid by each local society on its members who are not members of the parent Society. In order to equalize the cost to societies in all parts of the kingdom, the travelling and other expenses of representatives attending the conference should, it is suggested, be paid by the Treasurer of the parent Society, and covered by an equal conference fee for each representative, to be paid by the society sending him or her.

With a view to carry into effect the suggestions that have been made in such a way as to preserve the advantages of the present organization, whilst remedying its defects as far as pecuniary and other circumstances will permit, the following proposals were drafted and laid before the conference of Fabian Societies and groups in July last by which, with some amendments, they were approved.

# PROPOSED REGULATIONS FOR THE CONFERENCE OF THE FABIAN SOCIETIES AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE IN JULY, 1909. 

## I.

With the object of stimulating and promoting the work of the local societies and groups, and for conferring upon questions of common concern, the Executive Committee shall, at least once in each year, convene a conference of duly elected representatives of groups and local Fabian Societies.

## II.

The conference shall consist of (a) one representative of each group or local society having a membership as hereinafter defined of not more than fifty, together with an additional representative for every fifty additional members or part thereof; (b) the members of the Executive Committee of the parent Society, together with (if not members of the Executive Committee) the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Organizing Secretary, and the Trustees of the Parliamentary Fund.

The membership for this purpose shall be reckoned as including (a) all the members of each group and such members of each local society as are also members of the parent Society, and (b) members of the local Fabian Societies who are not members of the parent Society on whose behalf the local society has remitted to the Treasurer a capitation fee of one shilling.

## III.

To every member of the conference residing more than twenty miles from the place of meeting the Treasurer of the parent Society shall pay the amount of third class railway fare there and back, and (unless hospitality can be arranged) a sum of seven shillings and sixpence per night spent away from home for other expenses. A conference fee, sufficient to cover the total of these and the other necessary expenses of the conference (which ought, if possible, not to exceed one pound per representative) shall be payable to the Treasurer of the parent Society by the group or society sending the representative.

## IV.

There shall be laid before each conference for discussion and such resolutions as may be decided on by the members present :
(a) A report by the Executive Committee upon the progress of the work of the several societies and groups since the last conference.
(b) Any suggestions sent in for consideration by the conferonce or prepared by the Executive Committee as to the work of the several societies and groups, such as :

(1) Methods of propaganda.
(2) Organization of lecturing.
(3) Literature.
(4) Education of members and investigations or study.
(5) The political activities within the reach of each society.
(6) Any other subject that may be deemed within the scope of the conference.
(c) The arrangements for the conference itself.

On any of the above matters (a), (b), (c), any resolutions arrived at by the conference should take the form of recommendations to the Executive or to the several groups or local societies.

If it should be deemed necessary at any time to take action on any of the following matters, such action shall not be taken by the parent Society or by any of the local societies until the proposal has been brought before the conference for discussion and (if so decided) ordered for referendum :
(d) Any alteration in the Basis of the Fabian Society.
(e) Any union, alfiliation or formal alliance with any other society, or with any political party, whereby the freedom of action of any society or group, or of the officers or members thereof, is in any way limited, or any termination of such a union, affiliation, or formal alliance already entered into.
(f) Any change in the constitution of the conference, or of these regulations, or in the amount of the capitation fee.
On any of the above matters (d), (e), (f), the conference may pass resolutions, either in terms of recommendation or else mandatory. In the latter case they shall be binding on the Executive Committee, the groups and the local societies, unless the conference itself, the Executive Committee, or local societies containing not less than one-tenth of the societies entitled to be represented at the conference, ask that a referendum of such members be taken.

There shall be supplied free of charge to the Secretaries of local Fabian Societies (the cost being deemed to be covered by the capitation fee) a sufficient number of copies of Fabian News, and of all tracts supplied gratuitously to members, to enable every member or associate on whose behalf a capitation fee has been paid to receive a copy; and the local societies shall be bound to place such copies without delay in the hands of all their members, by post or otherwise.

The British National Committee of the International Socialist Bureau. The whole question of the method of appointing the British National Committee (which ats as a means of attachment between the English Socialist and Labour movement and the International Socialist Bureau) will soon have to be settled, together with the question of the financial responsibility of the various Societies having representatives on the
 Party, the Independent Labour Party, the Fabian Society, the S.D.P., the Gas Workers Union, and the Dockers! Union. Each of these bodies pay $£ 14$ per annum affiliation fee to the British National Committee amounting altogether to 584 per annum. of this sum 880 has to be sent to the International Socialist Bureau. The British National Committee has to meet other charges, including the travelling expenses of the British delegates on the Bureau. These charges have been met up till now from balances in the hands of the British National Committee which accrued owing to the annual amount paid to the International Socialist Bureau being only $£ 50$ prior to 1909. This source will soon be exhausted and the new British National Committee will have to raise $£ 100$ per annum at least.

We have carefully considered the whole matter and also the relation of the Fabian Society to the British National Committee with the contingent financial responsibilities. We think that in future the amount to be paid by each organsation affiliffated to the British National Committee should be based upon the voting strength at the International Congress of each affiliated organisation. At the Congress

Great Britain has 20 votes as a nation. These 20 votes are divided up as follows: Labour Party and the Trade Unions 10 votes; Independent Labour Party 4 votes; S.D.P. 4 votes; Fabian Sooiety 2 votes. On this basis the Pabian Society would pay $£ 10$ per snnus instead of $£ 14$ as at present.

Another point to be considered is the renresant.at ........ Great Britain on the Bureau. At present there are two dele gates feleoted by the British section meeting at the trienni, International Sooialist Congress and one elected by the Briti parliamentary Labour Party. Suburban Lectures.

The Suburban Tecture scheme which took the place of the Hutchinson Trust lectures was first undertaken in 1906 on the following lines. The Executive Cominttee approved a syllabus for a Course of four lectures on Modern Socialism drawn up by a Committee consisting of H. Snell and f.W.Macrosty. The Course was offered b to Sooialist and other Soofeties in and around London who were to make all the necessary armagements for securing an audience. The Fablan Sodiety guaranteed the whole cost of the Course including hire of hall, printIng and posting ( 50 to $100 \mathrm{D} / 0$ Posters and 1000 syllabuses) and the Lecture Pee of one guinea per lecture. Towards the cost reserved seat ticketswere sometimes sold or a collection made which sometimes covered the iire of hall. In most cases the lectures have been organised lopally by branches of the I.I.P. and local Fabian Societies In 1930 1909-10 the subject of the Courses was The Abolition of Povex ty" four lequres based on the Minority Report and the National Minimu In 1910-11 this new Course was continued but the one on Modern Social ism was als given to about the same extent. The places at which the Courses hav been given during the past three jears are as follows:-



Including the eight given in the open air $74^{\text {ax }}$ Courses were given at 59 diffirent places. The places where more than one Course has been g-ven during the three years are Clapham (F.G.) (2), Croydon (F.S.) (2), Ilford (F.S.) (3), Tunbridge Wells (F.S.) (2), 65 Ealing (2), Richmond (2), St. Pancras (2), Wood Green (F.G.) (3), Marylebone (2), Streatham (F.G.) (2), Westminster (2). In the cases of Yestminster, Marylebone, Streatham and Ealing the second courses were given in the open air; in the cases of Clapham, Croydon, Ilfoxd and Richmond the courses were not given in the same halls or in the same part of the district. In the other oades the subject of the two courses was not the same and the lecturers were different. In planning the courses it has always been kept in mind that except under speoial oiroumstances the same ground should not be gone over twice in less than three years. The lecturers for these courses were H. Snell and W. Stephen Sanders except in the osses of open air leotures which were nearly all given by Dr. Marion Phillips. The net cost of each course was about £7.7.0.

## Provineial Lectures.

The Provincill Lecture Scheme came into operation in 1908. The solieme differs from that of the Suburban Lectures in that the Fabian Society pays on the Lecture fee (one guinea per lecture) and travelling expenses of the lecturer and provides 1,000 syllabuses. The cost of the Hall and advertising is defrayed locally. The Courses given are the same as those under the Suburban soheme. The lecturers apponted have been Holbrook Jackson, Clifford Sharp, H. H. Schloesser, H. Beaumont and for special occasions (chiefly in connection with local Fabian Societies) W. Stephen Sanders. ## Memorandum on the Educational Work

When, at the beginning of the session, the Education SubComittee was appointed, we had in view two distinot objects. Distinct, and yet mutually dependent. The one being capable of attain ment without the other, though leading up to an incidentally accompli ing it. On the one hand we desired to present to our younger member to the young or new Pabians generally, and to the general publio, on ordered aocount of the Socialist outlook on Modern Life; and at the same time to explain the policy of the Fabian Society. On the other hand we hoped to discover a systematic method of produoing new lesture capable of addressing large outside audiences. The working of the ordinary Nursery method of trailing will be reflerred to later.

We were guite sure of the methods that we ought to adpt to accomplish the first part of our programme, but not at all sure of the best way to go about the second part: events have justified bof our confidence and our diffidence.

A syllabus with a bibliography was drawn up, and printed at the expense of the parent Sooiety. Eleven leotures were delivered at Prince Henry's Rooms, to audiences whose number averaged ratler more than fifty. The cost of the Rooms was defrayed by the parent Society; and all through the venture the Executive showed itself symathetio and as reoognising the value of our efforts. The syllabus Itself has been sent to places as remote as Wolverhampton, Portsmouth, Edirburgh and even Siam. The course is also being given to the Finsbury I.L.P., the audiences averaging in number close on forty.

It is difficult for us to speak of the quality of the Prince Henry's Room lectures, but several attained an exceptionslly high level and with onéunfortunate exception, all were good and adequate to their purpose.

The other aspect of the work must now be dealt with. Except Ing Gibson all the original lecturers at Prince Henry's Rooms were experienced speakers and expert in their subjects. Gibson had to get a new subject up, and till he undertook it, had had no experience whateve of lecturing; so that in his case, he owes what experience and training he has got, practically entirely to the work of the Sub-Committee. difficulty of repeating the course to the $I_{.} I_{*} P_{\circ}$, with identical lecturers, caused the Sub-Committee to call upon three men who had attends the Pirst course. Maude, Burns and Kelsey having listened to the lectures of their more experienced colleagues, were able to undertake to leature on "The Sooilaization of Industry", "The Socialist Program" and "The National Minimum". The expressed satisfaction of the Finsbu. I.L.P. is a fair proof of their success.

We may fairly olaim, that, besides instructing something a hundred people in the element of Socialism, the Sub-committee suoceeded in giving a considerable measure of training to four Fiduals. Besides the rallher adranced education thus afforded trohe Sub-committee, the Nursery hat oontinued its practioe of ptithag papers and lectures from totally untried persons. In w it way a number of members have been induced to study subjects t $\ddagger$ have been subjected to the Fabian disoipline of questions and gilite. Several of the people who have thus been discovered and gituraged have already lectured to local groups. To take two exf es personally known to the drafter. Alwyn Lloyd who spoke to Jursery on "Town Planning" has also leotured to the Golders Green

P, and Arnold Gibson who worked up a leoture on "The Economios arx" has since delivered it to the Chelsea Group. It must therebe evident that the Nursery already possesses the maohinery for ing out lecturers. It was essential that, in our endeavour to id our utility, we should go slowly, so that we should discover ler we possessed the ability to train, before we tried to practhat difficult art. Further, it was even more neoessary to re some confidence, before we offered, too freely, our services is matter to the Soolety and to the Movement.
