Notes and Definitions

1. **Local Housing Statistics** is prepared by the Department of the Environment and the Welsh Office to provide figures for individual local authority areas in a quarterly publication. These figures are taken mainly from returns made by local authorities; housebuilding figures incorporate reports from the National House Building Council on those dwellings which they inspect for building control purposes. Tables are by region and local authority area, unless otherwise stated.

Regular tables appearing in each issue (see paragraphs 5 to 8) show cumulative figures within either the calendar year or the financial year.

Supplementary tables on various other housing matters are included as annual data become available and appear in the index on page iv.

2. **Regional** figures, county figures and those for England are estimates allowing for missing returns; estimates are also published in Housing and Construction Statistics. Figures for individual authorities in England do not allow for missing returns but may include some late returns received after the regional estimates etc were finalised for publication.

3. Definitions

'**Local authorities**' in this publication are local housing authorities and New Town authorities. Names used are the names by which the authorities are known at present, regardless of the periods covered by the tables;

'**Counties**' are the areas specified in the London Government Act 1963 and the Local Government Act 1972; the Isles of Scilly are included with Cornwall for statistical purposes;

'**Regions**' are the standard regions for statistical purposes, revised following local government reorganisation on 1 April 1974;

'**Population**': the latest available estimates of the home population published by the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys. Population figures for New Towns are not separately available but are included in the figure for the housing authority in which they are situated.

More detailed definitions of the terms used are given in the annual volume of Housing and Construction Statistics.

4. **Adjustments to earlier returns** may occasionally result in a negative figure for an individual authority, when, for example, dwellings reported as started are subsequently withdrawn.

5. **Housebuilding.** Table 1 shows the building progress of permanent houses and flats, cumulatively within the calendar year.

'**Local authorities**' housebuilding figures include not only dwellings which they will rent but also those they intend to sell or lease (see para 7). Any dwellings built for an authority outside its own area would be included in that authority's figures in Table 1, but this activity has now effectively ceased, reflecting the decline in local authority housebuilding in recent years. These dwellings were formerly also identified in a separate table under the local authority area of their location, but due to the absence of any recent reported activity this table has been discontinued from Issue No. 104 onwards.

'**All**' includes progress on dwellings provided or authorised by government departments, county councils and other local government bodies acting in capacities other than as housing authorities. These dwellings are also shown separately in Table 2.

'**New Towns**'. Private building on privately owned land within New Towns is shown against the relevant housing authority. All building on land owned by development corporations and the Commission for New Towns is shown against the name of the New Town.

Figures are subject to amendment by housing authorities when they reassess housebuilding activity in their areas.

6. **Renovations.** Table 3 deals with completions of local authority and housing association dwelling renovation work for which government assistance in the form of a subsidy or a contribution may be given, including local authority dwellings which have been improved for sale (Table 5), and renovation work by private owners and by tenants for which grants were paid by local authorities. (Where a local authority has not reported improvements for sale but has reported other improvements to its stock only the latter component is shown against the name of that authority.) The figures, cumulative within calendar years, are the numbers of dwellings and in the case of conversions these are the total available after the completion of the work. Housing Corporation funded renovations of hostel bedspaces are excluded from January 1985. Estimated figures for New Town dwellings are included in regional totals but are not shown separately. Figures for Housing Corporation funded renovations are not currently available for local authorities in England.

Figures for Wales were for the number of renovations completed by housing associations funded by the Housing Corporation. Since the first quarter of 1992 figures for dwellings funded by Tai Cymru/ Housing for Wales are also included.

7. **Sales of dwellings owned by local authorities and New Towns.** Tables 4, 5 and 6 provide a full presentation of the sales of dwellings according to type of sale. The Housing Act 1980 extended the provisions under which local authorities and New Towns dispose of dwellings, particularly through the 'right to buy' established in Part 1 of the Act which came into force on 3 October 1980; these provisions are now embodied in Part V of the Housing Act 1985. The Housing Act 1988 introduced the provisions for 'Tenants Choice' and these came into force in April 1989. Progress during the financial year of sales to tenants exercising their right to buy is summarised in Table 4 which shows numbers of tenants from whom claims to this right have been received on form RTB1 (no adjustment is made for claims subsequently withdrawn), numbers whose right to buy had been accepted by the authorities on form RTB2, and numbers of completed sales. The figures in Table 4 include sales under shared ownership arrangements, the improvement for sale scheme, for improvement by purchaser, building for sale schemes, sales to housing associations and private developers, but not sales of dwellings which have been built on land made available under licence (see para 8). Table 4 'other sales' includes Tenants Choice or voluntary disposals to housing association or private developers.

8. **Housing land disposals.** Table 7 deals with local authorities' sales and disposals under licence of land for housing and in addition sales of dwellings built by private developers on land previously made available by authorities under licence.

9. **Table 8: local authorities' action under the homelessness provisions of the 1985 Housing Act.** Part III of the Housing Act 1985 gives local authorities the primary responsibility for dealing with homelessness. Their main duty is to secure accommodation on a permanent basis for those whom they accept as homeless, who are in priority need and who are not intentionally homeless. Acceptances include households found to be homeless (or threatened with homelessness within four weeks) and in one of the seven designated 'priority need' categories and it also includes any homeless households not in priority need for whom they have nevertheless undertaken to secure accommodation. Following extensive consultations with local authority associations the quarterly returns were revised as from April 1991, bringing the statistics more closely into line with the 3rd edition of the homelessness Code of Guidance. The figures for households accepted as homeless now relate to those for whom local authorities have accepted responsibility to secure permanent accommodation as required by the legislation. Acceptances on the previous return included a number of households - those found to be intentionally homeless and provided with temporary accommodation - who did not meet the full criteria for acceptance under the legislation. Other changes to the return and improved notes for

guidance on completing the return have resulted in some authorities changing their reporting practices and results may not be consistent with those for earlier periods (even after allowing for 'intentionally homeless' cases). In particular the term 'enquiries completed' previously used has been replaced with 'Total Applications' and 'Total Decisions Issued'. Although in the past most authorities reported under 'Total enquiries completed' the cases decided in the quarter, other authorities included all applications, many of which do not warrant full enquiries, and some counted acceptances at the stage of an interim not a final decision.

Those accepted by local authorities are provided with temporary accommodation if required, or may be helped to stay where they were on a temporary basis until permanent accommodation can be found ('Homeless at Home'). Those found to be intentionally homeless are also provided with temporary accommodation for a limited period. Annual summaries are published in the issue containing results for the first quarter of the following year.

Housebuilding and renovations statistics

Published figures of housebuilding and renovations (Tables 1 to 4) are compiled from the available returns for the relevant period. Revised annual tables incorporating late returns from the English authorities are published. However, earlier practice was to count the returns as and when these were received from local authorities, including any late returns for earlier periods, and to make no revisions; although distortions in the national and regional statistics were relatively slight, they could be large in the case of individual authorities which did not report regularly. The change in procedure was implemented for English authorities' housebuilding in 1980 and renovations in 1978 and for Welsh authorities' housebuilding and renovations in 1978.

Issues containing annual figures are listed below: for any authority, figures should be taken from the latest issue in which the authority is included.

Housing and Construction Statistics - Annual

Most of the tables in this reference book on housing and construction topics show how things have changed over the last eleven years; others give detailed analyses for the latest year. The quantity and type of housing built each year and the size of stock, improvements and energy conservation, slum clearance, rents and rent rebates, house prices and mortgage payments can all be derived from this publication. It also contains figures on the volume and type of construction work and new orders in Great Britain, the labour market, costs and prices of materials and labour, and the use of materials. Detailed analyses of the activities of private contractors and local authorities direct labour departments are given for recent years.

Housing and Construction Statistics - Quarterly

Produced in two parts each quarter designed to supplement the annual volume by making the latest figures available as quickly as possible.

Local Housing Statistics - Quarterly

This publication gives regular statistics on the progress of housebuilding, house renovations and council house sales in individual local authorities in England and Wales. Statistics on homeless households, slum clearance and homes specially designed for the chronically sick and disabled are included as they become available.

Household Projections, England: 1989 - 2011

The latest in an occasional series of publications giving summary results of the Department's 1989 based household estimates for England, the regions, counties, metropolitan districts and London Boroughs. Estimates are given for the years 1989 to 2001 and an appendix describe the methods of calculation.

Digest of Environmental Protection and Water Statistics - Annual

This Digest provides information on the main trends in environmental protection. Its explanatory text and commentary highlights the trends, gives information on some of the factors likely to influence them and, where appropriate, links series together. It has sections on air quality, water quality, radioactivity, noise, blood lead concentrations, solid wastes, landscapes and nature conservation. A separate section updates the series on water supply and use.

Local Government Financial Statistics - Annual

This publication presents details of local authority expenditure and income during the last financial year. The main figures relate to local authorities in England, but summary figures are also shown separately for the various types of authority (counties and districts, metropolitan and non-metropolitan) in both England and Wales. Further tables set the total of local authority expenditure in the context of the whole of the national economy, and relate present levels of expenditure with those recorded in earlier years.

Department of the Environment Publications

Land Use Change in England

This bulletin presents the results of the Department's statistics on changes in land use, based on data recorded by Ordnance Survey as part of its work on map revision.

Environmental Protection and Water Statistics - Statistical Bulletin

This annual bulletin provides additional detailed tables for most of the chapter topics in the *Digest of Environmental Protection and Water Statistics* (see HMSO Publications).

Rent Officer Statistics

Normally published quarterly, they contain statistics on housing benefit referrals to rent officers (primarily in the private sector) and fair rent determinations (in the private and housing association sectors).

Development Control Statistics

This annual publication provides details of planning statistics handled by local planning authorities in England. It also contains information on planning appeals and data on land with outstanding planning permission for private housing development.
