## Summer Schools and Travel, 1930.

- (1) Whitsuntide.—A week-end holiday School at Cober Hill Guest House, six miles from Scarborough, from tea on Saturday, June 7th, until after lunch on Tuesday, June 10th. The subject is "Some Makers of Modern History," and Mr. Frederick Whelen is among the lecturers. Fee for lectures and accommodation: cubicles 1½ guineas, double rooms, 2 guineas (each person), single rooms, 2½ guineas.
- (2) VISIT TO GENEVA AT WHITSUNTIDE FOR THE INTERNATIONAL LABOUR CONFERENCE.—Leaving London June 7th. Fee, 10½ guineas, including second-class travel London/Geneva and accommodation for one week.
- (3) THE GENEVA INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS (July 27th-August 1st).—This lecture course provides an unparalleled opportunity for studying the work of the League and the general trend of world affairs. A conducted party will leave London on the morning of July 26th. Accommodation in Geneva, social gatherings and excursions are arranged. Fee for accommodation and second class travel London/Geneva, return,  $11\frac{1}{2}$ Week-end Holiday extension (until after dinner, Monday, August 4th), 2 guineas. In connection with the Institute an additional course of lectures and demonstration lessons has this year been arranged for schoolmasters and schoolmistresses.

- (4) SECOND JUNIOR SUMMER SCHOOL (Geneva, August 7th-14th).—A popular holiday school for parties of boys and girls from the upper forms of public and secondary schools, leaving London, Wednesday, August 6th. Fee for accommodation and second class travel London/Geneva, 9½ guineas and 10 guineas.
- (5) Cambridge (August 30th-September 5th).—
  The Nineteen-thirty Summer School for the study of contemporary international affairs will be held at Trinity College, Cambridge. Accommodation will be provided for men students in College, and for women students in University lodgings. All students will take lunch and dinner in Hall. Fee, 4½ guineas, including accommodation and lectures.
- (6) A Week-end School for Teachers at Trinity College, Cambridge (August 29th-September 1st).—Fee for accommodation and lectures, 2½ guineas. Teachers attending the Week-end School will be able to stay on in Cambridge for the Nineteen-thirty Summer School.
- (7) VISIT TO GENEVA FOR THE ASSEMBLY OF THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS.—Arrangements have been made for groups of speakers and others interested in the work of the Union to visit Geneva during the Assembly, which opens this year on Wednesday, September 10th. Conducted parties will leave London on September 6th and September 13th. Fee for six days' accommodation and second class travel London/Geneva, 10½ guineas.
