
## EASTER IN HOLLAND

THE WORLD COURT

The Peace Palace at The Hague; the seat of the Permanent Court of International Justice

The party will leave Liverpool Street on the morning of Thursday, April 17th, and arrive at The Hague at 9.30 p.m.

The Dutch League of Nations Society has kindly offered to assist in arranging lectures and visits to places of historical interest at The Hague and in the organisation of excursions in the neighbourhood. These will afford an opportunity of seeing some of the more picturesque villages of Holland as well as the important cities, and will include a visit to the famous bulb fields where the flowers are usually in full bloom at Easter. There will be a visit to the Peace Palace, the seat of the Permanent Court of International Justice, and the short course of lectures will include two by Mr. Frederick Whelen on the World Court, its origins, functions and achievements. Accommodation for the party has been secured at a pleasant hotel at Scheveningen, the popular seaside resort, which is only a short distance by tramcar from The Hague. Applications, accompanied by a deposit of £1, should be made as early as possible to the Secretary, League of Nations Union, 15 Grosvenor Crescent, London, S.W.1, who will be glad to send any further information that is required.
