People from across Cambridgeshire unite to say we're better off in Europe

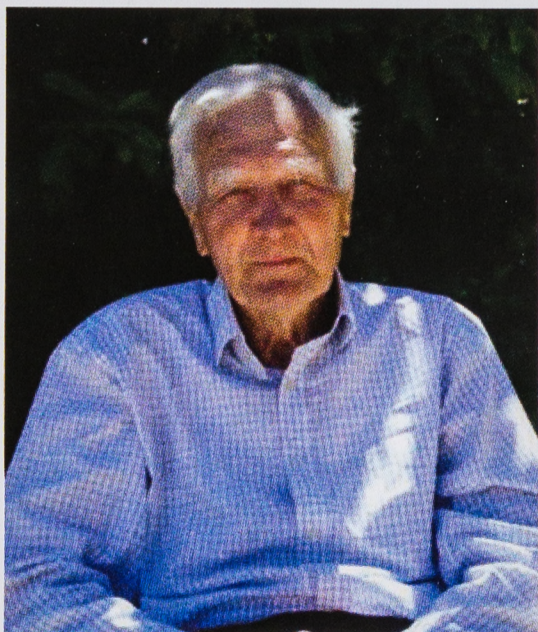
On 23 June, a referendum will be held on Britain's membership of the European Union.

WORLD WAR TWO RAF PILOT SPEAKS OUT



Each generation from the fall of the Roman Empire until 1944 slaughtered each other on the battlefields of Europe.

Robert Hinde was a World War Two RAF Pilot, he says: "The last century saw two World Wars within Europe. In the UK alone, thousands of members of our Services died, with many more wounded and perhaps handicapped for life. And there were those whose names never appear on War Memorials —the countless civilians killed or bereaved. Perhaps I should say 'especially the bereaved', for they had to go on living when their lives had been impoverished and saddened forever.

"Indeed on both sides of both conflicts, millions were killed or injured or bereaved, amid terrible devastation. Remaining within the EU and promoting our joint goals is the best way to ensure that such destruction will not happen again. Our goal must be to encourage the view that war is an unacceptable way of settling disputes."
