THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS,  
IN ENGLAND.

The following Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS which were Registered in all the Districts of England by 2189 Registrars, in the Winter Quarter ending *March 31st*, 1850; and the MARRIAGES in above 12000 chapels and churches, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the Quarter ending *December 31st*, 1849.

The Return of marriages is incomplete; but the numbers wanting are inconsiderable, and have been supplied from the previous years. Returns of the births and deaths have been received from every Registrar.

While the returns of the exports, imports, and revenue furnish good indications of the production, consumption, and commerce of great classes in the country,—the marriages, births, and deaths supply a surer test of the condition of the whole population. It is gratifying to find that the general results of both classes of returns are favourable. The marriages, which in 1847 were so much depressed, and increased almost imperceptibly in 1848,—rose to

141599 in the year 1849; and in the autumn quarter were 43632; which is a higher number than has ever before been celebrated, excepting in the autumn quarter of 1845. The deaths have also declined; they were 98607. The country, which, after the failure of the potato crop in 1846, was covered with funerals—in the train of a multitude of diseases and of two great epidemics, the fatal influenza of 1847-8, and the more deadly cholera of 1849—is now in health again. The deaths in the first quarter of 1850 were less by 21065 and 21414 than the deaths in the corresponding quarters of 1847 and 1848. Fewer children have been left fatherless; fewer parents have been bereaved of their children. Sickness and suffering—though perhaps not precisely in the same ratio as the mortality—have diminished. The skilled and active industry of the kingdom has been less interrupted by the illness of workmen and the incapacity of masters; the parishes have had fewer poor to relieve; the friendly societies fewer sick members to support; insurance societies less to pay on policies: everything dependent on the duration of human life has been relieved of pressure; the minds of the people have not been irritated by hunger, fever, and discontent.

The improvement in the state of the public health may be ascribed to various causes. The season was natural. January and March were cold, as they

† The Table may be read thus, without reference to the decimal points:—In the year 1848, to 100000 of the population of England, there were 790 marriages, 3222 births, 2289 deaths registered.—The annual rates of marriage in each of the 4 quarters were \*653, \*798, \*748, and \*952 per cent.; the rates of death 2\*770, 2\*294, 1\*990, and 2\*090 per cent. In reading the population on the first line add 3 ciphers (000). The 3 months January, February, March, contain 90, in leap year 91 days; the 3 months April, May, June 91 days; each of the 2 last quarters of the year 92 days. For this inequality, a correction has been made in the calculation. It was assumed that the population increased at the same rate as the females increased in 1831-41, namely 1\*332 per cent. annually, or \*331 quarterly. So  $\frac{1}{4} \lambda r = .0014370$ .

usually are in England; February warm; the three months were dry and bracing. The great epidemics subsided in 1849. Their force was perhaps expended. It is usual to say that they carry away the weak; but to this it should be added, that their attacks leave much weakness behind them. Then although, as hitherto has always been the case, much more has been said than done in the way of sanatory improvement, undoubtedly many houses, streets, and cities have been purified. Some flagrant nuisances have been suppressed, and have not had time to reaccumulate.

Food too has been abundant. The high prices of provisions in 1847, when wheat was on an average 70s. a quarter in England, and potatoes still dearer, induced agriculturalists everywhere to extend the breadth of land under culture in 1848, which, as the crops were scanty, did not then produce an amount of subsistence sufficient for the population. The agricultural returns, which by the command of the Lord-Lieutenant have been so ably digested by Captain Larcom, show how much this culture was extended in Ireland; 872038 acres of land were under wheat and potatoes in 1847, and 1308645 acres were under the same cultivation in 1848; while the produce, which was 2385308 tons in

1847, was 3269689 tons in 1848, without supplying the ordinary wants of the people.\*

No attempt has been made to procure returns of the breadth of land or the produce in England; and the Irish returns of 1849 have not yet been made up; but there can be little doubt that all over Europe the breadth of land under potatoes, wheat, and the other cereals, in that year, was sufficient to yield, on average crops, enough food to supply the markets. The crops were generally above the average; the potato did not fail; and the supply of wheat was consequently superabundant, so that prices fell lower than they have been since 1835. The general advantages of abundance are unequivocal: but whether the part of the population which is engaged in producing food for sale, procure as much money for the good crops of 1849 as they procured for the scanty bad food with which the markets of many counties were supplied in 1848, or for average crops, is uncertain, and must always remain uncertain, until a comprehensive system of agricultural statistics is organized. No one can imagine, however, for a moment because wheat was at 51s. a quarter in 1848, and 44s. a quarter in 1849, that the value of the produce was in that ratio; for if 10 million quarters of wheat at 51s. are worth 25½ million pounds, evidently 11590000 quarters at 44s. will be worth the same sum. This relation must hold if prices are in the inverse ratio of the quantities in the market; and if the price varies more than the quantity, it is nevertheless clear that the value of the produce will vary within a narrower limit than the price. The returns from the agricultural districts exhibit an improved state in the health of the great body of the inhabitants; and there is nothing in the facts, which can justify us in refusing to ascribe a part of the improvement to the comparatively abundant supply of the necessaries of life.

The following remarks made by the Registrars of the respective districts, are all of any consequence that refer to the economical and sanatory condition of the people:—

ISLINGTON, MIDDLESEX; *Islington East*.—The labourers begin to have more work, which has been very slack during the first half-quarter. Good bread is obtained now for 5½d. the 4lbs. loaf.

ST. GEORGE-IN-THE-EAST, MIDDLESEX; *St. Mary*.—There appear to be a less number of persons out of employment; provisions are cheaper, are more attainable; improvements have been made by the local authorities in the paving and cleansing of the streets and places in this district, chiefly inhabited by the poor and working classes. These circumstances have probably produced an improved condition of the public health.

HEAVITREE; *St. Thomas*.—The district is healthy and without epidemic. The poor suffer much, and labour is scarce.

STOKE DAMEREL; *St. Aubyn*.—Cholera, in the quarter ending September, 1849, carried off a number of females in different stages of pregnancy, and a number of sickly persons who would probably have lingered till about this time.

GAINSBOROUGH; *Misterton*.—The deaths are much below the average, and form the smallest number ever registered by me in a quarter. Perhaps this may be partly attributed to the sanitary arrangements enforced during the prevalence of the cholera, but to which it is to be feared that sufficient attention will not hereafter be given.

RASFORD; *Bulwell*.—The union medical officer gives it me as his opinion, that he never knew the district more healthy; that out of a population of nearly 8000 persons, he has not at this time one sick person chargeable to the Union to attend. He attributes the health of the people chiefly to their increased comforts, caused by the low price of provisions and plenty of work; and he expects if sanitary arrangements are still attended to, and other circumstances continue favourable, further benefits will accrue.

MARTLEY; *Martley*.—The deaths are much below the average. No cause is apparent, except reduction in the price of food, which I certainly think has promoted the public health.

STOCKPORT; *Hazelgrove*.—The people are well employed, especially the silk weavers.

BOLTON; *Eastern Bolton*.—The return of the births and deaths exhibits a small increase, as compared with the average of corresponding quarters of the last 3 years, which I attribute to a movement of the population in consequence of an improved state of trade.

CHORLTON; *Hulme*.—I have reason to suppose, that the practice of drugging children with narcotics is much on the decline in this neighbourhood. Perhaps the exposure of its pernicious consequences, by some of the Registrars' remarks in their quarterly returns, may have done much towards suppressing the evil. The diseases of infants are more generally placed under the treatment of qualified practitioners, hence perhaps the reason why we have latterly had fewer deaths of infants registered. This improvement, I think, may in a great measure be attributed to the requirement of medical certificates of the cause of death. The profession in this neighbourhood very willingly and promptly supply those certificates, and my registration will show that comparatively few deaths are recorded where the cause of death has not been duly certified.

MANCHESTER; *Market-street*.—It is gratifying to state that the condition of the working classes has been much ameliorated. The only drawback seems to be a deficiency of employment in some occupations, but this source of dissatisfaction, in the opinion of many, will not long continue.

TODMORDEN; *Hebden Bridge*.—Numerous families are leaving this district for other districts, in order to get more work and better wages.

BRADFORD; *Pudsey*.—The births and deaths have been rather above the average, which perhaps may be accounted for by an improvement in trade causing an influx of inhabitants.

There were great fluctuations in the meteorology—the temperature and dryness were nowhere the same: some parishes were covered with fogs and clouds, while in others the sun was shining on the fields and meadows—the rains, hails, winds, storms, lightnings, thunders, auroras, and lights over the face of the island everywhere varied in order, time, and intensity. So the yield of the crops in different districts varied; in some it was sound, in others blasted; in some scanty, in others thirtyfold. The profits of the multifarious occupations of the people rise and fall by the same law of change; and the more there is of speculation the greater is the range of profits and prices. The agriculturalists speculating on the high prices of 1847, and the possibility of the loss of a great article of consumption, insured the people of Europe against the contingency of starvation. The people have gained: and if the underwriters have lost this year, is it not probable that they will win in the long run the just rewards of their high calling and noble enterprise?

The appearance of scurvy in 1847, and the experience of the navy, prove that esculent roots, fruit and vegetables, cannot be foregone without impairing the public health; and it will be a great and dangerous mistake to forget that the potato is at present an essential article of food, which can only be partially replaced by bread and meat. Yet this corruptible crop may any year be destroyed; and the analogy between the disease, and diseases of the zymotic class in animals and men, renders the risk of its periodical recurrence so considerable, that for some time to come the producers and consumers of subsistence should every year inquire: "What will be the price of food, and how can the population of the United Kingdom be fed, if the potato crop should fail?"

Cholera was fatal in only a few cases during the quarter. 13 persons died of the disease and of diarrhoea in Bishop Auckland, 7 in St. Oswald, Durham; and a few cases were also met with in Wye, East Ashford; Mitchelmersh, Romsey; Kilmersdon, Frome; St. George, Liverpool; London-road, Manchester; Oldham-below-Town; Lancaster; Hebden Bridge, Todmorden; Thornhill, Dewsbury; St. Nicholas, Durham. The epidemic which was so fatal in 1831-2 broke out again in 1833, and raged in summer. Under these circumstances the wisest course for the people to pursue is to indulge no more dread of cholera than if it had for ever disappeared; but at the



same time to use the same vigilance, and to take the same sanatory precautions as if it were certain to recur—as it probably will—at intervals, until all our cities are thoroughly drained, are supplied with pure water, and breathe a sweet untainted atmosphere. London is but a type of other towns, and how far London is from this condition is too evident to the senses; the polluted water of the Thames, the damp soil, the stinking sewers, the burial-grounds, the markets, all throw noxious vapours into the air, which silently sap the health of the inhabitants, destroy thousands of lives, and like the gaseous mixture in mines, though often entered with apparent impunity, are ever ready to explode with destructive violence,—in the form of fevers, of influenza, of cholera, or of any other epidemic abroad.

The sanification of our cities is a great heroic work, and may, perhaps, yet be achieved before the present generation has passed away.

The annual rate of mortality in the first quarters of the 11 years 1840-50 was 2·754 per cent., in 117 districts, comprising the chief towns; and 2·222 per cent. in the districts of small towns and country parishes; in 1850, the mortality in the first class of districts fell to 2·401 per cent., and in the second class of districts, to 2·067 per cent. In the most favourable winter quarter which has been experienced since 1846, the mortality of the inhabitants of towns exceeds the mortality of the rest of the country by 16 per cent.

#### INCREASE OF POPULATION.

The 144,602 births exceeded the 98,607 deaths in the quarter by 45,995; and from a return with which the Registrar General has been favoured by the Emigration Commissioners, it appears that 46,423 emigrants left the ports of the United Kingdom, at which there are Government Emigration Offices. Of these; 40,927 left English ports; but it is probable that great numbers were of Irish extraction.

Remarks on the Weather during the Quarter ending March 31, 1850.

By James Glaisher, Esq., F.R.S., F.R.A.S., of the Royal Observatory, Greenwich.

The mean daily temperatures of the air till January 24 were below their average values, the mean deficiency was 4°·6; from January 25 to March 13 they were above their average values, the mean excess was 5°·8; and from March 14 they were below their average values, the mean deficiency was 6°·2. The mean temperature of January 15 was 11° below; of February 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, and 15 was 15°, 17°, 12°, 14°, 14°, and 15° above, respectively; and of March 17 and 25 was 11° on both days below the averages of the same days in 7 years. At the beginning and towards the end of the quarter there was much snow; the amount of rain fallen is less than usual, particularly in March. The weather was mild in February, and severe towards the end of March. The mean temperature of the 3 months ending February, constituting the winter months, was 39°·2, and that of the average of 79 preceding winters is 37°·6.

Zodiacal light has been seen on February 3rd, 4th, 7th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 20th, 26th, and on almost every clear evening in March. Its boundary was noticed at Stone on March 4th, at 7h. 10m. P.M.; its apex reached to the Pleiades; its N. side passed by α Arietis and γ Pegasi; its S. side passed by η and β Ceti. The sun seemed to be in the centre of its base; its axis was coincident with the ecliptic. The light seemed to move northward as it was going down with the stars.

The direction of the wind at Greenwich was S.W. on January 5th, passing at the rate of 86 miles daily; it was N.E. from January 6th to January 21st, passing at the rate of 80 miles daily; it was mostly S.W. from January 21st to March 7th, with an average daily motion of 155 miles; and from March 8th the direction was variable, with an average motion of 70 miles.

Days of storms and gales of wind, January 14th, 15th, 26th; February 5th, 6th, 9th, 21st; March 4th, 23rd, and 30th.\*

Meteors were seen on February 3rd, 4th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 13th, 20th, 22nd, 26th; March 4th, 7th, 11th, 15 h, 17th, 28th, and 31st.

The meteor of February 11th was the finest seen since that of the year 1783. It was first seen at the distance of 84 miles from the earth, and passed over Shropshire and Warwickshire to Bedfordshire; it exploded at the distance of about 19 miles from the earth. It was of dazzling brightness, and exceeded one mile in circumference.†

Solar halos were seen at Nottingham on January 1st, at Whitehaven on January 7th, at Aylesbury on January 30th, at Nottingham on February 1st, 2nd, and 20th, at Stone on March 11th, at Nottingham on March 22nd and 26th; at Greenwich, Aylesbury, Stone, and Nottingham on March 29th, and at Greenwich, Stone, and Nottingham on March 30th.

Lunar halos were seen on January 27th at Hartwell Rectory and Norwich; on the 28th at Norwich, and on the 30th at Greenwich and Cardington; on February 16th at Nottingham, on the 19th at Aylesbury, on the 20th at Guernsey, Truro, Greenwich, Stone, Cardington, and Norwich; on the 21st at Greenwich and Aylesbury, on the 22nd at Cardington, Norwich, and Durham; on the 23rd at Guernsey, Greenwich, Hartwell Rectory, Cardington, and Durham; on the 24th at Stone; on the 27th at Guernsey, Aylesbury, Stone, and Hartwell Rectory; on March 21st at Hartwell Rectory and at Norwich; on March 25th at Stone and Hartwell Rectory; on the 26th at Durham and Hawarden; on March 27th at Rose Hill, near Oxford; on March 28th at Stonyhurst; on the 29th at Greenwich, and on the 31st at Cardington.

Lunar coronæ were seen at Stone on January 23rd, 25th, 27th, and 29th, March 20th, 21st, and 25th.

Auroræ were seen on January 5th at Greenwich, on January 30th at Hartwell, on February 6th at Whitehaven, Stonyhurst and Durham; on February 9th at Manchester, on February 10th at Stone, on February 12th at Durham, on March 9th at Whitehaven, on March 10th at Nottingham and Stonyhurst, on March 11th at Greenwich and Stonyhurst, on March 27th at Rose Hill, near Oxford, on March 28th at Stone, and on March 29th at Stone and Leeds.

Thunder storms occurred on February 4th at Helston; on February 5th at Helston, Cardington, and Holkham; on March 27th at Hawarden and Leeds; on March 28th and 29th at Helston.

Thunder was heard, but lightning was not seen, on January 13th at Helston, on March 28th at Derby, on March 29th at Helston, and on March 31st at Derby.

Lightning was seen, but thunder was not heard, on January 9th at Oxford; on February 4th at Leeds; on February 5th at Aylesbury, Stone, Hartwell Rectory, and Nottingham; on February 6th at Aylesbury, Oxford, Hawarden and Nottingham; on February 7th at Hartwell and Hartwell Rectory; on February 8th at Hartwell; on February 9th at Leeds; and on February 27th at Hawarden.

Hail fell on January 4th at Stonyhurst, on January 5th at Guernsey, Helston, and Truro; on January 6th and 8th at Holkham, on January 9th at Greenwich, on January 10th at Guernsey, on January 11th at Helston, on January 12th at Helston and Truro, on January 14th at Helston, on January 15th at Guernsey, on January 26th at Hartwell and Nottingham, on January 27th at Holkham and Rose Hill, Oxford; on February 3rd at Stonyhurst, on February 5th at Uckfield, Stonyhurst, and Saffron Walden; on February 6th at Guernsey, Nottingham, and Stonyhurst; on February 7th at Stone, Cardington, Stonyhurst, and Hawarden; on February 8th at Cardington; on February 11th at Hawarden; on February 12th at Truro and Nottingham; on March 16th at Nottingham; on March 21st at Stonyhurst; on March 23rd at Helston, Truro, Hawarden, and Nottingham; on March 24th at Helston, Truro, and Holkham; on March 25th at Helston, Truro, and Stonyhurst; and on March 27th at Helston.

Snow fell at Saffron Walden on January 3rd; at Manchester and Stonyhurst on the 4th; at many places on the 5th; at Uckfield, Holkham, Liverpool, and Oxford on the 6th; at Birmingham on the 7th; at Uckfield and Saffron Walden on the 8th; on every day from the 9th to the 22nd it fell at many places, at times it was falling all over the country; on the 26th it was falling at many places, and on the 31st at Shap, Darlington, Manchester, Leeds, and Nottingham. On February 7th at Glasgow, Lanark, and Saffron Walden; on the 12th at Glasgow, Lanark, Shap, Stone, Hartwell, Norwich, Manchester, Hawarden, Saffron Walden, and Nottingham; and on the 13th at Whitby. From February 14th to March 15th no snow fell; on March 15th it fell at Hartwell, on the 17th at Holkham and Saffron Walden, on the 22nd at Holkham, Leeds, and York; from the 23rd to the 27th it fell at many places on every day; on the 23rd and 26th it was falling all over the country from Guernsey to Edinburgh; on the 27th at many places from the south coast to Stonyhurst, on the 28th at Derby, Leeds, and Durham, and on the 29th at Leeds.

Frost at various places on January 1st, 2nd, 5th, 6th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 14th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 29th, 30th, 31st; February 4th, 7th, 12th, 13th; March 4th, 12th, 13th, 18th, 23rd, 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th, and 31st.

Fog has prevailed more or less on 54 days during the quarter.

The highest reading of the thermometer in air, was 62°, at Aylesbury and Wakefield; the lowest reading was 10°, at Southampton and Latimer. The extreme range of temperature during the quarter in England was therefore almost 52°.

The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey and Liverpool; and the greatest at Aylesbury and Latimer. The least monthly ranges of temperature occurred at Guernsey and Liverpool; and the greatest at Southampton, Wakefield, and Latimer.

Rain fell in the least number of days at Hawarden, Rose Hill, near Oxford, and Oxford; the average number of these places was 18. It fell on the greatest number of days, at Whitehaven and Stonyhurst; the average number of these places was 45. The stations at which the largest falls took place were Stonyhurst, Whitehaven, and Falmouth; the average amount at these places was 9.4 in. The smallest falls occurred at Stone, Saffron Walden, and Oxford; the average was 2.4 in.

OF

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS, IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 registrars in all the districts of England during the Spring quarter ending June 30th, 1850; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter which ended March 31st, 1850.

The return of Marriages is not complete; but the numbers wanting are inconsiderable, and have been supplied from the returns of previous years.

MARRIAGES.

The marriages were 30425 in the quarter that ended on March 31st, 1850; the marriages in the corresponding quarters of 1847-8-9, were 27480, 28398, 28270. The number of marriages in the first quarter of 1850 was only once exceeded in the 11 corresponding quarters of 1839-49; and correcting for increase, the proportion of marriages to population is shown to be much

higher in the first quarter of 1850 than in any corresponding quarter since 1839, except in the March quarters of 1845, 1846, when the labouring classes were in full employment.

It is often stated that the marriages of a country increase after epidemics; which by destroying the heads of families "make room" for new establishments. This theory derives little countenance from the English returns, for the greatest increase that has latterly been observed in marriages took place in 1844-5-6, after a period of low mortality; while the marriages fell and showed no disposition to rise after the high mortality which prevailed from the middle of 1846 to the middle of 1847, and again from influenza at the close of 1847 and the first quarter of 1848. The increase of the marriages in 1850 is therefore probably due, not to the cholera, but to the improved prospects of the people, which it has been before shown, so often lead to this result. The marriages increased in Brighton, Cheltenham, Norwich, Birmingham, Leicester, Nottingham, Derby, and Sheffield; while cholera was not fatal in 1849 to many heads of families in any of these towns. In Merthyr Tydfil, Salisbury, Leeds, and Manchester, cholera was fatal in 1849, and the marriages increased in 1850; but in Hull and Liverpool, where cholera also reigned, the marriages declined, or were stationary, in the first two quarters of the year 1850.

† The Table may be read thus, without reference to the decimal points:—In the year 1848, to 100000 of the population of England, there were 791 marriages, 3222 births, 2289 deaths registered.—The annual rates of marriage in each of the 4 quarters were \*655, \*799, \*748, and \*952 per cent.; the rates of death 2\*770, 2\*294, 1\*990, and 2\*090 per cent. In reading the population on the first line add 3 ciphers (000). BIRTHS.

The births registered in the quarter that ended March 31st, 1850, were 144602; in the quarter that ended June 30th, 155727. Births are always more numerous in the first than in the second half of the year; and from 1840 to 1845 the births registered in the first quarters were more numerous than those registered in the second quarters of the 6 years; but in 1846, 8, 9, 50, a change has taken place, and the excess of births has been thrown upon the June quarters. The number of births in the June quarter of 1850 is the greatest ever registered in England in the same time. The annual rate of births is obtained by comparing the number of children born in a given time with the corrected population. It was in the last June quarter 3\*489 per cent., which is the same as the rate in the corresponding quarter of 1849; and less than that in the June quarter of 1846; but much more than in any other June quarter of the years 1839--1850.

INCREASE OF POPULATION.

In the quarter ending June 1850, the births registered were 155727; the deaths registered were 93005; the excess of births over deaths was 62722.

The natural increase of the population was 62722, without taking into account the births of children who may have escaped registration. In the same period the number of emigrants from London, Plymouth, and Liverpool (the only English ports at which there are Government emigration officers), was 61778\*. It might hence be inferred that the population of England was stationary; but a great number of the 50156 emigrants from Liverpool were, it is believed, from Ireland, and there has been for many years an uninterrupted stream of Irish immigration, which has replaced the emigrants of English origin; so that notwithstanding the emigration, the population of England increased at a faster rate from 1831 to 1841, than the probable excess of births over deaths would imply.

#### STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

The mortality is now, it is gratifying to report, much below the average. It has not been so low in any of the corresponding quarters since 1837, when the new system of registration commenced, except in the quarter ending June 1844. The rate of mortality per cent. per annum in the quarter was 2.084. At this rate one in 192 persons died in the last three months; in 1847 one in 161 persons died in the same time. This shows clearly how much the risk of life has declined. The average chance of living through the three months April, May, June, among persons of all ages is 179 to 1.

93005 deaths were registered in the quarter ending June; while the deaths in the corresponding quarters of the four previous years were 90231, 106718, 99730, 102249. The improved state of the public health has been general; the eastern is the only division in which the deaths of 1850 slightly exceeded the deaths in the corresponding June quarter of 1849. The most considerable decrease is observed in London, and in the north-western division, comprising Cheshire and Lancashire. The improvement in the public health is not confined to the parts which were visited by the epidemic cholera in 1849, as will be apparent upon examining the returns in detail.

Cholera was most fatal in the following town-districts, and chiefly in the September quarter of 1849. The deaths from all causes are given below:—

If there is a diminution in the mortality of the above town districts, where, according to a prevalent theory, cholera carried off the unsound lives, there is a similar diminution in the rate of mortality of other large towns, where cholera did not prevail to any great extent:—

A further examination is required before the causes of this improvement can be eliminated; but it may be safely affirmed that they act generally, and have been by no means confined to districts decimated previously by the epidemics either of cholera or influenza.

The Registrars in their notes refer to sanitary measures, to the state of employment, and to other circumstances which affect the social condition of the people, as probable causes of the happy improvement in the public health. The registrar of Llanely refers to the depressed state of the iron trade in his district; but this is a solitary case; and the general tone of the notes is, as expressed by the registrar of Kington, that "the people are employed, and feel the great blessing of cheap and plentiful provisions." The following are the chief notes of importance referring to this subject:—

285; 2. KINGSBRIDGE; *Stokenham*. Scarletina prevailed among children. A farmer who has a great dungyard close by the entrance of his dwelling-house, had 3 children lying dead at one time of this malady. No wonder that malignant diseases should at times appear, when almost every cottage has a pigsty attached to it.

381; 5. WEST BROMWICH; *Wednesbury*. The district is at present healthy, but the drainage is bad, and the supply of water for the poor insufficient.

392; 3. BROMSGROVE; *Tardebigg*. There has been a great improvement in the health of the district, and a diminution of the number of deaths, since the sanitary movement of 1848 and 1849. Although the population has considerably increased, the deaths for the last 18 months are only as 2 to 3, compared to what they were during the 10 preceding years. The increased population, which renders the reduction in the number of deaths the more remarkable, will account, in conjunction with a great improvement in the trade of the district, for the augmentation in the number of births.

400; 2. COVENTRY; *Holy Trinity*. The deaths are decidedly below the average. For some time past the staple trades of Coventry, ribbon weaving and watchmaking, have been remarkably good, and there has been "no complaining in our streets."

416; 3. BARROW-UPON-SOAR; *Rothley*. The Union workhouse is in this district, and the number of in-door poor is less than was ever known before; the births and deaths are therefore fewer than otherwise they would have been.

438; 5. BASFORD; *Arnold*.—The working classes are in far better circumstances than they have been for several years past, and sanitary improvements have been made by the officers chosen for the purpose.

461; 3. LIVERPOOL; *Dale Street*.—The district is in a healthy condition, which may perhaps be attributed to the sanitary operations that have been excellently carried out. There were one fatal case of cholera and 17 of fever.

461; 4. LIVERPOOL; *St. George*.—The deaths are fewer by 33 than they were in the June quarter of last year, and the births are 22 more. So that life appears to be under more favourable conditions, to which, no doubt, the sanitary regulations adopted here have much contributed.

465; 2. WIGAN; *Aspull*.—A very healthy quarter. Great improvements are being made by the authorities in the removal of nuisances.

465; 3. WIGAN; *Wigan*.—The town on the whole appears to be more than usually healthy. The authorities are bestirring themselves in the removal of nuisances; many have already been removed, and a great number are being got rid of. Cottage owners in many parts of the town have been compelled to make sewers.

468; 10. BOLTON; *Little Bolton*.—The births are about 20 per cent. more than the average of the corresponding quarters of the last 12 years, which is mainly attributable to



abundant employment being had in every branch of manufacture, and a movement of the population to this immediate neighbourhood. The deaths are more than 20 per cent. above the average for the same period. Measles has been very prevalent.

469; 7. BURY; *North Bury*.—The greatest number of births, and the least of deaths, registered in any quarter. The weather has been very fine, and sanitary arrangements are in rapid progress.

471; 4. CHORLTON; *Hulme*.—When the great increase in the population of this district is taken into consideration, and the number of deaths registered is contrasted with the number of births, the return shows a remarkably healthy state of the neighbourhood. The abundant supply, and good quality, of all articles of sustenance at moderate prices, and the beneficial effect of employment, which has been pretty general among various classes, have doubtless contributed to the healthy condition of the people; but perhaps the principal cause has been the dry state of the atmosphere, and the steady advance of temperature, without sudden or excessive variations.

473; 4. MANCHESTER; *Market-street*.—It is most gratifying to state that both crime and pauperism have greatly declined.

477; 1. HASLINGDEN; *Newchurch*.—The deaths have been below the average. The decrease seems to have arisen in consequence of the mildness of the weather and cheapness of provisions.

481; 4. CHORLEY; *Chorley*.—The births are above the average, which appears to be owing to an increase in the population. Operatives have been for some months past in demand, chiefly as weavers and cotton spinners. The deaths are below the average, the district having been free from any epidemic.

483; 3. FYLDE; *Poulton-le-Fylde*.—On the whole the sub-district is tolerably healthy, the labouring classes having plenty of work and cheap provisions.

499; 11. BRADFORD; *Idle*. The deaths are about the average, but the births are considerably above it. The cause of increase appears to be the improved condition of the people, from having more regular employment, better wages, and cheaper food.

501; 2. LEEDS; *North Leeds*. At present there does not appear to be any epidemic, the district being in a very healthy state, which may be partially attributed to some improvement having been made, for during the last nine months a great many streets have been thoroughly drained and cleansed, which were for many years previously in a very filthy state.

601; 4. CRICKHOWELL; *Llanelly*. The returns are rather below the average of corresponding quarters. The iron trade has been a little depressed.

603; 3. PRESTEGNE; *Kington*. There have been a few cases of typhus in the town in a lodging-house, owing to an offensive drain near the place, which I have reported to the authorities. No epidemic has prevailed, and this district is at present in a very satisfactory state. The people are all employed, and feel the great blessing of cheap and plentiful provisions.

Although vaccination is actively promoted by the Poor Law Board, is now performed at the public expense, and affords almost complete immunity from small-pox, it is still neglected to a great extent by the ignorant classes of society. According to an ancient and popular theory, the disease is the elaboration of some morbid principle from the system; which can only be delivered in this way from its influence. The objections to vaccination grounded upon the theory are, however, now deprived of all their force by the able and satisfactory investigations of Mr. Ceeley of Aylesbury. Mr. Ceeley has proved beyond doubt that small-pox and cow-pox are essentially the same disease. He introduced the matter of small-pox, taken from man, into the cow, and produced pustules; which supplied lymph and raised pustules in children possessing the properties of cow-pox; and which have served since for all the purposes of vaccination. Cow-pox then is a modified small-pox; and removes any morbid matter from the system as effectually as the more severe, deforming, fatal type of malady. Some of the objections are excuses for negligence; others are based on a sort of fatalism; but such cases as the registrar of Nottingham records are criminal, and it is to be feared spring from the same cruelty as leads to the sacrifice of children's lives in other circumstances. A woman there who had lost a child by the disease, assured the registrar that "she would rather lose half-a-dozen children by it than fly in the face of Providence, in having one vaccinated!"

Remarks on the Weather during the Quarter ending June 30, 1850.

By James Glaisher, Esq., F.R.S., Hon. Secretary of the British Meteorological Society.

The mean daily temperatures of the air till April 21 were above their average values, the mean excess was 4°·3, and during this period there was no frost; from April 22nd to May 16th the temperature was below its average value, its mean deficiency was 5°; from May 17th to June 9th the temperature was about its average value; on June 11 it was nearly 8° above the average; this was succeeded by very cold weather, and the temperature on the 15th was nearly 13° below its average; snow fell on this day at some places. Between June 18th and the 26th there was an excess of temperature of 6°·3, and after this time the temperature was again below the average.

The mean temperature of the 3 months ending May, constituting the spring months, was 46°·6, being very nearly that of the average of 79 preceding years.

The highest reading of the thermometer in air, was 87° at Uckfield and Nottingham; and the lowest readings were 25° at Uckfield and 26° at Wakefield. The extreme range of temperature during the quarter in England was therefore about 60°.

The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey, Liverpool, and North Shields, their mean value was 10°4; and the greatest occurred at Uckfield, Aylesbury, and Hartwell, and their mean value was 21°3.

The least monthly ranges of temperature occurred at Guernsey, Torquay, and Liverpool; their mean value was 25°1; the greatest took place at Uckfield, Aylesbury, and Nottingham, and their mean value was 45°8.

Rain fell in the least number of days at Helston, Holkham, Norwich and Newcastle; the average number at these places was 33. It fell on the greatest number of days at North Shields, Wakefield, and Derby; the average number at these places was 56. The places at which the largest falls took place, were Southampton, Stonyhurst, and Exeter; and the average amount at these places was 9.5 in. The smallest falls occurred at Hartwell, Holkham, and Liverpool; and their average was 4 in.

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 registrars in all the districts of England during the Summer quarter ending September 30th, 1850; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended June 30th, 1850.

The return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and have been supplied from previous years.

The general result of the return is favourable in a high degree: the Marriages in the Spring quarter are more numerous than in any corresponding quarter of the last 12 years; so also are the births in the Summer quarter; and the deaths are 86044 instead of 135358, which they were in the quarter ending September 1849, when cholera ravaged the chief towns of the kingdom.

The decrease of deaths implies necessarily the decrease of sickness and suffering; the increase of Marriages and Births indicates improvement in the condition and prospects of the great body of the people.

## MARRIAGES.

The marriages in all England in the quarter ending June 30th, 1850, were 39018. The numbers in the Spring quarter declined rapidly from 1846 to 1848, and rose still more rapidly up to 1850; thus following and portraying the state of the country. London, Cheshire, Lancashire, the West Riding of Yorkshire, and South Wales, presented the greatest fluctuations, and the greatest increase of marriages in the June quarter 1850. The marriages increased in Middlesex, Hertford, and Buckingham; in Essex and Suffolk the marriages declined, as they did also in Devon and Cornwall; in Shropshire, Staffordshire, Worcestershire, and Warwickshire,—the coal and iron regions—the marriages increased; they increased also in Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, and Derbyshire,—the seats of the thread, lace, and other manufactures. In the great agricultural county of Lincoln the fluctuation was in an opposite direction; the marriages rose from June 1846 to June 1848, and then declined. In the East and North Ridings, in Durham, Northumberland, Cum-

It was assumed that the population increased at the same rate as the females increased in 1831-41, namely 1\*332 per cent. annually, or \*331 quarterly. So  $\frac{1}{4} \lambda r = \cdot 0014370$ .

berland, and Westmorland, in Monmouthshire, and North Wales, the marriages increased in 1850. The marriages in Portsmouth and Plymouth declined; in Bristol and Cheltenham they increased; in Stoke-upon-Trent (the potteries), in Coventry, and in Birmingham, Liverpool, and Manchester, the increase was considerable. It was still greater in Leeds; Halifax and Sheffield shared in the general advance. Hull, Wolverhampton, and Salisbury—where cholera was exceedingly fatal in 1849—have little more than the average marriages.

## BIRTHS.

146970 births were registered in the quarter which ended in September. The births are invariably more numerous in the first and second than in the third and fourth quarters of the year; and they are in the last, fewer by 8757 than in the previous (June) quarter; the number and the proportion to the population are, however, greater in this than in any of the corresponding quarters since 1839. The increase of births is greatest in London, in the West-Midland Counties, and in the North-Western Counties—Cheshire and Lancashire.

## INCREASE OF POPULATION.

The excess of births registered over deaths in the quarter was 60926; which if all the births were registered would be the natural increase of the population. In the same time 53703 emigrants sailed from three ports of England; 1394 from Plymouth, 7684 from London, and 44625 from Liverpool.\* This leaves a narrow margin for the increase of population; but many of the emigrants entered at the English ports are from Ireland; which has been for many years diffusing a stream of natives over England as well as America. The progress of the whole fixed and moving population of the country can only be determined accurately from a comparison of the returns of births and deaths, of emigrants and immigrants, with periodical enumerations.

## STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

The mortality is much below the average; and the public health has never been so good since 1845, as in the present quarter. The rate of mortality is 1\*901 per cent. per annum. At this rate one in 211 persons living died in 3 months. The chances of living through this quarter were 210 to 1; the average chances of living through 3 summer months (1839-50), for persons of all ages, being 192 to 1.

The rate of mortality in 506 districts, comprising chiefly small towns and country parishes, was 1\*693 per cent. per annum in the quarter; the average summer rate (1840-50), being 1\*832 per cent.

The rate of mortality in 117 districts, comprising the large towns, was 2·206 per cent. per annum; the average rate (1840-50), being 2·517 per cent.

The juxtaposition of the figures in the table suggests the melancholy reflection that more than seven millions of people, inhabiting the metropolis and all the cities and great centres of industry, are still exposed to a mortality which is not inherent in their nature, but is due to the artificial circumstances in which they are placed. The waters, the sewers, the soils, the churchyards, the houses emit poisons. To every 10 natural deaths, 4 violent deaths—deaths from these poisonous exhalations—are superadded.

Still after the scarcity—after the great epidemics of influenza—and after the catastrophe of last year, the return even to the wonted degree of health is a relief to the nation; and health above the average, not only in places scourged by cholera, but in nearly all the towns of the country, is cheering, as it seems to show at once that the imperfect sanitary measures in progress are already beneficial, that the country is recovering from its loss, and that the wants of the people are now more abundantly supplied than they have been of late years.

The deaths in London during the 13 weeks ending September 1846-7-8-9-50 were 12409, 13187, 13503, 27109, and 11578. The zymotic diseases were fatal to 3011 persons in the last quarter, and it is chiefly, if not exclusively, to the diminished intensity of these maladies, that the improvement in the health of the inhabitants of London is ascribable. Small-pox destroyed 109 lives, measles 178, scarlatina 316, hooping-cough 300, croup 57, thrush 59, diarrhœa 1161, dysentery 73, and cholera 87. The deaths from diarrhœa in the same time last year were 2457; the deaths from cholera in the five summer quarters of 1846-50 were 197, 98, 153, 12847, and 87; so that fewer persons died of the disease in summer 1850, than in the summer quarters of 1846-7-8. Nine deaths from purpura and scurvy were returned; or less than half the number returned in the Summer quarter of 1847. The decrease of scurvy is a favourable symptom; it always demands attention, as nothing is more threatening to the health of large bodies of people, than a disease which involves the whole fluids of the body, and is the precursor of the most fatal epidemics.

26 deaths from poison, 26 from burns and scalds, 53 from hanging and suffocation, 94 from drowning, 137 from fractures and contusions, 19 from wounds, and 19 from other violence were registered. The increase in the deaths from hanging, strangling, and suffocation is considerable. The increase in the deaths by poison also deserves attention. Some alteration of the law to regulate the sale of poisons seems to be required. Arsenic is tasteless in food; it is inevitably fatal; it can be detected in the body after death; and it can be procured by any person in shops almost as readily as sugar. The placing of the sale of a commodity under restrictions is attended with difficulties; but to nip in its bud the practice of domestic murder by the administration of a tasteless poison is worth the effort, and will count against much inconvenience.

The deaths in the workhouses, hospitals, and other public institutions, were 2407, 1953, and 1719, in the three quarters of the year 1850: and of the 6079, 3498 were males, and 2581 females. One in six deaths of the inhabitants of London took place in public institutions during the three quarters.

The mortality was generally low in the South-Eastern and Midland Counties. Southampton suffered severely from scarlatina. Essex was visited by diarrhœa, and a few cases of cholera; Norwich suffered from a severe epidemic of scarlatina. The poor, whose dwellings were in unhealthy places, suffered most. Scarlatina prevailed in other parts of Norfolk, and raised the mortality. In Wilts, Dorset, Devon, Cornwall, and Somerset, where cholera was very fatal in 1849, the mortality returned to its normal state. The Registrar of Yeovil remarks that:—

No less than 26 of the 55 deaths have occurred from fever or other affections directly induced by it. Nearly all the cases of fever happened in Vicarage, Silver, and Middle streets, all of which lie directly under an extremely overcrowded churchyard, over which the wind had been blowing in a south and south-westerly direction for some time: this, with the imperfect drainage of the above streets, fully accounts for the origin of the disease.

Small-pox and scarlatina are also noticed in the West Midland Counties. In Hereford the Registrar observes:—

Small-pox prevails to a considerable extent in this district, having been introduced by a child sickening in a canal-boat which came lately from Gloucester; the child died in Gaolane, from which place the disease spread itself over the city. In nearly 60 cases, 7 proved fatal. Scarlatina also has prevailed slightly.

The Registrar of Burslem, in the Potteries, ascribes "the increase of births and decrease of mortality to improved sanitary arrangements, abundance of employment, and cheap food."

Bilston, which suffered last year so much by cholera, from the neglect of sanitary measures, is now losing lives from the neglect of vaccination. The Registrar says:—



The deaths are above the average, owing to the prevalence of small-pox. I have never known this disease so general among the working classes of Bilston. Many adults have taken it and died. It carried off 48 persons, 40 of whom had not been vaccinated. In several houses the whole of the children have been infected, and 2 or 3 have died. I find a growing aversion to vaccination among the poor, to the neglect of which I attribute so great a number of fatal cases.

Diarrhœa prevailed in Birmingham; cholera was fatal in a few towns in different parts of the country, but was nowhere epidemic. The mortality of Liverpool, Manchester, Leeds, Sheffield, and Hull was below the average.

Several of the Registrars refer to the prosperous state of their districts; in connexion with the increase of births and the diminished mortality:—

383; 2. STOURBRIDGE; *Stourbridge*.—Deaths 79. The deaths are 43 below those of the corresponding quarter of 1849, which is attributable to the salubrity of the weather, regular employment, abundance of good provisions, and the improved sanitary condition of the district. Diarrhœa has been less prevalent than usual at this season of the year.

386; 1. MARTLEY; *Martley*. Only one illegitimate birth. The blessing of cheap food appears to have a good effect on public morals as well as public health. There is not such dread of the expensiveness of housekeeping among the poor as formerly, when provisions were dear.

395; 1. ASTON; *Deritend*.—Births 212; Deaths 105. There appears a small increase in the births, which may be caused by the increase of population. Additional dwellings of small size have been lately erected in the district. The deaths are a little below the average, which I am at a loss to account for, unless it arises from the bettered condition of the working classes, owing to the improved state of trade and reduced price of food.

468; 4. BOLTON; *Halliwell*.—Births 56; Deaths 13. The deaths are greatly below the average, which I attribute to the working people being better fed, trade being good, and all in full employment.

468; 10. BOLTON; *Little Bolton*.—Births 220; Deaths 124. The number of births is considerably more than the average of the corresponding quarters of the last 13 years. The increase seems to be consequent on the steadiness of trade and influx of persons resident in the township, together with a large number of new cottages which are all occupied chiefly by the working classes. The deaths are about the average of corresponding quarters. Measles has been rather prevalent, and 17 deaths have occurred. The inhabitants have been free from any other epidemic, and are at present in a generally healthy state.

477; 2. HASLINGDEN; *Rosendale*.—Births 107; Deaths 44. Births, corresponding quarter last year, 66; deaths, corresponding quarter last year, 34. 8 deaths from measles, 2 without medical attendant. I cannot say to what the increase of births is to be attributed, except it be the improved condition of the labouring population, from plenty of employment and cheapness of food.

479; 1. CLITHEROE; *Gisburn*.—Births 27; Deaths 6. The deaths are below the average, which may be accounted for, perhaps, by the very fine weather, while provisions have been low in price, and work plentiful.

487; 1. SEDBERGH; *Sedbergh*.—Births 17; Deaths 4. The mortality has been far below the average for upwards of 18 months. I should be at a loss to account for it, otherwise than that the necessaries of life have been plentiful and cheap, and the labouring classes have had sufficient food.

498; 5. HALIFAX; *Elland*.—Births 116; Deaths 37. The proportion of births to deaths is nearly 3 to one. The number of the latter is less during the present quarter than in any previous one under the Registration Act. The district is remarkably healthy, and the whole of the population well employed, which gives them command of the necessaries of life and improves their physical condition. The present contrasts favourably with the period of limited employment and scarcity of provisions, when the number of deaths in this district was nearly equal to the births.

The next extract presents an exception to the generally prosperous state of the country:—

601; 4. CRICKHOWELL; *Llanelly*. Births 86; Deaths 44. This sub-district has been unusually healthy. The iron trade is still without animation.

The following note refers to a subject of great public importance.

553; 2. TYNEMOUTH; *North Shields*.—Births 135; Deaths 72. The police arrangements to prevent the influx of vagrants have tended to promote the health of the population, as most of the infectious diseases have been traced to this source. In fact, in one locality, Pumpwell-lane, in the township of North Shields, which is the resort of these persons, it is said that the Poor Law Union had better pay rent for the whole property and shut it up, than incur the great expense which it entails on the union,

On the Meteorology of England and South of Scotland during the Quarter ending 30 Sept. 1850.  
By James Glaisher, Esq., F.R.S., Hon. Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

The mean daily temperature of the air was below its average value till July 13; the mean defect was 2°·2; from July 12th to the 24th, the period was warm, the average excess of temperature was 4°·8; from July 25th to August 3rd, the temperature was below the average, its mean deficiency was 1°; from August 4th to August 18th, it was above the average, the mean excess was 2°; this was followed by a long period of fine, clear, dry, but cold weather, the average deficiency of temperature, between August 19th and September 17th, was 3°·5, and after September 18th the daily temperatures were slightly above their average values. Snow fell on Ben Lomond on August 23rd.

The mean temperature of the 3 months ending August, constituting the 3 summer months, was 61°·1, being 1°·2 above that of the average of 79\* preceding summers.

at Exeter; on the 23rd at Holkham and Norwich; on the 24th at Holkham; on the 26th at Stonyhurst, and on the 30th at Jersey and Trowbridge.

At Exeter.—On the 25th of July, the reading of the barometer decreased from 29·510 at 9 A.M. to 29·237 at 9 P.M., and the wind blew strong from the S.W., and a thunder storm then set in, accompanied by very heavy rain.

At Uckfield.—During the third week of July, the weather was very wet, and many places in Sussex were visited by severe thunder storms.

At Hartwell Rectory.—On the 15th of July at 1h. 30m. P.M. there was a storm, with thunder and lightning and very heavy rain, measuring in the gauge 0·510 in. The weather continued stormy with sheet lightning, all the evening. July 17th, at 6h. 30m. P.M., there was another thunder storm, but very little rain; sheet lightning was seen, at intervals, during the evening, to the south and west. July 18th, at 3h., 30m. P.M. there was a thunder storm and heavy rain; there was sheet lightning also in the evening, followed by continued rain, which measured in the gauge on the following morning 1·610 inches.

At York.—On August 8th, a thunder storm occurred between 6 and 8 in the evening. The Diocesan school and the Roman Catholic chapel were struck by lightning and injured; sheep were killed, and two individuals were knocked down, but no human life was lost. This was the severest storm that has occurred in York for the last 20 years. Thunder and lightning occurred again on the 9th.

At Stonyhurst.—The lightning during the thunder storm of 16th July was the most brilliant Mr. Weld remembers ever to have witnessed. It frequently resembled the explosions of fireworks, and on several occasions 3 or 4 branches darted from the same centre, while sometimes the sky seemed traversed in every direction by streaming lightning of the most vivid description. The thunder was incessant, but very distant, and no rain fell. Mr. Weld heard of 7 persons being killed, and about as many more struck, but not killed, besides several valuable cows and horses which were killed.

Thunder was heard, but lightning was not seen, on July 4th, at North Shields; on the 9th at Holkham; on the 15th at Guernsey; on the 16th at St. John's Wood, Linslade, Stone, and Wakefield; on the 17th at Greenwich, Durham, and North Shields; on the 18th at Wakefield; on the 19th at Stone; and on the 23rd at Guernsey. Snow fell on Ben Lomond on August 23rd.

Frost.—The first frost was on Aug. 22nd at Uckfield; the wheat and barley sheaves were frozen into a stiff mass, and Mr. Prince saw ice as thick as a wafer on his cucumber frames. On Sept. 5th there was a sharp frost at Hartwell House, and at Trowbridge on Sept. 7th and 8th.

Solar Halos were seen on July 6th at Uckfield; on the 10th near Oxford and Nottingham; on Aug. 3rd at Dunino; on the 17th at Greenwich; on the 20th at Dunino; on the 28th at Uckfield; on the 29th at Exeter and Nottingham. On Sept. 12th at Guernsey, and on the 29th at Dunino

The highest reading of the thermometer in air, was 89° at Uckfield and 88° at Linslade, and 88° at Hartwell; and the lowest readings were 31° at Wakefield, and 32° at Aylesbury and Hartwell. The extreme range of temperature, therefore, in England during the quarter was about 66°.

The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey, Liverpool, and North Shields, their mean value was 10°1; and the greatest occurred at Uckfield, Aylesbury, and Hartwell, and their mean value was 23°3.

The least monthly ranges of temperature occurred at Guernsey, Torquay, and Liverpool; their mean value was 23°4; and the greatest took place at Uckfield, Aylesbury, and Hartwell, and their mean value was 45°9.

The average range of temperature in the quarter at Uckfield, Hartwell, and Highfield House was 55°1, and at Guernsey, Jersey, and North Shields was 30°2.

Rain fell in the least number of days at Jersey and Torquay, and on the greatest number at Wakefield, Stonyhurst, and North Shields. The places where the least falls took place are London and Truro, and the mean amount at those places was 5.3 inches. The largest falls occurred at Stonyhurst and Whitehaven, and their average was 12.4 inches.

OF

THE MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS IN ENGLAND.

THIS Return comprises the BIRTHS and DEATHS registered by 2189 registrars in all the districts of England during the Autumn quarter ending December 31st, 1850; and the MARRIAGES in more than 12000 churches or chapels, 2869 registered places of worship unconnected with the Established Church, and 623 Superintendent Registrars' offices, in the quarter that ended September 30th, 1850.

The return of Marriages is not complete; but the defects are inconsiderable, and have been supplied from previous years.

In their general character the returns of the last quarter of 1850 are still highly favorable; and imply a happier condition of the population at the close, than at the commencement of the year. While fewer lives have been lost by epidemic diseases, the marriages and births have increased.

MARRIAGES.

The marriages celebrated in the summer quarter ending September 30th were 37496, or more by *ten thousand* than were registered in the summer quarter of 1842; and two thousand four hundred more than have been returned in the summer quarter of any previous years. Allowing for increase of population the proportion of marriages is greater than it has been in the same season of any year since the Registration commenced. Except in the Eastern and South Eastern Counties the increase of marriages has been general in all the great divisions of the country. In London the increase has been considerable; in Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Northamptonshire, and Bedfordshire, it has probably kept pace with the population; in Wiltshire, Dorsetshire, and Cornwall; in Gloucestershire, Shropshire, and Staffordshire, the increase has been still more marked; in Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Cheshire, Lancashire, and the West Riding of Yorkshire, however, the greater part of the excess has arisen. Northumberland, Cumberland, and South Wales, exhibit nearly the same increase as the Midland Counties. Among the counties in which the marriages have decreased, or have not sensibly increased, may be named—Kent, Hampshire, Suffolk, Norfolk, Devonshire, Lincolnshire, the East and North Ridings of York, Westmorland, and

North Wales. The marriages at Brighton increased from 133 in the summer of 1847, and 113 in 1848, to 177; at Cheltenham from 90 to 105; at Clifton from 88 to 115. At Wolstanton, Burslem, and Stoke-upon-Trent, among the potteries, the multiplication of marriages is remarkable. In the iron districts of Dudley, Walsall, Birmingham, and Merthyr Tydfil, the advance was slow, or inconsiderable. At Coventry, as well as Spitalfield Whitechapel, the seats of the silk trade, the marriages increased rapidly; as they did also at Leicester, Nottingham, and Derby, at Stockport, and Macclesfield. At Manchester, the marriages rose from 1097 to 1442; at Preston from 159 to 281; Halifax from 215 to 313; Leeds from 418 and 359 to 488; Newcastle-on-Tyne from 293 to 318; Carlisle from 39 to 53; Merthyr Tydfil from 160 to 213.

In the purely agricultural counties marriage then still went on slowly, but steadily; in all the iron and coal fields at but a slightly increasing rate; while in all the counties peopled by the workers in lace, silk, wool, and cotton, the number of marriages—of new families established—has increased at a rate of which there are few examples in the returns of the last hundred years. And the general result is an aggregate increase in the marriages of the whole country during the *summer* quarter of the year 1850.

## BIRTHS.

The Births in the quarter following, which ended on December 31st, 1850, were also the greatest number ever registered in the autumn quarters of any previous year. 146268 children were born in the three months. The births are in general most numerous in the spring quarter, and were so in the spring of 1850: they have since greatly exceeded the numbers registered in previous years in all the divisions of the kingdom—whether agricultural or manufacturing—in counties ravaged by cholera, and in counties left unscathed by that plague.

## INCREASE OF POPULATION.

The excess of births registered over deaths in the quarter is 54245. The usual excess is forty thousand more births than deaths; the excess in the last quarter of 1845 was 50000; in 1847, when influenza was epidemic, only 24000; in 1849, when the cholera epidemic was rapidly declining, 38000.

In the last quarter of the year 1850, 56971 emigrants left the ports of the United Kingdom, at which there are Government Emigration officers; 3836 departed from Irish ports, 1903 from Glasgow and Greenock, and 51232 from three English ports; namely, 1702 from Plymouth, 4282 from London, and 45248 from Liverpool. During the whole of the year 1850 the births were 593567, the deaths 369679, and consequently the excess of births over deaths was 223888 in England: the same year 280843 emigrants sailed from the shores of the United Kingdom,—214606 (many of them of Irish birth) from England; 15154 from Scotland, and 51083 from Ireland.\* The number of births and deaths in Scotland and Ireland is unknown; and the Census alone can disclose at what precise rate the population increases; but we know that the new births more than replace the vast armies of peaceful emigrants that every year assemble without much noise, and led apparently by the same kind of divine instinct that directs other migrations, leave their native land to seek homes in regions prepared for them all over the world.

## STATE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

That the health of the country is in a state not so unsatisfactory as it has been, is evident from the reduced mortality. 92023 deaths were registered; and allowing for the probable increase of population, the rate of mortality is lower than it has been in any of the last quarters of the years 1839-50 except 1845. The rate has been such that 1 in 197 of the population died in the quarter. The chances were 196 to 1, in *this quarter*, that a person would live through the 3 months; the *average chance of living* through the 3 months in England is 184 to 1.

London has suffered less than usual from zymotic diseases; and the deaths from all causes have been 12544. Of this number 1946 took place in public institutions; namely, 114 in the military hospitals and asylums, 1070 in workhouses, 636 in hospitals, exclusive of 9 deaths in hospitals for foreigners—108 in lunatic asylums, and 9 in prisons, so that 1 in 12 who died in London ended his days in workhouses, 1 in 20 in hospitals, 1 in 115 in lunatic asylums, and 1 in 1381 in prisons. The deaths from small-pox and hooping-cough are increasing; of scarlatina, 429 persons, chiefly children, died; diarrhoea declined; influenza which destroyed more than 1161 lives 3 years ago, was fatal only in 26 cases; of typhus 619 persons died; of childbirth, including metria, 117 women died. The deaths from bronchitis and pneumonia

together amounted to 1868; these diseases being fatal both in infancy and advanced age. Consumption was fatal to 1455 persons of all ranks; it is the great constant inexorable destroyer of men and women in the prime of life; and notwithstanding the efforts and researches of the most eminent inquirers has not yet been disarmed of its fatal powers. 17 deaths were due to intemperance, 9 to privation; 51 were ascribed to the want of breastmilk, 2 to neglect, 1 to cold, 22 to poisoning, 49 to burns and scalds, 54 to hanging and strangling, 59 to drowning, 142 to fractures and contusions, 20 to wounds, 11 to other violence.

In every division of England the mortality has declined; and been lower than in the corresponding quarters of 1846, 1847, 1849. Lancashire and Cheshire present the greatest fluctuations.

The mortality in the South Eastern Division has been generally low. In Kent, scarlatina was epidemic at Gillingham, near the Medway, where cholera was prevalent last year; in Sussex, at Lewes; in Hampshire, at New Forest, Southampton and Basingstoke. At Southampton the deaths (300) nearly equalled the births. In Oxford and other parts of the South Midland counties scarlatina prevailed. At Harpenden, St. Albans, four deaths from fever occurred in one house; and three other members of the family were attacked. The house stands in an open situation, but has only one bed-room.

A very accurate and interesting account of the health and diseases of Oxford has been given by Dr. Greenhill; who has for some time prepared for that city tables of mortality, which other cities and large towns would do well to imitate.

In *Norfolk*, Yarmouth, Norwich, and the neighbouring districts suffered severely from scarlatina. Scarlatina and small-pox prevailed in the South Western counties. Plymouth has been exceedingly unhealthy; in Exeter and Bath, the mortality has been low; Bristol and Clifton about the average. Measles was epidemic at Gloucester; small-pox at Hereford; scarlatina at Kingsland, Leominster; and at Shrewsbury. In Staffordshire, at Cheadle, a striking instance of immunity from mortality was noticed; out of a population of 7000 only two deaths occurred in the month of November, and one of these was in a child prematurely born. Small-pox has been fatal at Wolverhampton, and has raged 6 months at Bilston; where in the last quarter it destroyed 69 persons, 50 of whom had never been vaccinated. Birmingham and Coventry enjoyed an average degree of health. The mortality of Leicester, Lincoln, and Nottingham was about the average; Derby was visited by a virulent kind of measles, which raised the deaths above the average. Liverpool has been less unhealthy than usual; of Manchester the mortality is much below the average although small-pox has been prevalent. The mortality at Leeds has been low; at Sheffield near the average; although there scarlatina, measles, and hooping-cough prevailed. Scarborough, Whitby and Durham were healthy. The mortality in Newcastle-on-Tyne and Carlisle does not differ much from the average.

The comparatively good health of several districts is ascribed by the Registrars to the employment and the improved condition of the people. The following are the chief passages referring to this point, and to the effect of sanitary measures:

58; 4. MAIDSTONE; *West Maidstone*.—Births 67; Deaths 68. Deaths in the district generally are below the average, which I attribute to the improved condition of the poor, arising from the cheapness of food.

212; 3. SUDBURY; *Sudbury*.—Births 60; Deaths 25. Deaths considerably below the average, being in fact the smallest number registered in any quarter since the commencement



of the present registration. Abundance of employment for the weavers, and the cheapness of food, are the only apparent causes of the improved state of health.

274; 2. WEYMOUTH; *Weymouth*.—Births 76; Deaths 42. The deaths are 11 below the average. This may probably be accounted for by the unusual fineness of the weather for the season, and a better supply of pure water.

310; 2. REDRUTH; *Redruth*.—Births 100; Deaths 48. The births are in excess of the corresponding quarter in 1849, which may be accounted for on the same grounds as before, the great influx of strangers into the sub-district. The deaths are 40 below the same quarter of 1849, and also below the quarterly average. This improvement is attributable to the entire absence of epidemics and to the better condition of the inhabitants generally, consequent on an abundant supply of labour, and cheapness of provisions.

353; 4. CLUN; *Lydbury*.—Births 15; Deaths 9. The sub-district is at present in a healthy state and free from epidemics. I consider that the labouring class who form the majority of the inhabitants are better off than they have been for some time past.

440; 3. NOTTINGHAM; *Saint Ann*.—Births 120; Deaths 69. The deaths are below the average; 3 deaths have occurred from diarrhœa, and one from typhus. One-third of the deaths registered this quarter occurred in the Union workhouse. The decrease in this and 4 preceding quarters is attributable to three causes: the mildness of the season, the beneficial arrangements made by the Sanitary Committee, and the decided improvement in trade, which has enabled the mechanic to provide himself and family with wholesome food. The last-mentioned improvement has also thinned the Union workhouse, which contributes on an average at least a fourth of the deaths.

468; 10. BOLTON; *Little Bolton*.—Births 222; Deaths 121. The births are much above the average of the corresponding quarters of former years, which I attribute entirely to the steadiness of all branches of trade and manufacture, in this neighbourhood. The deaths are much below the average of the corresponding quarters of former years. Measles has been prevalent, and there has been 13 fatal cases. One death certified from English cholera, and 6 from fever have occurred. The mildness of the season, abundance of cheap provisions, and plenty of all kinds of employment, have doubtless tended to mitigate epidemics and diminish mortality.

468; 11. BOLTON; *East Bolton*.—Births 220; Deaths 137. This return exhibits a considerable decrease in comparison with the average of former years. The recent sanitary arrangements, combined with the improved condition of the working population, owing to a better state of trade and the cheapness of provisions, may account in some measure for the difference.

469; 7. BURY; *North Bury*.—Births 113; Deaths 65. Deaths considerably below the average; owing, almost entirely I believe, to the extent to which sanitary measures have been carried out.

487; 1. SEDBERGH; *Sedbergh*.—Births 21; Deaths 4. The deaths still remain much below the average. Sanitary improvements have been carried out to some extent in the town of Sedbergh and neighbourhood. There has been some trifling movement of the population, but not sufficient to account for the decrease. The low price of provisions, plenty of work, new enclosures, and improvements in agriculture, such as drainage, and bringing moss and waste land into cultivation, these things have been the means of keeping the labourers in full employment. With provisions low, the poor have been able to procure sufficient food.

Hull was the only town in which any appearance of epidemic cholera was observed. In that district and Sculcoates, so fatally visited by cholera last year, several persons died of cholera in the quarter; 10 at Sutton, one at Drypool, 15 in East Sculcoates, 9 in West Sculcoates, 19 in Humber, 20 in Myton. At present this district may be considered healthy. After the great epidemic of cholera in 1832, a second outbreak followed in 1833; and was fatal in towns that had before been spared. It is a subject of congratulation—and is perhaps ascribable to the better circumstances of the people, and to some of the sanitary measures in progress, that the country escaped a second visitation in 1850.

The mortality in the autumn quarter was at the rate of 2·323 per cent. per annum in 117 town districts; and 1·824 per cent. per annum in 506 districts, comprising small towns and country parishes. By causes still in operation, the towns to every 4 deaths from what may be called natural causes, lost in a favourable season, one life by the poisons generated in crowded, dirty houses, in the churchyards, in slaughter-houses, in undrained streets, and sewers.

On the Meteorology of England and South of Scotland during the Quarter ending 31 Dec. 1850.  
By James Glaisher, Esq., F.R.S., Sec. of the British Meteorological Society.

The mean daily temperatures of the air were below their average values till October 30th; excepting the 17th, 18th, and 19th days, the mean deficiency was 2°·6; from October 31st to November 12th the period was warm, the average daily excess was 5°·1; the 13th, 14th, and 15th days were cold, their average defect was 5°·3; from November 16th to November 25th the average daily excess of temperature was 3°·2; from November 26th to December 3rd, the average defect was 4°·7; December 4th and 5th were in excess to the amount of 6°·3; from the 6th to the 11th was in defect to the amount of 4°·3 daily; from the 11th to the 16th the excess was 4°·7; from December 17th to December 23rd it was 4°·4 in defect, and on December 24th a period of very warm weather set in, and to the end of the year the daily excess of temperature was 6°·3. The mean temperature of December 31st, was 50° nearly, and exceeding its average value by 13°. During the whole quarter there has been an unusual amount of fog, it having been prevalent more or less on 69 days.

The mean temperature of the 3 months ending November, constituting the 3 autumn months, was 50°·0,\* exceeding the average of 79 years by 0°·7.

Thunder storms occurred on October 1st at Uckfield and Nottingham; on the 5th at Hartwell Rectory, Hartwell House, Stone, Thame, and Liverpool; on the 8th at Cardington; on the 9th at Nottingham, Cardington, Manchester, and Stonyhurst; on the 11th at Hartwell House, and on the 23rd at Jersey; on November 4th at Uckfield, and on the 19th at Jersey; on December 14th at Jersey, Guernsey, Helston, Falmouth, Truro, and Southampton, accompanied at the last-mentioned place by a violent gale, which lasted for half an hour. On the 15th at Guernsey, Helston, Uckfield, Thame, and Rose Hill near Oxford; on this day the lightning set fire to a barn, situated about 4 miles to the S.W. of the last-mentioned place, which was burnt, notwithstanding the extreme fury of the storm, hail and melted snow falling

all the time in torrents, water to the depth of more than 0·5 in. fell, and the observer at Oxford says that the lightning of this storm struck a rick-yard at Radley, in that neighbourhood, and did considerable damage. The highest reading of the thermometer in air, was 71° at Nottingham; 69° at Chiswell-street, London, and 67° at Falmouth; and the lowest readings were 17° at Durham, and 19° at Wakefield. The extreme range of temperature, therefore, in England during the quarter was about 54°.

The least daily ranges of temperature took place at Guernsey, Leicester, and Whitehaven, their mean value was 7°; and the greatest occurred at Nottingham, Wakefield, and Hartwell, and their mean value was 13°.

The least monthly ranges of temperature occurred at Guernsey, Liverpool, and Leicester; their mean value was 22°; and the greatest took place at Wakefield, Nottingham, and Uckfield, and their mean value was 37°.

The average range of temperature in the quarter at Nottingham, Oxford, and Wakefield was 46°, and at Guernsey, Liverpool, and Jersey was 27°.

Rain fell in the least number of days at Newcastle, Dunino, and Southampton, and on the greatest number at Stonyhurst, Manchester, and Wakefield. The places where the least falls took place are York, Cardington, Bedford, and London, and the mean amount at those places was 4.6 inches. The largest falls occurred at Stonyhurst, Guernsey, and Whitehaven, and their average was 14.1 inches.

LETTER from WILLIAM FARR, Esq., M.D., to the REGISTRAR GENERAL, on the CAUSES of DEATH in ENGLAND, 1850.

SIR, General Register Office.

An inquiry into all the deaths that were known, were suspected, or were, from their nature, likely to be caused by wilful, careless, or accidental violence, was instituted in the earlier ages, and it has ever since been found to be so advantageous to society, that in England it has been continued in the coroner's court down to the present day.

Under the Registration Act, the cause of every death was, in 1837, required to be supplied by the informants, but its provisions involved no arrangement to secure the greatest possible amount of accuracy in the information that was thus communicated. The opinions of the medical men who treated the cases that terminated fatally were consequently only given indirectly, until 1847, when you distributed forms of certificates of the cause of death among all the qualified members of the medical profession; from the first directing the Registrars to withhold them from quacks and unqualified practitioners. The medical authorities, and the great majority of the medical practitioners of England and Wales, supported this measure; and, although the inquiry into the causes of death, like that in the coroner's court, is still imperfect, it is carried out to a large extent, and with more accuracy than it is in any other state.

I now proceed to bring under your notice briefly the results of this extended inquiry into the causes of all the deaths that happened to the people of England and Wales in 1850.

The causes of 361,542 deaths are specified. Of the causes of 7060 deaths no accounts are found in the registers. The great majority of the causes of deaths are certified by the medical attendants of the persons deceased, in the forms that you have prescribed.

It often happens that certain diseases are followed by other diseases, or that two forms of malady are successively developed and are in intimate connexion. Thus scarlatina is sometimes followed by dropsy, measles and hooping-cough by bronchitis or pneumonia, typhus by perforation of the intestine, phthisis by pneumothorax, hernia by peritonitis, stone by nephritis, childbirth by metria. External causes are frequently fatal, not in a direct way, but by developing phenomena that are recognized as diseases. Thus arsenic induces gastritis (inflammation of the stomach), alcoholic drinks induce delirium tremens, privation leads to scurvy and dropsy, cold to mortification, burns to internal irritative diseases, contusions, fractures, and wounds to erysipelas, tetanus, purulent deposits (pyemia), and, under certain circumstances, to hospital gangrene.

It has been the general rule, in the classification, to refer the secondary affections that supervene in the course of measles, scarlatina, phthisis, and other diseases, to the primary diseases by which they are caused or modified, and the diseases that are the direct result of external causes to those causes. The partial exceptions to these rules occur in the above classes of cases. At some subsequent period it will be right to investigate these double causes.

The year 1850 differed, as the extracts from the quarterly tables\* show, from the previous year, in salubrity. The epidemic of cholera

terminated in 1849; the temperature of 1850, after considerable depression in January and March, intercepted by a warm February, rose, and remained high. The temperature of the year was one degree above the average. The prices of provisions were moderate, and the working classes easily met with employment.

Table I. presents a comparative view of the deaths in the four years 1847 to 1850.

To admit of the mortality from each separate cause being shown without fractions, a million is made the basis of the Tables II., III. The Table II. exhibits the proportion of deaths by each cause to every million of the population; the Table III. the proportion of deaths from each cause to a million deaths from all causes.

ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

The causes of death are arranged in seventeen groups. The first group comprises zymotic diseases, and includes the diseases that prevail at all

times, more or less, but at distant intervals and places break out as epidemics or plagues. Certain matters are developed, that differ in activity under different circumstances and in different places, setting up in other bodies actions and changes similar to those that take place in their own production.

74,833 deaths, or 21 in every 100 deaths, were the results of zymotic disease, which was fatal to 4 in every 1000 of the population.

The Table may be read thus: To 1,000,000 deaths from All Specified Causes there were 12,906 deaths from small-pox; 19,583 from measles; 36,980 from scarlatina, and so on. By placing a decimal point before the three figures on the right the proportion will be shown to 1000 deaths; thus there were 12.906 (nearly 13) deaths from small-pox to every 1000 deaths from All Specified Causes.

The most fatal diseases of the class were typhus (14,296 deaths), scarlatina (13,370), diarrhoea (11,468), hooping-cough (7770), measles (7080), small-pox (4666), and croup (4321).

Cholera was fatal to 886 persons; cholera and diarrhoea to 12,354 persons. In the previous year 71,104 persons died of these diseases.

Influenza was the cause of 1380 deaths. In the year 1848 it was fatal in 7963 instances.

Of typhus, including all the common continued fevers of England, 30,320 persons died in the year 1847, and 14,296 in 1850.

One death in every five was the result of zymotic diseases, or 21 in 100 deaths.

SPECIFIC DISEASES: or (1) Diseases of uncertain or variable Seat; and (2) Tuberculous Diseases.

The diseases of the zymotic class are generally attended in some of their stages with acute febrile excitement, and affect the blood and secretions. The two subsequent groups comprise diseases of uncertain or variable seat (2), and tubercular diseases (3). Hæmorrhage, dropsy, abscess, ulcer including fistula, and mortification, also affect various parts of the body. In cancer, gout, scrofula, and phthisis, there are specific deposits; and in the diseases of the two groups the blood is apparently modified.

The deaths from the second group amounted to 19,341; from the third group, or tubercular diseases, 60,385; and from the two groups together 79,726; a number which is considerably in excess of the deaths by zymotic diseases.

In unhealthy years, and in unhealthy places, it may be laid down as a general law, that the zymotic diseases (1) are always more fatal than the diseases in the two next groups (2, 3); and that in healthy seasons and places the converse is true.

Dropsy is referred to as the cause of 9981 deaths, and was undoubtedly in many instances associated with organic diseases of the heart, or of the kidneys (nephria).

Of cancer, in various forms, 4966 persons died; and it will be observed that, as in the other diseases of the class, the numbers fluctuate little from year to year.

The deaths from phthisis (consumption) were fewer than usual (46,614), but amounted to more than the deaths from any other disease, and to 1 in 8, or 13 per cent., of the deaths from all causes. To every 1000 of the population 2.6 die every year of consumption.

ORGANIC DISEASES; or Diseases of particular Organs.

The body is composed of many organs, which in the Tables are arranged in eight groups (4-11): (4) the brain and its appendages, the seats of consciousness and the sources of sensation and of motive power; (5) the heart and the blood vessels that contain and circulate the blood; (6) the organs of respiration; (7) the organs for the digestion of food; (8) the organs of urinary secretion; (9) the uterus and other organs of reproduction; (10) the organs of locomotion; and (11) the integumentary organs. All the organs are subject to inflammations, and to various functional as well as structural diseases, which destroyed the lives of 134,559 persons. Deviating somewhat from the common use of the term, this may be designated the great group of organic diseases; that is, of diseases of particular organs, or of particular sets of organs; while the life of the rest of the organization, though it is affected only indirectly, is nevertheless in the end destroyed or arrested in its course.

47,450 persons died of diseases of the nervous system, including 22,997 of convulsions, 8093 of apoplexy, and 7318 of paralysis.



Medical men throughout the country have become acquainted with the means of distinguishing heart disease with facility, and it is now detected in cases which would formerly have escaped notice. 11,357 persons died of diseases of the heart and blood vessels.

43,827 deaths were the result of diseases of the lungs and of the other organs of respiration; 14,612 arising from inflammation of the air tubes (*bronchitis*), 20,303 from inflammation of the cells and substance of the lungs (*pneumonia*), and 4573 from asthma.

The diseases of the organs of digestion (22314) were not fatal in half so many cases as the diseases of the organs of respiration; teething was the cause of 4086 deaths; gastritis and enteritis of 4252. The French writers would refer many of the cases of diarrhoea and typhus to this head, or to gastro-enteritis.

The diseases of the pancreas were considered the causes of 18 deaths; the diseases of the spleen of 58 deaths.

The fatal diseases of the liver, including hepatitis (1437) and jaundice (1164), were 6156. 1541 deaths are referred to diseases of the kidneys and their appendages, indiscriminated in the Table; 178 to inflammation of the kidneys (*nephritis*); 430 to *nephria*, which, because it was first well described by that physician, has been called Bright's disease by some nosologists. The apparent increase of the deaths by *nephria* from 254 in 1847 to 430 in 1850 is partly referable to improvements in the diagnosis of the medical practitioners throughout the country; for the accuracy of these records depends as much on the diffusion of medical knowledge as on the progress of medical discovery. *Nephria*, as well as many diseases of the heart, were formerly referred to dropsy, which is a common result of their protracted existence.

Diabetes, that singular disease, in which sugar is excreted in the urine, is always fatal; and 421 persons died of it in the year. Stone was the cause of 250 deaths; cystitis of 214. The 207 deaths by stricture of the urethra must, I fear, be considered as the remote results of syphilis. The whole group of the diseases of the urinary organs was fatal in 3332 cases, or 9 deaths in 1000 were referred to the head, which was fatal to 188 persons in every million of the population.

The reproduction of the human race is chiefly fatal to women, of whom 1113 died of metria (a zymotic fever incidental to childbirth), and 2139 of the other puerperal affections. Thus in the births of 593,422 living children 3252 of the mothers died; or one mother died to every 182 children born alive. This great loss of women in the prime of life is the result of negligence and ignorance, in many cases, and would be diminished by the education of the nurses and midwives who attend the poor. 219 deaths arose from ovarian dropsy; 701 from diseases of the uterus and of the other organs of reproduction.

2367 persons died of diseases of the organs of locomotion, including rheumatisms, not stated to be acute, or rheumatic fever and diseases of the joints and bones. Rheumatic fever in the zymotic class was fatal in 391 cases.

The leprosy and other diseases which were so fatal in the middle ages, and which were the results of uncleanliness of the skin, have now almost disappeared from the list of causes of death; only 169 deaths are referred generally to diseases of the skin and integuments, 422 were the consequences of phlegmon, and 134 of carbuncle. It will be noted that carbuncle and boil was fatal in the three preceding years to 77, 91, and 81 persons; so that the disease which has since continued to prevail extensively, though rarely fatal, almost assumed an epidemic form in 1850.

The carbuncle attacks or is fatal in the proportion of 3 males to 1 female, and chiefly to persons of the age of 40 and upwards. No female over 5 and under the age of 35 died of carbuncle.

#### DISEASES OF GROWTH, NUTRITION, AND DECAY.

The human body is developed from a small cell into organs, systems, and all the elaborate mechanism of its perfect form; which, amidst endless mutations of its substance, exists for a series of years, and then gradually decays and dies. Derangements of the processes of development and the decay itself constitute the classes of causes (12, 13, 14, and 15) to which 54,878 deaths are referred. Some of the processes of development are arrested; hence malformations, such as harelip, spina bifida, imperfect closure of a passage through the heart, causing cyanosis; which are the early forms of the organs left in their imperfect state. These imperfections are often, directly or indirectly, fatal in infancy or in the course of a few years of age; and 781 deaths are referred to malformation. Then, in the nine months of intra-uterine life, many casualties occur and diseases arise, which have hitherto been only imperfectly described, and which destroy the fœtus that is *stillborn*, and is therefore not registered under the Act. Many children are born prematurely, or, if maturely, in a state of great vital debility and of exhaustion, from protracted parturition or from some other cause: they breathe for a few hours, days, or weeks, and then die. This state is generally called "debility," or sometimes premature birth. A similar state that supervenes in advanced age, and sometimes in the intermediate stages of life, is designated by the same name. The deaths that are referred in the registers to premature birth and debility are 18,045, of which 9901 befell male, 8144 female infants under one year of age.

The body wastes away in many diseases; and this is so particularly the characteristic of the tubercular class that one has been called "marasmus," and another "consumption." Sometimes, however, the cause of the wasting is not discovered, or nutrition is simply suspended; and 9950 persons are returned as having died of atrophy; under which the decay that attends old age has, however, in a certain number of instances, been apparently classed.

26,102 persons died of "old age," or, if we deduct those under the age of 70, the number becomes 25,576. But the total number of persons who died aged 70 and upwards was 55,266; so that specific causes other than age were assigned to nearly half the number of these deaths, and may have operated unperceived in many of the other instances, for disease itself becomes feeble and indistinct in a feeble decaying body. The 3559 sudden deaths are cases in which inquests were held, and the organic or other cause of death was not ascertained. They may be referred to organic diseases.

Thus have been rapidly passed in review the deaths of 347,555 of the people of England; and we have seen that 74,833 fell by *zymotic diseases*, 79,726 by two classes of what may be called, for the want of a better term, *specific diseases*, 138,118 (including the 3559 sudden deaths) by *organic diseases* in eight classes, and 54,878 by *diseases of growth or nutrition, or by decay*. Some of these diseases of the four classes are induced, and the greater part of them are diminished or augmented, by heat and cold, the atmosphere, the impure water, the exhalations from the earth, and a great variety of external circumstances; but death is thus only indirectly caused by the intervention of diseases which in many other instances arise spontaneously through the bad composition or the ill-working of the organization itself.



EXTERNAL CAUSES OF DEATH.

A certain number of deaths are caused directly by external causes, which may be classed as physiological, chemical, and physical causes.

The physiological causes include intemperance (323 deaths), privation (73 deaths), want of breast milk (460 deaths), neglect (38 deaths); and it is evident by this statement that many of the deaths by these causes have been referred to the previous heads of the classification without reference to their external causes.

The chemical causes of death come under three heads; *cold* (102 deaths), *burns and scalds* (2782 deaths), and *poisons* (455 deaths). By intense cold, or by intense heat acting through hot air or hot water, or by the direct contact of burning bodies, the structure of the body is destroyed, and its organic elements are decomposed, with inevitable death as the result when the injury is extensive.

To breathe is to live, and of the *physical causes* two produce 3705 deaths by stopping the breath; namely, 2532 with water (drowning), and 1173 by other means, such as hanging, strangling, suffocation by closure of the mouth, and the inhalation of irrespirable and sometimes poisonous gases. Lastly, mechanical injuries cause 4824 deaths; namely, 4233 by fractures and contusions, 591 by wounds. In 1225 other cases of death by violence, its nature was not defined. A few cases were returned merely "manslaughter," "murder."

Some of the external causes that in too many instances are fatal are wilfully or negligently set in motion by men, and the act is homicide or suicide. This subject deserves to be fully investigated, for the mental states appear to admit to a large extent of moral and physical control.
