CONSTITUTION.

TITLE.

THE EDINBURGH NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE.

OBJECT.

To obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.

METHODS.

The adoption of all legal and constitutional means to advance the Object:—

- (a) By acting as a centre for collection and diffusion of information with regard to the progress of the movement in all parts of the country.
- (b) By holding Public Meetings.
- (c) By the distribution of Pamphlets, Leaflets, and other literature bearing on the subject.
- (d) By the formation of Women's Suffrage Societies.
- (e) By working at Elections and By-Elections according to the policy of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies.
- (f) By getting up petitions in favour of the Reform.

MEMBERS.

Men and women in favour of the "Object" shall be eligible as members.

SUBSCRIPTION.

The Minimum Annual Subscription shall be One Shilling.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

- (a) The Executive Committee shall consist of not more than twenty-one members, that is to say, of the President, two Vice-Presidents, the Secretary and the Treasurer, and sixteen ordinary members.
- (b) The Office-bearers and the ordinary members of the Executive Committee shall be elected by the members of the Society at the Annual Business Meeting.
- (c) The Members of the Executive Committee shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election: vacancies during the year to be filled by co-option.
- (d) The notice calling the Annual Business Meeting shall be sent to members fourteen days before the Meeting, and shall include an intimation that nominations for

members of the Executive Committee shall be sent to the office seven days before the Meeting.

- (e) Election shall be by ballot.
- (f) No one shall be eligible as a member of the Executive Committee who is a member of (a) any Political Party Organisation or (b) any Militant Suffrage Society.
- (g) The Executive Committee shall meet at least once a month. Five members shall form a quorum.
- (h) The Executive Committee shall have the right to appoint Sub-Committees of not less than three members, one of whom must be a member of the Executive Committee; the others may be ordinary members of the Society.

THE PRESIDENT.

The President shall convene all meetings, which shall be called by the Secretary.

The Chairman shall have a deliberative and a casting vote.

FINANCE.

The Financial year shall close on the 31st of December.

The Treasurer shall submit a Balance-Sheet at the Annual Meeting.

The Accounts shall be audited annually by an auditor appointed by the Society.

MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY.

The Annual Meeting shall be held in February after the Annual Council Meeting of the N.U.W.S.S.

Not less than two business meetings shall be held during the year, whereof one shall be the Annual Meeting of the Society as above mentioned, and the other, a meeting held after the second Council Meeting of the N.U.W.S.S.

No alteration of the Constitution may be made except at the Annual Meeting.

Other business meetings shall be arranged by the Executive Committee.

Extraordinary business meetings shall be called on the written requisition of one-third of the Executive Committee, or of 25 ordinary members of the Society.

Seven days' notice shall be given of all extraordinary business Meetings, and the business to be transacted shall be intimated on the cards summoning the Meeting.

60 Members shall form a quorum.

ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION.

The Constitution of the Society can be altered at the Annual Business Meeting or at any General Business Meeting, if, after the statutory notice has been given, two-thirds of the members, present and voting, vote for the alteration.

FORTY-SIXTH REPORT

OF THE

Edinburgh National Society for Woman's Suffrage.

THE Executive Committee of the Edinburgh National Society for Woman's Suffrage have the honour to present their Report for the year 1913.

The year began with what is known as the Reform Bill Fiasco. The opinion of the responsible Law Officers of the Crown and the judgment of old Parliamentary hands, such as Mr Asquith, Sir Edward Grey, and Mr Lloyd George, to say nothing of well-known members of the Opposition, were brought to nought by the Speaker, who ruled the Woman Suffrage Amendments to the Reform Bill to be out of order.

Owing, as was stated by the Prime Minister, to their inability to fulfil the solemn pledges made to the women of the country, the Government decided to drop the Reform Bill altogether, a concession which, as all Suffragists realise, was more apparent than real.

The year has been characterised by nearly all the speakers in the Union, as one of "Set-back in Parliament, but of great progress throughout the country."

The chief feature of the year from the Suffrage point of view was the great Pilgrimage. Pilgrims marched from every part of England into London, and the march culminated in a Monster Demonstration in Hyde Park on Saturday, 26th July.

Though there was no pilgrimage in Scotland, members of the Edinburgh Society helped their English sisters. Miss L. M. Gordon went to Carlisle on 17th June, the eve of the start, and spoke for more than an hour to a crowd that numbered over 2,000.

Miss Pressley-Smith, E.F.F., Organiser for Leith Burghs, spent a week in the North-Eastern Federation helping to start the pilgrimage in that district, and speaking at several places *en route*. Miss Low went to Harrogate and spoke to the pilgrims in that town.

Miss Low, Miss Gordon, Miss Pressley-Smith, and Miss

Loudon did one day's march, from Barnet to Highbury, the day before the Demonstration.

There were two platforms allotted to the Scottish Federation in Hyde Park, with three speakers on each platform. Of the six speakers, five—Miss Macmillan, Miss Crompton, Miss Low, Miss Gordon, and Miss Pressley-Smith, were members of the Edinburgh Society. The sixth speaker was Miss Louisa Lumsden, L.L.D., President of the Aberdeen Society.

Summer School.—Some members of the Edinburgh National Society attended the Scottish Federation Summer School at St. Andrews during August, whilst others sent donations.

West Lothian By-Election.—The chief event of the year in our political work was the West Lothian By-Election, which was caused by the appointment of the Right Hon. Alex. Ure to the Office of Lord President of the Court of Session.

Our policy at the election was propaganda only, as neither candidate would answer all our questions in the affirmative.

Baillie Pratt (Liberal) mentioned Woman's Suffrage in his election address, and promised to press the Government to bring in a Government measure for the enfranchisement of women, but would not oppose more votes for men unless women were included.

Mr Kidd (Unionist) was in favour of a very limited franchise.

The constituency is a very wide one, and it was necessary to have centres of work both at Bathgate and Bo'ness.

At the former place Miss Foggo, Miss Jeffrey, and Miss Craigie did splendid work, keeping open the Committee Rooms, holding outdoor meetings, and working up hall meetings in the surrounding district.

Provost Robertson kindly took the chair for Miss Matters at a big meeting in the Co-operative Hall, Bathgate, two nights before the poll.

Miss Sheard (kindly lent by the North-eastern Federation) organised and spoke at outdoor meetings in Bo'ness and neighbourhood, arranged for workers for polling day, and managed an enthusiastic meeting at which Miss Matters spoke, and Councillor Livingston took the chair.

In addition to these places already mentioned, practically every village and hamlet in West Lothian was visited, and crowded meetings were held. The electors were most sympathetic, and showed their appreciation of our speeches by signing 2,272 post-cards on polling day, calling upon the representative for West Lothian to press the Government to bring in a Government measure for Women's Suffrage.

The Society owes a debt of gratitude to those members who stood for hours in the bitter cold on 7th November at the door of the polling booths. Miss Evelyn Simson, Miss Rhoda Whyte, Miss Hilda Cotterill, the Misses Bruce, Miss Sayer, Miss MacKay, Miss Thomson, Miss Ireland, Miss Bessie Barclay, Mrs Rees, Miss

Vere Bogle, Miss Duncan, and several others volunteered for this special piece of work, and many of them also assisted during the campaign.

The main burden of the speaking was taken by the Misses Low, Gordon, Pressley-Smith, Sheard, Foggo, and Craigie, while Dr Inglis, Miss Stuart Paterson, Miss Florence Matheson, and Miss Hilda Cotterill also helped.

The Organiser in charge of the election work was Miss Alice Low.

In all, thirty-three meetings were held, 1,500 copies of the *Common Cause* disposed of, and there were few places in West Lothian to which the gospel of Women's Suffrage did not penetrate.

Meetings.—Inclusive of meetings arranged by other organisations, but addressed by our speakers, such as the I.L.P., B.W.T.A., Co-operative Guilds, etc., the number of meetings held during the past year in Edinburgh and district amounts to over 180.

Of these meetings a great many were held in the open-air.

Large Public Meetings.—The Annual Meeting of the Edinburgh Society was held in St Cuthbert's Hall, King's Stables Road, on 14th February, at 8 P.M., when the adoption of the Report was moved by Councillor Margaret Ashton in a fine speech. Miss Ashton also addressed a crowded meeting the previous night in the Merchiston Rooms, organised by the Merchiston Ward Committee.

The chief meeting of the year was held on 20th November in the Music Hall. The speakers were Mrs Fawcett, who occupied the chair, Miss Maude Royden, and Mr Fenner Brockway, Editor of the *Labour Leader*.

The Music Hall was filled with an enthusiastic audience, and the speakers had a great reception.

The collection, with special donations, amounted to over £40.

Minor Public Meetings.—Minor Public Meetings have been held at Addiewell, Winchburgh, Musselburgh, Livingstone, Newhaven, Bo'ness, Dalkeith, Loanhead, Mid-Calder, Broxburn, Uphall, Pumpherston, Arniston, Newtongrange, Rosewell, Bonnyrigg, Bathgate, Straiton, Mossend, Newlandrigg, Pathhead, Newcraighall, Temple, Blackridge, Kirkliston, Blackburn, Torphichen, Philpstoun, Fauldhouse, Whitburn, Dalmeny, Longridge, Stoneyburn, Armadale, West Calder.

The Merchiston Ward Committee organised a capital meeting in the Morningside Public School on December 15th. Miss Abadam the advertised speaker, was unable to be present owing to severe illness. Miss Low took her place, and Dr Alice Hutchison gave an interesting address from the chair on Sex Antagonism.

The Leith Meetings are mentioned elsewhere.

This list, long as it is, does not give a full account of the work done, as at many of the places mentioned two or three meetings were held during the year.

Drawing-Room Meetings.—A great many Drawing-Room Meetings were held during the year. The thanks of the Society are due to the Misses Bell, Mrs Glover, The Misses Henderson, Mrs Horsburgh, Mrs Lindsay, Mrs M'Laren, Mrs Pagan, Mrs Nicholson, Mrs Jack, Mrs Scott (Leith), Mrs Denholm (Bo'ness), Mrs Somerville (Dalkeith), who kindly gave meetings at their houses, adding, on each occasion, a number of members to the Edinburgh Society.

Members of the Society addressed meetings organised by the Women's Liberal Association, Women's Labour League, the Independent Labour Party, the Miners' Federation, the B.W.T.A., the Social Guild of Women, the Women's Co-operative Guild, the Girls' Guild, the G.F.S., the Railway Women's Guild, and various local Literary Societies.

Debates.—On February 7th a debate was held in the Junior Liberal Club, Leith, between Miss Low, Suffragist, and Mrs Greatbatch (London), Anti-Suffragist.

The voting was very close, and the motion was lost by 4 votes.

On March 11th, in St John's Mission Hall, Viewforth, Mr John M'Michael took the Suffragist side in a Debate at a men's meeting.

The result was a victory for the Suffragists.

On November 13th, there was a Debate in St Vincent's Church Hall, St Stephen Street, arranged by the Northern Branch of the Co-operative Women's Guild. Dr Elsie Inglis championed the cause of Woman's Suffrage against Mrs Gladstone Solomon, Anti-Suffragist.

A vote was taken, and the Suffragists won by 7 votes.

On 2nd December a Debate organised by the Labour League was held in the Labour Hall, Leith:—Subject, "Should Militant Methods be Employed in the Agitation for Votes for Women?" *Affirmative*, Miss Muriel Scott; *Negative*, Miss Alice Low. The Constitutionals won by 49 votes to 14.

On 8th December Miss Low again took part in a Debate organised by the Restalrig Literary Society. The question was "Should the Parliamentary Suffrage be Extended to Women?" *Affirmative*, Miss Low; *Negative*, Mr Paterson. Miss Low won the Debate by 38 votes to 6.

On 17th December at a meeting of the Working Men's Unionist Association, a Debate was held between Miss Low, Pro-Suffrage, and Mrs Norris (London), Anti-Suffrage. No vote was taken.

Theatricals.—A very successful performance of Miss Cicely Hamilton's play, "Just to Get Married," was given in the Lauriston Hall on 17th January.

The hearty thanks of the Society are due to Miss Carmouche, who got up the play, and herself gave a vivid impersonation of the heroine, Emmeline Vicary. We also wish to thank Miss J. E.

Pagan, Mrs Morley Fletcher, Miss Doris Forsyth, Miss Mary Bruce, the Rev. W. H. Bridge, Mr Redwood Payn, Mr King, and Mr Macpherson, and all who contributed to the success of the evening.

Miss Frances Simson gave a short Suffrage speech between the acts and drove home the lesson of the play.

Thanks to Miss Carmouche and her talented company, the sum of £20 was handed over to the funds of the Society.

Sales.—The Autumn Sale, which is now one of the fixtures of the year, took place on Saturday, 25th October, in St Cuthbert's Hall, King's Stables Road, and proved very successful. Professor Sampson occupied the chair, and the Sale was opened by Lady Margaret Sackville in an eloquent and witty speech. The drawings for the day amounted to £160, a sum which was increased by some £20 owing to subsequent sales.

The thanks of the Society are due to Madame Marie Stewart, palmist and clairvoyante, who gave her services free for the whole day. Madame Stewart had hard work, as her tent was besieged from the beginning of the Sale to its close by eager enquirers into the future. Her contribution amounted to the handsome sum of £5.

Two excellent dramatic performances were given during the day by Miss Maud Morin, and the Misses Nan and Hilda Cargill Knott.

The pieces on the bill were "The By-Election at Weatherley" by Miss Maud Morin, in which the authoress played the part of an anti-suffragist canvasser; and a dramatised version of the interview between Mr Collins and Elizabeth Bennet from "Pride and Prejudice," entitled "Mr Collin's Proposal."

The pieces were admirably acted, and the Society is greatly indebted to those ladies who got up the plays and acted in them.

Mrs Purves was again the Organising Secretary and Convener of the Bazaar Committee. Mrs Purves and her Committee worked hard for months beforehand, and the Society owes a deep debt of gratitude to her and to all those ladies who toiled so indefatigably for the success of the Bazaar.

It is impossible to thank all the members individually, but besides Mrs Purves, we must mention the names of Miss S. E. S. Mair, Miss Mair, the Misses Bell, Mrs Nesbit, Mrs Eddington, Miss Pearson, Mrs Inglis Clark, the Misses Kemp, Mrs James Low, Miss J. Hepburn, Miss F. Suffrage Calendar.—In connection with the Sale, the Literature Stall again brought out a Suffrage Calendar. This year the Bugler in the colours, appeared on every page of the Calendar, with a quotation from some famous man bearing on the Woman question. One thousand copies were ordered from the printers, and Societies all over the country availed themselves of the privilege of buying the calendar at practically cost price.

Jumble Sale.—A Jumble Sale by which we made over £20 was held in the Buccleuch Street Hall, on Saturday, May 3rd. Educational Syllabus of the National Union.—After the summer holidays the National Union proposed an educational course of lectures dealing with "The Child and the State." The Edinburgh National Society took up the scheme, and from October 24th till December 19th (with one exception) the Friday afternoon lectures were devoted to this subject, addresses by experts being given on various points connected with the child. A glance at the list of the office meetings will show the extent of ground covered by the speakers. The outside public seemed to appreciate the course, as the meetings were always well attended.

Special Speakers.—The Society was fortunate in obtaining the services during the year of some of the best speakers in the National Union.

Miss Muriel Matters paid us three visits—Jan. 14th to 20th, April 17th to 27th, October 31st to November 7th, and we paid her the compliment of working her very hard.

A similar compliment was paid to Miss Margaret Robertson, who was with us from February 14th to 18th, and again from June 18th to 24th.

In May we had two days from Fru Anker, the Norwegian Suffragist, and in the same month we had the pleasure of hearing Miss Louisa Lumsden, L.L.D., President of the Aberdeen Society.

Amongst others who came to speak for us were Miss Geraldine Cooke, Miss Wakefield, and Miss C. M. Gordon.

The Edinburgh Society and North-eastern Federation sometimes exchange workers and speakers for a week or ten days at a time, a plan which has worked admirably, as it gives both speakers and audiences a change of ideas which is most beneficial.

OUR BRANCHES.

Leith.—The Suffrage Cause has been put before the people of Leith in every possible way during the past year, and in the Spring a branch was formed with Mrs Scott as Secretary, and Councillor Clarice Macnab as Chairman of Committee. Other members of Committee are Mrs Cameron, Mrs Adam, Mrs Vyner (Press Secretary), and Miss Alice Smith.

During the Autumn session fortnightly meetings were held in Wilson's Hall, Hope Street, Leith, among the speakers being:—Miss Muriel Matters, Rev. C. Howard Davies, Councillor Graham, and the Rev. P. Wilson.

At the afternoon meetings Mrs Adams and Mrs Cameron kindly took charge of the arrangements for tea.

During the first week of October many dinner-hour meetings were held at the various works in Leith where girls are employed, and the week ended with a social evening in the Labour Hall, Miss C. M. Gordon giving a capital address, and Mr James Low and Miss Hughes delighting the audience with their songs.

On Saturday, 1st November, a Sale was held in the Bonnington Road Hall to raise funds for the Leith Branch. The opening ceremony was performed by Miss Muriel Matters, who was introduced by Miss Clarice Macnab. Amongst the stall-holders were Mrs Cameron, Mrs Adams, Mrs Wilson, Misses Bell, Miss Loudon, Miss Moody, Mrs M'Craw, Miss Alice Smith, Miss Sayer, Miss Cornish, Mr Scott, Mrs Eddington, Mr Taylor, Mr Airlie, Miss Abbott, Mrs Cruickshank, Miss Macnab, Mrs Norman. Mrs Bolan, whose services as palmist were greatly in demand, spent the whole day at the Sale. In the evening two plays were given by Miss Maude Morin, the Misses Cargill-Knott, and Miss Hodsman.

A net sum of £15 was realised after all expenses were paid.

Theatricals.—In the early part of December a theatrical entertainment was given in the Assembly Rooms, Leith. Two plays, "Snowed Up with a Duchess," and "How the Vote was Won," were performed by Miss Radford and her talented company. The Hall was packed, and an enthusiastic reception was given to the players. Miss Pressley-Smith gave a short speech on Women's Suffrage in the interval, the chair being taken by Mrs Scott, Secretary of the Leith Branch.

In all, over twenty-four meetings have been held in Leith during the year, and much spade work done by Miss Pressley-Smith, to whose untiring efforts the success of our work in Leith is largely due.

Bo'ness.—Our Bo'ness Branch has sustained an irreparable loss in the departure of Miss Andrew, the Hon. Secretary, who left to take up work with the Newcastle Society. Miss Smith and Miss Borthwick have kindly taken Miss Andrew's place as Joint Secretaries.

The outstanding work of the year has been the West Lothian By-Election.

Miss Sheard's visit to Bo'ness did much to help the local branch, and the Secretaries gave her all the assistance in their power. The Deputation which waited upon Mr Kidd, the Unionist candidate, consisted of Mrs Andrew, Miss Denholm, Miss Borthwick, Miss Smith, Miss Jenkins, and Miss Low. Mr M'Culloch kindly introduced the deputation.

Our thanks are due to Mrs Andrew, Mrs Denholm, and Miss Denholm, who gave hospitality to speakers and workers, and to the following who assisted on polling day:—Miss Turnbull, Mr White, Miss Smith, Miss Bremner, and others. An account of the meetings held will be found under the West Lothian by-election.

Mrs Denholm, Tidings Hill, gave a delightful drawing-room meeting for Miss Margaret Robertson during the summer, when thirty new members were gained by the branch.

Dalkeith—(*Hon. Sec.*, Mrs Charles Somerville).—The chief event of the year was a delightful garden meeting given by Mrs Somerville, Glencairn, at which Miss C. M. Gordon spoke, and Mrs Somerville herself took the chair. Several members were gained, and the whole company spent a most enjoyable afternoon in the beautiful garden.

Dalkeith members sent a number of contributions to the Annual Sale.

Open-air meetings held in Dalkeith and neighbourhood are mentioned elsewhere.

Livingstone.—Our energetic Secretary, Miss Traill, organised two admirable meetings at Livingstone village, and succeeded in getting the use of the schoolhouse, in spite of the fear expressed by the board that the speakers might break the windows. The speakers at these meetings were Miss Cotterill, Miss Low, and Miss Loudon.

North Berwick Society.—We have pleasure in recording the fact that we have been instrumental in handing over a strong Society to the Scottish Federation.

In 1912, as the result of a meeting addressed by Miss Rosaline Masson and Miss Alice Low, a number of the North Berwick people became members of the Edinburgh National Society for Women's Suffrage.

In March 1913 a public meeting was held at which Provost Macintyre took the chair, and at which our North Berwick Branch became a Society within the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies, under the name of the North Berwick National Society for Women's Suffrage.

Press Work.—Under the able guidance of Mrs Guyer, the Press Committee has done admirable work during the year. The tone of our leading newspaper, the *Scotsman*, still leaves a good deal to be desired, but Suffragist communications are no longer tossed unread into the waste paper basket. The *Scotsman* published a *communiqué* of nearly a column from Miss Leaf, Press Secretary of the National Union, giving an account of the work of the Union during 1913, and it has also published a great number of letters on the Woman question.

The *Evening News* is always generous to us, both as regards space and sympathy.

Of the local papers in our area the majority are lukewarm, some are definitely anti, and the following are sympathetic:—The *Leith Pilot and Observer*, *Leith Worker*, *Musselburgh News*, *Portobello Advertiser*, *Bo'ness Journal*, *Linlithgowshire Gazette*.

The Committee take this opportunity of expressing their warm thanks to Mrs Guyer and her sub-committee for their invaluable work. It is with the greatest regret that they have received Mrs Guyer's resignation from the Executive. This step was taken under medical advice, but the Committee earnestly hope that a year's rest from work will restore Mrs Guyer to health, and that next year she will again be able to give her services to the Society. Mrs Eddington has kindly consented to act as Press Secretary and Convener of the Press Committee *pro tem*. Special mention must be made of Miss Alice Kemp, who so ably conducts the press work in connection with the *Scotsman* and the *Evening Dispatch*, and whose letters in both these papers are just what is needed in each particular case.

The "Woman's Outlook" column in the *Weekly Scotsman* does not invariably appear, but some important notes on Suffrage Work contributed weekly by Miss Maud Morin have been published. They are of distinct value in reaching a public who might not otherwise learn much of Suffrage doings.

The newspapers are, on the whole, much more open to the statement of our case both for and against than formerly, though it may well be said of the anti-suffrage press that they do not always print the correction of a mis-statement when it is supplied. We have very great reason for encouragement when we think of the immense progress made since the formation of our Press Committee in 1911.

FRIENDS OF WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE SCHEME.

ANNUAL REPORT.

This scheme was inaugurated at the Council Meeting in May 1912, and was described there by Miss Maude Royden as "one of

the most important developments ever undertaken by the National Union." There is no doubt that this statement has been justified by the rapid growth of the movement, and by the present large membership, almost equalling that of the parent Society itself.

In January 1913, within the Edinburgh area, there was a total of 373 "Friends." Of these 274 had been gained at the by-election in Midlothian, and the remainder—about 100 more—in Edinburgh. We had 8 Secretaries in the country and 12 Visitors in town.

This year, 1914, the total number of "Friends" is 1,517, an increase on the last Report of 1,144. Of these 452 are in Edinburgh, 218 in Leith, 365 in Midlothian, and 482 in West Lothian. We have still 8 Secretaries in charge of different districts in Midlothian, but we have now 34 Visitors in all. Most of the latter are at work in Edinburgh and Leith, but there are a few also in the country. The most substantial increase of the year was obtained at the by-election in West Lothian, nearly 500 "Friends" signing; the majority of these are miners.

The Leith contingent of over 200 "Friends" and 11 Visitors we owe to the work done there by Miss Pressley-Smith, and every day of the by-election adds to the number.

What stands out very clearly from the work of the year is this, that there is no difficulty at all in getting "Friends." There is a constant stream of signed cards into the Office. We get them from many sources—from meetings, from individual members, from Secretaries and Visitors, from London and the Provinces, and from outer space. The flow never ceases. There is only one difficulty, and that is to get Visitors for them. It should be interesting work, it is most certainly useful. Much time is not required—only two or three hours once in three months. It is work that every member can do, distributing leaflets, giving information about meetings, and generally keeping the "Friends" in touch with the Suffrage movement.

Mr Asquith has said recently, and in reply to a deputation on this subject, that "Parliament is bound to yield to the opinion of the country." There is no doubt that this is one of the best ways of ascertaining that opinion, and also of confirming and educating it. Surely, therefore, it must be a matter of first-rate importance at the present moment.

We appeal now for volunteers. It is a pity that such useful work should remain undone.

This report would be inadequate without some mention of the invaluable service rendered by the Hon. Secretary, Miss Rachel Jeffrey. She has made herself responsible both financially and otherwise for the organisation of the "Friends" Scheme in all the Constituencies under the jurisdiction of the Edinburgh Society, and it is owing to her untiring energy and enthusiasm that the work has been so successful.

"COMMON CAUSE" REPORT.

When Miss Royden became the new Editor of our paper, the *Common Cause*, in April 1913, it was thought desirable to appoint a new sub-committee to be responsible for all matters relating to *Common Cause* throughout the year. This sub-committee met for the first time on May 1st, 1913, the following members of the Society having consented to act:—Miss Gordon, Mrs Phillips, Miss K. Kemp, Miss N. Neill, Miss B Barclay, Miss M. Pearson, Miss V. Bogle, Miss M. Ross, and Miss Moody. Miss Gordon is Chairman of Committee, Mrs Phillips and Miss Moody joint-secretaries.

The first piece of work undertaken was the Canvass of all the members of the Society. Districts were formed numbering twenty-one, and callers were procured for most of these. The *Common Cause* Committee here take the opportunity of thanking all those who so kindly consented to do this work. Miss K. Kemp, Mrs Nicholson, and Miss Vere Bogle with great zeal undertook to canvass two districts each. As a result of this, 304 members of the Society promised to subscribe annually to the paper, and not a few promised to take the paper occasionally. We had hoped to win the £20 grant offered by the National Union to the Society which had the largest number of subscribers, but we were unsuccessful, securing third place with a percentage of 33·4. This is less than one-third of the entire membership.

The *Common Cause* Committee have also to report a marked increase in the number of papers sold in the street. Miss K. Kemp, Miss R. Jeffrey, and Miss Daisy MacKay have been most faithful in selling the paper each week in Princes Street, on Friday and Saturday.

Miss Gordon and Miss Pressley-Smith are invaluable as sellers, and have encouraged the Committee in every way, and helped to obtain good sales for the paper.

Miss Westwood, now of the North-Eastern Federation, was always most ready and willing to assist in selling the paper either in the street or at meetings. The Misses Ross, Miss Pearson, the Misses Neill, Miss E. A. Simson, the Misses Barclay, and Miss Sutherland have been most helpful in selling the paper at Suffrage Meetings, and also at the doors of Public Meetings other than Suffrage.

During 1913, 9,541 copies have been disposed of, 3,472 during the first six months, and 6,069 during the second six months.

This shows an increase of 100 per week. Forty-three free copies are sent each week to members of Parliament, editors of newspapers, I.L.P. Secretaries, Free Libraries, etc. The total number of free copies for the year is 1,768. Miss K. Scott, although not yet a member of the Society, has proved a most worthy helper in coming to the office every Friday to address the papers, and we thank her heartily for this valuable assistance.

This shows a gain to the Society of £1. 9s. The expenditure is nearly three times that for 1912 (£15), but the sales of the paper are more than trebled. As will be seen from the above, thirty-five members have the papers sent direct from London. Most of these became subscribers in May or June, and we may, therefore, add the number 910 (*i.e.*, for six months) to the total number disposed of in our own office. This would make our grand total for the year 10,451, which is 200 copies per week.

In conclusion, we hope to achieve great things for *Common Cause* in 1914. We would ask every member of the Society to co-operate with us, either by helping to sell the paper, or by subscribing each week. The Committee would also ask those members who order the paper through a newsagent, to endeavour to induce him to stock more papers than those ordered, and exhibit a *Common Cause* card or poster intimating that he does do.

The Committee cannot sufficiently appreciate the way in which Miss Moody organises the sale and distribution of the *Common Cause*. Her tireless energy and infinite capacity for taking pains, have achieved the excellent results set forth in the foregoing Report.

Reception.—On 28th March the Committee had the pleasure of welcoming the delegates to the Annual Meeting of the Scottish Federation at a Reception in the Office. The thanks of the Committee are due to Miss Souter and to Mr James Low, who delighted the company with their songs.

Ward Committees.—The Society this year made an experiment by the formation of Ward Committees. It was thought that interest in the work of the Society might be stimulated if in each ward of the town there were a Suffrage nucleus in the shape of a Local Committee. Ward Committees were formed in Newington under Mrs Eddington and Mrs Guyer, and in Merchiston under Miss Begbie and the Misses Kemp.

These Committees have done admirable work, and have amply justified their existence.

Our Hon. President.—The Society this year mourns the loss of its Hon. President, Dr Agnes M'Laren, who died at Cannes in April last.

The Second Report of the Edinburgh Society was presented by Miss Agnes M'Laren, who was then Joint Hon. Secretary with Miss Whigham.

For the last seven years Dr M'Laren filled the post of Hon. President, and the welfare of the Society was an object which was always close to her heart. She contributed liberally to its funds during her lifetime, and at her death she bequeathed to it a legacy of £100.

She has not been permitted to see in this life the coming of the day for which she longed, but when that day comes, and till that day comes, the Society will gratefully remember her as one of those who worked during the hours of darkness, but passed away before the dawn.

Our Hon. Auditor.—We wish to record the grateful thanks of the Society to Mr George Dall, our Hon. Auditor, who gives us his services ungrudgingly. The extent of these services may be gauged by the fact that accounts dealing with a sum of over a £1,000 have passed through his hands this year.

Our Presidents and Vice-Presidents.—To our President and Vice-Presidents the Society offers its hearty thanks for sympathy, help, and counsel, which it cannot adequately acknowledge.

Our Hon. Treasurer.—The warmest thanks of the Society are due to Mrs Wilson, our Hon. Treasurer. What her work has been is shown in some degree by the Balance-Sheet which she presents to-day; but there are hours of work and worry which do

not appear on any balance-sheet, and for all of these we heartily thank our Hon. Treasurer.

Our Hon. Secretary.—The Society wishes to record its gratitude to its Hon. Secretary, Miss K. M. Loudon, for many valuable services rendered during the past year.

Our Organisers.—The Committee take this opportunity of expressing their warm appreciation of the work of their Organisers, Miss Low and Miss Gordon, to whom the Society, and indeed the Suffrage Cause in Scotland, owe so much.

The Committee also express their thanks to Miss Abbott, the Office Secretary, who, besides working very hard during office hours, gives them days of overtime.

Help given in the Office.—For the last three months the Office Staff has been greatly helped by Miss Sayer and Miss Westwood, who have given valuable and devoted work.

Our helpers are too numerous to mention, but we particularly wish to thank the following members of the Society:—Mrs Norman, Mr and Mrs Nicolson, Mrs Patterson, Miss Rhoda Whyte, Miss MacKay, Mrs Dickson, Mrs Martin, Miss Bogle, and the Misses Bell, who have in many ways assisted in the work.

Our most grateful thanks are also due to Mrs Inverarity and Dr Venters who lent their motor cars on various occasions.

The results of the Society's labours up to 31st December 1913 may be analysed as follows:—

Membership, 1,050. Income, £1,275; increase of over £300 (£962 in 1913). All meetings held, over 180.

This year we in Scotland celebrate the sex-centenary of the battle by which our country gained its independence. It may be too much to hope that 1914 will be memorable as the year wherein the women of the United Kingdom won their political freedom, but we believe that we are on the side of the angels, and so as Suffragists, we face the future bravely and hopefully, knowing that if we work whole-heartedly for our great cause, victory must ere long be ours.
