


### Pamphlet

### **OBJECT:**

The Guild is formed for the purpose of affording means of social intercourse amongst the wives and daughters of Railway Workers; to render such assistance to any of its members as may be necessary; to co-operate with the local branches of the N.U.R.; to organise on behalf of the N.U.R.; to study and spread the principles of Trade Unionism amongst women; to co-operate with other Women Workers, and to help in the cause of the workers generally.





PROGRESS for the year, on the whole, is satisfactory. Since last Conference ten new branches have been formed, viz.:

Newport Pagnell, Forest Gate, Wymondham, Stratford, Cardiff, No. 2, Cardiff, No. 3, Croydon, Portsmouth, Southampton and Princes Risborough. Eight of the new branches have affiliated, and the Goole branch renewed its affiliation. After striking off two branches—non-existing—Tyldesley and Glossop, we have increased the number of affiliated branches from 78 to 84, with a paying membership of 3,299.

The G.E.C. met once during the year at Bristol, April 20th. It was considered advisable, under existing circumstances, to abandon the Autumn Meeting.

At its meeting, April 20th, the G.E.C. decided to recommend to Annual Conference resolutions dealing with Widows' Pensions, Education and Extension of Rent Restriction Act.

It was resolved to make a Grant of £2 2s. to "The National Council for the Unmarried Mother and her Child," and to support the Council's Bill for improving the status of the illegitimate Child, and helping the Mother back to good citizenship.

The G.E.C. continued its affiliation to the Standing Joint Committee of Industrial Women's Organisations.

The work of this Committee both as the Advisory Committee to the Labour Party on Women's Questions, and as the coordinating body in putting before the public the demands of Labour Women, has been very great.

The number of bodies represented upon it has increased and now consists of:—Women's Trade Union League, Women's Cooperative Guild, National Federation of Women Workers, National Union of Railway Women, Labour Party, Workers' Union, National Union of General Workers, Railway Clerks' Association, Dock, Wharf, Riverside and General Workers' Union.

One of the chief parts of its work is in obtaining representation for working women on all National Public Bodies dealing with questions of special interest to women, and also in stimulating public opinion on these matters, and helping local organisations to be fully represented on such bodies within their own areas.

Mrs. Hobbs, National President, is one of its representatives on the "National Council for the Unmarried Mother and her Child," and the Society for Oversea Settlement of British Women.

Through the medium of the S.J.C. several of our members have been made Justices of the Peace.

The Twentieth Annual Conference was held at Saltley, June 23rd. The following resolutions have been passed:—

- "That this Conference appeals to the Executive Committee of the N.U.R. to consider payment of Orphan Fund Benefit to children adopted by members paying to the Fund."
- "That this Conference, realising the great hardship prevailing amongst Old Age Pensions under present conditions, strongly urges the Government to take immediate steps to increase Old Age Pensions to £1 weekly"
- "This Conference urges that suitable houses be erected, without further delay, at a reasonable rent—to secure decency and health conditions to the overcrowded and long suffering workers."
- "That this Conference calls upon His Majesty's Government to provide employment of a national character for those now receiving unemployment benefit, to prevent future poverty and crime."
- "That this Conference utters its strong protest against the ever increasing prices of all the necessaries of life. We consider that a general strike of every industry should be organised to stop the growing impossibility for the masses to live a decent life."
- "That this Conference reaffirms its opinion that Pensions adequate for a healthy and useful life should be paid to all widows with children, or mothers whose family breadwinner has become incapacitated, and

hereby calls upon the Government to introduce a Bill in Parliament at the earliest possible moment for the provision of such pensions by the State to be administered by a Municipal Committee wholly unconnected with the Poor Law."

- "The Conference demands that Education from the Primary Schools to the University shall be universally free, with maintenance grants for pupils of proved capacity whose education might otherwise be unduly curtailed, and that the regulation in force for Secondary Schools concerning air space, playing fields and other means of physical education, size of classes, shall apply to Primary and Continuation Schools. We also urge the Board of Education to prohibit the juvenile employment for profit during full-time school attendances."
- "This Conference heartily supports 'The National League of the Blind' in its demand for adequate State maintenance for blind persons."
- "That the Rent Restriction Act be extended for a further period of three years."

Reports during the year show a considerable increase in the number of members serving on Public Bodies—National Insurance, War Pensions, Infant Welfare, and other important local committees.

The various efforts of our branches, individually and collectively, with the N.U.R. branches to assist the Orphan Fund, have produced good results.

The increase in branches and membership is encouraging, but at the same time we cannot fail to recognise that there still remains much work to be done to bring our organisation up to its numerical strength pre-war time.

We trust this will be accomplished, with additional success, during 1921.
