I do not withdraw, because I
believe it is a righteous cause:
to me personally it would make
no difference, but the absence
of it places women who have to
work for their own living & also
women landowners at a disadvantage!
but I cannot pay it without a

strong protest against the gross
indecorum which has lately
been practised: I cannot see any
heroism or self-sacrifice in those
who have suffered imprisonment,
quite the contrary. Hitherto the
standard of women has been
above that of men in manners
& morals: their conduct has
certainly been below in manners
& I am quite sure that in the
long run it will prove injurious
to every department of woman's
work: it is a matter of real

sorrow & regret to me.
