THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Executive Committee much regret that owing to the great shortage of paper it has been necessary to curtail the Annual Report very considerably and to omit the Preface; it is hoped that the chief features of interest have been preserved. It is satisfactory to note that the number of ordinary members has once more increased, being 2858 as against 2828 last year.

The Committee record with much pleasure the election of *Mr. A. L. Smith*, Master of Balliol, as Honorary Member of the Association (Arts. 9 and 10), and trust the honour conferred upon the Association by his acceptance of membership will be duly appreciated by all members. There are now 27 Honorary Members, 355 Life Members and 2503 Annual Subscribers, making a total membership of 2885.

The Executive Committee report with regret the death of *Miss S. A. L. Hutchins*, B.A. London, on the 11th November, 1917.

The Executive Committee have met 9 times during the year and 10 Sub-Committee meetings have also been held.

Miss Swann has been obliged to resign from the Committee owing to her being appointed Headmistress of the Southend County High School, which makes it impossible for her to attend. *Miss Thomson*, Principal W.R.N.S., has also had to resign, having been transferred from Sydenham to Devonport.

A special Sub-Committee was appointed to consider the question of pensions, and their recommendations for Pension Schemes for Teachers in Secondary Schools were forwarded to the President of the Board of Education and to the Secretary of the Departmental Committee of the Board of Education on Salary Scales. These recommendations agreed on the whole with the provisions of the Government's Teachers' Superannuation Bill.

The financial position of the Association continues to be satisfactory; full particulars are given in the Hon. Treasurer's Statement at the Annual Meeting.

The Hospital Branch of the Association is working satis-

factorily. The patients who applied for admission were received without delay and expressed their entire satisfaction with the treatment received. More members are needed for the Hospital Branch, the number of subscribers this year having been only 201, 200 being the number required to make up the £50 paid to the Hospital.

The Association was invited to send three representatives to give evidence before the Departmental Committee of the Board of Education on the principles which should determine the construction of scales of salary for teachers in Secondary Schools, and three members of the Executive Committee attended for this purpose. The Report of the Committee, published in August 1918, may be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, 28, Abingdon Street, S.W.1, price 6d.

Representatives of the Association have attended the following Committees and Conferences: Committee of the Conference of Educational Associations; Committee of the Teachers' University Election Association; Education Sectional Committee of the N.U.W.W.; Conference of Professional Women; Committee of the Federation of Professional, Technical, and Clerical Workers; Conferences of Representatives from Associations of Secondary School Teachers; Appointments Committee of the Students' Careers Association; Conference called by the Froebel Society on the examination for final B.A.(pass) of the University of London; Conference between members of the University of London and Headmistresses of London Schools for Girls (arranged by the Executive Committee of the A.U.W.T.) on the question of preparation in Schools for the Intermediate Examinations in Arts and Science of the University of London; Conference arranged by the Assistant Masters' Association on the Superannuation of School Teachers Bill; Annual Council Meeting of the National Union of Women Workers. Lack of space unfortunately prevents the publication of reports of these meetings.

The present year has seen the formation of a large number of Women Citizens' Associations, the object of which is to instruct women in matters of local and imperial government, with a view to assisting them in the right use of the Parliamentary and Municipal franchise, and the Association has endeavoured to help

forward this movement. An informal conference on the subject was held at the office in May, with *Miss Kilgour* in the Chair, and since then many individual members have taken an active part in starting Women Citizens' Associations in their own districts. Names of any members of the A.U.W.T. who are willing to help either in this way or by addressing meetings of Women Citizens, will be gladly received by *Miss Normanton*, the Secretary of the Central Committee of Women Citizens' Associations, 82, Victoria Street, S.W.1. The National Union of Women Workers will also be grateful for the help of members of the Association in the educational work of their local branches.

The address of *Miss Alice Woods* on retiring from the office of President was printed and distributed to the members in May, as owing to the unforeseen length of the business it was not delivered at the Annual Meeting.

THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING.

JANUARY 26TH, 1918.

The Thirty-fourth Annual Business Meeting of the Association was held on Saturday, January 26th, 1918, at University Hall, Gordon Square, W.C.1, at 2.45 p.m.

The President, *Miss Alice Woods*, took the Chair.

Forty-seven Members and some visitors were present.

The Chairman read out the names of those members who being of less than six months' standing were not entitled to vote at the meeting.

On the motion of *Miss Hedley*, seconded by *Miss I. Stephens* and carried unanimously, the minutes of the Annual Business Meeting held on January 20th, 1917, were taken as read and signed by the Chairman.

The adoption of the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts

was moved by *Miss M. W. Newton*, seconded by *Miss H. R. Potter* and carried unanimously. The *President* called upon the *Secretary* to mention any points of special interest in the Report. The *Secretary* called the attention of the meeting to the decrease of eleven in the number of members and hoped that every member would endeavour to bring in at least one new member so that the numbers should again increase. She also called attention to the moving of the office in February, 1917, to 108, Victoria Street, which had proved a central and convenient situation. She stated that the number of posts filled through the Registry was somewhat less than last year, partly owing to the shortage of teachers, and partly owing to the impossibility of getting passports for those who wished to take up work abroad. She stated that three members of the Executive Committee had attended by invitation to give evidence before the Departmental Committee of the Board of Education for enquiring into the principles which should determine the salaries of teachers in Secondary Schools.

It had not been possible to mention this in the Annual Report or to report the very interesting Conference on Post Matriculation work in Schools between Representatives of the University of London and Headmistresses of London Schools.

The Honorary Treasurer, *Miss Coward*, reported that the financial position of the Association was most satisfactory. In spite of the increased cost of printing and stationery and the cost of removal to new premises, there was a balance in hand of £157; £100 had been invested in a 5 per cent. National War Bond, and the holding of £105 converted from 4½ per cent. to 5 per cent. War Loan had been made up to £150. She also reported on the Secondary, Technical and University Teachers' Insurance Society. The accounts of the State Section had not been made up, having been postponed owing to the War. The Dividend Section showed a most satisfactory balance sheet. Members' own Fund amounted to £4000 and there was a reserve fund of £740 which was equivalent to the sick payments for the last four years. Thus, if for any reason the Society were wound up, no member would suffer any financial loss.

The *President* enquired if there were any questions arising in regard to the Financial Statement.

Miss Knight: I should like to ask a question about a small point on page 34 of the Report. Under Payments (Salaries) we have "War Bonuses, £21 10s." That is a payment due to increased cost of living owing to the War, and one which everyone has been glad to see the Association undertake. It is simply a verbal point that I want to raise. I find on page 4 of the Memorandum and Articles of Association this very clear statement: "The income and property of the Association whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association, and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise." I am sure the increase is desirable from every point of view. But it is regrettable that we should have used a word which by the Articles of Incorporation we are debarred from using.

The *Hon. Treasurer* explained that "Bonus" as used in the Articles of Association really meant any return of money on a subscription paid.

Miss Gruner: I am sorry to rise on this point; but I happen to be one of those who were instrumental in drawing up the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and who signed both. I certainly understood the word "bonus" to mean gift, and, by Article 4, no bonus can be paid to any officer or servant of the Association, "whilst nothing shall prevent the payment in good faith of remuneration in return for services actually rendered." I think that we had better avoid the expression "war bonus" in our Financial Statement and replace it by "additional salary." Perhaps I might mention that shortly before I ceased to be the Secretary, I had an interesting correspondence with the Headmaster of a Public School who approached me on this question, he having a strong objection to the use of the word "bonus," and we both held that instead of the term "war-bonus" we should say what we really mean, *i.e.*, an increase of salary due to war conditions.

Miss C. Vavasour doubted if the Association had the legal right to use the term "Bonus" according to the Articles of its Constitution.

Miss Knight: I beg to propose that the words "Increase of

salaries due to war conditions," be substituted for the words "War Bonuses" in the statement of accounts next year, and that a written correction to that effect be made in any further copies of this year's Report. This was seconded by *Miss Gruner*.

Miss Strudwick suggested the insertion of the word "Temporary" before "increase of salaries," which was accepted by the mover and seconder. The motion was carried by 21 to 8.*

By the consent of the meeting *Dr. Mackail* was now asked to give his address on "Fifty Years of Women's Education"—on the conclusion of which a hearty vote of thanks proposed by *Miss Winifred Smith* was carried by acclamation.

The *President* stated that the next item on the agenda was the appointment of the auditor: the following resolution proposed by *Miss D. W. Sprules* and seconded by *Miss Boorne* was carried unanimously:—

"That *Mrs. Harold Cox* be appointed Auditor for the year 1917-18, and receive the fee of £5 5s."

The *President* then read the following resolution which she was proposing from the Chair:—

"That Members of the Executive Committee living outside a 10-mile radius from Charing Cross should, in accordance with paragraph 4 of the Memorandum of Association, be refunded the expenses of their railway fares when attending Committee."

She mentioned that paragraph 4 said that "No remuneration shall be given to any member of such Committee or Governing Body, except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses," stating that in view of this paragraph the Committee felt the question should be considered at a General Meeting. There were two reasons which made the payment of railway fares desirable—the first was that present members of the Committee who lived at a distance found the expenses of attending every meeting a heavy tax owing to the increase in railway fares; the second was that, if the railway fares were paid, it might be possible to get members from the provinces, who would be very valuable on the Executive Committee, but who

could not be expected to incur the expense of the journeys. It was open to the meeting to consider the question as they thought suitable. Alterations could be made if desired; for instance, a limit to the distance for which fares would be paid might be fixed, so as to limit the expense to the Association—she thought there was no doubt the Association could afford these expenses.

Mrs. Martin Clarke said she would like to ask two questions. First, what would be the cost if the Resolution were adopted this year. Second, whether the Committee thought of limiting the expense to a fixed sum. She thought the real matter to be decided was the interpretation of paragraph 4 of the Memorandum. If the words "repayment of out-of-pocket expenses" covered the Committee's expenses, it rested with the Committee to carry out the Memorandum. If not, was the meeting free to interpret them in such a way that they should.*

Miss Gruner: I want the Members present to understand that I am not speaking as the former Secretary of the Association, but as a Member of the Committee which drew up the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and, because I was also one of the signatories of the Memorandum and Articles, I feel responsible for the carrying out of the conditions on which the license of Incorporation was granted. We must consider paragraphs 4 and 5 in conjunction. The latter says: "the 4th paragraph of this Memorandum is a condition on which a license is granted by the Board of Trade" . . . and paragraph 4 lays down "that no remuneration shall be given to any Member of such Committee or Governing Body except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses," &c., whilst Bye-law 17 states exactly what was meant by "out-of-pocket expenses." It says "The Members of the

"The resolution 'that members of the Executive Committee living outside a 10-mile radius from Charing Cross should in accordance with paragraph 4 of the Memorandum of Association be refunded the expenses of their railway fares when attending Committee' is not, I think, contrary to the Memorandum or Articles, as Clause 4 expressly permits the repayment of out-of-pocket expenses. We think, however, the words 'in accordance with paragraph 4 of the Memorandum of Association' would be better omitted from the proposed resolution as they imply that that paragraph directs the payment of these fares, whereas it in fact only permits such payment."

“Committee shall be paid *all actual outlay on behalf of the Association incurred by order of or sanctioned by the Committee.*” Now such expenses have always been paid by the Association and have been shown in the Statement of Accounts, for example: the purchase of Reports and Blue-books and Parliamentary Papers for information *required by the Committee*; all expenses, including railway fares, of delegates *sent by the Committee* to Conferences, Parliamentary Committees, &c.; and travelling expenses of the Secretary visiting University Colleges *on behalf of the Association*. But in the whole of the 34 years’ history of the Association, travelling expenses of Committee Members for attending Committee Meetings have never been claimed, since they are *personal* expenses and cannot be regarded as incurred *by order of the Committee*. It seems to me that those who drew up the resolution now before the meeting, have overlooked Bye-law 17, for *personal* expenses cannot be put under it, also the curious proposal of a 10-mile radius could not possibly fit into it. If the interpretation of out-of-pocket expenses could be stretched to cover *personal* expenses, then the travelling expenses of all attending Committee Meetings, including the President, whatever the radius, should come under it.

However, I think it safer and wiser not to proceed with a proposal which appears to me contrary to the spirit as well as to the letter of Memorandum 4, laid down for us by the Board of Trade and contrary to Bye-law 17, drawn up at the same time by the Committee for its own guidance. I also feel that the proposal if carried out, would be a distinct lowering of our banner!

Further I should point out that we are eminently a *central body*. We tried at one time to establish branches, but membership of the A.U.W.T., being so miscellaneous, did not admit of branches. With the Assistant Mistresses’ Association Branches are possible since all its members are Assistant Mistresses in Public Secondary Schools. Our Association being a central body, it is absolutely necessary that the administration should be at the centre because of the difficulty in getting scattered and distant administrators together when immediate and important decisions have to be made, as very frequently occurs.

In 1910 and the succeeding years our Presidents lived in London

and those years were the most active of the Association with regard to educational matters. We were in everything that moved. The same can, however, also be said of the time when Miss Clough was President, for although she lived at a distance, she was in a position immediately to answer a call (witness the Liverpool Corporation Bill), though even then there was always a chance whether or not she could reach us in time.

There have been occasions when the Association could have taken a much more prominent place in educational movements, chances being given us by the Authorities in question, but owing to distance, the Secretary was unable to get quickly into touch with either President or some Committee Members whose judgment and experience were needed and whose authority *for action* at the time was indispensable. These were instances when we lost our opportunity.

Our Association is very strong in London, so that there is no need to go to the Provinces for Committee Members, and after all, attendance at Committee Meetings is only one of the functions of Committee Members. They must be in close and constant touch with the Office and the Secretary, and because of this, Committee Members living in the Provinces are of much less value to the Association.

I know as a fact that some Associations with branches who were accustomed to pay travelling expenses of their local Secretaries have now withdrawn that privilege and that others only pay one half of their delegates’ expenses.

In face of the increased expenditure and diminished income and decrease in membership, it is the wrong time to contemplate a proposal such as now before us, even if it were not contrary to Memorandum 4 and 5 and contrary to Bye-law 17. Also where would such expenditure lead us? Those who attend Committees from a distance—the meetings being held in the late afternoon—could not travel back the same night, and so would have to incur hotel expenses as well. These too would come under “out-of-pocket expenses.” Lastly, is it right under present circumstances, to encourage people to travel more than is absolutely necessary? If it were necessary, *yes*, but I feel sure it is not, for there are many London Members willing to serve on Committee

and these, able to get into closer touch with it, would also prove more helpful to the Association.

I will read a letter from a Member who also signed the Memorandum and Articles of Association and who would have been present at to-day's Meeting if she had not been prevented by illness. The letter is from *Miss Kilgour* :—

“ I am very sorry that illness prevents me from coming to the Meeting; I hope the Meeting will not decide to pay travelling expenses of Committee Members, for many reasons, of which the chief to my mind is that the quality of the work suffers in the long run if members who live far off are chosen, for arrangements for meetings become so inelastic,—it is so hard to suit distant members and to get enough work done. Usually, as time goes on and new folk take such payments more and more for granted, it is seen that the arrangement tends to moral slackness taking the place of self-sacrifice with the Committee.

“ Then the Committee would be less respected. In some bodies there are special reasons why you must have geographical representation,—not in the A.U.W.T. surely.”

Miss C. Vavasseur said that as an old Committee Member of many years' standing she recollected numerous occasions (Parliamentary Committees, &c.) in which it had been absolutely essential to assemble several influential members of the Committee at a few hours' notice. It would be invidious to discriminate as to which members were to receive travelling expenses. The meetings in the late afternoon prevented distant members from returning the same day, and their hotel expenses ought also to be paid. She asked if it would not be possible for members of the Association in large Provincial centres to meet once or twice a year, for the consideration of points they would like discussed at the Annual General Meeting. During the War, however, she deprecated the idea of the Association incurring any additional expenses, especially in view of the heavy Income Tax.

The *President* stated she did not think the Committee had exceeded the regulations of the Bye-laws, because she thought that expenses incurred on behalf of the Association could not be called purely personal expenses. It was very difficult to interpret such

a phrase as out-of-pocket expenses. The object of the resolution was to facilitate getting the very best people as members of Committee. *Miss Gruner* has said that sometimes the Committee had consisted of inexperienced members. The Association did not want a Committee of such people, but the very best that could be got. The Committee did not feel that the payment was in any sense a necessity, but that it was a matter to be brought before a general meeting because it had come up as a difficulty in asking certain people to join the Committee.

Miss Knight: May I ask a question? Are we justified in interpreting “ expenses incurred on behalf of the Association ” as including travelling expenses? To my mind “ expenses incurred on behalf of the Association ” could only mean travelling expenses if the Committee had sent one of its members on a special mission. But surely if anyone accepts work on this Committee, she realises that it entails a certain amount of expenditure not only of time and labour, but of money also in attending the meetings; and I do not think she can say that the travelling expenses have been “ incurred on behalf of the Association ”—they have been undertaken voluntarily by the act of accepting nomination.

Miss A. Robertson: If we take for granted that this motion is carried and that it would be advantageous to have Committee Members from a distance then I suggest that the probable travelling expenses of each candidate should be stated. If the majority, or even the minority, came from the North, or Wales, or Ireland, or perhaps South Africa the surplus £166 would soon disappear! This may sound ridiculous, but such a possibility must be faced.

In these days, it seems to me, that a Committee from the London area, or chiefly from the London area, is more satisfactory. It would be ready to deal with emergencies, and I believe it would represent the majority of the members. You will remember that the L.C.C. new scale of salaries has affected us and indirectly all teachers during the last few months. I think this Association was not quite on the spot at that moment; the Committee perhaps could not get together? At an emergency meeting, representatives came from the Headmasters' Association, the Headmistresses' Association, the Assistant Masters' Association, the Association of Assistant Mistresses and the London Teacher's

Association to consider the new scale but this Association was not represented. At another meeting composed of Assistant Mistresses in London County Secondary Schools, members of this Association asked "what is the A.U.W.T. doing in this matter?" Miss Gruner has dealt with the paragraphs in the memorandum, but these two points must be considered. May I ask the Secretary to state the number of members in this area?

The *Secretary* said it was impossible to give the number of members in the London area because it varied constantly owing to members changing their posts.

In answer to *Mrs. Martin Clarke's* question, the *President* stated that she understood that it would probably cost the Association £10 or £12 for the coming year. *Miss Gruner* questioned these figures; she calculated that it would be at least £20 with the increased railway fares, if the three present members of Committee living at a distance, and a fourth who was now a candidate for election, attended all the meetings including those of Sub-Committees.

The resolution was then put to the Meeting and lost by 14 votes to 17.

The *President* then announced the result of the election of the President and Members of the Committee. *Miss Stephen* had been elected President, no other nomination having been received; *Miss Sprules*, *Miss Strudwick*, *Miss Swann*, *Miss Tarrant*, and *Miss Thomson* had been elected to the Committee. *Miss Swann*, having received the lowest number of votes, would serve for 2 years only, in place of *Miss Fairbairns*, who had been obliged to resign on account of war-work. As it was now very late she thought the meeting would agree with her that it would be best to omit the Presidential address and proceed to have tea.

Miss E. Strudwick proposed a hearty vote of thanks to *Miss Alice Woods* for her chairmanship during the meeting and for her untiring and unselfish service to the Association during her two years of office, which had been of the greatest assistance in enabling the Association to cope with the difficulties created by the War. This was carried by acclamation and the members then proceeded to tea.

SOCIAL MEETINGS.

Two Social Meetings were held in 1918.

One on January 12th at the Conference of Education Associations, at University College. *Miss Alice Woods* took the chair, and *Miss Margaret McMillan* gave a most interesting address on Nursery Schools; a full report will be found in the Report of the Sixth Annual Conference of Educational Associations, which may be obtained from the Secretary, Teachers' Guild, 9, Brunswick Square, W.C.1, price 2s.

The Second was held at University Hall, on March 2nd, *Miss Winifred Smith* took the chair and *Dr. Harriette Chick* lectured on "The Importance in Diet of Accessory Food Substances (Vitamines)." This delightful lecture dealt with the amount of vitamins to be found in various food substances, the lecturer giving most interesting details of the effects of various foods in widely differing cases, from the soldiers in the siege of Kut, to orphan babies in a New York institution.

THE REGISTRY.

The number of posts filled is slightly smaller than was the case last year, whereas the number of applications has again increased. In view of the increasing scarcity of teachers, this is hardly a matter for surprise, though it is much to be regretted.

Salaries have decidedly increased; in many cases the County Councils have done away with a War Bonus and increased the salaries instead, but there are still instances in which a substantial War Bonus is paid. No post abroad has been filled through the Registry this year, but one member who had obtained a post through the A.U.W.T. last year in Egypt, has now gone to Jerusalem as Headmistress of a High School for Mohammedan girls, under military command.
